Positions Drawn 2 Slates & 1 Independent

PERTH AMBOY - Petitions for those wishing to keep or pursue a Council Seat were turned in by the deadline. Those that qualified were notified. The only element missing was what would be their ballot positions for the November 4, 2014 election.

This was decided on September 11, 2014 at 3 p.m. at City Council Chambers.

The Candidates, some of their supporters, family, friends and curiosity seekers were present to see this occur.

City Clerk Elaine Jasko explained the selection process to those in attendance. On the railing in front of Council Chambers were three index cards. Two of them had the slates of the candidates running together and one card had the name of the independent candidate, (Nunez) who was there.

The candidates were instructed by Jasko to look at the cards, but she cautioned them, "Do not touch them!"

The Perth Amboy Democrats Candidates endorsed by Mayor Diaz: Bill Petrick and Sergio Diaz were present. Running mate Joel Pabon was absent.

New Direction for Perth Amboy Slate: Ana Mascenik and Fernando Gonzalez were present. Jelmin Caba was not available.

Before the cards were placed into the box, Jasko put her

hand in the box then spun it around to show that it was empty. She placed the cards in the box, spun it around, and when it stopped, she pulled out one card. New Direction for Perth Amboy qualified for the first ballot position. The second spin yielded In-

dependent Candidate Miguel Nunez. That left Perth Amboy Democrats with the final position number three. Jasko said the results will be forwarded to the Municipal Clerk Elaine Flynn who assigns the numbers and letters to the candidates that will appear on the 11/4/14 ballot.

Mayor Fred Henry and the entire council had nothing but nice words to say about the work Kemble-Kalantsis has done filling in for Vigilante. Henry pointed out the excellent work she has done handling license and permit applications as well as her part in the recent election.

"I'd like to thank everyone for coming to witness Laura being sworn in," Councilwoman Zusette Dato said during her opening comments. "As much as we miss our former clerk Kathy Vigilante, Laura is really doing a great job for us. Congratulations."

"I'd also like to congratulate Laura...she works very hard," added Council President Jo-

seph Connors. "She still has to go to school and that's the hard part...going to school while you're doing a job."

According to Resolution No. 136-2014, Kemble-Kalantsis may be reappointed for a maximum of two subsequent one-year terms following the termination of the temporary appointment. The appointment as Acting Municipal Clerk shall not be more than three consecutive years.

All council members were in attendance for last week's meeting. The next city council meeting will be Wednesday, October 15th at 7:00 p.m.

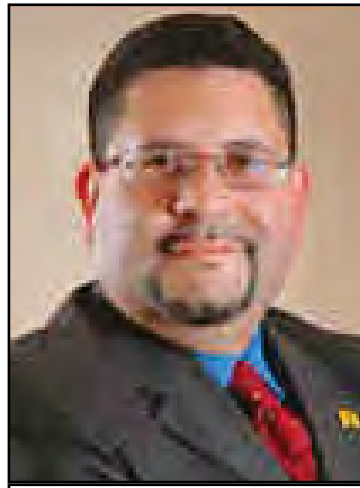

The Education Period Needs to End

PERTH AMBOY – At the Sept. 8, 2014 Caucus Meeting one of the topics for discussion was the noise ordinance/enforcement. Councilman Fernando Irizarry is the one who requested that this be examined further.

At a previous Council Meeting, there was a discussion that fees should be increased for any offenders of the noise ordinance. Council President Joel Pabon said, "I don't think fees are the issue, but the enforcement needs to be stronger."

"The education period needs to end," stated Councilman Fernando Irizarry, "We need to get serious and start imposing fines, even for special events. I would like to increase the fees. \$100 summons are nothing if you are making \$2000 a night."

Councilman Kenny Gonzalez was in agreement with Irizarry and Pabon, "I think the offenders are not heading the warnings from the police. The fines should be adjusted according to the infractions that took place. The ordinance

es on the books are okay."

Pabon wanted calls for establishments where the police have to constantly come to because of habitual offenders, they just get a warning and continue with disturbances. "Now, I feel they are disrespecting the police. People have been afraid to report disturbances."

