Mr. Mainberger from Hatch Mott McDonald Engineers went before the Council to discuss the condition of the South Pier that was heavily damaged during storms from the last two years. The piers in question are located from the Armory Restaurant on Front Street to the Marina. According to Mainberger 35 piles were in such poor condition that it was not cost effective to do repairs. He recommended demolishing

Deputy Chief Ruiz Responds to Councilman's Concern about High Street and Buckingham Avenue

PERTH AMBOY - At the July 9, 2012 Council Caucus meeting, Councilman Fernando Gonzalez stated people near the Harbortown entrance are concerned about speeding cars. Some parked cars have been hit.

Deputy Police Chief Benjamin Ruiz stated, "Radars have been placed in that area and enforcement is limited. 4-way stops are not viable and state law determines where stop signs are placed. Every intersection on High Street has been

looked at. Many of the homes on High Street are multi-family. We have regulations that must be followed as far as stop signs are concerned."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez was also concerned about how many accidents have occurred on the intersections of High Street and Buckingham Avenue.



thority Michael George went before the Council carrying a duffel bag with him that contained bolts and stakes to show the Councilmen what the Authority used to repair their pier. He stated that money was spent from the Port Authority Budget and not the City's for their repairs. "The group that the Authority hired went underwater to inspect our pier. We have better bolts and only made a \$5 profit on each bolt." Chairman George said, "The City is being overcharged for repairs by the engineers. I think the pier should be rebuilt by using different materials. Inspect the South Pier thoroughly before demolishing it first."

Developer Barry Rosengarten said, "The pier was elevated to protect it from severe weather elements. Some of the piles were used in 1929 when the new piers were constructed. In the years 2010 through 2011 the piers were constructed correctly. I agree with Mr. George's evaluation."

**Business Administrator Greg** Fehrenbach said, "The cost and longevity of the pier is in auestion."



## Upsetting the Apple Cart

Every so often the Sadie I-phones, I-pads and the like. Dowdell Library in South Amboy will send the Amboy Guardian pictures and press releases where Amboy Bank has sent them either monetary donations to defray the cost of the library. The reason I bring this up is to compare the library in South Amboy to the Carnegie Library in Perth Amboy. The South Amboy Library which is newer than Perth Amboy's Library is connected to the High School on the left hand side and the middle school which is on the right hand side. Since the facility in South Amboy is newer, it is in much better condition than the Perth Amboy library built in 1901.

We think it is wonderful when financial institutions hand out scholarships or have programs to help students in the school system but you also have to remember that the schools are not the only educational institutions in town. Where do you think that students go if they need to do additional research and they may not have computers available at home?

If you haven't gone to the Perth Amboy Library lately, I suggest you pay a visit there ASAP. To have students go to a library that is in need of a great deal of repair with mold on the walls, paint peeling, overcrowded shelves and a roof that leaked for years is not that conducive to learning.

The roof was finally repaired this year and the conditions we described are on the main level. The children's library which is located on the lower level is in a little better condition. Unfortunately a lot of the books located on that level are deteriorating and it is a very sad situation. We are asking local banks to contact their corporate headquarters to make financial investments to local libraries becasue that is where students go to do more extensive research.

People use computers in the library to do research, job searches, and it may be the only communications they have to keep in touch with their relatives, friends and other loved ones overseas. Yes, we know that there are people that will abuse the system but let's not punish those who use the resources in the library to better their lives. These are just a few of the reasons why we are calling on the local banks to help defray the cost of repairs to the library.

We have noticed that some agencies have received large donations over and over again. We think the library trustees should go after those corporations for donations, too.

A video showing dire conditions of the Perth Amboy Library was filmed last year before the 2nd Annual Taste of Perth Amboy. Due to a programming glitch it was only shown on PA-TV twice. (And that was one day before the Taste of Perth Amboy). This 2011 video showed the conditions that existed at that time. Not much has changed. (The roof doesn't leak anymore).

You don't need special permission to go to the library. Take a look and see for yourself at the conditions.

