

### **Barricades Placed on Victory Bridge Pedestrians & Bicyclists Blocked From Use**

PERTH AMBOY/SAYRE-VILLE - In the wake of recent suicides and attempted suicides happening so close together on the Victory Bridge, a directive was issued by the New Jersey Department of Transportation. (See Public Notice: Page 7)

Barricades were placed on the Perth Amboy and Sayreville ends of the Bridge, blocking the bicycle lane and pedestrian sidewalk. They hope the barricades will be a deterrent from future incidents occurring.

The DOT's decision came after one of their top officials met with Perth Amboy's Mayor Diaz, Police and some County and State Officials representing the 19<sup>th</sup> District.

Diaz wanted the commissioners from the DOT to come to Perth Amboy to see the bridge in person. Since her first term as Mayor she has been calling on politicians on all levels to help get some sort of barriers on that bridge.

What You Should Do: Contact PSE&G or Elizabeth Town Gas, confirm the status of your account. DO NOT PROVIDE any personal information such



### Update on Mary Street Caucus Meeting 9/22/14



#### Business Administrator Jillian Barrick

PERTH AMBOY - Business Administrator Jillian Barrick gave an update on the parking problems on Mary Street. Residents have been experiencing problems since it was turned into a one-way street.

Barrick said, "Of 48 homes on that street, 40 have driveways. There are 41 parking spaces on the side of the street that residents can park on. We will give the residents one parking space per household. The residents who attended a meeting held a couple weeks ago in that area seemed to be happy with that resolution. A person would get ticketed if they park in a residential per-

mit only parking spot if they don't have the required permit."

Councilwoman Lisa Nanton said, "The people who don't have the required sticker should be towed."

There was a discussion on multi-car homes and the priority as to who was permitted to get a residential sticker.

There will be an ordinance on the agenda on the October 8, 2014 Council Meeting to add Mary Street for permit parking. Speakers will be given a five minute opportunity to voice their opinions on this ordinance.

### **Discussion on School Programs**

PERTH AMBOY – During the 9/23/14 Board of Education Meeting there was a discussion about some of the items on the agenda regarding the curriculum.

One topic of discussion was an After-School and Saturday Detention program. Acting Superintendent Dr. Vivian Rodriguez read from a statement from High School Principal Dr. Nester Collazzo regarding this matter. It stated that all teachers and staff will be on the main campuses. Detention will be 90 minutes on weekdays and 120 minutes on Saturday mornings. Board Member Maria Garcia was concerned that students would be doing nothing and therefore being unproductive during detention. Rodriguez advised Garcia that students will be provided with necessary materials. The ALEKS math web-based program was another topic of discussion. Board President Obi Gonzalez explained that this year a much smaller program is being utilized than the one that was used last year. "It works very well when used with fidelity. In the past, teachers chose not to use it."

# Bridge Fences The October 1, 2014 issue

had an editorial that wondered if anything could be done to prevent people from jumping off the Victory Bridge. There are a couple of faults with this editorial. First, it only applies to these public suicides. Most suicides take place in private, the phrase "died at home" is a euphemism for suicides. A fence on any bridge does nothing here. An economic depression often results in more suicides, even if this is censored in the press. The suicides and murders during the great depression of the 1890s were documented in the book "Wisconsin Death Trip" over forty years ago. Did "bullying" cause the death of a student? What were the failures at his school? Can they be corrected? An ounce of prevention is still worth a pound of cure.

I remember some rule in Classical Logic that warns against going from the particular to the general. In modern times there is the concept of "cost effectiveness". But this requires knowledge and rationality that won't fit into a newspaper headline. There are always limits and trade-offs for any action. In particular, that fence along New Brunswick Ave. was put up about forty years ago (?) to prevent teenagers from throwing rocks and bottles to the highway below. There is no such fence on the Route 184 bridge over Route 9, or other bridges over highways, such as the Route 35 bridge over the Fayette St. bypass. I believe the way to prevent suicides in a "Great Recession" (another euphemism) is to create another Works Progress Administration for the



### **Perth Amboy 2<sup>nd</sup> Street Park** From Scrap Yard to Play Yard — A new park for Perth Amboy

News Release 10/2/14 PERTH AMBOY - A 6-acre former scrap metals yard has been vacant for so many years that residents rarely notice it. That is changing. Across from Wilentz Elementary School on Second St. and stretching from Patterson St. to the waterfront, a new park is in the works. The City of Perth Amboy acquired the property with a Green Acres grant to facilitate park development and to complement current waterfront redevelopment.

