

Fire Chief Volk Fields Questions About 6/3/12 Cortlandt Street Fire

PERTH AMBOY - Fire Chief David Volk gave an extensive explanation to a question from a local resident who lives 1 1/2 blocks from the Cortlandt Street fire. The resident questioned whey some of the hydrants in the immediate area of the fire had either no pressure, low pressure or not a drop of water coming out of them. Fire Chief David Volk explained the reason behind this, "Hydrants in a certain radius are on the same grid. If one hydrant on the grid needs extra water it will pull excess water from another hydrant." He compared it a similar situation on a smaller scale: if someone has water running, for instance in the kitchen and someone else turns on a faucet in another part of the house, for instance in the bathroom at the same time, pressure from one of the faucets will drop. "That is why you can't pull all the water out of the same grid."

In a phone interview, Fire Chief Volk explained that each hydrant is supposed to get 700 gallons of water per minute. "We had to get water from State Street and West Side Avenue, which have bigger mains and grids."

"The hydrants are num-

their data that they gather on hydrants when they do their maintenance. The Fire Department flushes the hydrants. If is there is any problems with the hydrants that are flushed a report will be submitted to the Business Administrator."

B.A. Greg Fehrenbach stated that he had not gotten any reports stating there were any problems with any fire hydrants.

The hydrant numbers are more of an assistance to the water company and there are over 700 of them. Water fluctuates for hydrants also because of pipe replacements. We have good equipment but you can't plan or design a water system for the size of this fire. Two houses were fully engulfed when I arrived on the scene," Volk stated.

Volk compared this fire to the Harbortown fire (December 2010) where they were forced to go outside the grid because of the intensity of the fire.

Volk also mentioned that, "This was a very intense fire," comparing it to the fire at Water's Stadium in the 1980s that burned down the wooden grandstands including the concession stands, lockers and bathrooms. "You can't plan for a fire that intense."

tures on Cortlandt Street, #654 (which is still standing) was built in 1919; #664 was built in 1899; #660 was built in 1909; #662 was built in 1899; and #656 was built in 1899. They were all Balloon Houses."

(Balloon framing was a popular construction method in the 19th Century up until the mid 1950s.)

911 received the first call at 3:45 a.m. It came from 662 Cortlandt St. "Based on our investigations and interviews there may have been a possibility of the fire spreading because of people trying to put the fire out themselves." Volk emphasized that you should get out of a house or building quickly and close the door behind you. "Everyone was out of the building when we got there."

Frustration Mounts at Perth Amboy Board of Education Special Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Frustration mounted at the special Perth Amboy board of education meeting on June 13th as the board attempted to agree on the Superintendent's propositions for the 2012-2013 school year.

The agenda for the meeting consisted of 38 different items that needed board approval, but only 32 were successfully motioned and passed. The entire process took over four hours, including a two-hour private session and two hour discussion.

Conflict ensued over two portions of the agenda, one including the Teach-to-One program and the other dealing with Reading Horizon Training. Vice President Kenneth Puccio was firmly against the Teach-to-One program, insisting that he would not allow Perth Amboy's education system to become privatized. "We are spending a lot of money for outside consultants to come in with no guarantee that it will work," Puccio said. "Why do people have to come in and teach? We don't need to privatize Perth Amboy because we have teachers that can teach the kids. We will not privatize this school district while I'm on this board."

Superintendent Dr. Caffrey defended her plan to bring Teach-to-One to Perth Amboy, saying that the teachers of the district strongly supported the idea and that this program would be the best way to improve scores in the middle school.

"I urge the board to move forward with the plan and let it pass today. It can dynamically transform the Mc-Ginnis School," Caffrey said. "I'm not privatizing the school district, that's not what this is. The teachers brought this idea to you."

