



Majority Rules in Voting

VotingThe framers of the US Constitution were in favor of majority rule in deciding elections, no matter what any person may claim. In most states all the Electoral College votes are given to the candidate with the most popular votes, even if this could be less than 50% of the total. The Electoral College was a compromise solution to satisfy the wishes of the small and large states. If no candidate received a majority, the House of Representatives would choose the President by majority vote.

Alexander Hamilton's argu-

ments in Federalist 68 seem like false advertising to appeal to one section of the people. There were two other writers of the Federalist Papers so it is unwise to concentrate on one article out of dozens. The US Constitution was adopted by a majority of the states as it solved the problems that existed with the Articles of Confederation. That quote from Hamilton is ludicrous: "the office of President will never fall to the lot of any man who is not in an eminent degree endowed with the requisite qualifications". Hamilton's morals later forced his resignation as Secretary of the Treasury.

The Electoral College system prevents fraudulent voting in one state from affecting national elections, even if it affects the popular vote. Allowing instant registration creates a loophole that could allow fraudulent voting. There have been plenty of cases of fraudulent voting in the past, usually by forging the totals. In one famous case a candidate was elected when fifty people voted in alphabetic order. They later found these people had died but were still on the voting rolls. It's not only in horror movies where the dead rise from their graves.

If anyone wants to learn more about the adoption of the US Constitution your Public Library may have a history book that documents the events.

NJ Transit Awards Funds for Train Station Construction



Press Release 12/15/16 PERTH AMBOY- Mayor Wilda Diaz is pleased to announce that NJ Transit has committed the necessary funding totaling nearly \$47 million to renovate and improve the Perth Amboy Station.

"Since 2008 I have been advocating for our station's upgrades, including ADA compliance. I am so thankful for the work of NJ Transit and for their dedication to our community. I know this will completely change our commuter experience and enhance our downtown area for greater economic development opportunities. Most importantly, this ensures the safety and best service to all residents and visitors," said Mayor Wilda Diaz.

In 2013, the NJ Transit Board's approval of \$2,051,128 for the completion of the final design and engineering services, which at this time has reached thirty percent completion. In 2014, \$9.6 million of funding was allocated for the Perth Amboy Train Station conceptual design and future construction.

Mayor Wilda Diaz, City and

NJ Transit officials recently met to discuss the progress of the project, which is currently at 30 percent design. The Environmental Assessment (EA) process has commenced and is expected to last between six to nine months. The DEP's Community Collaborative Initiative will be involved to help advance the Environmental Assessment process. A public meeting will be held thereafter. Conservatively, the station's design is expected to be completed by the end of 2018 and construction to begin early 2019.

"The Perth Amboy Station Accessibility Improvement Project is a priority project currently advancing through our design process. Funding for this project will be a combination of state and federal resources," said NJ TRANSIT Executive Director Steve Santoro. "Once the station improvements are completed, the more than 840 customers who use the station on a daily basis will benefit from improved accessibility."

The Perth Amboy Station Accessibility Improvements

Project will make the historic Perth Amboy Railroad Station more accessible for riders in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The project will include construction of two new side high-level platforms, in addition to four new elevators, and accompanying stairs and ramps to access the new high level platforms. Additional platform access will be provided at Smith Street. The plan also includes upgrading existing restrooms. The project also includes rehabilitation and repairs to the Eastbound Station and Westbound Station build-

Located on the North Jersey Coast Line, Perth Amboy Station serves approximately 1,700 trips on a typical weekday. The station has been listed in the National Register of Historic Places since 1984, and the station improvements will preserve the 1920s historical architecture design and features. There are also plans to see if the city's art gallery can be moved into the southbound building.

Waterfront Improvements Under Fire

12/12/16 Caucus

PERTH AMBOY - William Kurzenburger Program Coordinator, Office of Economic and Community Development talked about the Waterfront Improvement Project. "It involves work to be done on Sadowski Parkway and the beaches in that area. He introduced a representative from Helios Construction Inc. to explain more.

