6/12/17 Caucus Meeting



Council President William Petrick

PERTH AMBOY - Councilman Fernando Gonzalez questioned RFP's (Request For Proposals). He wanted to know, "Are we looking for ways to spend our money? The City Engineer is supposed to be the planner, yet we are looking to hire a planner. I'm looking at some of the resumes of these candidates. They have good plans and ideas and we're looking at a salary of \$90,000 to hire them. In previous years, the City Engineer was listed as the Planner for RFP's."

After Gonzlaez made this statement, City Engineer Jeffrey Rauch came up to speak. He stated,"In previous years, Ernest Feist, who was the previous Engineer was the Planner. He had the credentials. I'm an Engineer."

Gonzalez came back and stated, "In the past, the RFP's said that you (Rauch) are 1 of 4 planners. I'm putting this before you guys to review."

Councilman Joel Pabon spoke next, "I was hoping the Business Administrator would be here. Whether the amount is \$95,000, \$10,000 or whatever - How did this end up happening (Getting a Planner at a cost of \$90,000)."

Gonzalez then added, "We don't always have to get the lowest bidder. It has to do what in includes. One of the Planners listed as Topology had been here in the past and look

where we are. Why bring them back?"

Council President Bill Petrick then suggested that they bring back Feist to answer questions because he is familiar with the town.

Rauch answered, "He's (Feist) back and he can appear before the Council."

The Council had a question regarding R-234-6/17 - Authorizing a contract with RJ Twitchell & Company, Inc. for extensive repairs to the Transfer Station Push Pit in an amount not to exceed \$45,505.17.

DPW Director Frank Hoffman came up to answer this, "We needed to raise the bidding price. 4 bids went out and Twitchell is the only one who responded and he's worked with us before. We will have to bid for hydraulics, too."

The next topic for discussion was an IT update.

Council President Bill Petrick had questions about email monitoring. City IT Technician John Alleman came up and stated, "I was asked about one specific suspicious e-mail. It was research in response to an OPRA request. I do not question what my superior asks of me."

Councilman Gonzalez wanted to know, "Who has the jurisdiction to ask you to look up an e-mail?"

Alleman responded, "The

Administration." He also reminded the Council that they signed a policy stating that emails could be OPRA'd under certain circumstances."

Councilman Joel Pabon questioned Alleman, "How are you protected if a request comes in verbally if there's no paperwork to back up a request."

Alleman responded, "IT's have access to many government databases."

Councilman Gonzalez said, "I want to see the document that Alleman referenced that the Council Members have to sign stating that our e-mails can be looked at."

Council President Petrick stated, "A simple OPRA request can blossom into something bigger. I'm concerned unethical practices. There are ethical challenges when I've talked to other IT people. Maybe we need an outside auditor. I've talked to Woodbridge about their IT operations. Woodbridge has shared services with us. We just need an assessment of our IT services."

Alleman answered, "I don't have a problem with this, but we should have an outside auditor with no connection to the City. I've given you (the Council) information about updated services."

Verizon Looking to Install **Equipment on Stevens Avenue** Node Would Improve Cellular

Signal Within Small Distance

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - A Verizon representative presented a plan to install a small cellular 'node' near Stevens Avenue during last week's South Amboy business meeting.

The node is a two-and-a-half foot antenna with a small radio box that would be installed on a pre-existing utility pole near the Cardinal McCarrick High School building. It works in conjunction with Verizon's wireless network to cover a small dead spot found in the

According to the representative, the box will provide more

reliable service and better upload and download speeds for wireless networks within an 1800 feet radius of the pole. Verizon installs these boxes where it is deemed necessary but it is not meant to provide significant coverage to a large area.

These boxes have been proposed to several municipalities in New Jersey and, per the representative, Verizon has received roughly 180 approvals to install. Verizon is only requesting to install one node in the city of South Amboy for now and would have to come

Dioris Louis Arlequin "The Poet"

Another contributor to the Amboy Guardian has left us too soon. He now joins Peter Book a.k.a. Pedro Libro, and Thomas Francis Clark who were prolific letter-writers or submitted poetry.

