Not Buying It: Concerns About Trust, Losing Part of City's History & Population Density 6/14/16 PARA Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Residents of the City showed their support for the homeowners of the Landings Complex a the 6/14/16 PARA Meeting.

Kushner Representatives came back to present a revised plan for the proposed Sea Gate Development and how they will reduce the number of units.

In spite of this, those present in the audience were not buying this. Council President Lisa Nanton said, "The City's infrastructure can't support this (development). It looks like a tenement. I don't trust your credibility. You would not present anything like this to Staten Island, Sayreville or South Amboy. This is not a Victorian Look. Our property values are already low."

Landings Resident and planning Board Member Christine Dispenziere came up to speak. "Kushner presented us with a beautiful development (the Landings) and failed. I'm embarrassed about our property. The only value is the water (Waterfront area). I don't know how you (PARA) had allowed this. You can't trust him. The Landings is falling apart. How can you give them the courage to even show them? They can't even built their properties here. They took our (Landings Home Owners) money and ran. The Landings has poor construction and it's not what we paid for. When we have high winds and rainstorms we get floods. I paid a lot of money for my unit. Kushner has money but spent it in New York. Fix our properties first. The Waterfront is the last of our jewels. Do you (PARA) want Sea Gate built and have the same problems as the Landings? South Amboy and other places are building with home ownership."

Resident Alan Silber came to show his support to the Landings owners. Silber stated "This Meeting should have been held at the Landings location, and the original Landings Presenta-

tion should have been shown. Kushner blames the economy. This is all make believe. It's an unstable world. Nobody in Perth Amboy will approve this plan. Between 2000 and 2013 the home sales are down in Perth Amboy by 18%."

Historic Preservation Chair and Resident Reinaldo Aviles had concerns about one of the historic sites. He disagreed about slow home sales in Perth

Amboy. Houses are being sold left and right in Perth Amboy. Our concern (the PA-HPC) with the plan is that Thomas Mundy Peterson (First Black Person to ever vote under the 15th Amendment who lived in Perth Amboy) house was located there. The Historic Preservation Commission is requesting that there be a dig on that site

Playing With Fire 6/22/16 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Public Hearing held on June 8, 2016 - No. 1. An Ordinance adopting an amendment of Article II of Chapter 98 of the Code of the City of Perth Amboy. Re: Public Contracting.

Despite what Executive Director Office of Economic and Community Development Perth Amboy Redevelopment Agency Annie Hindenlang and Joseph Maraziti of the Maraziti LLP Law Firm said they were no violations by developers of the existing ordinance.

Some residents still were not satisfied.

Former Councilman Ken Balut wanted to know, "Were there any violations of the ordinance right now? There was a big hoopla from a citizen's committee about this. Where are they now? Are they informed? The lawyer did not do due diligence. Before voting on this, you should know who the contractors are and if they are in violation. Why did this just pop up now just before the elections? The public should know it's a bunch of bull."

Council President Lisa Nanton had a problem with Paragraph B (see www.amboyguardian.com for a copy of the ordinance) "We should look at that section and remove it. That's what the citizen's committee suggested."

Balut then asked, "How can you vote on this if you don't know if anyone is in violation?"

Law Director Arlene Quinones-Perez said, "Annie Hindenlang said there were no violations at the time she looked at it. I don't know if there are any violations now."

Joseph Maraziti of the Marazitei LLP Law Firm spoke. "There were no violations of the \$300 ceiling. The ordinance that's in the books makes it a violation if there are contributions in any amounts. This (amendment) will not address prior contributions. The timing of this problem was identified prior to the election. There's always elections going on." He proceeded to say, "Annie Hindenlang said it's because that there's more developing that will be coming up. I'll be clear about this. We saw no violations when my associate did an analysis. This does not forgive prior violations. This change in the ordinance is for the future and not retroactive."

Balut was still not satisfied and said, "You did not do your due diligence."

Council President Lisa Nanton responded, "You can OPRA information and contributions of past developers."

Resident Alan Silber spoke about Ali Rada who had made contributions to political contributions in the past. He asked Maraziti if Rada is a developer.

Maraziti answered, "The name does not ring a bell."