The Representative said, "There will be 5 separate improvements:

- 1.) Reconstruction of the Tennis Courts includes lights, paving, fencing, walkways and walls. All of the improvements mentioned will be ADA compliant and handicapped accessible.
- 2.) **Public Rest Rooms** This will be a part of a grant.
- 3.) Shower Stations, Water Fountains and Foot Washes 4.) Sailboat Storage Yard on Second Street and a Kayak Storage and Rental Racks.
- 5.) More Volleyball Nets

Councilman Joel Pabon had some concerns, "We need to talk to Kenny Ortiz, Director of the Department of Recreation. We also need to talk to representatives from the Boys and Girls Club that we may need the Brighton Street Building back."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez was concerned, "More information and diagrams are needed on this proposal."

The Representative stated, "Different locations will be looked at for the trailer which will house the rest rooms."

Councilman Bill Petrick said, "We also need the trailer to be more visually pleasing."

The trailer was described as being twelve feet wide and thirty feet long.

Councilman Pabon said, "It will be cheaper to build a permanent rest room."

During the public portion, Resident Stanley Sierakowski wondered, "Who is going to have a key to the building that houses the bathroom? I also agree with Councilman Fernando Irizarry, "Having showers on Sadowski Parkway is going to encourage swimming."

Towing the Line: It's a Bus(t)! 12/12/16 Caucus

PERTH AMBOY - An Auto Wrecker Ordinance and School Bus Parking were two topics that were discussed at length at the 12/12/16 Caucus.

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez was the one who requested that these be put on the agenda.

Gonzalez started out by stating, "We (the Council) just approved the towing list for this year (2016). I'm questioning this towing ordinance in the books now and the fees as described. I'm looking at other Municipalities that charge a flat fee. In Perth Amboy the towing fees are different depending on what type of truck is used to tow vehicles. My daughter's car was towed to South Amboy and all of her paperwork was in the car. I had to drive her there. The new Council should look at extending the towing list until we can discuss this further. We should have the towing companies come here and the community to give input or suggestions."

Councilman Bill Petrick stated, "We have discussed this issue several times and we need to put something into action. We should have approved the 2016 tower list much earlier in the year. Newark and Edison keeps their towing services in

town. We should do the same and I feel for our community."

"Maybe we can put a proposal together for the Council," Law Director Louis Rainone suggested.

Petrick commented further, "It should be within the City. We have multiple towers in town.

Councilman Joel Pabon stated, "I know many towers in town that have flatbed trucks. Why do we need so many towers? I don't know of any towns that use Perth Amboy towers. Let's give the money to our intown towers."

Rainone suggested, "Maybe the Police Department can give us more directions on

Councilman Fernando Irizarry who had stated before in previous meetings that the City should establish its own in-town towing yard. "So towers can tow vehicles to the City's pound. We can charge them for using the City's facility."

Council President Lisa Nanton said, "I thought it was illegal to make the towers use the City's Pound."

Gonzalez said, "There was something on the books and I like that idea, but we still need more suggestions and an open dialogue with the community and towers involved."

After that discussion ended, school bus parking was discussed once again.

Councilman Joel Pabon said "The ordinance was not clear at to what vehicles could park at the train station. We're not making that much money from them. We need to be more specific and see where these companies are coming from."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez suggested, "The Council should make a formal request that the City looks at the one acre property located at State and High Street."

Irizarry once again reiterated, "We can look at this property for impound or bus property."

Fernando Gonzalez suggested, "The administration should look at it and come back to us."

Irizarry suggested that a remediation be done on the one acre property first.

Acting Law Director Rainone commented, "You have City residents driving those buses who have no other place to park. You would rather have them fenced in a lot than have them parked back on the street."