We are going to piggyback

off of the Ambassador Program that Dot Daniel spoke about at the Council Meeting recently. This summer program was to introduce students to historic sites in New Jersey hopefully starting with Perth Amboy. With the Perth Amboy Library being a original Carnegie, it only makes sense that it should be on the list for students to visit. The library also should be in the forefront as an educational institution that should be slated for repairs as soon as possible

of that school was Hammarskjold (which no one could even spell). My principal's name was Joe Joesefowicz. He was a quarterback for Richmard. We decided to start a sports club and give some extra interest to these boys and girls. We had many different kinds of clubs and we met every Thursday afternoon. My club was for kids that didn't necessarily play sports but liked sports. Some people might remember a game called U.Pic, EmTry and Pick the winners of all the college football games each weekend. That spread like wildfire. We also had meetings each Thursday. We would talk about sports or show a film. This became a bore. I should add at this point that if you belonged to this sports club, you had a beautiful membership card. You were a H.A.C. (Hammanskjold Athletic Club). Adults all over East Brunswick had a membership card to H.A.C. It

was right next to your driver's license in case a cop stopped you. This gave me an idea and I started to think about sending membership cards to sports figures. Hey! I could ask them to speak on a Thursday afternoon and they might come and they did come. Our meetings were no longer a bore and we needed the auditorium to listen and see Wes Bogle from the Home News and Jersey Joe Walcott, the most famous boxer from New Jersey. The year was 1973 and our club had really flourished. That same year Frank Burns became Head Football Coach at Rutgers. I started to pay attention to Rutgers Football in 75 and 76. They went 9 and 2 and then 11 and 0 in 76. Big time Bowls passed them up because of their weak schedule. Burns mad that weak schedule tougher and the follow-



Former Perth Amboy Youth Pastor Charged with Sex Assaults

#### Press Release

PERTH AMBOY - Middlesex County Prosecutor Bruce J. Kaplan and Benjamin Ruiz, Acting Chief of the Perth Amboy Police Department, announced today that a former youth pastor has been arrested and charged with sexually assaulting a 12-year-old boy on numerous occasions more than a decade ago.

Jeffrey Mackintosh (DOB 8/11/1965) of Dinah Drive, Phillipsburg, was arrested at his home on July 19, 2012, at 9:15 p.m. on charges of aggravated sexual assault, sexual assault and endangering the welfare of a child. Mackintosh, who works as a computer technician, is being held at the Middlesex County Adult Correction Center in North Brunswick in lieu of \$150,000.00 bail. He must post the full amount before he can be released. He was arrested during an investigation by Investigator Gregory Morris of the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office and Detective Pete Boulieris of the Perth Amboy Police Department.

The investigation began on July 5, 2012, after the 12-year-old boy, now an adult, contacted the Perth Amboy Police Department.

The investigation determined that Mackintosh, while serving as youth pastor at the Glad Tidings Assembly of God Church, repeatedly sexually assaulted the boy between January 1, 2000, and December 31, 2000. youth pastor between 1993 and 2004, was responsible for church-sponsored youth activities such as sporting events and trips to shopping malls.

He was not affiliated with the church when it relocated.

He since has been a member of churches in Woodbridge and Cranford, but has not served in any official or volunteer capacities with those churches.

The investigation is continuing. Anyone with information is asked to call Investigator Morris of the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office at (732) 745-3600, or Detective Boulieris of the Perth Amboy Police Department at (732) 324-3868. As is the case with all criminal defendants, the charges against Mackintosh are merely accusations and he is presumed innocent until proven guilty.