To help the City, the Middlesex County Improvement Authority (MCIA) received a US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Brownfields Coalition Assessment Grant to use at the site. About \$300,000 of the grant is being used for public outreach, education and park planning, as well as advising the City on environmental issues, performing environmental testing if needed, and helping the former owner plan the clean-up process before the park is built.

In September, Rutgers University staff held public open houses at the Brighton Avenue Community Center near the new park. More than 120 residents shared what they would like to see in the park. Early stage design concepts for the park, ideas from similar workshops, surveys for residents,

environmental information about the metals site and how it affects design ideas were shared. Attendees gave many comments and were very excited about the idea of a park there. Joel Pabon, Sr., Perth Amboy City Council President and a member of the Second Street Park Steering Committee is a strong park advocate. "This is an incredible opportunity for Perth Amboy. Other planned waterfront improvements, combined with this new park are and will be wonderful assets for our community and will draw more visitors." Similarly, Joel Polidura, City resident and Wilentz Elementary School teacher said, "We need something unique to Perth Amboy to make people come here, and our water front really is beautiful," Polidura is eager to spread the word, "We need

to tell the whole community about the new Second Street Park. Many people don't know about it or heard about it from the past, but now it's really happening!"

### Wisniewski, DeAngelo, Coughlin & Benson Bill to Ease Home Improvement Costs for Seniors Advances in Assembly

News Release 10/2/14 TRENTON – Legislation Assemblymen John S. Wisniewski, Wayne P. DeAngelo, Craig J. Coughlin and Daniel R. Benson sponsored to allow New Jersey towns to exempt senior homeowners from municipal building permit fees was released Thursday by an Assembly panel.

The bill (A-1681) would authorize municipalities to enact

fees can go a long way."

Any senior citizen who meets the requirements necessary to receive a homestead property tax reimbursement would be eligible for a fee waiver under the bill. Provisions of the bill would not apply to new construction or construction done solely to increase the square footage of the home.

"When seniors are able to stay in their homes, they tend to have a more positive overall life outlook," said DeAngelo (D-Mercer/Middlesex). "This bill acknowledges that transforming a home into a space that can accommodate older residents is necessary for the health and safety of New Jersey's seniors and will help make that very important process a bit less costly." "Our older residents have contributed so much to New Jersey, and they deserve to be able to continue residing peaceably and safely in the homes that are familiar to them," said Coughlin (D-Middlesex). "This legislation will help remove one hurdle for seniors who want to maintain comfort and independence in

their homes as they age."

"If a homeowner has lived at the same residence for quite some time, it's inevitable that the home will need routine repairs. For seniors, being able to complete those everyday projects as well as install instruments that will facilitate life at home can play a crucial role in preventing falls and other injuries," said Benson (D-Mercer/Middlesex). "This legislation will give seniors peace of mind regarding prospect of living independently and the costs associated with doing so." Under current law, a municipality may choose to grant a building permit fee exemption to individuals with physical disabilities. The bill extends this exemption to seniors seeking repair or routine maintenance of their homes. The sponsors note that the cost of the exemption will be offset by fees paid by other, non-exempt permit applicants. The bill was released by the Assembly Health and Senior Citizens Committee, of which Benson is vice-chair.

### Rise In Drug-Treatment Admissions In NJ Reveals Progress Of A Plague

With Heroin and Opiate Abuse on The Rise In New Jersey, Data And Anecdotal Evidence Tell Heartbreaking Tale of Addiction and Death

News Release 10/3/14 NEW JERSEY - An increase in heroin and opiate addiction in New Jersey has fueled a rise in drug treatment admissions over the past five years, and heroin and other drug-induced deaths have also risen, state and federal data show.

The numbers tell only part of the story. Yesterday, Sens. Joseph Vitale, D-Middlesex and chairman of the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee, held the first of a series of community discussions throughout the state on heroin and opiate abuse in Ocean County. The county prosecutor's data on dozens of overdoses and the stories of those who lost family members to drug addiction were heartbreaking and convinced him the state needs to move quickly to take greater action to help addicts get help.

"His (the prosecutor's) frustration and one that I share is what's next for the people who have overdosed?" said Vitale, who is sponsoring a wide-ranging 21-bill package to deal with the problem. "There is certainly a law enforcement component to this, but we can't arrest our way out of it. When there is a demand, there is always going to be a supply."

Among the ways Vitale's package seeks to increase and enhance treatment are bills that would require health-insurance plans to cover behavioral healthcare services when medically necessary and increase Medicaid reimbursements for some behavioral healthcare.