Councilman Bill Petrick had

a suggestion, "Maybe the bus company owners can have their employees bussed to where their buses are parked.

Councilman Gonzalez said, "These buses are not from the Board of Education. The Board of Ed buses are privately parked. They are looking for land and recently bought property on the corner of New Brunswick Avenue and East Avenue for a possible garage."

Councilman Irizarry said, "I need information as to how the buses got to park at the train station in the first place."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz told the Council, "I will give you an update on the one acre property that you suggested for bus parking or an impound on State and High Streets."

Ordinance No. 4 - Regards to the powers and duties to the Director of Law.

Irizarry wanted to know who sponsored this ordinance.

Council President Nanton reminded Irizarry, "At the last meeting, you had questions of what the salary will be on this amended ordinance."

Irizarry shot back, "I didn't want this as an ordinance." He also asked who sponsored the Ordinance dissolving PARA and designating the City

Council as the Redevelopment Entity.

Rainone responded to this, "You need approval in advance from the local finance board. This amendment is not consistent with the form of government in the City." Rainone read an ordinance that supported his argument.

During the public portion, Resident Stanley Sierakowski made comments about the school bus parking and the towing of vehicles. He stated, "There is an empty lot that has been vacant for 10 years on Sayre Avenue. There are at least parking for 50 vehicles. You should use eminent domain. There is a big pile of contaminated soil on the property on High Street (that you are talking about using for bus parking or impound)."

Resident Renee Skeleton said, "The lot that Mr. Siera-kowski is talking about are used by hospital employees to park."

City Auditors, Waterfront Improvement & Other Concerns Questioned 12/14/16 Council Meeting

During the 12/12/16 Caucus meeting, Resident Kenneth Balut questioned the validity of using the same auditor for a long period of time. "Best Practices states you should change your auditor."

At that same Caucus Meeting, CFO Jill Goldy challenged Balut's statement. "This is not currently a part of Best Practices to change auditors and auditor services do not go out for bids. FEMA funds require separate audits."

At the 12/14/16 Regular Meeting, during public comments, Balut stood his ground and said, "The Best Practices was changed 4 years ago. It has to be done every year and it has to be check-marked. Rumor has it that Jersey City donated a large amount of money to the (Mayor's) campaign."

Balut also had comments to make about the old City Buildings on High Street. "Money has been given to that building that Kushner should clean up. Developers sell properties to the government who cleans it up and buys the property back. You keep getting the same auditor who just keeps doing the same thing over and over again."

Resident Jeremy Baratta questioned the City having the same auditor for a long period of time. "Sometimes things get overlooked." He questioned how much time these auditors were putting in for \$86,000.

Resident Sharon Hubberman came up to speak next, "I looked at the amounts that the City paid the auditors in the previous years and wondered why there is an increase. It's not a forensic audit. Look at the disclaimer. They are just matching the bank statements to what's in the bank. Some departments have remained the same except those that are in the upper level. No appropriations were made to see if actions were executed. It's good to have at least 3 years of audits on hand. It's a template to check for efficiencies."

Resident Alan Silber had questioned about the Waterfront Improvements and a statement about the City Auditors. "It doesn't make sense to have the same auditors and Mayor for a long time. This auditor gave away wine at a League of Municipalities Party. At a Council Meeting, he (the Auditor) argued about raising taxes and having to have skin in the game, which is not appropriate. The Council should look at getting another auditor." He also wanted to know, "Who is the owner of 386 High Street?"

Councilman Bill Petrick answered, "It's the City's."

Silber questioned, "Is the City selling that property?"

William Kurzenbuger came up to answer those questions,

"We are cleaning that property to sell it and it's located in the redevelopment area. DEP is covering the cost."

Kurzenburger went on to answer Silber's questions about the Waterfront Improvement. "This is a post-Sandy recovery grant. The bathroom facilities - we are looking to reduce the size of the trailer to 8 feet wide and 18 feet in length."

