Property Tax Evaluations & Transparency Still a Concern

PERTH AMBOY - "When the Business Administrator Greg Fehrenbach was appointed he should have told everyone to appeal their taxes," said Local Resident Alan Silber. "How did the City Council not know that there was going to be reevaluation of the Spa Springs area? Six neighborhoods had their property reevaluated and I wonder how much did it cost? I believe that the reevaluation probably was done on a computer. The Business Administrator said it wasn't wise to appeal taxes."

Councilman Bill Petrick said that the homes in the Spa Springs area are consistent in size and lot. Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez said,

"To do a reevaluation would cost 1.5 million dollars which would be a detriment to the City." This prompted Council Pres. Kenneth Balut to say that he would be fine to do a reassessment of property taxes which would be a lesser cost to the City.

B.A. Greg Fehrenbach stated there was abuse by the prior administration in the 2005 reevaluation. "The loss of State Aid is not as bad as the loss of revenue through tax appeals. The City received 3.5 million dollars in extraordinary transitional aid in 2010. We put in checks and balances that were not put in place previously."

Local Resident and Businessman David Caba was

Taxes per Household Are Discussed at South Amboy Council Meeting

SOUTH AMBOY - The money that is being taken from South Amboy residents by the city was discussed by a number of meeting goers on December 21st.

Vince Mackiel, of Augusta Street, questioned a recently approved resolution that gave tax money back to South Amboy residents. The document stated that \$43,589 was due to homeowners by December 13th, but Mackiel wanted to know when to expect that money and how much is being given back.

"At the last meeting the council approved a resolution for a tax appeal that was supposed to be paid on the 13th of this month," Mackiel explained to the council. "In two parts it says tax appeals was to be paid for \$3,363 but then in another part it said \$43,589. All I want to know is how much was paid for these tax appeals."

After a discussion with council president Joseph Connors, Mayor Fred Henry, and Business Administrator Camille Tooker, it was decided that the numbers on the document were a misprint.

"It's a misprint because some numbers weren't carried over, and what should have been brought down was a refund of \$3,363 to the residents," Connors said. "It's just a mistake in the paperwork that will be looked into and fixed, but it will be sent out."

George Flugrad, a 23 year old resident from Augusta Street, was worried about the long term stability of the town and how much spending the town is doing. He was primarily concerned with unpaid sick time compared to other towns in the state.

"South Amboy owes \$1.3 million for unpaid sick leaves for our town workers,

which averages out to \$412 per household compared to South River's average of \$45 per household," Flugrad said. "We don't have a tax problem in South Amboy, we have a spending problem, and if I'm going to be here a long time I would hope there's a certain plan for the future."

Business Administrator Tooker appreciated Flugrad's comments, but was concerned on where he got his numbers. She noted that the town actually was one of the only towns to manage sick time extremely well.

"Whatever we have on the books for sick time, the people that retire don't get that money. We are one of the few places that have capped sick time to where the governor wanted it at \$15,000," Tooker said. "We have gone to many lengths to make budget cuts and make changes, but the number you're taking from the budget isn't exactly what's going out to our residents."

Flugrad went on to emphasize that the city was on the hook for \$1.3 million, and that not much can be done for the employees that have been in town for 15-20 years. However, he wanted to see something to be done for the future residents of South Amboy.

"I'll be in South Amboy for a long time, and I know you will too, so I'm going to keep an eye on the budget and see if there is any changes," Flugrad said.

Other concerns about the city were toward cross walks near the train station, which was brought up by resident Tom Kross. Kross had mentioned the intersection between 1st and Augusta at a previous meeting, but raised concern about the safety of commuters in the area.

"People are being forced to J-walk from the train station to the other side, and it's only a matter of time before someone gets nailed over there," Kross said. "Is there any way we can change it or put something in?"

Tooker agreed that the area could be unsafe, but noted that the planning board wanted a cross walk or cross over when the designs were first put in. However, the intersection was not capable of having such things.