Silber came back and mentioned about a project that will be taking place on Washington

Maraziti answered back, "I know about that site, but Rada is not a redeveloper. I don't' know the facts if he violated the pay to play in the past. PARA did not pass this proj-

Silber proceeded to talk about an executive order from the Mayor in 2009 to combat political corruption. Mr. Rada gives to everyone. If you pass this, then you are for political



*Continued from Page 1 to check for any historical artifacts. The parcel we're talking about isn't very large. We request that piece not be touched to commemorate it. We have lost a lot of history and don't want to lose that. We're happy that Kushner will look at that historic value."

Resident and Councilman Fernando Gonzalez had some concerns. He stated, "Someone said they think this (Seagate Community) is a done deal. The (City's) Master Plan no longer exists. Instead of asking people what they want, developers do whatever they want. Everything has been changed from ownership to rental. We are the dumping ground and they are cuddling him (Kushner). This administration must deal part of the property that belongs to us. They never closed on the \$4 million that they were supposed to buy from us. We lost over 10 years of taxes owed on that property. Redevelopment should be for the benefit of the citizens. Don't sell yourself to Kushner."

Resident and HPC Member Anna Daily came up to speak. "My request is a citizen and a member of the community that is concerned about the Thomas Mundy Peterson Property. Peterson voted in this building (City Hall). It's embarrassing that Perth Amboy doesn't have a statue commemorating Thomas Mundy Peterson. I'm appealing on behalf of the Community that Mr. Kushner should donate the Peterson Property."

Resident Mel Knight who is also the Vice-President of the Perth Amboy NAACP spoke about the historical value of

Perth Amboy. Besides the Peterson site, she mentioned Eagleswood. (The historic progressive school which taught both sexes and all races. See documentary by John K. Dyke or Stories From Perth Amboy by Katherine Massopust) "You should want to make this happen. The plan is nice, but where is the history? To sell it for a buck? I'm a descendant of slaves. The NAACP wants to see something historical happen on the Thomas Mundy Peterson Site."

Next to speak was Planning Board Chair Maria Garcia. She wondered, "How many people were expected to live in the plan that was first presented? Have you thought about the overcrowding? We need to slow it down and think about how we need to progress. Reduce the size. No rentals. Maybe single family home or townhouses. The town is not that big and we are on top of each other. You represent us and not the builders. We will suffer and pay."

A Landings Homeowner came up to speak next and stated, "This plan scares the hell out of me. I love the scenery, but the buildings are falling apart at the Landings. Not many places have a vantage point (the view). We need more of a police presence. I constantly have to pull glass out of my dog's paws."

Resident Maria Vera wondered, "Where are we going to park if this is built? Teachers have to park far away from where the schools are. We can't find parking at the Waterfront and we can't breathe. 30,000 people surround each other. Put a playground or museum there. People that are moving into town are not improving our quality of life. We work

hard. Why are they destroying our town? We care. They don't. We have to live with it every single day."

A Landings Resident who is a Board Member in the Bayview Building urged the PARA Members to look at the previous video. "I bought my unit in 2007. There are so many discrepancies. They are smiling because they ripped us off."

The next person who came up to speak was Steve Nascimento who is a homeowner in Harbortown and a Planning Board Member. "We have our Homeowner's Association as well. I have been here for 10 years and our property values have gone down. Most of the Harbortown units are rentals. I urge you to reject the new complex. Be cautious."


Another Landing Resident came forward and just bluntly said, "We've been coming here for 10 years. The last piece of nice property will be destroyed. Do the right thing - no rentals. Property must be bought."

Resident Brian Bonilla was concerned as a parent, "They (Kushner) had their chance. They blew it. One of my children has to be bussed to a school in Fords because of overcrowding."

One of the representatives from Kushner Enterprises came up to speak regarding the Landings Residents' complaints, "Kushner Companies does care and they want to fix the homeowners properties, but they will not let us onto the properties."

Another Resident suggested, "In the meantime the property can be used as a Farmer's Market or Flea Market until you decide what you want to do. Let

the people of Perth Amboy use the space in the meantime."

Daisy Gonzalez who is an owner in the Admiral Building said, "We have been in litigation for 10 years and Kushner's engineers and inspectors have seen the property. They know the problems."

Mayor Diaz who is also the Chair of PARA stated, "We will have a sit-down with Kushner. Not every Board Member has the history of the Landings. We are working on projects to bring rateable's to the City. We need to have people in the transit area to support local small businesses. We are having community meetings and our City Directors are there to be available to meet with those attending. She told the Landings Residents, "We can meet with you on your site. We will go back to Kushner with all your concerns. Kushner will help out with the Mundy site which is historic here and to the Country."