Police Chief Benjamin Ruiz came forward to address some of these cases. "We will not divulge individuals who call to complain. We have certain addresses that we check between 3 a.m. to 4 a.m. because they have a history of problems. The Councilman is right. Historically we don't take an aggressive stance, but more to educate. The ABC (Alcoholic Beverage Commission), Code Enforcement, and the Fire Department addressed the liquor store that people have been complaining about. Now we have taken zero tolerance with liquor stores. On special occasions, such as birthday/graduation parties at private residences, we will just give them a warning. Because of a change

of shifts officers reporting to a disturbance may think they are going to a first time offender not realizing they have multiple complaints."

Former Council President Kenneth Balut who is also a retired Police Officer was taken aback by that last comment by the Chief. Balut said, "I retired in 1993 and it didn't matter what shift we were on. We always got updates by the previous shift Captain."

At the 9/10/14 Council Meeting Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez stated, "We should put out a press release to let the public know that these laws will be enforced."

At that same meeting Resident David Caba said, "Six people got shot recently (that we know of). You want a press release about a noise ordinance, which is OK, but we need to have press releases about these shootings. The blame game has come to an end."

Resident Alan Silber said, "Wouldn't you like to warn your children about shootings occurring?"

Perth Amboy Board of Education Statement on NBC News Story

Press Release 9/16/14
 PERTH AMBOY - On September 11, 2014, NBC News aired a story regarding a former substitute teacher involved in an illegal relationship with a student in the 2012-13 school year.

A parent and board member interviewed alleged that the Perth Amboy School District did nothing to protect this student and that two high school vice principals provided the Court with supportive letters for his sentencing. The Board of Education vehemently denies these allegations and would never condone acts that are illegal or harmful to children. In early 2013 when this incident came to light, the District protected the student

by immediately notifying the police and child protection authorities. This release provides the accurate facts and seeks to correct the recently reported inaccuracies.

The news story failed to report that one of those letters was a job reference written before the substitute teacher was accused. The other letter was written by a former administrator who showed poor judgment in supporting the former substitute. At the time, the District had no ability to predict or control these unknown acts by staff or former staff or the subsequent use of said letters in the criminal Court action. The District also fervently rejects the positions and statements taken by an individ-

ual member of the Board who has orchestrated the publicity surrounding this issue despite the fact that he has no legal authority to speak on behalf of the full Board before the press or in any other forum. The District will take the appropriate and necessary action with respect to the transgressions of this board member at the appropriate time. Regardless of the effort to revisit resolved issues to cast us in a negative light, the District will continue to focus on the goal of improving the lives of Perth Amboy students, funding effective programs, building a new high school, reducing class sizes and providing our students with a quality education.

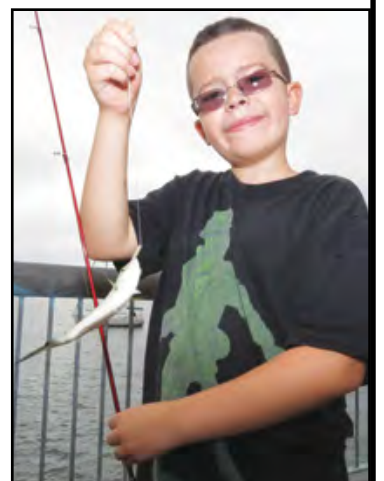

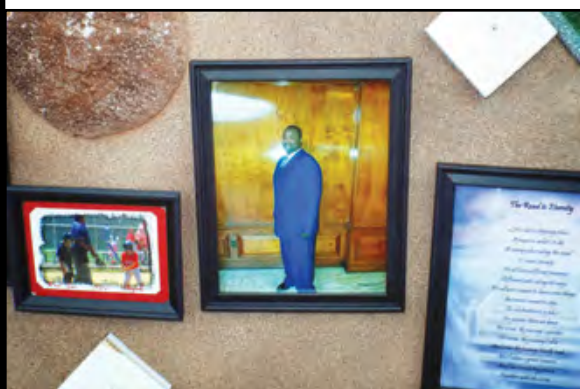

Madden-Vitale Bill to Improve Newborn Screening Advances

News Release 9/16/14

TRENTON – Legislation sponsored by Senators Fred H. Madden and Joseph F. Vitale to improve the state’s program for screening newborns for congenital disorders in New Jersey hospitals was approved yesterday by the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee.