"When the project was first designed, they said there was no corner to put an overpass, so we weren't allowed to do it," Tooker said. "We will

know about the existing Olive Street location.

Note: When the Madison Avenue location closed down there was a notice put on the door that they were moving to the Alexander Jankowski Center on Olive St.

Joel Pabon said that perhaps flyers can be distributed to different locations advising residents of this move. Fernando Gonzalez said that he paid a visit to the Perth Amboy location. “In the 2 hours I was there not one person walked in from the public to ask for assistance.”

B.A. Greg Fehrenbach said, “Let’s make sure social services will be at Olive Street long term before we start advertising that location. Because of reduced funding and staff, social services is trying to do more with less. This is why they have gone to an automated telephone and internet services.”

The personnel at Olive St. can also advise potential clients with documents they need for prescreening and can also provide them with vouchers for transportation to the New Brunswick Office.

Fernando Gonzalez was also concerned about the general population of Perth Amboy not being very versed when it comes to using computers and looking for information when it comes to social services assistance. There also is a lack of a bilingual clerical staff.

The building of the office that where Social Services were previously located on Market St. & Madison Ave. had horrendous conditions. Originally that building was converted from three town houses to offices. At the time that the Social Services were moving out of that location the conditions were so horrendous with rotting wood, mold problems and you could see the basement through holes in the floor.

Because of that problem some records were lost and the landlord had no intention of making repairs to the Madison Ave. location. ETC recently bought the old Madison Ave. location in the latter part of 2011.

The sign on the building says they will be leasing the building for stores and office space.

NJ Transit Academy Busline 815 can be taken to New Brunswick and then there is a shuttle bus that goes to the Board of Social Services on How Lane.

PERTH AMBOY - “To Cast a Freedman’s Vote”: How a Handyman from Perth Amboy Made Civil Rights History. On March 31, 1870, Perth Amboy resident Thomas Mundy Peterson dropped a ballot into a box. It was a simple action that took, perhaps, all of a second or two. Yet, in that moment, Peterson made history as the first African American to vote under the 15th Amendment to the United States Constitution.

Many factors had conspired to make that moment possible, from the bloody Civil War to surprisingly progressive local attitudes. “To Cast a Freedman’s Vote”: How a Handyman from Perth Amboy Made Civil Rights History is a new presentation by historian, author and lecturer Gordon Bond. It explores who this man was, how he came to cast his historic vote and what happened afterward. This talk summarizes the work done by himself and other NJ historians to tell Peterson’s story. It is a study in race relations that resonates with us even today. Gordon Bond is the ePublisher of Garden State Legacy, a free online quarterly magazine dedicated to New Jersey history. Its website, www.GardenStateLegacy.com, includes many free resources for the history and historic preservation communities. He is also the author of the book, “James Parker: A Printer on the Eve of Revolution” and is working with The History Press

on a book tentatively titled, “North Jersey Footnotes: Tangential Tales and Hidden History,” due out in the Spring of 2012. He is a proud native of the Garden State and presently lives with his wife, Stephanie Hoagland, and their two cats, Daisy and Onslow, in Union Township.

Students are distracted. I teach 2 or 3-timers, who have a lot of distractions and it is hard to fight this. I’ve taught troubled youth from Elizabeth, Newark and Plainfield and they were able to pass a test I gave at a prep school. Their lives are so filled with distractions that its very hard for them to function. I think I saved a few.	We have to develop the strong parts of the low performing schools and identify the opportunities in specific areas and create an action plan. Then, I would support the BOE vision and respectfully challenge it to improve it
			We have to put resources into the learning program; for ex., Quantum Learning. Also, parental outreach is crucial to student success. In the mid-high or high school years, it drops off. We have to make sure the parents know how much power they have in their child’s student career.