PARA Member Geri Bolonowski questioned how they were going to reduce the number of units.

The Kushner Representative said, "Some of the one bedroom units will be converted to two bedroom units."

PARA Member Elaine Jasko had concerns about the density.

PARA Meeting

"There was a default of the previous contract. As far as the infrastructure, we are not capable of this additional density. There are other projects that were approved. City Services concerns me. Harry Pozycki of the Citizen's Campaign and those in Perth Amboy that belong to the group should be sent the Sea Gate plan."

PARA Member Joel Rosa said, "We should have the questions and answers posted on the website."

During the second public portion Reinaldo Aviles came up to speak again. "We should demand that a portion of the construction jobs from the Developers be given to the Residents."

When Resident Mel Knight came up to speak again, she challenged the Board. "I want you to be accountable about preserving the historic sites. I need to be told publicly and not by word of mouth. The Peterson Site needs to be preserved for the entire country to see."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez spoke about other rentals on Hobart Street and the Five Corners. He wanted to know what attorneys from the DeCotiis firm were representing PARA at this Meeting. He also requested, "When the community event takes place at the Landings, please answer the questions in front of the crowd."

Mayor Diaz stated, "When we have Community Meetings, we (myself and Directors present) want to give people individual attention to a specific problem."

Resident Alan Silber posed a question to PARA Member Joel Pabon, "Mr. Pabon, why would people think this is a new project? Just walk down Rector Street and look at the road conditions. It looks like World War II. See the garbage and broken glass. The Kushner Property is a dump. Have you all looked back there? That's why people are coming here, because they think it's a done deal."

Christine Dispenziere encouraged the new PARA Members to look at the original plans and videos for the Landings."

Near the end of the Meeting, Mayor Diaz said, "Anyone can follow up with our Executive Director Annie Hindenlang for any additional question that you may have. The Kushner Representatives came back to answer your concern from the last meeting."

Anna Daily told the PARA Members, "Let us know the outcome of these negotiations. The elections are coming up. This property (Thomas Mundy Peterson) Parcel should be gifted to us (the City.)

Resident David Caba came up to speak and said, "The Mayor should distribute the wealth - part of the donation that she received. She has already spent \$200,000."

Resident Stanley Sierakowski also was concerned about political contributions. He urged the council to table this in order to see what developers contributed. The Mayor is the Chair of PARA. You (the Council) can designate people from the audience to help you out (looking at previous political contributions). The Mayor should be at the mic to answer questions about her executive order from 2009. She can go to superior court and testify there."

Resident Gregory Pabon came up to voice his opinion about this ordinance. He urged the Council to limit the amount of money for political contributions. "There have been Board of Education Candidates who received contributions from people from out of state who knew nothing about the City. The media makes money when these large contributions are made. We should set a limit of up to \$300."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez was uneasy about voting for this amendment of this ordinance. "We just got this 5 minutes ago (the requested change). I didn't get a chance to read it and it's rather lengthy."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz answered Councilman Fernando Gonzalez' concerns. "We are just changing the \$3000 contribution limit to \$300."

Gonzalez still had a concern and wanted to know, "What constitutes a major change in an ordinance? Does it have to be re-advertised?"

Councilman Bill Petrick spoke up and said, "Should we postpone? Law Director Perez said, "Your deleting one line and the amount changes."

Gonzalez still had his concerns. "This is a major change. It may have not been properly advertised."

During the second public portion, resident Alan Silber remarked, "That was some show that Maraziti had. The Executive Director (of PARA) said there were no violations. Are you saying that developers won't come here because they can't make campaign contributions? We're giving some people projects and their using subcontractors. People were coming here that can't build. Developers come here because they think we're stupid. Now we have to pay Maraziti to come here again because we tabled this resolution. Why didn't other people take those 12 parking spots if they were open to anyone?"

Codey-Vitale Bill to Establish Tuition Reimbursement Program for Psychiatrists Advances

Aims to Address Shortage of Mental Health Care Access, Encourage Professionals to Practice in Underserved Areas

TRENTON - Legislation sponsored by Senator Richard J. Codey, a leading advocate for mental health reform in New Jersey, and Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee chairman Joseph F. Vitale that would establish a tuition reimbursement program for psychiatrists to address a shortage of mental health care access in certain underserved areas of the State cleared the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee today.

