

#### **Perth Amboy Board of Education Debates** Sandy Make-Up Dates

By: Joseph L. Kuchie PERTH AMBOY - The Perth Amboy Board of Education made an attempt to approve an alternate school schedule

as the city continues to recover from Hurricane Sandy. Schools were closed for a week after the city was hit with one of the worst storms in history, causing the Board to find alternative days to reschedule classes. Superintendent Janine Caffrey originally recommended six dates: January 21 (Martin Luther King Day), February 18 (Presidents' Day), March 28 (change from half day to full day), March 29 (Good Friday, half day), June 27 and June 28.

Donna Chiera praised Superintendent Caffrey's work during the storm and was happy that she made the dates available for teachers so quickly. However, she did suggest that the board take the selection a date further to prepare for a unpredictable winter.

"We have three days to make up. We have five days for spring break and we also have Memorial Day," Chiera said. "When you consider this, I suggest you put in Memorial Day and spring break but prioritize it so people have a sense of where we are going

event and we don't know what winter is going to bring. I'm concerned that if we get hit we will be playing the guessing game."

Linda Nagy, a teacher from Richardson School, was concerned about the idea of having school on Good Friday. Although it was only scheduled as a half-day, she noted that 75-80 percent of the district is Roman Catholic and it should be considered a solemn day.

"One of those days is Good Friday. It's the most solemn day of the Roman Catholic calendar and I just ask you to reconsider it," Nagy Said. "To me, even if you did Memorial Day or the Friday from the end of spring break that would be good, I just have an issue with Good Friday and I know many

students have the same denomination as me."

When the discussion was brought to the Board, the priority was to find a replacement day for Good Friday. Milady Tejada and Diane Roman brought the date up to debate, and suggested that something be done to honor the religious holiday.

"I recommend that this Board look at an alternative date for Good Friday. I think we should respect the wishes of the community," Roman said. "I've talked to the Superintendent and I believe we should eliminate that day and observe it."

Dr. Caffrey made the suggestion to replace Good Friday with Memorial Day on May 27 to work with the teachers

By: Jennifer Lilonsky SOUTH AMBOY - Disappointed and troubled residents want to know where Mayor Fred Henry and City Council members were after Hurricane Sandy wreaked havoc on South Amboy but received little explanation at the special council meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 14.

The only council member that residents actually saw while coping with the aftermath of the storm was Councilwoman Christine Noble who most thanked at some point during the meeting.

But for residents like Nancy McLaughlin, and many others in attendance who only saw one City Council member out power and some residents without homes, the response was unacceptable.

"I'd like to commend the police, the fire department and the first aid. They did a marvelous job during this disaster," McLaughlin said to the council. "But where were you guys?"

Councilman Michael Gross jumped in to respond before the Council President and said that he was working with the county as a member of the Middlesex County Office of Emergency Management before and after the storm.

And when McLaughlin asked whether his priority is the county or South Amboy,

Continued from Page 1 wishes and preserve spring break. She noted that she would prioritize that day so it could be put back as a holiday if the district didn't need to use it.

"In talking and hearing Ms. Nagy's comments, It seems to me that May 27, Memorial Day, would be an alternative so we preserve spring break," Caffrey said. "By putting five days on the calendar we are preserving two snow days. If we don't need the snow days we can put May 27 date we put back into the calendar for a holiday."

However, the Board attorney warned Dr. Caffrey that there may be legal litigation that would prevent the district from having school on a Memorial Day, so she would have to look into it before officially passing the new dates. The Board tentatively approved the change, but it will be up to further discussion once the legal changes are made.

Student representative Jonathan Parris also sat with the board to discuss the recently cancelled Spirit Week. Although the hurricane forced the high school to close, the

student body has changed the dates of Spirit Week and announced the dates for Homecoming 2012.

"Spirit Week was postponed because of Hurricane Sandy, but we have come up with three dates next week to replace it," Parris said. "Monday will be 'Amboy Pride', Tuesday will be 'the blackout', and Wednesday will be 'college / sports t-shirt or jersey day'. Homecoming will be held on November 20th and the Homecoming football game will be on Thanksgiving."

Gross said that his obligation was to everyone and claimed to be working 'around-theclock' for both the county and the city.

Mayor Henry said that McLaughlin's question was unfair.

"Nancy, do you really think we weren't doing anything? Come on." Henry said. "If anybody was around here they would know that I was up at the first aid building everyday and at the senior center almost everyday."

No other council members commented on where they were and what they were doing after the storm.

But resident Barbara Pasternak was more concerned with the lack of communication following the storm after she looked at the city's website only to find notices about the Halloween parade being canceled and the senior citizen party suspended. "We were essentially stranded," Pasternak said. "I think there was a big lack of communication on the part of the government here. Not just where you were but you didn't say anything. You left people hanging and this is what happens."

The mayor also blamed the storm.

"This is a once in 500 year storm. We know that there was a problem. I admitted that there was a problem with those things," Henry said. "There are definitely things we need to look at."