In Plain Sight

January has rolled around and with the new year one often makes resolutions - #1 on the list - lose weight. I've been a member of the YMCA since it opened . Growing up in Perth Amboy in the '70's and '80's I learned to swim in the Metuchen YMCA because the Perth Amboy YMCA was old and the pool there was old as well and the facilities needed an overhaul. My parents thought the Metuchen YMCA was nicer back then. Then in the late '90's the Perth Amboy YMCA burned down and what little facilities that Perth Amboy had was gone and Perth Amboy had nothing for years. I was thrilled when the new YMCA was built and finally opened on December 1, 2008. I was even more thrilled when the pools opened one year later.

What is disappointing to me is the amount of people that tell me that they have never even set foot in the building and worse they never even thought about it. The "Y" offers 2 pools (one recreation - one competition), two cardio fitness rooms, an exercise room, weight lifting facility, Basketball Courts, Spinning Rooms and an Indoor Track and much more. For a minimal cost anyone can join (resident or non-resident). The "Y" has something for everyone ages 2 to 102. Presently the "Y" has over 7000 members, 1400 of which are under age 17.

I love to swim, so my favorite part of the "Y" are the pools. (I use the Competition pool). The Competition pool

is huge (12 lanes). The Competition Pool is utilized by the Perth Amboy High School Swim Team and the St. Joseph's High School Swim Team and other swim teams as well. They have swim meets there sometimes with over 1000 people at the "Y" at once. The smaller recreation pool is only 4 feet deep so even if you can't swim you can enjoy the facility. The "Y" offers classes for those of you who can't swim (adults and kids) or for those of you a little more advanced there's the Master's Swim Class . People come from as far as Somerset, Middletown and Red Bank just to use the Perth Amboy YMCA pool.

Say you have no interest in swimming? The "Y" offers classes in aerobics, body-flow, kickboxing, zumba, water aerobics - even belly dancing. You can even have your own personal trainer if you want (for an additional cost). There's also a playground for the kids. If you just like to walk there is an indoor track for those rainy days.

Some of these programs cost a little extra (many are free to members) but they are worth it if you are interested. So if you are committed to keeping that #1 New Year's resolution (lose weight- remember) or you just want to get into or stay in shape, if you haven't already check out your own backyard and enjoy what Perth Amboy has to offer. It's a beautiful facility. Enjoy it.

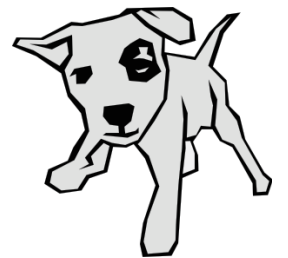

The Benefits of Taking the Train

PERTH AMBOY - You can take the train, which runs on the NJ Coastal Line, all the way down to Bay Head, NJ. It stops at various beach towns: Belmar, Point Pleasant and Long Branch, to name a few.

That means that in the warmer months, you can go to the Jersey shore and avoid all of the Garden State Parkway traffic, tolls and parking lot fees once you arrive there! The train travels North all the way to Penn Station, 34th Street in Manhattan. Some people do not believe when I tell them that it goes all the way to NYC! It also stops at Newark Liberty Airport , so if you can get by with a carry on bag or two, you can again avoid paying anything at all to park at the airport while you fly. The train can also bring you to downtown Newark, NJ, very close to the Prudential Center – The Rock – for all kinds of sports events and concerts and also the New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC) which is either a brief walk or subway ride away. You can take the train to the Secaucus stop and go to Giants Stadium from there. Finally, there is even one train a day that takes you right into Hoboken – no changing in Newark Penn needed.

What about cost? If you are over 62 years of age, you pay half price, which means that a roundtrip ticket to New York Penn Station is just \$11.50 for you. Yes, round trip to NYC and back for less than \$12.00! Disabled persons travel also at half price and guess what – with proper ID, the aides or assistants of disabled persons ride for free! Children four years old and under ride for free. Children 5 to 11 ride for half price. During holidays, from 7 pm the evening of the Friday before the holiday up until 6 am the Monday after a holiday, two children aged

5-11 can ride at no charge accompanied by one adult. A few conductors have told me there is no charge for uniformed military or public safety staff but I could not verify this. Monthly rail passes, with unlimited number of rides allowed during the month, are available at a rate less than buying individual tickets. These rail passes are transferable to the bus and light rail systems, all included. Finally, if you use the train to commute, there is a commuter tax benefit available for your employer – up to \$230 per month pre-tax can be utilized for your rail pass. See the details at njtransit/taxbenefits.com.

