Absent Parents and Teachers Overshadow Impressive Board of Education Retreat Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Despite a relatively impressive retreat meeting held by the Perth Amboy Board of Education, the big story was the lack of parents and teachers in attendance.

Only four teachers from the school district showed up to hear the future plans of the Perth Amboy education system, which was noticed by not only the board but also some residents that came to listen. The concerns of disinterest within the city were brought up during the public session of the meeting. "How is it that when the board and superintendent are talking about the negative morale in the school district, none of the teachers come to listen?" resident Cecil Graham asked the board. "There was a lot of good stuff said here today, but most of the city won't know about it because they're not here or won't want to look for it." There was confusion on whether or not the parents and teachers were notified about the meeting, which was unusually held on a Saturday morning. Richardson Elementary

Kindergarten teacher Lynn Audet, who was one of the few teachers to speak, explained that none of the teachers knew about the meeting.

"There was no clear vision amongst the teachers of this meeting taking place, and there was no announcement about what time to be here," Audet said. "The only reason why I'm here is because the Educational Leaders of the district just got out of another scheduled meeting upstairs and I heard this going on."

Resident Veralouise Davis, parent of two Perth Amboy students, noted that she did receive a phone call from the city informing her of the meeting, but was disappointed that other parents weren't in attendance. She feared that there was a stigma coming over the city and not enough was being done to unify Perth Amboy. "I got three phone calls about today's meeting and checked the website for the available times, yet there's still nobody here with me," Davis said. "I don't see how a community can move forward with our education system if nobody is here to listen."

Davis also noted that Perth Amboy was becoming a temporary living location because of the school system, and she was worried that her family would have to move because of the current plans in place. She had originally moved from Piscataway to Perth Amboy because of the pre-school program, but told the board she may have to pack up again.

Mobility was one of the main problems that Superintendent Janine Caffrey talked about in her Intra-district presentation to the board. She noted that mobility within the district ranged from 17-27 percent last year, and it has become an issue that the board will have to work toward fixing in the 2012-2013 school year.

"More things need to be done in order to get everyone on the same page," Davis said. "Teachers need to be on the calling list or something because there's a stigma that Perth Amboy's system is not up to par and I'm afraid I'll have to make plans to move once my daughter hits the fourth grade."

Board of Education Vice President Kenneth Puccio was very vocal following the open comments from the public, explaining that the board did make it known that the meeting would be taking place. Puccio understood why the public was so upset, but explained that messages were sent out to the residents of Perth Amboy. "We all do our due diligence to make sure things get done and are done right, and I only open my mouth when I've done my due diligence," Puccio told the audience. "I know for a fact that 1,000 e-mails

First Meeting of February Brings Tough Questions from Residents

SOUTH AMBOY - The unusually warm winter weather brought a number of residents to South Amboy's council meeting on February 1st to address issues that are currently affecting the town.

The Bachonski family, who are now the operating owners of The Station Eatery located at the South Amboy Train Station, raised concerns about the 15-minute parking signs that were placed in front of their business. The council had passed a ordinance in 2011 to add those signs to the area, but Cheryl

when it was passed. However, Council President Joseph Connors explained to Bachonski that they are just being tested and that if they do not benefit the businesses, they will be taken out of the area.

"The signs were placed there because of the people who would wait outside the train station and take up spots," Connors said. "We tried them out for the first time and it just started, but if it's not going to work then they will be removed."

Connors also noted that there would be a business meeting on February 14th in which the 15-minute parking signs will be discussed. However, the Bachonski family believes something needs to be done as soon as possible before they lose more business. "We would watch people try to come in and leave because they couldn't find parking, or they would come in and say 'sorry, I couldn't find a spot'," Jessica Bachonski said after the meeting. "They don't have time to sit down and eat so they aren't bothering to come in. It's killing us."

Bachonski expressed her disapproval of the change.

"Nobody can come into our store or anywhere else in the area in 15 minutes if they have to park and walk to where they have to go," Bachonski told the council. "You want to bring people into town, not push them away, especially on Broadway, and we are pushing them away."