Business Administrator Cruz stated it will reduce the amount of stalls from 8 to 4."

This prompted Councilman Fernando Irizarry to say, "We were not looking to decrease the amount of stalls but just to make it esthetically inclined for the Waterfront."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez said, "How much input from the community in the area including the church there have been? You should have input from any community where perspective projects are involved."

Councilman Bill Petrick commented, "The trail that would hold the bathroom stalls should not be put on Sadowski Parkway."

Council President Lisa Nanton suggested to put the trailer in Caledonia Park.

Resident Kenneth Balut was concerned that when the Council made the suggested changes on the Waterfront Improvement Plans, did you change the bid? Maybe those companies that lost out on the Waterfront Improvement bid should be allowed to rebid."

Councilman Petrick said, "Grants were used for the removal of oil tanks from the old City buildings on High Street. Gonzalez was concerned, "This property was sitting there for 8 years without us getting any taxes from it. I want the contract status of these City owned properties on High Street."

We Will Not Be Threatened 12/14/16 Council Meeting

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez was very upset as he read part of a letter drafted by Mayor Diaz to the local Finance Board and copied to the Attorney General. In this letter, it

accused Council President Nanton of committing fraud. Gonzalez firmly stated, "The Council will not be threatened."

Acting Law Director Rainone cautioned the Council that they cannot take action on this ordinance before they get the approval for the local finance board.

Councilman Bill Petrick made a motion to postpone the ordinance. It was seconded by Councilman Joel Pabon. Motion passed.

Cathy's Kids Redefines Christmas

PERTH AMBOY - In 2009, Eladio Ruiz 3rd, a lifelong resident of Perth Amboy, was on his way to work and stopped at Sipos Bakery to buy cupcakes when he passed a mom walking her four children to school. They all looked so happy that it was almost easy to overlook the one thing that would start a movement. Although all the children were wearing coats, none of them fit properly. It really bothered him, not only that the children needed the coats, but also that he never noticed there was this need in his own hometown. That day he spoke with his good friend Chris Rezes and he shared the story of what he had seen earlier. She then shared her mom's story, which would be the birth of a group called Cathy's Kids named after her mom.

The Bolanos family was your typical middle class family from Perth Amboy. Augustine a blue collar worker, and Cathy a housewife whose job was to care for their two children and manage the household including the finances. One of the things that made Cathy so special was that she opened up a Christmas Club every year, and whenever possible she would put away a little money. At the end of the year she would withdraw the money for "the kids," but the money was not for her kids. She would go to the A. V. Ceres School and ask the principal to identify children that needed coats and she would buy them new coats, hats, scarves and gloves. The number of recipients varied from year to year, some years she would buy more than 10. She never wanted to be acknowledged, so she did it anonymously.

Eladio was so moved by Mrs. Bolanos's generosity that the following year he emailed family and friends, sharing Cathy's story and letting them know that he was going to donate coats to the Perth Amboy elementary schools and wondered if they would also donate a coat. That year 107 people volunteered to donated new coats and accessories. He reached out to all the Pre-k and elementary public schools and they identified students. The schools supplied only the gender and size keeping the children anonymous.

Although the group is not an organized charity, every year the number of donors continues to grow. This year they already have 846 donors. Eladio believes the secret to the groups success is that the donors are actually paired up with a child and since they are buying the coats and accessories, they know all the money spent is going directly to what many refer to as "my kid". The group has grown so large that Eladio has many family and friends that now assist organizing. He points out Perth Amboy natives Gabriella "Gabby" Cuzzola, the daughter of Kelly Cuzzola, a friend of Chris's since kindergarden. Gabby is responsible this year for soliciting over half the donations. The group now delivers coats to children from Pre-K up to high school primarily in Perth Amboy but also in Woodbridge, Newark and Jersey City. This year a Cathy's Kids chapter was started in Lambertville, NJ.

