PERTH AMBOY - Senate Majority Leader Loretta Weinberg from Bergen Co., Sen. M. Teresa Ruiz from Essex Co., Sen. Nellie Pou from Passaic Co., Asm. Connie Wagner from Bergen/Passaic Co's., Asm. Annette Quijano from Middlesex Co., Mayor Colleen Mahr from Fanwood, Grissele Camacho, Chair of LUPE PAC (Latina's United for Political Empowerment) all came to speak in defense of Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda Diaz. The last supporter to speak was Assembly Speaker Sheila Oliver (Essex/Passiac Co's) who is also the first female speaker of the General Assembly.

The gathering of these women at City Hall Circle came about in response to personal e-mails sent to Mayor Diaz from Billy Delgado's political consultant, Jim Devine.

Some of the comments made by the women who spoke in the Mayor's behalf were as follows: Weinberg: "For generations, women have been told to sit down and shut-up iver: Stated it was a pleasure

and accept the fact that they are not as smart as men. It is sickening that in the 21st Century there are people running for office that still believe in this nonsense. Quite simply there is no room for this kind of rhetoric in the state of New Jersey."

Sen. Nellie Pou stated that she was concerned about the remarks, especially by one gentleman whose name is not even worth mentioning and that it is hard for Latina women. I'm asking Delgado to remove himself from remarks made by his campaign consultant. I look forward for returning back for Mayor Diaz' second term inauguration.

Asm. Connie Wagner: (a former high school guidance counselor) stated that the comments made by his consultant were very disrespectful. Wilda has stepped up to the plate to make Perth Amboy better. We can respectfully disagree without attacking character. Let's get back to the issues.

Assembly Speaker Sheila Ol-

to stand with other women and lend support to Mayor Diaz. I am familiar with Perth Amboy because of Bishop Donald Hilliard because of his work in the community. I've seen the growth and expansion of the downtown. I am shocked and appalled about the tone of this campaign. A crotch is not required to have intellect, to be savvy and to prove your leadership. #### Judge Cameron Pushes On - Continues Campaigning Until Decision is Made

NEW BRUNSWICK - The campaign of Former Perth Amboy Municipal Court Judge Jose Cameron announced today that the New Jersey Superior Court has restrained the Perth Amboy Municipal Clerk and the Middlesex County Clerk from printing and dis-

tributing Mail-In Ballots until

the court can hold a full hearing on the reasons why the Perth Amboy Clerk excluded Mr. Cameron from the ballot. The court entered the order at the request of the Cameron campaign, who has brought suit in Middlesex County Superior Court seeking to be included on the ballot for the November 6, 2012 election for Perth Amboy Mayor. (Jose Cameron v. Elaine M. Jasko et. al., Docket No.: MID-L-6265-12)

"Our campaign is very pleased that the court entered the Order to Show Cause. We are confident that we will get a full and fair hearing in the Superior Court. Our campaign will continue in full force on the streets of Perth Amboy because we believe that the nominating petitions that we submitted were more than legally sufficient," said Perth Amboy mayoral candidate Jose Cameron.


"Our campaign submitted 332 nominating petitions from legal Perth Amboy voters, 115 more than were required. No other campaign objected to our petitions. Somehow the City Clerk found that over for-

ty percent of these valid petitions were invalid," continued Cameron.

"We have gone to court to stand up for the right of the voters of Perth Amboy to have a full choice of candidates on November 6, and for the rights of the 332 lawful Perth Amboy voters who nominated me to be their mayor," concluded Cameron.

The court has scheduled a hearing for September 27, 2012 at 9 a.m. before Hon. Heidi Willis Currier, JSC at the Middlesex County Courthouse.

*Continued from Page 1* of ratables. Let's disagree with respect. I hope to hear from Billy Delgado about comments made by Jim Devine.

Devine appeared towards the end of the remarks made by some of the speakers and he tried to ask a question when he heard his name being mentioned. He was quickly surrounded by police officers who told him that he had to remove his car that was parked illegally around the curb of City Hall Circle.

After he moved his car to another illegal spot, he came back but was not successful at asking any questions to the Mayor or any of the women who spoke on her behalf. What happened instead is that Devine had a barrage of questions tossed at him from reporters from other media outlets. In the press packet distributed by those working on the Mayor's behalf were documents accusing Devine of domestic violence and child support arrears.

Devine answered back to the reporters, "I was never charged with domestic violence. We both (his ex-wife) filed domestic violence charges but they were dismissed. "I paid twice as much in child support. I proved I was overcharged."

Devine who is now the consultant to Billy Delgado's campaign worked for the Diaz Team in 2008 when Diaz pulled a major victory over the then 18 year incumbent Mayor, Joe Vas.