Parking ordinance #19-2011, which was approved at the council meeting on November 2nd, 2011, was met with some criticism from some of the town residents

(Continued from Page 1) went out to parents a week ago and phone calls were made to notify them of the retreat, so things were done to get people here."

Resident Lou Vargas also admired the work of the council and took the microphone to praise the job they did on the presentation. He wanted to make it clear to the public that it wasn't just the board who was at fault.

"We have to remember that it's Saturday and the board members don't get paid to be here. They volunteer their time and energy and the only reward is the furthering of our children's education," Vargas said. "Let's spend more time on the problems the city faces and move forward as a team to reach our ultimate goal."

However, Puccio was still upset about the lack of teachers and administrators in attendance and didn't understand how the leaders of the district didn't make time to come. He believed that it would have been beneficial for them to be there if parents had a question about their child's school.

"I'm disappointed that not every principal and department head was here today, and I think all of them should have been here," Puccio said. "If parents would have come and had questions about certain schools, then the principals at least should have been here to step up and answer the tough questions."

By some surprise, Mayor Wilda Diaz voiced her opinion during the public session after sitting in the audience to hear the Superintendent's presentation. She praised Dr. Caffrey's eye-opening lecture and urged the board to work together to do more for the city's children.

One of the most popular presentations came from Dr. Nestor Callazo, who proposed the idea of bringing the S.T.E.M. program to Perth Amboy High School and the rest of the public school system. S.T.E.M., which stands for science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, is something that he believed would not only change the way things are taught but prepare students for the world's top rated jobs.

"Of the 20 fastest growing professions known today, 15 of them require significant science and math educations," Callazo explained to the board. "More then half of our students don't go into the career choice they want because they don't know how to start, but with this program we will bring the professionals to them and advance their education to prepare them."

Mayor Diaz agreed with the need to advance the use of technology and better the way teachers presented themselves to their students. She once again praised the great presentation, but believed the word

Despite the back and forth beliefs of the board and residents, Israel Varela concluded the meeting by attempting to unify the two sides. He explained that nothing can get done if everyone is against each other.

"Let's not point fingers, we are all at fault for what's going on with the education system," Varela said. "I believe in the saying 'Collaboration, Consensus, and No Fault'. Let's not fault each other but rather come together and fight this together. Don't point at one another."

The meeting was recorded and will be televised in the next week or two. The presentation made by Dr. Caffrey will also be posted online in the future, and the Board of Education urges those who were not in attendance to read up on the information regarding their children.

to get them done properly," Tooker said. " We are well aware that we need to do more out there and we are addressing those issues."



More Than Just Books - The Need for Funding for the Renovation of the Perth Amboy Free Public Library

The Perth Amboy Free Public Library is more than just books. The entire library is widely utilized every day by patrons from surrounding towns as well as from Perth Amboy. As of the latest statistical study (completed in 2010 - I am certain that the numbers are even higher now) the Perth Amboy Free Public Library has over 13,000 adult patrons (ages 8th Grade & up) and over 12,500 child patrons (ages 7th Grade & lower).

The computers are utilized by over 150 to 200 patrons daily depending upon the hours that the library is open.

People utilize the Perth Amboy Free Public Library for a diverse amount of research purposes including genealogical research and preparing employment resumes.

The library has a collection of over 170,000 books available to the public plus a collection of children's books. This collection includes traditional research materials such as periodicals and other reference materials such as microfilm and microfiche available for the public to utilize. The library has over 400 titles of magazines and newspapers accessible for the public to read. If a title of a book is not available, the staff can arrange an interlibrary loan. People from other libraries also borrow books from the Perth Amboy Library. A Perth Amboy Library Card is good for most surrounding libraries in the area.

The Perth Amboy Free Public Library receives frequent inquiries from national and in-



ternational residents who desire local information.

The Children's Library has frequent programs that many children participate in.

The Library is a historic building and an integral piece of Perth Amboy's rich history. A little history about the Perth Amboy Free Public Library: The Perth Amboy Free Public Library was built on its present site on Jefferson Street, in 1901, on land donated by J. C. Mc Coy, of the Raritan Copper Works and constructed with the aid of a \$20,000 grant from the Andrew Carnegie Foundation, a \$1,000 donation from Adolph Lewisohn to purchase new books, and an agreement by the City to provide for the Library's upkeep.