"Mental health is at the core of a functioning society, and providing mental health care services to those who need it, when they need it and where they need it is a moral obligation," said Senator Codey (D-Essex and Morris). "This bill would put in place a tuition reimbursement program to incentivize a surge in available psychiatrists in New Jersey's most underserved areas."

Under the bill, S-2331, the Commissioner of Health would designate, on the basis of health status and economic indicators, geographic areas of the state which have a shortage of physicians in the specialty of psychiatry. The program would provide reimbursement of a portion of medical school tuition expenses to psychiatrists who agree to provide mental

health care services in one of these State underserved areas for a period of one to four

"We cannot ignore the shortage of mental health specialists and psychiatrists in certain areas of our state, which leaves vulnerable individuals without the care they need," said Senator Vitale (D-Middlesex). "By connecting those who require treatment in areas of high need with those who provide the critically-needed service, the tuition reimbursement program created under this bill will prove to be a win-win."

Program participants would be required to: (1) be State residents; (2) be State-licensed physicians who have completed all educational and residency training requirements for the practice of psychiatry; and (3) apply for the program within one year of completing an accredited residency program in psychiatry.

Under the bill, program participants would enter into a contract with the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA) for a specified number of one-year periods of service, up to four years, in which they agree to engage in the full-time practice of psychiatry in a State underserved area. In return for this commitment, a portion of the participant's tuition expenses

in attending medical school would be reimbursed.

Tuition reimbursement would equal 25 percent of the participant's eligible tuition expenses for the one academic year of medical school attendance in which tuition was the lowest. in return for each full year of service under the program. The maximum total tuition reimbursement for a participant for four years of service would be 100 percent of the participant's eligible tuition expenses for the one academic year of medical school attendance in which tuition was the lowest.

Under the bill, participants in the program would be required to adhere to certain terms and standards, including charging for professional services at the usual and customary rates, allowing patients who are unable to pay that charge to pay a reduced rate or receive care at no charge, and not discriminating against any patient on the basis of ability to pay. Participants would also be required to maintain their State residency and medical license, remain current with payments on any student loans, maintain satisfactory performance of services, and report to HESAA on the performance of services rendered prior to receiving tuition reimbursement.

Legislation to Repeal Family Caps, Adjust Benefits Under Work First New Jersey Program Advances

Press Release 6/23/16

TRENTON – Legislation that would repeal the family cap in the Work First New Jersey (WFNJ) program and increase the amount of benefits under the program was approved today by the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee.

The first bill, S-1854, sponsored by Senate Health Committee Chairman Joseph F. Vitale and Senator Ronald L. Rice, would repeal parts of the "Work First New Jersey Act" which prohibit a household from gaining additional cash assistance benefits as a result of the birth of a child. Currently, the law prevents an increase in the amount of a cash assistance grant if a child is born unless the child is born 10 months after applying for benefits or the birth is a result of rape or incest. The law also has certain exceptions for families with a working parent and for children born to minors.

"State assistance programs like Work First New Jersey are intended to alleviate the negative effects of poverty on individuals and families struggling to make ends meet," said Senator Vitale (D-Middlesex). "As a family grows, especially one already living on a low income and relying on temporary assistance, its needs grow. Prohibiting additional assistance because a woman had a child is essentially punishing the children because it denies them of having their basic needs met and destroys the chances of growing up healthy and finding future success."

New Jersey Policy Perspective reported recently that the state has seen an alarming increase of children living in poverty since the Great Recession. It further reports that since the family cap's implementation in 1992, over 20,000 children in New Jersey have been denied assistance, which in turn creates enormous stress and greater hardship for these families.

"Our current law basically punishes low-income women for having children, without regard for what is in the children's best interest," said Senator Rice (D-Essex). "Child poverty rates in New Jersey are already too high. This legislation will help address the issue by providing growing families with the assistance they need to survive."

According to the Welfare Rules Database from the Urban Institute, and NCSL legislative summaries, at least 19 states currently have a family cap policy and an additional two states have a flat cash assistance grant regardless of family size.

The second bill, S-1829, sponsored by Senator Vitale and Senator Jim Whelan, would increase the maximum amount of cash assistance benefit for families participating in the WFNJ program over three years to factor in cost of living adjustments.

"While living expenses rise every year, families with dependent children receiving cash assistance through the Work First New Jersey program have seen no adjustment to their benefit amount to reflect the increased costs," said Senator Whelan (D-Atlantic). "This legislation simply ensures that the assistance provided is realistic and consistent with current costs."