Dioris was a classmate and friend of Stanley Jaremczak a.k.a. the Garden Guru who passed away a short time ago. Dioris immortalized Stanley in the poem titled: "Garden Guru."

In the letter section of the paper, Attorney Eralides E. Cabrera talked about how Louis captured the essence of well-known characters of Perth Amboy and gave them the recognition that they deserved. Some of Dioris' poems appeared in some of Cabrera's books.

We wish to add that Dioris was very astute in capturing the beauty that is nature, be it land, sea or sky. He would take a butterfly or other insects and the way he would describe them would be as if they were humans. He also loved to write poetry about family and friends. He was proud to write a poem about his daughter titled, "The Runner."

It was not unusual for the Amboy Guardian to receive mail 2 or 3 times a week with poems written by Dioris. This was much appreciated because they dealt with such a vast variety of

subjects that could be placed in the Voice of the People. Sometimes I would ask him to write a poem on a particular subject and he would always come through.

We will be showcasing his poems until the end of the year.

You wrote about people that you often saw, but the person who was the most special was the person you were.

It is sad to report the loss of a friend who was so devoted to Perth Amboy. Dioris Louis Arlequin, "the poet," as he liked to be called, passed away at Raritan Bay Health Center last week. Louis was proud of his naval service and loved Perth Amboy. Much of his poetry had to do with real characters who lived in Perth Amboy and that if linked in a chain would tell a story about this city, the city Louis and I came to know

as kids. We were boys once who walked the streets daily and saw those personalities Louis talked about in print. I am going to miss my friend a lot.

Political and Shameful Cesspool

I am a twice combat wounded Marine Corps (that's pronounced "core" Mr. Obama) Veteran of the Vietnam War. My second wound was nearly fatal from mortar fragments shattering my left shoulder blade and crushing three ribs. The hole blasted was large enough to put a football into my chest. I will carry that massive scar and the mortar fragments in my chest to my grave.

During the infamous Tet Offensive of 1968, I was a 19 year old Marine Pfc. (Private First Class) one of 2,500 Marines sent to liberate the ancient Imperial City of Hue, held by 11,000 North Vietnamese trained, disciplined, combat hardened troops, plus an unknown number of Vietcong. Of the 27 Marines in my platoon, 11 were killed and the rest of us suffered 2, 3, and 4 wounds. I lasted 9 days be-

fore I was air lifted.

On day 12, Valentine's Day, there was not even one of my platoon left. Not a one!! All gone. All gave some, some gave all.

On February 6, 1968, Frank Thomas, Alan McDonald, and I struck the enemies flag flying in the courtyard of the Provincial Capital Building which was the headquarters for all the NVA (North Vietnamese Army) in Hue. The enemy fire was intense from soldiers dug in around the courtyard wall. We raised the stars and stripes! This action made the front page of every newspaper in the free world. It can be viewed in at least 6 different documentaries.

I have been honored to have been elected State Commander of the Disabled American Veterans 1993-1994, State Commander of the Military Order of the Purple Heart 1995-1996,2014, 2015, 2016, and am now the National Executive Committee of the Military Order of the Purple Heart. I love my country and have spent my life serving other

veterans.

I was not only appalled but sickened to read how Congressmen Frank Pallone, Democratic candidate for Governor Phil Murphy, and Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda Diaz disgracefully use Memorial Day weekend to verbally attack our President and turn it into a campaign event. Absolutely despicable!!!

At a meeting sponsored by DAV Chapter 29 of Tinton Falls, held at a nursing home billed as a day to meet your Congressman. I asked about Andrew Tamarossi, a Marine Sergeant who made a wrong turn and accidently crossed the border into Mexico. He was physically beaten, chained to a wall, and held in inhumane conditions. President Obama, Secretary of State Kerry and Congress did nothing! Congressman Pallone didn't even know who Tamarossi was. His Aide, a Marine veteran died.

