Discussion on New Bus Depot 11/19/15 Board of Education Meeting

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - On the Old Business portion of the agenda of the 11/19/15 Board of Education Meeting there was a discussion on a proposed Bus Depot to be built on the corner of East Avenue and New Brunswick Avenue. Presently this is an empty lot and the land is owned by the Board of Education. The proposed Bus Depot would house school vehicles including maintenance vehicles, food service trucks and school buses, etc. The plan is to have an in-house mechanic to service the vehicles plus in-house cleaning services and a storage facility to garage the vehicles thereby extending the

life of the vehicle.

The Amboy Guardian reached out to Board Vice-President and Buildings and Grounds Chair Israel Varela. Varela stressed the need of the Bus Depot to help alleviate the problems of outsourcing school vehicles. "It will make things perfect. In the past we had to outsource maintenance vehicles and were at the company's mercy, especially during snowstorms. We had to pay an outsourced company around \$100,000 to plow for a storm. Now we own our own Bobcats and we are paying less than half the money that we were paying before. These Bobcats can be are also being retrofitted to do other things such as landscaping which we are using them for."

The plan is to eventually purchase enough vehicles so that the Board of Education does not need to outsource any vehicles. "We pay around \$80,000 a year to store school vehicles. If we have our own facility, we will have more room. We will be able to maintain vehicles and clean them. What we now pay a contractor to maintain vehicles each year is enormous. The Depot will be a great, great savings."

During the 11/19/15 Board of Education Meeting, Board Member William Ortiz ques-

tioned the Board on the need for the construction of the Bus Depot, "Is there a timetable that this is going to cost?"

Board Secretary Derek Jess answered, "The architect is preparing the renderings. We will get an estimate for the cost and then we will go forward."

Board President Sam Lebreault provided some information, "About 3 years ago it cost \$7.2 million (the amount the BOE spends on transportation). Today, I don't know."

Derek Jess added, "It's in the ballpark."

William Ortiz continued, "How many square feet (will this Bus Depot be)? How much will it cost – from \$2.5 million to \$5 million?"

Jess answered, "We currently own around 30 school buses (plus maintenance vehicles and food service delivery trucks). We outsource around 40 other (vehicles)."

"Buy more buses?" Ortiz

Jess replied, "Because then we don't have to outsource it (vehicle services)."

Ortiz continued, "I would like to have a presentation. Once you build, you have to maintain the building and pay health benefits (to employees). What is the starting salary for a bus driver?"

Jess answered, "Around \$28,000/year. Once we have the information from the architect we will know the cost."

Ortiz continued his questioning, "How would this benefit the students if we overspend on it?"

Buildings and Ground Chair and Board Vice President Israel Varela stated the necessity of the building, "A lot of private companies are opening up. There's a large profit in this. In reference to cost, the amount of buses (outsourced) it's a massive amount of a bill. By having our own, it's very lucrative. We can maintain our own vehicles and keep them more secure. We'll have a nice

garage and always be ready for any emergencies."

Ortiz argued, "How are we going to store 70 buses - in this building? It's always cheaper to lease than to own. I know enough to know that this is a Red Herring. At some point, this should be presented to the public. There's no way it's beneficial to the students."

The Amboy Guardian asked Vice President Varela on the need for so much busing in Perth Amboy. Varela answered, "Federal law requires special needs students to be bussed. If a program is far away and a special needs student is required to attend it, the student must be bused. More and more special needs students are coming into Perth Amboy."

When asked about buses being parked all over town, especially recently buses being parked in the Train Station parking lot, Varela answered, "All Perth Amboy Board of Education buses are housed in storage during the day when not in use. They are not parked on the street or in the train station lot. In Perth Amboy, the outsourced vehicles are not required to be stored during the day. If it does not say Perth Amboy Board of Education on the bus or vehicle - it is outsourced and not owned by the Perth Amboy Board of Education."

Demolition Begins at C-Town Property

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - After a long legal process that took months to conclude, the destroyed C-Town property on Bordentown Avenue has finally begun demolition.

Mayor Fred Henry made the initial announcement at last Monday's city council meeting that demolition and debris cleanup would begin on Nov.

"I would like to thank the patience of our citizens. I know it's not an easy process," Henry said. "We have an investigation into the cause of the fire, the insurance companies, the courts involved...It just takes time but Wednesday will be the day they start."

Council President Mickey Gross credited the hard work done by the city's officials for making the demolition hap-

"I don't think people realize the amount of effort our Business Administrator, our Mayor, our Law Director, and our City Engineer put into this,"

Gross said. "It really should be part of the record here tonight. Thank you, it's not something that just happened over night. As always you guys do a great job and I personally want to thank you for your efforts."

The council held a moment of silence for those affected in the Paris terrorist attacks that claimed the lives of 120 people. Mayor Henry sent his condolences to the friends and families of those who lost their lives and hoped that the United States would come to their aid.

"We know that evil exists in the world and there are evil people out there. We offer our prayers and resolve that we will fight these terrorists," Mayor Henry said. "These cowards who perpetrated this atrocity were evil and I hope our country takes the lead to bring them and people like them to an end."

Councilman Applegate was not in attendance for the meeting. The next city council meeting will be held on December 16th at 7:00 p.m.

The bill, an Assembly Committee Substitute for A-4444/S-20, which advanced through the Assembly Finance and Insurance Committee today, aims to promote transparency and advance consumer protection by requiring full disclosure of out-of-network health care charges.