AFT President Donna Chiera, who sat in the audience for the entire meeting, took Caffrey's side during the public session of the meeting. She confirmed that the teachers did approve this new program, and that Teach-for-One would definitely help the district's test scores. "Dr. Caffrey was 100 percent right about the Teach-for-One program. The teachers were excited about it and based on that excitement, the AFT supported it," Chiera said. "This has nothing to do with the cost or privatizing the district." The board was also split on proposition six which would bring in Elizabeth Willaum to instruct the staff on Dual

Board Appointments Questioned

PERTH AMBOY - Resident Alan Silber was one of several people questioning some of the appointments of various Board Members. He questioned a resolution to appoint the Mayor to the Redevelopment Agency for a term to expire on June 30, 2017. "Wouldn't it be embarrassing and uncomfortable to have a former Mayor on the Board? Shouldn't we wait until after the elections to do appoint-

ments? Can't we just fill seats for six months temporarily? Attorney Mark Blunda said it depends on the Boards. Some are covered by state statute. If a seat becomes vacant before that person's term ends, you can have someone fill that seat until the term expires. We can look at each Board individually and see if the Council can change the stature of the terms of the Board.

Councilman Fernando Gon-

zalez said, "The Zoning Board excludes you from being on other Boards." Speaking to Blunda, he said, "He should advise the Mayor so she can make appointments appropriately."

Businessman David Caba said, "I don't have time to be on 3 Boards. I am looking at the list on the agenda and there are some people on 3 Boards.

Language Training. Some believed that the training would better the district, but it would eventually be tabled until the next board meeting due to a lack of data needed for further action.

"I want to see data for this year compared to last year before we move this proposition, we don't even know the results yet," Puccio said. "I'm not saying to do away with the whole thing, but I'm not comfortable changing our dual language program without seeing the data. The training is not for another two months, why is it important to vote right now? Wait until we have more information."

Board member Israel Varela was against many of the decisions proposed by Caffrey, explaining that he did not have the proper information

on most of the propositions to confidently vote. Varela would eventually vote "nay" on 16 propositions, and wished that more information were given to the board before they decided to meet and deal with these important issues.

"I'm uncomfortable voting on this whole situation and almost everything on the agenda. We are not getting the information we need," Varela said. "I am unable to have an intelligent conversation on most of this, and I wish I had a little more knowledge."

There were also comments made about Caffrey's current job status, which was brought up by a number of board members during debates on the propositions. Along with Puccio commenting on her attempt to privatize the school district, Caffrey shot down accusations that she was getting paid to bring in programs such as AMIkids.

"There were some rumors

that I was getting paid off by some of these programs. When it was voted to place me on leave... one of the items on the list said I was getting a financial advantage by bringing them into Perth Amboy. That is not true," Caffrey said. "I'm doing what is best for our kids. There was a belief that I was getting paid off to put it on the agenda... so I believed it was due for another vote."

The board recently voted to invoke the doctrine of necessity for a second time against Dr. Caffrey, but no further action was taken and Caffrey remained Superintendent. Board attorney Isabel Machado addressed the comments made by the rest of the board, urging them to refrain from making comments about Caffrey's status and remaining focused on the meeting's real goals.

The propositions that were tabled will be discussed at the next Board meeting on June 28th.

Lessons to be Learned: A Joint Venture Sounds Good to Us

Recently, the "Perth Amboy Young People History Hunters Program" was presented to the City Council by Dorothy Daniel. The idea is to get the children to visit all the historical sites in the surrounding area. Dorothy Daniel provided each Councilman with a copy of the Raritan Millstone Guide to Historic Sites in Central Jersey. The basic idea behind this program is to get the children acquainted with the historic sites in the New Jersey, specifically in Perth Amboy. "If you teach the children about history, especially in the town where they live, they in turn will pass this knowledge along to their parents," Dot Daniel explained to the Council.

She went also on to say that she herself didn't know the history about William Dunlap. Nor were any of the residents who lived in Dunlap Homes Complex. She also mentioned that she was not aware that Thomas Mundy Peterson was the first black voter under the 15th Amendment and he was from Perth Amboy. She learned about these facts as an adult.