“Newborn screening is essential to protecting the health and wellbeing of infants and detecting disorders that if discovered early in life can be effectively treated or managed to the benefit of the child,” said Senator Madden (D-Gloucester/Camden), vice chair of the committee. “By continuously reviewing and updating this program, we will ensure that it is kept current and that quick and effective health care interventions are provided in the event a condition is detected.”

“New technologies make it possible to screen newborns for a variety of disorders and allow parents and medical professionals to learn of the need for medical treatment early,” said Senator Vitale (D-Middlesex), chair of the Committee. “Reviewing the program

annually is critical to ensuring that we remain at the forefront of these advances and to providing improved health prospects for children in New Jersey.”

The Department of Health currently requires that, within 48 hours after birth, all newborns be screened for 54 disorders. One heel prick of the newborn provides enough blood to test for all 54 disorders. The bill (S461) would require the formal establishment of a “Newborn Screening” program within the Department of Health and require the Health commissioner to establish the Newborn Screening Advisory Review Committee consisting of medical, hospital, and public health professionals, as well as scientific experts and consumer representatives and advocates. The committee would annually review the disorders included in the Newborn Screening program, screening technologies, treatment options, and educational and follow-up procedures. It would also meet annually to review and revise the list of disorders recommended for inclusion in the newborn

screening program.

The Newborn Screening program would screen all infants born in the state based on the list of disorders that is recommended by the Newborn Screening Advisory Review Committee and approved by the Commissioner of Health consistent with the Recommended Uniform Screening Panel of the United State Secretary of Health and Human Services. The commissioner would be required to provide a follow-up program to provide timely intervention and, as appropriate, referrals to specialist treatment centers for newborn infants who screen positive for disorders.

The measure would permit parents of newborn infants to opt out of having their child screened if they provide written notice stating that they object to screening on the grounds that it would conflict with their religious tenets or practices. The bill was approved by a vote of 9-0. It next heads to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee for consideration.

Vitale/Greenstein Bill to Connect Caregivers And Physicians to Improve Post-Hospital Care Approved by Health Panel

TRENTON – A measure sponsored by Senators Joseph F. Vitale and Linda R. Greenstein that would ensure that those taking care of patients after they leave the hospital are included in instructions on post-release care was approved today by the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee.

“Often a friend or relative is acting as a caregiver and helping a patient when they are released from the hospital, ensuring that they take their medication or receive the therapy needed to heal,” said Senator Vitale, D-Middlesex, and Chairman of the Committee. “But these individuals are often receiving their instructions not directly from a doctor or health care professional, but secondhand through the patient. To avoid that important health and care information doesn’t slip through the cracks, we should allow the health care professionals to include these caregivers in the discharge plan and post-release care.”

The bill, S-2127, would allow patients in hospitals to declare

a caregiver who could receive instructions for post-hospital care. Under the bill, a caregiver could be anyone, such as a relative, friend or neighbor, who is providing after-care assistance to the patient in their residence.

The bill would require an attending physician to consult with the designated caregiver and issue a discharge plan that describes the after-care assistance needs. The bill would require that the plan include a description of all after-care assistance tasks necessary to maintain the patient’s ability to reside at home and contact information for any health care community resources and long-term services. This consultation would provide the caregiver with the opportunity to ask questions about the after-care instructions and tasks.

The hospital would also be required to notify the caregiver of the patient’s discharge or

transfer to another facility as soon as possible, but not less than four hours prior to the discharge.

