





During his presentation, Rodgers said, "We train over 5,000 officers a month in New Jersey. One town saved \$350,000 in court costs after going through our training. Training is based on each city's guidelines. We have completed training in over 100 cities and we have done training for half of the prosecutor's offices and in some sheriff's departments. In the City of Perth Amboy you lost your status because other things took priority. We have a 100% track record. We have two departments which include training and accreditation. Because you have gone through the training one time, we can give you a discount. We are contracted by over 100 communities and we were the only company that submitted proposals to them. Morris County paid to have each police department accredited. Some towns have received grants to offset costs. We are the only company in the country to be accredited by a university (Fairleigh Dickinson). The insurance industry supports our training practices. All the police departments that go through the training classes are given a test after completing each module. All the material is mandated by the Attorney General. The longest module is four hours (domestic violence). Others are 30 to 90 minutes. There is a time frame when a test has to be taken after completion of each individual module. We trained the original Camden Police Department and now we're going back now that the State has taken over."

Rodgers said, "We have nothing to do with the accrediting body."

Police Chief Benny Ruiz addressed some of the concerns of some of the critics of this program. He stated, "Some individuals may have to take the training or the testing several times. If an individual does not meet the mandates after retesting, they can lose their job." He also explained that when he became chief, some of the officers who had gone through the training previously had been reassigned to other duties. "We reassigned people to catch up so we could get the accreditation. We never stopped using the practices that we had learned, even when we lost the accreditation. There were some police who had the training and have since retired. The majority of our personnel is new." Former Council President and retired Police Officer Ken Balut said, "We lost a \$600,000 lawsuit while we were accred-

ited. Camden was accredited and was still taken over by the State. He (Frank E. Rodgers) need the money. That's why he started this company."

Resident Alan Silber said, "Mr. Rodgers presentation was smooth. He said at the beginning of his presentation that he quit his job to make money. Then he said that the statement that was made by a critic, that he just started the program to make money was an ignorant statement. Training should start with the heads of police departments."

At the 9/8/14 Caucus Meeting and the 9/10/14 Council Meeting, there were last minute arguments made about not awarding the contract to the Rodgers Group.

Ken Balut said, "The Prosecuter's Office had several harassment charges after they were accredited. As a whole the Rodgers Group is going to cost more money. Talking to a computer is just that. You need a live person to talk to that has seen action on the street. Do what you (The Council) want. In my opinion, it's a scam."

Councilman Bill Petrick said that forfeiture funds paid for the Rodgers Group training before."

Alan Silber told the Council, "I think Frank Rodgers' presentation made you decide it's not a good program. Mr. Rodgers made very disparaging remarks. Only 4 Middlesex County Departments are accredited. Mr. Rodgers is putting out stats that he couldn't verify. Look what happened in the Sheriff's Department with the previous Sheriff. The then Deputy Sheriff who is now the Sheriff did not know about the corruption that was taking place at the time."

R-433 Authorizing a contract with The Rodgers Group LLC for consulting services assisting the police department in securing NJSA COP reaccreditation in the amount not to exceed \$39,000. Resolution was approved by all Council Members except for William Petrick who voted "no."

R-434 Authorizing a contract with The Rodgers Group LLC for the purchase of the 2015 subscription of the On-Line In Service Training Module Program in the amount not to exceed \$20,672 was approved by all Council Members.



200 Years Old and Still Going Strong As Relevant Today as it was Then



The American Flag at Fort McHenry

The Star Spangled Banner turned 200 on Sunday, September 14, 2014.

In 2008, my aunt Joanie took Paul and I to Baltimore While we were there, we went to Fort McHenry. The absolute best presentation you can ever see on the Star Spangled Banner is the movie shown at Fort McHenry in Chesapeake Bay. It is so well done that anyone who doesn't come to tears at the end of this presentation has a very cold heart. The presentation shows the meaning of the words and why they were so dear to Francis Scott Key.

The history of our national anthem began in Chesapeake Bay during the Battle of Fort McHenry in Baltimore during the War of 1812. Francis Scott Key, a 35 year old Washington lawyer and amateur poet had come to Baltimore to secure the release of Dr. William Beanes, a civilian who had been taken prisoner of war by the British on a truce ship. Key wasn't allowed to leave the ship because the British Commander stated that it was a moot point because he felt by the next day the British will be victorious and rule the Colonies once more.

and were under British rule. Key looked into Chesapeake Bay and saw hundreds of British ships. The Commander could not understand why the Americans fought so hard. Key responded, "We would rather die with our legs standing then live with our knees bent to a king."

The battle raged all night long and rockets lit up the sky so bright it seemed like it was broad daylight. All night long the British bombarded Fort McHenry. Key would go up on the deck of the truce ship and saw that the flag was still there and told the prisoners of war this. By the next morning, Key saw that the flag flown at the rampart at Fort McHenry, although tattered, was still there. Patriots had held the flag despite the bombardment of British fire. Key wrote a poem called "Defence of Fort M'Henry" which would later be renamed "The Star-Spangled Banner" and officially become the United States' national anthem in March 3, 1931.


