Estimated Cost From Hurricane Sandy Over \$9 Million

Perth Amboy 11/26/12 Caucus Meeting





PERTH AMBOY - B.A. Greg Fehrenbach gave a breakdown of some of the cost associated with Hurricane Sandy. Some of the estimates came from the Department of Public Works estimated damage around \$1 million.

Hatchmont & McDonald who were in charge of doing the Waterfront repairs from previous storms gave an estimate damage of \$4.5 million, \$100,000 worth of damage to the building contents of the Harbor Master building.

Overtime by the City \$700,000. Damage to the towers in the Parking Utility: in the east tower of the Parking Utility 15 panels blew out, stairwells are unusable. There is buckling in the west tower. Estimated cost about \$25,000 to repair. \$65,000 to replace.

The water treatment plants: no electricity from about 7 to 8 days. Estimated cost: over \$1 million.

Water had to be purchased from the Middlesex Water Company. The Second Street Pump Station was under 8 feet of water and it affected a lot of their functions. Insurance will cover some cost.

"We are looking for FEMA funds. It is possible to get 75% of the cost covered," Fehrenbach stated.

Fehrenbach also said that the Department and Division heads, City employees, laborers all worked outside of the normal working hours for the welfare of the City. "There is a dedication and love people have for the City and their neighbors. To see the extent that this community came back, with coordination, and Larry Cattano was unshakable. The people of this City came back faster than Cities who were still looking for the light switch."

Progress Continues in South Amboy Cleanup

SOUTH AMBOY - The Department of Public Works have made several pickups of garbage from devastation due to Hurricane Sandy. One of the hardest hit sections in South Amboy was parts of John and Rosewell Streets. As you can see in the top photo that was taken on 11/27/12 this property was inundated with garbage that was posing a health hazard to the surrounding area.

The second photo taken a few days later shows the same area cleaned up.

A resident who is on the Board of the Raritan Harbor Village Raritan Reach Association called up Councilman Mickey Gross to voice her concerns about the Rosewell/John Streets section of town. She also called the Middlesex County Health Department.

Councilman Gross called her several times and within an hour assured her that section of town would be cleaned up by Friday (11/30/12).

The one building that still has a lot of garbage in front of it is privately owned and they are being fined by the City of South Amboy. (See Photo Page 2)

The resident who contacted Councilman Gross was also told that the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints voluntarily helped homeowners remove debris from their residences.

The numerous garbage bags were the results from garbage that was collected from contractors and the Church Members who assisted the residents in the cleanup.

The cost for the disposal will come under the FEMA grant.

Landings Residents Go Before Council to Outline Lawsuit Filed Against Developer Kushner

PERTH AMBOY - At the November 28th City Council Meeting Landings Resident Tracy Jordan went before the Council as she has done in the past. She presented the most pressing issues in the lawsuit filed by the Landings homeowners against developer Charles Kushner on October 31, 2012.

The causes of action asserted in this Complaint include (a) violations of the New Jersey Consumer Fraud Act; (b) negligence; (c) rescission; (d) breach of contract; (e) breach of the implied covenant of good faith and fair dealing; (f) breach of warranty; (g) breach of implied warranty of habitability; (h) fraud and misrepresentation; (i) promissory estoppel; and (j) unjust enrichment.

Some of the amenities that the plaintiffs were promised were: the building of three parks, community center, Waterfront Esplanade as well as other recreational improvements.

They were led to believe that this would be an upscale neighborhood.

All of this was to be completed by 2012. Out of the 17 luxury buildings promised in the project only 2 buildings have been built.

Other amenities promised were a marina with boat slips, retail shopping, restaurants, a hotel, a 6000 sq. ft. state of the art health club. Discrete and secure underground parking, a cultural center, a high speed fairy service to New York City, especially the Wall Street Area. They also were promised a security system and owners' cable television at all the luxury buildings.

The buildings were supposed to have been built with high grade quality construction materials and the contractors hired would only perform high end workmanship.