Public Sector Unions Facing Supreme Court Threat With Resolve

When unions are under attack, I think of my 31 years as an elementary school teacher in Perth Amboy and my two sons - a firefighter in Perth Amboy and a Monmouth County corrections officer. Both my sons put their lives on the line every day and depend on union brothers and sisters (mostly brothers) to protect one another. During my career I depended on my union sisters and brother (more sisters than brothers since more women go into teaching) for guidance, camaraderie and—particularly when times became difficult for educators—support and protection.

This term the Supreme Court is considering Friedrichs v. California Teachers Association which could weaken unions and make it harder for working people to come together and negotiate for better wages, benefits and working conditions. States without such provisions lag behind stronger union states such as New Jersey in education attainment for students, health outcomes and higher in family and childhood poverty. Throughout the United States (and in other countries) objective measures show that when unions are weaker working people bring homes less, have fewer benefits and the balance of power shifts to the rich and privileged with disastrous public health and economic outcomes for the overall society.

During my career, the union functioned as a valuable tool for learning my craft as an educator, receiving professional development from my peers and subsequently mentoring new teachers. I learned to help new teachers channel their enthusiasm and excitement into developing great lesson plans, mastering the daily routine of reaching out to students as unique individuals and dealing with observations and evaluations.

Many factors influence success in teaching, but I have seen new teachers thrive when mentored through having the confidential support system unions promote. My union helped create a safe space to have frank discussions with my colleagues about what works for each student and how to best maximize their potential, in a much different way than high stakes testing and state-mandated evaluations can count.

Other than being recognized by former students for making a difference in their lives, one of my greatest joys is seeing the success of the volunteer literacy program I helped start for my students' parents. We stayed late to open the school so they would feel comfortable assisting their children a program particularly needed in Perth Amboy where a majority of our students are coming from homes where English is not the primary language. The idea came from my union colleagues in other states and our local now sponsors an annual literacy fair along with many voluntary professional development programs.

While my sons depend on their unions to make sure staffing levels are maintained and safety equipment is available, our union advocates for smaller class sizes, nurses in the schools and community services for families.

The union helps balance power when people were unfairly harassed and would have lost their jobs if not for due process protections and a strong union. I have seen good teachers who give back to the district and their students have their careers jeopardized because of heresy and false

accusations. Fortunately the union made sure they were kept in place and able to continue working with dignity and respect.

My local union does not coddle poor teachers or those with disciplinary problems that rated termination; instead counseling them out and taking responsibility for maintaining the integrity of our profession. In this way, we earned the respect of management so when we stand up for a teacher they knew we are serious.

Those of us who are public workers in the schools, the hospitals and the fire stations cannot influence the legal outcome of Friedrichs or any other well-funded legal attacks on unions. If unions lose rights to court decisions, members and the communities we serve will suffer. What we can and will continue to do is to be committed professionals and engage through our unions to improve the individual and collective impact on the lives we touch. That is the nature of our work and it becomes even more necessary the tougher times become.





By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk is the head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the world since March 25, 2011. He is directly under Pope Francis in charge of all the Ukrainian Catholic Churches worldwide. On Saturday, November 7, 2015 he was at the Holodomor Memorial Dedication in Washington DC. Holodomor translates to Death by Hunger. This memorial is to honor those who suffered during the Forced Famine initiated by Joseph Stalin. From 1932-1933 an estimated over 7 million Ukrainians died in the Holodomor.

While in the United States, His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk visited Assumption Catholic School on Wednesday, November 11, 2015.

According to Assumption Catholic School Principal Michael Szpyhulsky, "It is an immense honor to meet His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk."

Students from Assumption Catholic School greeted His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk with gifts of bread, salt and flowers. Bread represents the good in life and salt represents the bitterness in life. Students also gave a brief program which included one song and a recitation of a poem written by Maria Datscko.

Father Ivan Turyk said, "Two great leaders (Archbishop of Philadelphia Stefan Soroka and His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk) are here. The school and church are for everybody. Our doors are open to everyone who wants a good education. Children of

all races and colors make Assumption Catholic School a beautiful mosaic."

After a brief speech to the students His Beatitude answered questions from the students. His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk is fluent in English, Ukrainian and Spanish and answered questions in all three languages.

Q: When did you become a priest?

A: 23 years ago when I was 24 years old.

Q: How many Ukrainian Churches are there in the world?

A: There are 51 Bishops, 3000 priests in our churches but the number of churches I don't know.

Q: How could we as children of God become leaders?

A: You have to have that gift from God to be a leader. One has to be listen and kind to others or they won't follow you.

A student held up a photo of His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk holding a staff.

Q: What does the staff in your hand symbolize?

A: It's a symbol of the Pastor to lead his people and his service and authority.

Q: When you were young, what did you enjoy?

A: I love music.

Q: Where are you from? Where did you go to school?

A: I was born in Ukraine. I

was educated in the same town I grew up in. When I became a bishop I was assigned to Buenos Aries, Argentina. When I became a Patriarch I came back to Ukraine. I worked as a nurse in a hospital in Ukraine.

Rev. Ivan Turyk asked one question: Do you foresee Catholic Schools in Ukraine? A: Until last year (remnants of being under the Soviet Union) it was not allowed for a Catholic Church to have a School in Ukraine. Now there is a new law. In each metropolitan city in Ukraine we do have Catholic Schools starting up. I am overseeing a new school in Kyiv. In the prior Soviet Union controlled education.

Q: What's your favorite part of being a Bishop?

A: To meet all kinds of people. Fr. Ivan thanked everyone, "History will be made here."