This was the Garden State Bowl. Rutgers could have easily won that game but came up short 34-18. The following year impressed me the most. Burns took a Rutgers Team to play Tennessee before a homecoming crowd of about 85,000 in Knoxville. Rutgers won that game 13-7 and went 8 and 3 that year. I received my 1980 football schedule from Alabama and Rutgers was on it for the last game. I got membership cards out for our Athletic Club quickly to Paul Bryant and Frank Burns. They both responded with a thank you note and agreed to speak at our club. The game was played at the Meadowlands. I still have Bear Bryant's note. It says, "Thanks for the membership card and I'll see you at the game. Hope Frank doesn't

upset me." Alabama won that game 17-13. Frank Burns spoke at my club after that game and I received a wine from Paul Bryant. It read, "I'm sorry that I can't speak at your club because I have to prepare for a Bowl Game. Say hello to Frank for me and give him my best regards." Frank Burns had a 7 and 4 record that year. He was fired in 1983 after a 3 and 8 season. His record at Rutgers in eleven years was 78-43-1. He did all this with no equipment or tools to work with. Frank Burns was the greatest football coach that Rutgers ever had and they gave him the short end of the stick. He is upstairs now and has the tools and equipment he needs. He is with all the famous coaches up there and they have a beautiful home overlooking a huge and spacious stadium. God Bless you, Frank and I'll never forget you.





It is a great balance of vegetable, good protein, and carbs that leaves me satisfy but not too groggy after a meal.

AG: Do you have any other locations besides in Perth Amboy? Any plans for expansion in Perth Amboy or in other locations outside of Perth Amboy.

FL: We thought about it but didn't want to pursue it because it would mean separating the family as Fu Lin is a strictly family-run business. And also we think that if we spread ourselves too thin, we would compromise our quality and we definitely would not risk that. Therefore, there's no expansion plans in the immediate business.

AG: What do you find the easiest and the most difficult part of being in the restaurant business?

FL: The most difficult part is the hours, hours, and long

hours. Our restaurant is open 12 hours a day and seven days a week. We have only had two Whole family trips in the past decade, one for my uncle's wedding, and one for my college graduation. But knowing that we are doing good business and serving great food does make it worthwhile. The easiest part? It's nice to have the family together.

AG: Do you plan on adding any new items that may be unusual that you do not expect to find at a Chinese Restaurant? FL: We don't know, yet. That's why I am in the process of creating a new website and also a Facebook page. We want our clients to tell us what we can do better. There are already a dozen posts online and we are rank #1 on Google and Yahoo for Chinese food in Amboy. The new website will offer a more interactive platform for us to hear from our customers and become better in serving their needs. *AG: What do you attribute to your success?* 

FL: We cook food the way we like to eat. Fresh, clean, delicious. In an environment that we want to eat in, clean and inviting. # Tax Facts

Supreme Court Upholds Health Care Law

• A 3.8% surtax on the lesser of annual net investment income or the amount by which modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) exceeds \$200,000 (\$250,000 for married couples). "Net investment income" includes interest, dividends, royalties, rents, gains from dispositions of property and income from passive activities, but not tax-free interest or distributions from qualified retirement plans and IRAs. • A 0.9% surtax on earned income (e.g., wages) exceeding \$200,000 (\$250,000 for married couples).

But I think it helped me build charIn a landmark decision, the U.S. Supreme Court generally upheld the constitutionality of the controversial 2010 health care law. In addition to preserving mandates for health insurance coverage, certain tax provisions will take effect as scheduled in 2013, barring any subsequent legislation. Here's a summary of the main tax changes for 2013.

Medicare surtaxes: The health care law includes the following two Medicare surtaxes that could affect individual taxpayers: Currently, there's a \$5,000 limit on pre-tax contributions to a flexible spending account (FSA) used for dependent care expenses, but there's no such limit on health care FSAs. The law caps health care FSA contributions at \$2,500 starting in 2013.

Medical deductions: For 2012, you may deduct unreimbursed medical expenses in excess of 7.5% of your adjusted gross income (AGI). The law raises this AGI floor in 2013 to 10% for taxpayers under age 65. Other tax-related provisions by the Supreme Court. For instance, an individual will generally have to obtain "minimum essential health insurance coverage" or pay a nondeductible penalty, beginning in 2014. Another provision, which took effect in 2010, allows a qualified small business to claim a tax credit for part or all of the cost of providing health insurance.