Next was Code Enforcement Update. Director Jamie Rios came forward. He let the Council know that at the address at Colfax Place, "There's no indication that there was a business there or illegal housing."

Fire Chief Abraham Pitre gave the breakdown, "\$150,000 of that money would be for equipment and \$250,000 would be for training for the firefighters for scuba diving."

No one came up to speak during the public comments portion of the Meeting.

PERTH AMBOY - During the Public Comments, Resident Stanley Sierakowski had a question about Communication No. 9 dealing with services being provided by Berkley Insurance that Council President Bill Petrick had asked B.A. Cruz that the Council be provided with copies of 5 other proposals submitted.

Sierakowski was puzzled and asked if the Attorney reviews contracts before they are presented to the Council. "Was Fairview an RFP? I don't understand the same amount of proposals from 5 different contractors. Sierakowski also questioned R-243 extending the

contract of Peter King for an additional 90 days. "Is this the final 90 days? Or will it be perpetual? Is the Attorney encouraging the Administration to look for permanent attorney?"

Acting Law Director Peter King responded, "I was not requested to review contracts." Sierakowski responded, "I find that incredible."

King continued, "I had no involvement with Fairview. I've review some of the contracts, but not all of them."

King responded, "I haven't

been asked to review contracts."

From Middle School to Mars: Students Win National **Competition to Design Spacecraft to Take Astronauts** to The Red Planet

Students Win Opportunity to Pitch Their Ideas to Panel of Space Experts. - All Part of New Lockheed Martin Initiative to Prepare Students for Space-related Careers

BETHESDA, Md. – With NASA planning to send the first crew to Mars in the 2030s, today's students will grow up to create the spacecraft and science to get them there. the name of Justin M. Spivey who believes that it will be in the best interest to restore the gateway. It is of historic and sentimental value."

Aviles went on to state, "This was a WPA Project which put local people back to work. This wall has lasted 80 years and it might last another 80. This Historic Architect (Spivey) was hired by the Board and Superintendent. The Board of Education Secretary, Derek Jess will reject all bids of this \$800,000 project. The ball is now in the City's court. Who will pay after the estimate for the restoration? The City? Or will the cost be split with the Board of Education?"

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez addressed this situation. He was adamant that the Board of Education, "Since they are the main user of the facility - they should pay for the cost of \$800,000. A letter should be written on our behalf stating

Council President Bill Petrick had a different view. "The City needs to consider hiring Spivey (Historical Architect) for an esti-

Gonzalez retorted, "The local taxpayers should not have pay."

Petrick stated, "It will get bounced back and forth."

Aviles interjected, "I got the impression at the end of the Meeting (between the Board of Education, Superintendent, etc.) that everyone agreed that the City should have the final word."

Gonzalez spoke up again, "Let the Board of Education do it." Petrick still insisted, "The City should work with a standard point of knowledge.

Aviles suggested, "If the City comes up with part of the money, then the HPC can budget part of our money for the cost."

Councilman Jelmin Caba agreed with Fernando Gonzalez.

Councilman Joel Pabon said, "It's in our best interest to look at this."

Gonzalez then mentioned, "We have a lease agreement."

Petrick came back and stated, "Unless we get an expert opinion, the Board will make all the decisions."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry suggested, "Let's get an estimate first, then make a decision. I don't know if the lease agreement is still in effect. The Board of Ed did a lot of improvements without a cost from us."

After Irizarry spoke, Renee Skelton Vice-Chair of the HPC came up to speak and said, "I agree with Councilmen Pabon, Petrick and Irizarry. The HPC's mission is to preserve history. Our expert is good, but we need more information."

Fernando Gonzalez still had more to say, "In my business (real estate), I have put together a lot of contracts where tenants will take care of a lot of things. The Board of Education has \$200 million budget, most of which comes from the State. If we don't ask the Board of Education to pay, then we may have to pay. A lot of the Board of Ed Members have an interest in

Joel Pabon then spoke, "The ball is in our court. That's their answer."