The Star Spangled Banner Lyrics By Francis Scott Key 1814

Rabbi and Palestinian Seek Peace through Understanding in Middle East Conflict



PERTH AMBOY - An orthodox rabbi and a Palestinian walked into a synagogue.... It sounds like the beginning of a joke, but this was real. On Sunday, Sept. 7, exactly that combination presented a talk at Congregation Beth Mordecai, 224 High St., on the sensitive and dangerous situation in the Middle East.

Rabbi Hanan Schlesinger, who resides both in Israel and New York, discussed the exasperating status of Israeli-Palestinian relations with Ali Abu Awwad, a leading Palestinian peace advocate, before a crowd of about 115. The discussion was free and open to the public.

It was not a debate because both participants agreed on the basic principle of their appearance — that all sides in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict need to develop a leap of faith to trust one another. In turn, they said, understanding will lead to peace. The theme was set at the beginning by Rabbi Ari Saks, the religious leader of Beth Mordecai, when, in introducing Schlesinger and Awwad, he said, "Peace means you give up what I want, and I give up what you want — and neither of us is happy. But that's peace."



else and still be true to yourself?"

That point essentially governed the discussion. Initially it seemed that the two men were going to hold a debate, but they appeared to agree on every point. They said they are friends, have known each other for several years and live near each other in Israel.

Schlesinger, a diminutive, greying man appeared in stark contrast to Awwad, who was much taller. Both wore beards and were dressed casually.

Speaking on the "bema" or elevated platform in the main sanctuary of the 115-year-old temple, Schelsinger said he had a "personal transformation" and was "rocked" by his relationship with Awwad, whom he referred to during the talk by his first name, "Ali."

He said the lack of understanding between Palestinians and Jews stems from the essential separateness of the two cultures. They live among each other in some parts of Israel, Schelsinger said, but they have different municipal services, their children go to different schools, and they seldom if ever talk to each other. He and Awwad have been trying to change pattern. Awwad, in turn, said that most Palestinians truly want to be "pro-solution," but Israelis continue to fear Palestinians. This leads to "pain, anger and blood," he said, and the result is, "We are dying."


conflict over his family as a young man. He was separated from his mother, who was an activist, for two months, and when he was released from jail, he decided to become involved in politics. He realized, he said, that violence does not help resolve issues, especially between two groups that have literally thousands of years of hatred between them.

He went on a 17-day hunger strike to be allowed to visit his mother, he said.

"What is the danger to Israel for me to visit my mother?" he asked.

He said that he came to realize, "Human beings are susceptible to being shown what they have done and to take responsibility for their acts."



That simple understanding showed, Awwad pointed out, that there exists a gigantic gulf of misunderstanding between two warring parties in the my truth has caused them pain and suffering."

The two men almost seemed to be completing each other's sentences. They agreed that the lack of understanding is causing most problems in the Middle East.

The talk was co-sponsored by Beth Mordecai, the Jewish Federation of Greater Middlesex, Congregation Neve Shalom in Edison, Temple Emanu-El, also of Edison, and the Jewish Community Center of Middlesex County. The ecumenical nature of the talk served to show that the Jewish community is seeking new ideas to resolve differences over strife in the Middle East. After the talk, many participants embraced each other, and cookies and fruit were served in Safran Hall, adjacent to the sanctuary at Beth Mordecai. Scheslinger and Awwad are part of a movement whose website is called friendsofroots.net in Reston, Va.

Saks invited the two speakers to Perth Amboy. They are on a tour to help educate the public about the current situation in the Middle East.

Schlesinger said, "Is it possible to learn about someone In an impassioned description of his background, Awwad said that he became involved in the He compared the situation in the Middle East to Perth Amboy, where people do not have to worry that they will be shelled with bombs in their sleep or not be able to travel a short distance without being searched and delayed for hours by guards at check points.

He said he brother was killed by an Israeli patrol.

"I promise you," Awwad said, I can give up anything to get my brother back, but I guarantee you he will never be back."

Awwad said a turning came for him when he found himself in a group of Israelis who also had seen family mem-

"It was the first time I saw a Jew as a victim," he said. The two speakers decided at one point to go on this speaking tour to explain that it is the lack of sympathy with fellow human beings that is driving the war. Deep emotion keeps the conflict alive, Awwad said. "Rockets are the consequences of one-sided solutions," he added.

Schlesinger discussed some experiences he had regarding misunderstandings between Arabs and Jews.

"What we [Jews] believe is true," he said, "but there is another truth. It is easy to ignore the other truth. Many Palestinians don't see our truth, and