Currently, New Jersey's maximum benefit amount for WFNJ households is \$424 per month for a family of three. Under the bill, the maximum benefit amount would be increased to \$466 in FY 2017, \$509 in FY 2018 and \$551 in FY 2019. Subsequently, the maximum benefit would be annually adjusted according to the cost of living adjustment applied under the federal Social Security program.

New Jersey Policy Perspective also reported that the amount of assistance families receive has been stagnant for 29 years. As a result, assistance is worth less today than half what it was worth in 1987.

"Our safety net programs provide assistance to those who need it, but they must be indiscriminate and at the appropriate level to have an impact," added Senator Vitale.

The bills were both released from the Senate Budget Committee and now head to the full Senate for consideration.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

The Battle of Raseiniai, in Lithuania, ends in an overwhelming German victory on June 27, 1941. The four-day fight pitted the 245 tanks of the 4th Panzer Group under Gen. Erich Hoepner against 749 tanks of the Soviet Red Army, commanded by Col.-Gen. Fyodor Kuznetsov. Of the Soviet armored force, 704 tanks are destroyed, while German losses are "light." The victory allows the Germans to continue their push eastward. In Belorussia, German Panzer groups link up and encircle about 20 divisions of the Soviet Red Army between Białystok and Nowogródek, near Minsk. Churchill and Stalin reach an agreement that the United Kingdom and the Soviet Union will form an alliance to defeat Hitler.

On June 28, German forces take Minsk, in Belorussia, and Rovno, in Ukraine. Albania declares war on the Soviet Union. In Washington, President Roosevelt signs Executive Order 8807, creating the Office of Scientific Research and Development. It will be headed by Vannevar Bush, an electrical engineer who co-founded the Raytheon Company. The agency's research ranges widely; it includes the super-secret S-1 Section, later to become designated as the Manhattan Project.

In a decree issued on June 29, Hitler's second-in-command, Reichsmarschall Hermann Göring, is named as Der Führer's successor should Hitler die or be incapacitated during the war. In the Karelian Isthmus (on the Finnish-Soviet border) the Germans and the Finns begin attacks on Soviet positions. Farther north, the Germans and the Finns launch Operation Silver Fox, aimed at capturing the Soviet Arctic port of Murmansk.

The German 6th Army, part of Field Marshal Gerd von Rundstedt's Army Group South, takes Lwów, Poland, on June 30 while, farther east, another of von Rundstedt's units, the 5th Army, moves towards Kiev. Vichy France severs diplomatic relations with the Soviet Union.

On July 1, British mechanized cavalry and an Arab Legion desert patrol from Transjordan combine to break up a Vichy French mobile column near the city of Palmyra, in Syria. They capture four officers and 60 soldiers, prompting the Vichy garrison in Palmyra to surrender. In the U.S., registration for the draft becomes mandatory for all male citizens over the age of 21. Having received approval from the Federal Communications Commission, the National Broadcasting Company begins commercial television broadcasting over station WNBT (channel 1) in New York. The first commercial — a 10-second pitch for Bulova watches (which costs the company \$9 to air) – occurs at 2:29 p.m., before a Brooklyn Dodgers-Philadelphia Phillies baseball game. Later in the day, the Columbia Broadcasting System begins its first TV broadcasts, over station WCBW (channel 2) in New York. In the Middle East, British Gen. Claude Auchinleck is named Commander-in-Chief, Middle East, replacing Gen. Archibald Wavell. Wavell, whom Churchill blames for the failure of Operation Battleaxe to relieve Tobruk, takes over Auchinleck's position as Commanderin-Chief, Indian Army.

In Tokyo, on July 2, the government decides that attempts should be made to establish bases in Indochina, even at the risk of war. One million men are called for military service. In Poland, massacres by German SS Einsatzgruppen ("task forces") begin, as 7,000 Jews are executed in Lwów. In New York, Yankee centerfielder Joe DiMaggio homers against the Boston Red Sox, extending his consecutive-game hitting streak to 45, a major league record.

The Battle of Białystok-Minsk ends on July 3 in a German victory: 290,000 Red Army soldiers surrender and 2,500 tanks are captured. The Soviets suffer another 50,000 killed and 71,700 wounded. In a radio broadcast, Joseph Stalin calls for a "scorched-earth" policy of resistance and guerrilla warfare against the invaders. In southern Ethiopia, Italian resistance ends with the surrender of 7,000 troops by Gen. Pietro Gazzera to a force from the Belgian Congo