And parking? Parking is free on Sundays and after 6 pm Monday thru Saturday. If you are a resident of Perth Amboy and also use the train to commute to your job, you can obtain a sticker for your vehicle that allows you to park at no cost at the lot at the station. Call the Parking Utility to apply: 732-826-9223. Otherwise, parking is 25 cents per hour and the machines take quarters or one dollar bills only – they do not take credit cards at this time, which is very frequently needed by travelers. There is plenty of parking available.

In the past month, the loudspeakers have been fixed so announcements are audible, plus there is now a speaker in the main lobby and also inside the coffee café. The cafe also has plenty of train and bus schedules plus a map of the entire rail system in NJ, which comes in handy for many making long or multi-line trips. The list goes on, but these are some of the main benefits of utilizing our train station. After the interviews, Mr. Carvajal asked if the candidates' qualifications could be discussed publicly. He was told by the Board Attorney that all four candidates would have had to have been asked if this was acceptable and if all four had said yes in writing, then that could have occurred. The President stated that in the past candidates did not like this, so these candidates weren't asked. Ms. Roman said we can't assume based on experiences of the past. Mr. Carvajal added he had understood the candidates would be asked in advance from a discussion with Mr. Lebreault and Mr. Leabreault replied that Mr. Carvajal had 'dropped it' to which Mr. Carvajal repeated his comment; he has understood the candidates would be asked in advance.

The candidates were called up to stand before Attorney Machado. Apparently, permission to discuss the candidates was not given by all four, although nothing was announced to this effect. A ten-minute break was called so that the Board could go into closed session for discussion. Mr. Carvajal asked if anyone who already knew how they would like to vote needed to go into the closed session? He was told no by Mr. Lebreault, so various members did not enter

the closed session. The others stayed in the auditorium, chatting amongst themselves. As soon as the members returned and the public session resumed, Ms. Obi Gonzalez nominated Janelle Rodriguez. With five votes "yes", Ms. Rodriguez won the seat.

Various board members wanted to make comments at this point, "It's difficult to appoint someone with so many issues and criticisms abounding although we are all on the same page," said Obi Gonzalez. "I would vote for Nina, who put her money where her mouth is and actually ran for a seat and barely lost," said Ken Puccio. (By 18 votes! Someone called from the audience). Kurt Rebovich stated that all candidates had wonderful resumes but he felt tonight's decision "...is a disgrace as Ms. Nieves was fourth runner up (next in line) the last time there was a school board election", and added he felt that "No one up for re-election on this current board should be voted for" by the public.

Ms. Rodriguez was sworn in and took her seat at the board table. The public comment period followed and Rev. Milton Lester, President of the Perth Amboy Chapter of the NAACP, stated that he was offended. "Ms. Nieves had lost by so few votes last time; she

is the one who the people have voted for. The people have expressed their voice." He added, "This was a stacked deck. You all knew who would be in before you even got here tonight. I don't come to Board meetings because you don't represent the people. It eats my guts!" Comments by Rick Aviles: "There are no African American or Latino or Caucasian seats here – all of you work for all of us. You need to respect the President and not fight and act like you all just met each other yesterday!" Alan Silber said he was amazed at partial private and partial public sessions all occurring in one meeting: "You decided to discuss the candidates in private, yet some of you were doing it in public, while others went into private. Then, you did end up commenting on them at length in public!"

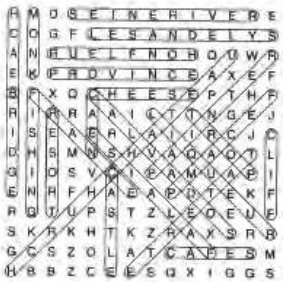