Anecdotal stories of the skyrocketing of the use of heroin and other opiates are backed up by data from the state Department of Human Services. According to annual substance-abuse reports, the number of treatment admissions, both inpatient and outpatient, for heroin or opiate addiction, rose by more than a third between 2008 and 2013 to 32,607 or nearly half of all treatment admissions. In 2008, 38 percent of those with a drug or alcohol problem sought help for heroin or opiates. Last year, that class of drugs accounted for 45 percent of all admissions.

Data also backs up the contention that Ocean County is ground zero for New Jersey's problem. There were nearly 4,000 treatment admissions for heroin and opiate addiction in Ocean County last year, more than double the amount in 2008 and more than 1,000 higher than the county with the next largest number -- Essex, which had 2,666 heroin admissions. In Ocean, Atlantic, Gloucester, and Sussex, more than half of treatment admissions were for heroin and opiate abuse. Statewide, the number of deaths from heroin overdoses rose by more than a quarter between 2007 and 2011, the most recent year for which data is available, to 131, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Multiple Cause of Death database. The number of overdoses due to all opiates rose by almost 100 over that time, to 393. All drug-induced deaths rose by about 30 percent, to 1,042 in 2011, the data shows.


Given the scope of the problem, Vitale is hoping for quick action on his bill package. He expects about half the bills to move through the health committee next Thursday and would like to see most or all of the bills sent to Gov. Chris Christie's desk sometime next month and hopes the governor will sign them.

"This is a bipartisan effort," said Vitale, who was joined by

"As senior citizens age, it becomes increasingly important to their sense of community and overall wellness that they can stay in their homes," said Wisniewski (D-Middlesex). 





### Perth Amboy Inaugurates Monument to Juan Pablo Duarte, Founding Father of the Dominican Republic

On Saturday September 27, 2014 the City of Perth Amboy accepted the gift of the Juan Pablo Duarte Monument from the Dominican Community. Numerous Perth Amboy residents gathered at the beautiful Perth Amboy Waterfront to witness this historic event. It was a remarkable ceremony on a beautiful, sunny Saturday afternoon.


The Perth Amboy High School Band accompanied the national anthems, there were poems recited, musical performances by children and adults, a historical review by historian Jesús Méndez Jiminián, music and folk dancing among other things.

Reverend Monsegnor John B. Gordon, pastor of Most Holy Name of Jesus Parish delivered the invocation. Professor Sarah Aponte, representing the CUNY Dominican Studies Institute, and the participation of the renowned poet and writer Rhina Espaillat, with translators Antonio Pérez and Nelson Santana, the Juan Pablo Duarte Committee organized a presentation on Juan Pablo Duarte's writings and their translation into English.

The Monument's inaugural events culminated with an extraordinary gala dinner with legendary Joseito Mateo and the orchestra of Victor Ouezada. During this event, the keynote speaker was historian Alfonso Torres Ulloa. The Juan Pablo Duarte Committee presented a plaque of appreciation to Hon. Mayor Wilda Diaz for her efforts in support of the Monument. Juan Pablo Duarte was born on January 26, 1813 and died on July 15, 1876. In addition to being the founding father of the Dominican Republic, Juan Pablo Duarte left an important legacy to the world. His honesty, faith, unselfishness, commitment to service, patriotism and passion for education, unity and justice from an early age make him an inspiring role model for everyone, but specially for the youth. He lived his life as a global citizen as he lived in the United States, Venezuela and Europe and spoke six different languages. In 2007, the City of Union

City led by Hon. State Senator and Mayor Brian Stack made the decision to donate a bronze bust of Juan Pablo Duarte to the City of Perth Amboy. The city administration received the bust and embarked on selecting a permanent location to place it. The city then conducted a survey of Perth Amboy Dominican residents for selecting the best location for the bust. The overwhelming choice was the Caledonia / Roessler Park located near the waterfront.

In 2008, the City of Perth Amboy renamed the chosen park and formally became Roessler/Caledonia/ Honorary Juan Pablo Duarte Park. It is in this backdrop that a group of local Dominicans formed a committee to ensure the bust would be properly placed in this park. The Juan Pablo Duarte Committee started to raise funds from local residents and businesses with the intent to build a monument where the bust could be placed. With the Committee's hard work and dedication, the city council approved the placement of the Juan Pablo Duarte Monument. It was then and still is the dream of the Juan Pablo Duarte Committee that this monument signal to the community that we all embrace Perth Amboy's multicultural heritage. It is also our goal that this monument becomes a symbol