Daniel said, "Catholic Charities runs afterschool programs for the Dunlap Homes children. The Housing Authority, YMCA and Alianza would like to partner together to plan trips to have the students of Perth Amboy go to the historic sites at least once a week during the

summer. All of these entities have their own transportation and we can borrow each other's busses when necessary,"

Daniel stated, "We can make arrangements that each organization can provide interchangeable chaperones. Each time a student visits a historic site, we can give them a certificate. When they return to school, they can truly talk about what an exciting summer they had." She also spoke to Woodbridge about doing a similar summer program.

Councilman Bill Petrick wanted to know how many children would be participating in this program.

Councilman Joel Pabon said, "Each organization has 75 children or more participating in summer school programs."

Petrick stated, "I would like to see Perth Amboy sites visited first by the participants in this program."

Carolyn: I for one am all for this project. As a member of the Historic Preservation Commission, it is extremely important that we highlight the history of Perth Amboy. It is too important for it not to be recognized for the contribution it has made to not only to our country but worldwide.

Katherine & Paul: Perth Amboy was described by one individual as "One of the 10 most historic sites in the United States." Perth Amboy's rich history needs to be told, espe-

cially to the children. Many of Perth Amboy's citizens have no knowledge of the history of our City. Mainly because: 1.) it is not taught in our schools; 2.) many of the children of our town are immigrants or children of immigrants and have no knowledge of Perth Amboy history.

Perth Amboy includes such historical sites as the Royal Governor's Mansion (home to William Franklin, the last Royal Governor), the Kearny Cottage (home to Commodore Lawrence Kearny), the Historic Ferry Slip (site of the famous Tottenville Ferry), St. Peter's Episcopal Church (one of the oldest Episcopal Churches in New Jersey), The Simpson Methodist Church (and its famous clock tower), an original Carnegie Library, and the oldest functioning City Hall in the United States to name some.

Perth Amboy was also the first in many moments in history. Perth Amboy was once the capitol of New Jersey. The Bill of Rights was first signed in Perth Amboy. The first flight of a dirigible took place over Perth Amboy with the flight of Solomon Andrew's Aereon. The USS Holland, the first submarine was tested in Perth Amboy's Dry Docks. During the 19th Century Perth Amboy was the site of the Raritan Bay Union and its famous school Eagleswood which spawned many poets, artists, inventors, etc. In the 1930s Perth Amboy had the largest roller rink in the world. Much of the terracotta in New York City was manufactured in Perth Amboy. Also it is the 100th Anniversary of the first air-mail flight between South Amboy and Perth Amboy. A Cancellation Stamp has been proposed to celebrate this anniversary. These list of "firsts" is quite extensive. What other town can boast so much?


City of Perth Amboy Benefits from Settlement



PERTH AMBOY - This week on the fishing front, fluke action has been at its best with many reports and great fish are coming into the shop. One of Amboy Marina's finest fisherman, Bob Woods of *The Maryellen* when out and limited out in no time with two at 21" one two 171/2" and a 20" all on gulp. What a catch! Great Job!

Victor Dennis brought in four striped bass caught on chunk bunker. Fishing the night shift is verifying that stripers are still in the area along with the blues cocktail. Blues made their way in following the herring. Peanut bunker has been spotted in the bay as well. Reports from the guys coming off the sea hawk have been excellent with plenty of fluke being landed. The number of people going out are getting better by the day. Captain Vinny of The Morning Dew has been landing the fish as well, making his charters



very happy. The captain has a open boat on Sundays. For more info call 732-322 -2456. This week hot spots:

- Fluke the angle ,highlands, flats the ammo the boats and the outer bridge are worth giving a shot.
- The bunker been spotted at Great Kills and the Raritain River
- Bass- deeper cooler water by the channel, Great Kills and the ammo have reported some nice fish.
- Blues- by the coastline up and down to say the least

Fresh bunker has still been the top seller at the shop. Bunker heads have been landing some nice bass while chunks been working on the blues. Small fact - fluke love bunker! I often use bunker chips for fluke. I slice chips off by the tail end of the bunker thick enough to hook one time through. I've had great success with this method.

