


The Amboy Guardian spoke to another resident on 12/10/12who said that most of the gar-

Special Perth Amboy Board of Education Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - On Dec. 3, 2012 there was a special meeting called at McGinnis School. The meeting was held because of the resignation of Board Member Kurt Rebovich. Rebovich accepted a position on the State Board of Education in Trenton.

A resolution to accept the letter was moved by Obi Gonzalez and seconded by Milady Tejeda.

Board Members present at this meeting were: Board President Sam Lebreault, Board Members: Milady Tejada, Obi Gonzalez, Janelle Rodriguez, Israel Varela. Absent was Kurt Rebovich, Dianne Roman, Vice President Kenneth Puccio, Mark Carvajal. Also not in attendance were the Board Secretary Derek Jess, Asst. Superintendent Vivian Rodriguez and Superintendent Janine Walker Caffrey.

During the public portion of the meeting newly elected Board Member Maria Garcia spoke. She will be sworn in this January. Garcia criticized the Sitting Board for holding this special meeting which she felt was a waste of taxpayers money.

Garcia stated that the agenda for this special meeting was not published on the Board's website and the information was incomplete. She said, "This Board has sixteen special meetings in the past year. I would like to know the rules and regulations that you've had in the past to replace resigning Board Members."

Jeanette Gonzalez who has children in the school system said that she did not have a problem with special meetings being held. The advertisement about the meeting did not say that legal action will be taken. Gonzalez also said that there were meetings that were cancelled which caused tutoring for students to also be canceled.

This was due to the fact that there were programs on the agenda of canceled meetings and those programs couldn't be implemented because they could not be voted on.

Board Member Israel Varela said "I'm glad that Ms. Gonzalez brought up this problem." Varela said, "In the past phone calls have been made to Board Members to vote on agenda items that were on meetings that were cancelled. This was necessary, especially when it pertained to programs benefiting the students."

Gonzalez said, "There are some things that cannot be voted on by phone."

Local Resident Stanley Sierakowski commended the Board Members who followed the stature of the law. "It's important to have special meetings to take care of issues relating to students or personnel." Sierakowski also wanted to know when did Kurt Rebovich start negotiating with the State for this job? Did they approach him or did he initiate seeking the position for this job? If he approached the State for the job, did he have a conflict when voting on agenda items?



PERTH AMBOY - At the November 26 Caucus Meeting, B.A. Greg Fehrenbach discussed issues pertaining to property tax assessments. He brought up the fact that the assessor (Joanne Jimenez) had appeared before the Council several times, especially to answer questions from Councilman Fernando Gonzalez.

Fehrenbach explained that the sales or adjustments are

made by the county Board of Taxation. "This stopped our assessor from reducing evaluations in some neighborhoods. The Board of Taxation assessed \$160 million of reduced value. Our assessor figure was \$180 million of reduced value. Some of the areas will be reduced this year. There are some areas we thought would be reduced but will not be."

How To Move Forward After Your FEMA Letter Arrives

Press Release

TRENTON - Hurricane Sandy survivors have many options for obtaining disaster assistance even if they receive a letter stating they have insufficient damage.

The survivor has three key options after receiving an "ineligible insufficient damage" letter from

the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA):

• Appeal. Filing an appeal of an inspector's decision on habitability requires verifiable documentation to show there was disaster-caused damage that rendered the house uninhabitable. Appeal letters must be postmarked within 60 days after the date of the decision letter.

• Apply for a low-interest, long term disaster loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration. Loans are the main form of disaster assistance to households, and SBA representatives will work with survivors to find affordable terms. Applying for an SBA loan also preserves a survivor's potential eligibility for other forms of assistance, such as grants for replacing personal property losses.

• Get volunteer help. The path forward can also lead to the dozens of private, non-profit groups that have pitched in to help out in the response to and recovery from Hurricane Sandy.

Some groups provide volunteers to help out with minor repairs to real estate.

The "insufficient damage" determination is made by a housing inspector under contract with FEMA. After making an appointment with the survivor, the inspector views the property and assesses the impact of Hurricane Sandy on essential living areas.

The inspector is required to determine whether the home is safe, sanitary and functional. contact the FEMA Helpline at That is the definition of habit- 800-621-FEMA (3362), ability.

After the inspection, FEMA makes a determination about eligibility, and the disaster survivor receives

a letter from FEMA concerning the status of the application. The letter is a starting point about whether or not the applicant will receive disaster assistance.