Devine stated, "There were a number of people to challenge Joe Vas. The Latino Alliance decided to unite behind one candidate. I helped elect Mayor Diaz and I'm proud of it. I left her four days before her inauguration. I have compassion for Wilda, but she lacks leadership. I sent e-mails to her but Delgado did not have knowledge of them."

Diaz said that the e-mails sent by Devine were demeaning to women in general. In a she said/he said press conference, Devine attempted to justify his comments to her which included calling her "stupid," "incompetent," and "not as smart" as Mayoral counterparts in surrounding cities referring to Dan Reiman of Carteret and John McCormac of Woodbridge. Also included in the email sent to Mayor Diaz, Devine did give her credit for the Buckeye Partnership at the former Chevron property. This is just a small sample of a twopage email sent from Devine to Diaz dated 8/27/12.



not to retain him after discovering his arrest for spousal abuse and failure to pay child support. In Devine's email from 8/27/12 he stated: "I have no reason to be dishonest, and had you asked at the time when it would have mattered I would have helped you get the city on track. You never called," referring to after Diaz won the 2008 Mayoral election.

After the event broke up the Amboy Guardian asked Senator Joe Vitale if he had any comments to make. He said that it was a great turnout of women across the spectrum supporting the Mayor. The personal e-mails that the Mayor received were demeaning and I was stunned by the comments that Devine made.

Vitale also said that the worst part is that Billy Delgado saw the e-mails Devine sent out. When asked if he had given the e-mails personally to Delgado. Vitale stated that he had given them to someone working in Delgado's headquarters.







Press Release 9/19/12 PERTH AMBOY -- Mayoral Candidate for Perth Amboy Frank Salado, released the following statement regarding offensive statements by Billy Delgado to Mayor Wilda Diaz.



#### Caffrey Placed on Leave for Second Time Vivian Rodriguez Becomes Superintendent

PERTH AMBOY - The large crowd of parents and teachers at Perth Amboy High School erupted in applause when the Perth Amboy Board of Education placed Superintendent Janine Caffrey on administrative leave last Saturday.

After an hour-long private session, the Board passed a resolution to not only place Caffrey on leave but also name Assistant Superintendent Vivian Rodriguez as active Superintendent. The board also unanimously voted to not bring Caffrey back as Superintendent once her current deal expires.

"Many of you are aware that an administrative law judge issued a decision to uphold our vote last May to place Dr. Caffrey on administrative leave," Board President Samuel Lebreault said. "That decision is under review by the Commissioner of Education, but the final ruling isn't expected until late October. Our attorneys have advised us that nothing prevents us from taking new action in the meanwhile if we think it is warranted."

Lebreault also commented on the dark times the district has undergone since the problems with Caffrey began. He believed that the Board needed to take action now in order to prevent further issues.

matter of public record," said Lebreault. "We must take action now to avoid further turmoil as the new school year gets underway. This board remains committed to moving the district forward and will make all steps necessary."

The board also met in private session to discuss the possibility of bringing on Dr. Librera to assist them through the process of replacing Dr. Caffrey. Librera has been helping the school district fix their grading problems over the past few months and many board members believe he will help reduce the stress going forward. "I am proposing that we engage with former Commissioner of Education Dr. William Librera as a consultant to help this board work through these issues during the transition period," Lebreault said. "He will bring experience and perspective to move toward stability."

Once the Board opened it up to the public, there were mixed comments about the current status of the district. Union president Donna Chiera was hopeful that the decision would help move the district forward.

"I'm hoping today is the new first day of the school year," Chiera said. "The people I represent want to come here everyday and teach the kids. This vote should take the indecision out of the classroom, and I believe Vivian Rodriguez is the perfect person to take us to the next step."

Some residents like Junior Iglesias were not convinced by the Board's decision, saying that it was disappointing that they were going in this direction.

"This decision is going to cost the district a lot of money, and I don't want to pay more taxes with the decision that the Board is making," Iglesias said. "I also believe William Librera is a state monitor, and it is disappointing to know that someone from the outside has to come in and tell the Board how to do their jobs. It's sad to see our district going in this direction."

The Board attorney and President Lebreault explained later that Dr. Librera was coming to Perth Amboy because they asked him to, not because the state was sending him.

"Dr. Librera will not be coming to assist us unless the Board wants him to be here," Lebreault said. "The state approached us to see if we wanted assistance, but we made it clear that we would like to do it on our own."

Dr. Caffrey was not in attendance for the special meeting, but will continue to make her annual salary until a further decision is made. Board members Dianne Roman, Kurt Rebovich, and Mark Carvajal as well as Vice President Kenneth Puccio and Board Secretary Derek Jess were also not