But the city council has not had a meeting since the storm hit the city to discuss what went wrong and how they were going to improve, according to Connors.

Resident and first responder Tom Kross is alarmed that there is only one generator for the whole city.

"I spent many hours in the firehouse that had no electricity, no generator, we were having heat from a stove," Kross Kross said. "Think about that please."

And to make matters even worse, Connors tried to adjourn the meeting about 30 minutes into it while residents clearly had their hands raised throughout the room waiting to address the council. Connors tried three times to close the meeting, each time raising his voice over the sounds from the audience who were in disbelief.

It was only after the emotional response from residents that Connors kept the meeting open, letting people finish their statements.

"They want to be here. Let's go," Connors said.

Resident Ken Feeley expressed strong feelings about

Connors agreed with her assessment while the mayor blamed the problem on not being able to get in contact with the person who maintains the city's website and claiming his computer crashed.

said. "In this day in age when you have first responders that are working out of prehistoric times there is absolutely no need for it."

Connors did not let Kross finish the rest of his statement and cut him off mid-sentence because the timer rang.

The audience immediately responded to Connors' behavior with disdain, gasping in shock.

Kross's father later addressed the council regarding this issue suggesting that time limits for residents to speak be waived in situations like these.

"These people have concerns. Legitimate concerns and they can't speak their mind,"

what happened during and after the storm and received applause from the audience after saying that he did not see First Ward Councilman Donald Applegate for nine days following the storm.

Feeley went on to criticize the behavior of the city government, excluding Councilwoman Noble.

"What I just saw, especially from you Mr. Connors, raising your voice over these people," Feeley said. "Go home tonight and I'm serious. I want you all to really think about that because the only people we were able to rely on were the police department, our fire department and our EMS."



These bills were reintroduced earlier this year and had been in committee ever since, the only sponsors are the legislators for the 19th district. I would thank them for their concern and efforts, but the people who approached them about these bills mislead them as to how best to pro-



ceed to help the Proprietary House. If these funds were by some chance to be granted they would be administered by the Historic Trust which has both funding limits \$50,000 for programs and \$700,000 for construction and guidelines for how to qualify for funding. Lastly there are two other issues which would be issues under this funding, the Proprietary House is in need of extensive repair but the association is only a tenant on the first two floors of a building owned by the state. If you want to repair and restore the house you should increase the State Parks Department maintenance budget and have them fix the building. Secondly the Historic Trust has announced a new round of grants for this year in the amount of \$1,100,000. This leaves \$2,179,459, it seems no one told them they going to be giving all of their funding away.

Several months ago in anticipation of receiving this money MOPA drew up a wish list. In addition to making repairs to a building owned by the state, they had a plan to buy and demolish all of the homes around the House in order to create a park and parking spaces. The first question is, if you were to spend the money to purchase and demolish the homes and then landscape the property, who is going to pay to maintain it and in a City with the financial problems of Perth Amboy do we really want to wipe out tens of thousands of dollars in ratables to create a parking lot?

In this wish list presented by MOPA there was also to be funding provided for their three other projects. I had stated to the City Council that if this bill were to pass and the funds were provided to the Association, any money that was passed to either MOPA or their projects they would be violating 2C:27-12, Crime of corruption of public resources, which in this case would be a crime of the second degree.

It should be clear that those in charge of the promotion of the historic nature of the city have little understanding of historic preservation, the funding of preservation or of the needs of a city such as Perth Amboy; they seek only to gain control of what they believe to be a large sum of money.

I will now turn to the restoration work that has been done in the House. It is true the Mr. Hogan spent a lot of time and a lot of money redecorating the

first floor. It is also true that the house was toured by the 19th district legislators who admired the work that was done. That does not mean that they approved the work that was done. The lease in effect for the use of the House states that any work done in the House must reflect the historical aspects of the house and be approved before work starts by the Office of New Jersey Heritage and the New Jersev Historical Sites Council. There had been an extensive study done to develop a historically accurate plan for the painting and decorating of the House. Mr. Hogan was advised by a local historian that what he was doing was not in accord with that plan and did not reflect the history of the House. He chose to ignore this advice and continued as he wished.

The current leadership of the Association brought in a professional contractor who is associated with a local home improvement center. The opinion of this contractor and other people associated with the home improvement center was that not only was the work not done in accordance with the prior study, but that the work was of substandard quality and in fact structural damage had been to the house during the redecoration process. They recommended that the damage be repaired and the entire process be redone. The Association then with the cooperation of the home improvement center agreed to underwrite the entire restoration program. If you were to visit the Museum today you will see the historically correct work done by this contractor with materials donated by the improvement center at no cost the Association or the state. The Proprietary House Museum stands in the best shape that it has ever been in since it was designated a historical site and the Association is attempting to put on a series of programs that will be of interest to the entire community. The Association is working hard to fulfill its mission to preserve and promote the Museum and are more than willing to work with the city in an effort to promote the history of our community. They should not be the subject to continued attacks by MOPA and members of the city administration.