In six years, this Perth Amboy grassroots group has donated over 2850 coats and continues to grow. Eladio proudly admits that what he thought would be a Christmas project has grown larger than he imagined. "We are spreading an epidemic of helping thy neighbor one coat at a time. Cathy's Kids has redefined Christmas to me. Christmas is no longer December 25, it is the day we deliver coats, knowing we are making a difference. A difference that started many years ago by a very humble woman who now looks down upon us and makes sure we are successful."

Rising Receivables Call for A Year-End Review

Rising business receivables can be a sign of a growing, prosperous company - or of troubles ahead. How can you know if your receivables are right-sized for your business?

Start by breaking down the numbers. A report of your receivables listed by age will give you the information you need. Track the percentage of invoices paid late and compare the information to that of past years. Benchmark your statistics with those of your industry peers and look at the amount of unapplied or unreconciled customer payments.

Do you notice an issue with too many receivables? A receivables problem can be symptomatic of a defective accounting system. Are customer payments posted to the proper accounts accurately and timely? A delay in updating your records will make receivables collection less efficient. Are late notices sent to customers quickly and regularly? Is staff following up on outstanding bills? Perhaps your collections team needs training to beef up skills.

Your sales procedures can also cause problems. For example, extending credit to a borderline customer is a temptation that can result in painful losses. Create a consistent credit application process for your business. Make sure credit limits conform to company policies and that they are strictly enforced. Check bank and vendor references where appropriate.

What can you do before year end to address past due customer invoices? Here are three tips:

- 1. Double down on your collection efforts. Take advantage of the fact that your customers are likely flush with cash from seasonal sales.

 2. Pay collection-related costs before year end. This ordinary business expense can give you an additional tax deduction this year.
- 3. If your business is on the accrual basis, consider writing off old invoices that you deem uncollectible. Bad debt expense can lower your taxable income.

Moana "to get my magic hooks back we've got to go through a whole ocean of bad" - Maui

"Moana" is the latest Disney animated film to tell the tale of a young princess who sets out on a quest to save her people. The movie is beautiful and fun. Moana (Auli'i Cravalho) is a young girl whose grandmother (Rachel House) tells her that a special person must journey across the ocean to find a demigod who stole the heart of the sea. Moana must convince him to bring it back before an oncoming darkness destroys their world.


Forget your traditional princess with the long blonde hair, flowing dress and a castle - Moana doesn't need them. She has powers of her own, and thru her connection to the ocean, so she can handle anything that the ocean throws at her.

The story is a bit slow to get going, but when she does eventually meet Maui (Dwayne "the Rock" Johnson), the story really picks up pace.

There's plenty of great Disney music throughout, especially Maui's song "You're welcome."

The big reason to see "Moana" is the fantastic animation. Massive oceans, huge storms full of dangerous lightning, the beauty of the Pacific islands are all beautifully rendered. The colors are alive and it makes for very vivid imagery. The characters are memorable and the voice acting is excellent. Moana makes a great princess, and the Rock brings the demigod, Maui to life. My only complaint is that it hits all the notes you expect from a Disney animated film.

Recent films like "Wreck-it Ralph" and "Zootopia" felt completely fresh and original whereas Moana is your typical princess on a quest film. It's well done with excellent characters, but it feels like we've traveled this road before. Little kids will love it, as will fans of great animated films, despite the fact that we've seen this story before.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On December 19, 1941, Adolf Hitler — blaming his generals for the lack of success in the U.S.S.R. — names himself Supreme Commander-in-Chief of the German Armed Forces (Wehrmacht). The U.S. Naval Academy graduates its "Class of 1942" a semester early so it can induct the graduates as Navy or Marine Corps officers without delay for immediate war assignments. The British light cruiser HMS Neptune enters a newly laid Italian minefield off Tripoli, Libya, hits four mines and quickly capsizes. Only one sailor of the vessel's complement of 768 survives. Italian "human torpedoes" damage two British battleships — HMS Queen Elizabeth and HMS Valiant — and an oil tanker in the harbor of Alexandria, Egypt.