A letter stating that the structure is "ineligible" due to "insufficient damage" means that the inspector found that the home or property did not sustain sufficient damage to essential living areas to qualify for disaster assistance. Essential living areas include one living room, one kitchen, one dining room,

and bedrooms sufficient to accommodate the number of persons occupying the house.

Although the disaster may have caused damage, the inspector found it reasonable to expect that

the applicant or the applicant's landlord would make the repairs.

Always read the FEMA letter carefully and follow the instructions. If there are any questions,

call the FEMA Helpline 800-621-FEMA (3362) or TTY 800-462-7585. The Helpline is open

24 hours a day, seven days a week, or visit a Disaster Recovery Center for one-on-one assistance.

Survivors should also refer to pages 20-26 of the booklet, "Help after a Disaster: Applicant's Guide to the Individuals and Households Program," which is mailed to everyone who registers with FEMA.

This guide explains all possible reasons for denial of assistance.

FEMA assistance is designed to cover disaster damage and losses not covered by insurance. If an insurance settlement does not cover all losses, or TTY, 800-462-7585.

FEMA Assistance Denial Still Offers Option For Appeal

TRENTON - Survivors have the right to appeal the Federal Emergency Management Agency's decision about what assistance they can receive.

You may ask for another review to appeal the amount or type of help provided or any other decision about federal disaster assistance.

Before asking for an appeal, it is important to review the "Help After a Disaster" applicant's guide. The booklet explains the different types of assistance that may be available to survivors and could answer some questions you have about the appeal process. Each applicant receives a copy and it is available online at www.fema.gov/helpafter-disaster.

When appealing, explain in writing why you disagree with a decision. Include any new or additional documents that would support the appeal. Be as specific as possible in the letter. Include materials such as itemized receipts and contractor estimates.







Santa Fly-in Press Release

PRINCETON - Thirty-seven years ago someone suggested that Santa fly into the airport for the area children watch. Over the years this event has evolved into a wonderful annual event for families and those less fortunate.

The tradition will continue on Christmas Eve day when the Nierenberg family, owners of Princeton Airport, will open the hangar doors to area children while they await Santa's arrival. The event began at a neighboring airport and the Nierenbergs brought the tradition to the Princeton Airport in 1985. This year the event will be held on Monday, December 24th. Airport Manager Kenneth Nierenberg (a.k.a. Santa) has confirmed Santa's arrival time to be 11:00 A.M.

Participants come from far and wide for this happening. If you wish to have your children participate in the event, please bring a wrapped gift for each child with the name in large print to the lobby of the airport. If you have several children, wrap the gifts in the same paper and tie them together to expedite the distribution. Gifts should be no larger than 12" to accommodate Santa.

On the day of the event adults are advised to bring the children prior to 11:00 A.M. and wait in the Maintenance Hangar. While waiting, members of the Princeton Airport Flying Tigers will be serving cocoa and cookies. Ms. Pat McKinley, a local folk singer, will lead the audience in a variety of holiday songs. Chris Maslanka will provide the sound system. Santa will call in on the airplane's radio to confirm his ETA (estimated time of arrival).


Once contact has been made with Santa, everyone will proceed outside onto the ramp in front of the hangar where they can watch Santa fly low over the runway. After he lands, Santa and everyone else will go into the hangar and Santa will distribute each gift individually.

The event will be held regardless of the weather conditions. Parents will have the opportunity to take pictures of their children on Santa's lap. Typically the distribution lasts about an hour and a half.

The most important feature of this event is the collection of gifts for needy children. If you plan to participate, you are required to bring new unwrapped gifts of clothing, books, or toys. These gifts are being collected and distributed through the Mercer County Board of Social Services. Although toys are a common donation, items such as scarves, mittens, and other articles of clothing are welcome. Personal checks made out to the "FoodBank Network of Somerset County" will also be collected. The airport will have a container for the public to donate canned or boxed food to help the local food banks in this particularly difficult year. The public is asked to be extra generous this year in light of the devastation of Hurricane Sandy. The airport will gladly accept contributions from nonparticipants also.

The airport will begin the collection the day after Thanksgiving and it has set a deadline for the collection of both the gifts for area children and the needy of December 16th in order to enable county workers to arrange for the best matches for the needy. The gifts can be deposited in the "chimneys" in the lobby at the airport between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. In fairness to all, Santa will distribute the gifts in the order in which they are received at the airport. Usually the distribution of the gifts is completed by 1:00 P.M. when Santa will continue his journey.