On December 9, 1903, the building, the first in New Jersey to be the beneficiary of Mr. Carnegie's generosity, was opened to the Public. The growth of the Library from that time was so marked, that in 1914, the Carnegie Corporation donated an additional \$30,000 for the creation of two reading rooms. A Children's Library was built in 1925, unfortunately destroyed by fire in 1977, and was not rebuilt. The K.A.M.

present Children's Library is located in the basement of the building, in an area formerly used as a meeting room and theatre.

This centrally located building now is in desperate need There is a of renovation. proposed \$10 million dollar library renovation and expansion project. Presently after years of leaks the roof is finally receiving much needed repairs. Many more repairs are needed as well. The Library is a widely utilized and much needed facility for Perth Amboy.

The recently formed Friends of Perth Amboy Free Public Library have been raising funds for the Library's renovation as have other organizations. The Library is still looking for an Angel Investor for this much needed project.

Resident Vince Mackiel Looking For Environmental Changes in South Amboy

SOUTH AMBOY - After tive effects on neighborhoods years of living in South Amboy, resident Vincent Mackiel is looking to make big changes to the environmental status of the area.

Mackiel, who has lived in South Amboy for over 30 years, has consistently voiced his concern over the Amboy Aggregate area of South Amboy. He believes that the area is causing environmental issues such as dust mitigation and air pollution, and there are plenty of construction ideas that could better the town in the long run, including a sporting facility.

"The Amboy Aggregate area is large enough to support a minor league baseball complex, something that Sayreville has already started working toward for their city," Mackiel said. "We can have a facility used for baseball or soccer which would benefit the town in terms of public use and business possibilities."

H2M Associates Incorporated, a consulting engineer and architect company who assist environmental projects, in wrote a letter to the South Amboy planning board in 2010 about the status of the Amboy Aggregate area. H2M Vice President Stanley Puszcz explained, "The existing system of oscillating sprinklers on top of one stockpile is woefully inadequate" to dust control, and Mackiel believes it could eventually harm a number of people in South Amboy.

"Right now we have a very limited facility that has nega-

with dust and other issues." Mackiel said. "I'm not looking for the moon, but I'm asking for a company to move toward a better solution or a settlement that will satisfy everyone and will be positive for residents, town officials, and the company itself."

Mackiel believes that all of these changes can be made to better the city of South Amboy, but only if the council has a political leader in place to move in the right direction. He does not question all the decisions of the town's officials because they have their own responsibilities, but thinks the status of the planning board needs to be addressed the best it can

"We need to have a political leader in town that will help move in the right direction and make it clear that there is a problem with the environmental status of South Amboy," Mackiel said. "We need some sort of public pressure or voice that moves us because right now I see nothing moving us forward."

Mackiel has voiced his opinion at a number of South Amboy council meetings, questioning a number of resolutions passed and what the town is doing about fixing the environment. His display of passion for the residents of South Amboy was at a high point in January when he wore a dust mask out of town hall to protest the air pollution.

"I used a dust mask at the meeting to exhibit in my own

way without any public outburst or challenge to show the problem," Mackiel said. "It's a citizens right to stand up and sign their complaints, and I want to offer options to move the city into the future."

At that meeting, Mayor Fred Henry noted that South Amboy has always done what's best for the town's residents, and that things are moving along the best they can. However, Mackiel believes that more can be done to better the area.

"We all need to get working on the behalf of the town's residents, and I believe that certain politics shouldn't interrupt the path to future success," Mackiel said. "Anyone with a concern for South Amboy is responsible for the future, and everyone working together is a lot better then working against each other."

Mackiel announced that he would be running for 2nd ward councilmen this year in an attempt to bring change to the decisions in South Amboy. He believes that the residents in town trust his judgment and respect his effort to make things right.

"I have taken part in a number of town functions with a good amount of organizations, and I think South Amboy residents have come to respect me better and acknowledge the effort I'm making for improvements," Mackiel said. "I believe that I've spoken out with my concerns a number of times, and that our residents






know me better and know I'm doing what I can to protect them."