Japanese forces attack Dutch Borneo, the Celebes and the Moluccas in the Dutch East Indies on December 20. They also capture Davao, Mindanao Island, in the southern Philippines. On Hong Kong Island, counterattacks against the Japanese by the British and Canadian defenders fail with heavy casualties. The 1st American Volunteer Group of the Chinese Air Force ("The Flying Tigers," comprising volunteer pilots from the U.S. Army, Navy and Marine Corps) flies its first combat sorties over Kunming, China. The unit is commanded by Claire Chennault, a retired U.S. Army Air Corps captain. In Germany, Joseph Goebbels, Reich Minister for Propaganda, appeals for winter coats and warm clothing for soldiers on the Eastern Front. The General Petroleum Corporation tanker SS Emidio is torpedoed and damaged off Cape Mendocino, northern California, by Japanese submarine I-17. Five crewmen are killed. Charles Lindbergh writes to Lt. Gen. Henry Arnold, Commandant of the U.S. Army Air Forces, offering to serve in the military.

In Bangkok, Japan and Thailand agree to a ten-year military alliance on December 21. In the besieged city of Leningrad, Russia, it is estimated that 3,000 citizens per day are dying of starvation or disease.

On December 22, the Arcadia Conference opens in Washington, D.C. President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill and their top military aides discuss strategy and make decisions that will guide the Allied war effort in 1942 and 1943 in Europe, Africa and in the Pacific. In the Philippines, the Japanese 48th Division lands at Lingayen Gulf, northern Luzon. Allied troops reach Beda Fomm, Libya, roughly halfway between Benghazi and Al Agheila, but are turned back by German tanks. Axis forces begin evacuating Benghazi by sea.

A second Japanese landing attempt at Wake Island succeeds on December 23, and the garrison of 450 U.S. Marines is overwhelmed and surrenders after a night and morning of fighting. In the Philippines, Gen. Douglas MacArthur declares Manila an open city, thereby stating that all defensive efforts to protect the locality have been abandoned. Despite the declaration, the Japanese bomb and shell the Filipino capital anyway. MacArthur orders U.S. forces on Luzon to withdraw to the Bataan Peninsula as Japanese troops approach Manila from the north. Two Japanese landings south of Manila prevent MacArthur from moving that way.

Elements of the British Eighth Army capture Benghazi, Libya, on December 24. In the Philippines, American and Filipino troops move into the Bataan Peninsula. The Japanese bomb Rangoon, Burma. Dutch submarine *HMNLS K XVI* is the first Allied vessel to destroy a Japanese warship, torpedoing and sinking the destroyer *Sagiri* near Sarawak, Borneo. (The next day, the Dutch sub is itself torpedoed and sunk with a loss of all hands by Japanese submarine *I-66*.) The Nazis order authorities in all the Jewish ghettoes of occupied Europe to collect fur coats and other fur items from Jewish residents. The German occupation administration of the Baltic States declares that Romani (gypsies) are to be treated the same as Jews.

The Battle of Hong Kong ends on December 25, after 17 days; the British Crown Colony is surrendered to the Japanese by the defeated British and Canadian garrison. 11,000 troops are taken captive. Japanese soldiers in the city kill two doctors and seven nurses treating wounded soldiers at St. Stephen's Emergency Hospital, then murder the 50 wounded. Admiral Émile Musilier, commander of Free French naval forces, seizes the archipelago of St. Pierre and Miquelon, a French Overseas Department in the Atlantic Ocean near Newfoundland, Canada. The islands are the first part of France to be liberated by Free French forces. In the Philippines, the Japanese 48th Division begins moving southward on Luzon, driving U.S. forces ahead of it. In Bangkok, Thailand declares war on the United States and the United Kingdom.