Live killies have been blowing out of the shop. I'm lucky my killie guy brings me some jumbo killies that everyone seems to love along with clean ready to go squid strips. Along with white gulp minnows teaser rigs have been doing the job right this week. Blues are loving the metals krocs. Avas cripples herring cast masters and blue fish bombs all been selling well aside from bunker. Eddys Tip: Since crabs are becoming more active - check your bait more often to make sure that your not sitting on a empty hook. Also check for seaweed. It can cover your bait. I like to change my bait every 15 min or so and give it a nudge here and there if things are slow. It just might catch the attention of a fish passing by.

This week I had a guest ask me if I could show him how to snell a hook. I teach a class on basic fishing 101 which covers simple effective tips and techniques and a Q & A. Sunday mornings from 5:30 a.m. to 6 a.m. Anyone and everyone are welcome. Veteran anglers that would like to participate and share some knowledge are encouraged to come.

- 1/8 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1 teaspoon dried tarragon


1 tablespoon minced green onions

Shiva Nata

What is Shiva Nata?

PERTH AMBOY - Shiva nata, translated to "dance of Shiva," is a systematic approach to a traditional style of dance that has the potential to make you smarter, more compassionate, more creative, more intuitive, more coordinated and more self-aware. It can accomplish all this based on a fairly new scientific concept called "neuroplasticity." And it can accomplish all this in as little as five minutes a day.


Neuroplasticity is the idea that your brain is not a concrete object inside of your skull that develops only until a certain point in childhood, but rather, that it is constantly changing and adapting through our entire lives, even in our senior years. Neuroplasticity is proved every time someone loses the ability to talk or walk after a stroke - but then with therapy regains that ability. It is also proved by recent advances in cochlear implants that allow people who have been deaf all their lives to hear for the first time. The main way our brain communicates is through the connection between neurons. The more we do something, the more certain neurons fire. Similar to the ways that muscles become stronger when we work them out at the gym, if we are always thinking and doing the same things, those

same neural connections can potentially become stronger. This leads to adages like "you can't teach an old dog new tricks." Because we can potentially become stuck in older patterns of thought, it does become harder for us to learn new things, and to create new neural connections.

Enter the dance of Shiva. Shiva nata is a mind-body exercise where practitioners learn 8 basic arm positions and then combine them into increasingly complex patterns. The actual process of learning and executing these patterns is what engages so much of your brain at one time that it helps to create these new neural connections. First, you have to learn the individual hand positions. Then you learn a pattern. Then you have to coordinate waving your arms around in this specific pattern. If that is not challenging enough, one can always learn the four basic foot positions (and the four different ways one can move in and out of those positions) and add those in as well. Sound hard? That's the point. No one ever went to the gym and said, "Yes, I think I'm going to work with the one pound dumbbells today." When one wants to improve something about themselves, a challenge is always involved. In fact, the only way someone working on a Shiva Nata patterns can tell that they are actually giving themselves a mental workout is if they are, in fact, making a mistake every now and again while moving through a sequence.

But one of the great things about Shiva nata is that anyone can do it. Starting out requires very little beyond the interest to give it a try. No special gear or clothing needs to be purchased. Attending a class only requires that you wear comfortable clothing you can move your arms freely in. It can be done while standing, but even that is not necessary if you do not engage your legs. You can sit in a chair if that is more comfortable, or even cross legged on a comfortable cushion on the floor. Positions can be adapted if you have a limited range of motion. And of course, the teacher will never make it so hard that it becomes frustrating, it will be just enough of a challenge to jump start those neurons. Since it is primarily an arm workout, you can expect your arms to be sore the first time you try it, and that's ok, because you can take as many breaks as you need. A typical Shiva nata class can be anywhere from 30-60 minutes, but once you take the basic moves home with you, your own practice can be as long or as short as you like. If you are creating enough of a challenge for yourself (and there are infinite ways to make it a challenge), you can reap the mental and physical benefits just from a 5 minute practice while you wait for your tea to steep each morning.