“Ensuring that someone follows a doctor’s orders when they are released from the hospital can help a patient recover faster and avoid relapses and readmittances into a hospital,” said Senator Greenstein, D-Middlesex and Mercer. “But our current system doesn’t allow for the person who is actually providing care to the patient after they get home, to hear first-hand from the physician what the after-care instructions are. By allowing patients to designate caregivers, we can ensure that these individuals are equipped to provide competent, post-hospital assistance to loved ones.”

The bill was approved by the Committee with a vote of 9-0. It now heads to the full Senate for consideration.

Legislators Press Governor To Restore Food Aid Resolution Directs Christie To Prevent Loss of Food Stamps

TRENTON — Senator Raymond Lesniak on Monday introduced a resolution directing Governor Chris Christie to tap unused energy funds to prevent the loss of food aid to the needy, a move that would protect them from having food stamps cut by as much as \$90 a month because of a rule change in the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

The formula for the “Heat & Eat” program, that uses heating assistance for the poor to determine qualification for food stamps, was changed by Congress to require payments of at least \$21 a year for recipients to continue to receive full SNAP benefits. By spending \$3.2 million in federal funds in the state’s energy assistance program, New Jersey would continue to qualify for the additional \$53 million to feed those in need.

“Congress has taken food off the table of families already struggling to make ends meet,” said Senator Lesniak, who submitted a budget resolution to provide the needed funds that was vetoed by the governor. “Hunger in America is a real problem and it is just as real in New Jersey. An estimated 160,000 families could lose as much as \$90 a month in food aid. That is unconscionable.”

Senator Lesniak just completed a week-long “Food Stamp Challenge,” when he

lived on \$4.20 a day for food, matching the amount SNAP recipients receive.

“Of the 15 states affected by the Heat & Eat program, eight have already acted to prevent these cuts from taking place,” said Senator Shirley Turner, who sponsored legislation vetoed by the governor to preserve the food aid. “New Jersey should do the same. This would be a smart and compassionate way to prevent the problem of hunger and food insecurity from being made worse.”

Under the federal Agriculture Act of 2014, households must receive more than \$20 annually in energy assistance to maintain eligibility for full SNAP benefits.

“These are the most vulnerable people in the state, including families with children who often don’t know where their next meal is coming from,” said Senator Joe Vitale, a co-sponsor of the legislation. “It’s also good for the economy. The federal dollars spent on food can generate as much as \$300 million in economic activity.”

Senator Lesniak said he will work to get every senator to sign-on to the resolution, Democrats and Republicans. Concurrent resolutions do not go to the governor for approval.

The bill vetoed by the governor had been approved 36 – 1 by the Senate and 60 – 13 – 6 by the Assembly.