Fernando Gonzalez still pleaded and said to the City Attorney, "Please submit the letter to the Board of Ed (about paying the cost of the estimate) and let's see their answer."

Councilman Irizarry finished off the conversation with, "Let's not waste time. You know the answer will be no. We should just do a resolution to allocate funding for an estimate."

Acting City Attorney Peter King wanted to let the Council know, "Former Law Director Mark Blunda is working on one other case with the Public Safety Complex Appeal."

R-243-6/17 - Consenting to the extension of the appointment of Peter J. King as Acting Director of the Department of Law for a period no longer than 90 days from July 4, 2017.

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez agreed that King has done a good job since he's been with the City. "Sometimes when I call him, he's in court and I may not get a call back from him for a few days later. I'm pleased that the billing is less with him."

Councilman Pabon wanted to know, "Can they (the administration) bring you back (after the 90 days?)"

King responded, "Yes, there is a third time."

Pabon asked, "Have you ever considered full time?"

King responded, "I think the City wants to see how I work out. I would like to be full time."

Pabon said, "This our guy." R-243 passed with Councilman Fernando Gonzalez with the only "No" vote.





This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

In the U.S. on June 19, the Second Washington Conference begins. Led by President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill, U.S. and U.K. military staffs discuss how the Allies could best aid the Soviet Union. In Russia, a small German aircraft crash-lands behind Soviet lines. On one of the crash victims are found papers outlining German plans for the upcoming summer offensive, "Operation Case Blue." The German High Command frantically debates how much the plans will need to be revised to accommodate this disastrous security breach. Unbeknownst to them, Stalin believes the papers have been planted by the Germans as a ruse, and he orders that they be ignored.

At the Second Washington Conference, the U.S. on June 20 proposes opening a second European fighting front, in France, to relieve the pressure on the Soviet Union. The British, however, feel that this is not feasible. Churchill instead suggests, with Roosevelt's agreement, the development of a joint Mediterranean operation leading to an invasion of Italy—"the soft underbelly of the Axis." The Allies agree to begin preparing for "Operation Torch"— an invasion of the North African colonies of Vichy France. In the U.S. the song "Sleepy Lagoon" by Harry James & His Orchestra hits #1 on Billboard Magazine's singles chart.

With the assistance of Luftwaffe aerial attacks, Rommel's Afrika Korps on June 21 captures the contested Libyan port of Tobruk, taking over 35,000 British and Commonwealth soldiers prisoner and bringing the Gazala Campaign to an end. The road to Egypt is now open to the Germans as the Allied forces retreat deep into the interior of that country. During the night, Japanese submarine I-25 surfaces at the mouth of the Columbia River in Oregon and fires 17 shells from her deck gun at the Fort Stevens army base, located there at Point Adams. The attack causes no damage to the fort itself, but destroys the backstop on the installation's baseball field.

On June 22, Gen. Erwin Rommel is promoted to the rank of Field Marshal as a reward for winning the Battle of Gazala.

The Auschwitz concentration camp, operated by the Germans in Poland, on June 23 begins the systematic murder of Jews by use of the gas chamber. In Berlin, Albert Speer, Reich Minister for Armaments and Munitions, informs Hitler that a nuclear "superbomb" cannot be developed in time to affect the outcome of the war. Based on this information, the German military decides to deprioritize further serious nuclear-weapons research.


German and Italian forces cross into Egypt from Libya on June 24

Having arrived in London from the U.S. the day before, Maj. Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower on June 25 assumes responsibility as Commander, European Theater of Operations, U.S. Army. In North Africa, Gen. Claude Auchinleck, losing confidence in his subordinate, sacks Gen. Neil Ritchie and takes direct command of the British Eighth Army. In Washington, Adm. Ernest King — Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Fleet, and Chief of Naval Operations — deems Gen. MacArthur's suggestion of June 8 to invade New Britain, New Ireland and New Guinea as "too ambitious." King instead proposes that the Solomon Islands and the Santa Cruz Islands be taken first.