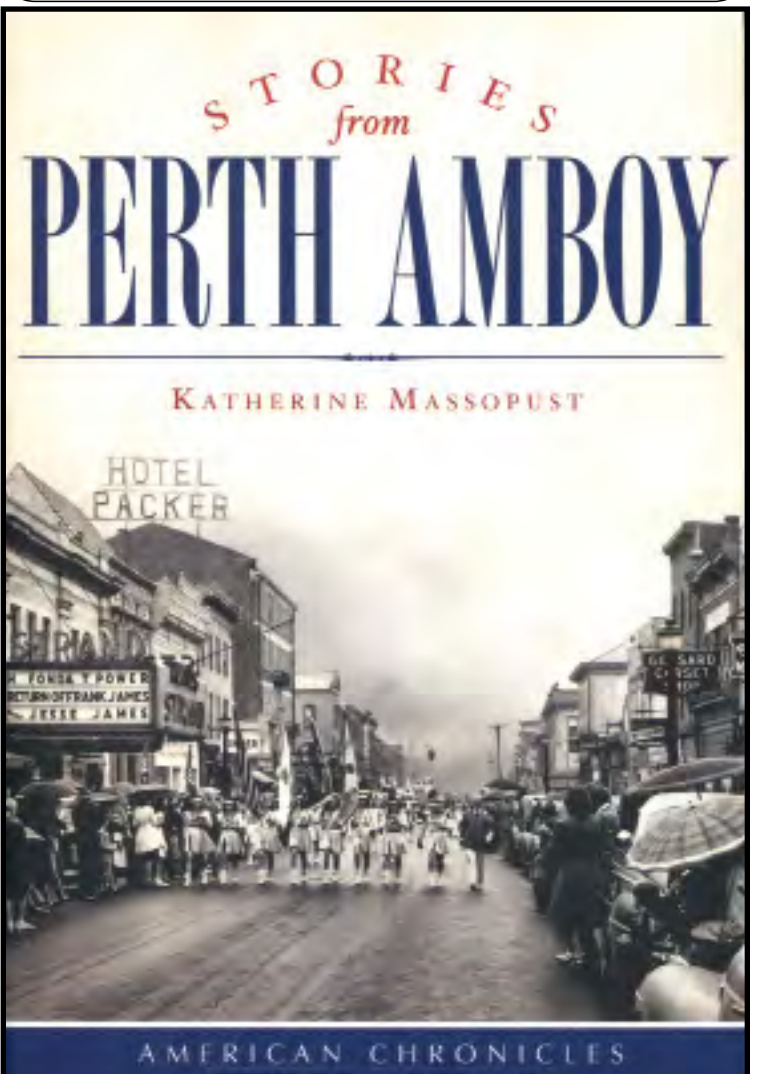

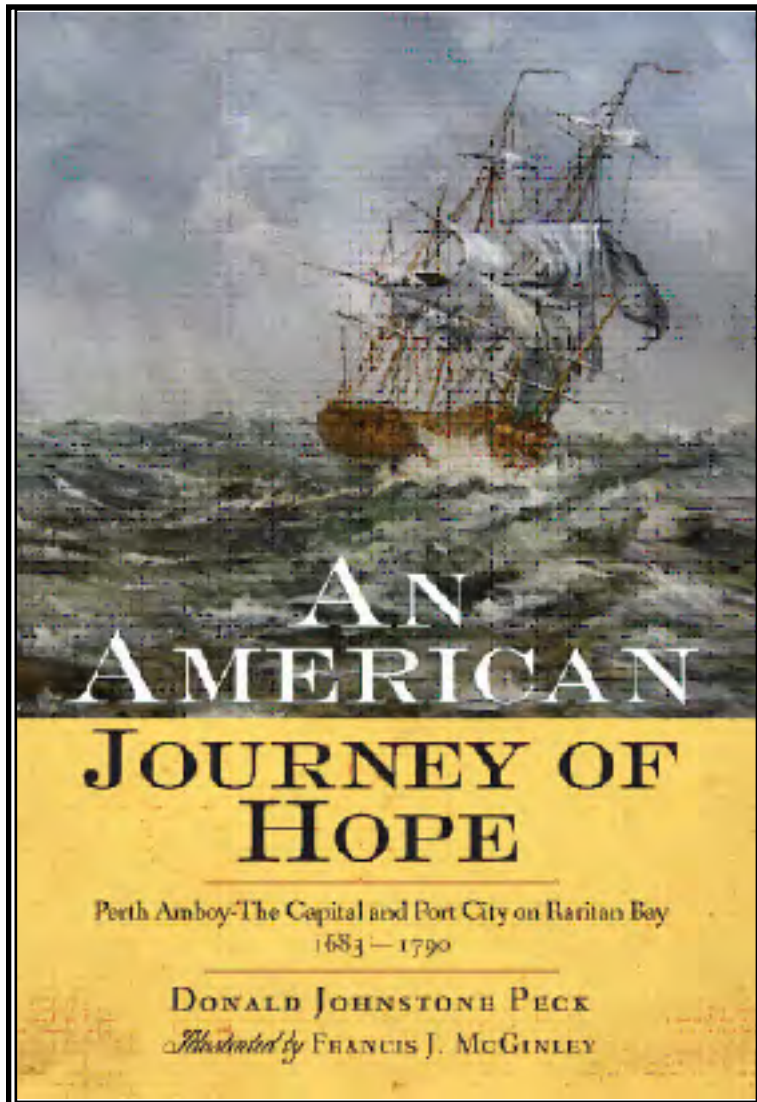