The defendants promised to build up and fix Washington Street which is adjacent to the Admiral and Bayview Buildings.

There was a high pressure sales pitch for potential homeowners to buy quickly since all 17 buildings would be filling up rapidly.

This was supposed to be a \$600 million development project. Of the promises and representations that the defendants made to the plaintiffs none were kept.

Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez suggested maybe the City of Perth Amboy can join in with the Landings residents in the lawsuit.



The Good, the Bad and the Ugly

When you area newly elected politician, you inherit from the previous administration the good, the bad and the ugly.

Case in point. Under the tutelage of former Mayor and Assemblyman Joseph Vas, the good that was inherited was Best Buy, Geek Squad, U.S. Food Services and other corporations on the outer Amboy Avenue section of Perth Amboy. Some of the other good included the renovations of some of the recreational parks baring Bayview (which in my opinion was better off before with band shell located close to Rector Street.

The way Bayview Park was redesigned makes it difficult for all sitting in the park to see the performers and band. The Landings is not the only development with broken promises. If you look at the original plans of Harbortown you can see how those plans also went astray. Hidden Village on New Brunswick Avenue was supposed to have a community center and swimming pool. Neither ever came to fruition and some of the land was taken away when they redid the railroad bridge to build the Municipal Complex.

Remember the original cost of the Municipal Complex ballooned from \$35 million to \$90 million.

This is a lot to inherit and to put on your plate. Anyone can come voice their complaints at Council Meetings. My father used to always say, "If you make a complaint, you should also offer some sort of solution to the problem.'

Landings Lawsuit

This letter was read at the Perth Amboy City Council Meeting on Wednesday, November 28, 2012

We have all suffered dearly from the latest blow nature has unleashed on our city. As all residents, we are most interested in supporting the plan for recovery from Sandy. We urge the City Council to continue to inform and elicit residents to participate fully in recovery

The Landings saw our sea wall breached and significant flooding occurred in vulnerable parts of the two buildings in the Landings. We are currently wroking with our insurance and FEMA/SBA to restore our already weakened buildings to their former working order and where possible mitigate the areas that could prevent this disaster from reoccurring.

The sea wall is of special concern. The developer, Kushner Industries was required to build the sea wall which was not sufficient to hold back Sandy's surge. We do not know what specifications were met, but one thing is certain is that it will need repair and mitigation in the future. I am sure Perth Amboy in general is looking at the needs for sea walls to defend all its low lying areas and we urge you not to forget our portion. We have not heard from the developer either about the sea wall or the nearly destroyed community room and fitness center that is still their responsibility under our Master Condo regulations. We ask your help to reach out to the developer to determine their intentions. If they are seeking FEMA/SBA low interest loans my understanding is they have to file by December 31.

As fate would have it, twentv homeowners from both Bayview and the Admiral, including myself, have filed a complaint in the Middlesex County Court principally against Kushner Industries, just before Sandy struck. We are represented by Patrick Whalen, esq. This is clearly a David vs. Goliath case. We have often offered testimony to the Council about our struggles with Kushner's represenof work, we have concluded we have to challenge the deceitful and misleading actions of the developer and others that led us to invest our savings and in my case my retirement money in the Landings. Personally, what particularly attracted me was the stated idea that Landings would be a key factor in the Renaissance of Perth Amboy. We also expected we would be getting a quality construction to establish a home in what promised to be a beautiful development. Instead greed seems to have gotten in the way and Kushner seems to believe that he can treat both the residents and the city with disdain and will challenge the idea that we are helpless in the face of his billions.

We know Patrick Whalen is interested din addressing PARA if the December 4 meeting will occur. He has urged us to share the Complaint so we will send it by e-mail to as many of you who share our goals.

Those Registered with FEMA will Receive a Letter From FEMA

Press Release

NEW JERSEY - After registering with FEMA, you will receive a letter from FEMA concerning the status of your application. The letter is a starting point about whether or not you will receive disaster assistance.

Read the letter carefully. Even if the letter says that you are ineligible, the reason might simply be that you have not provided all the information or documentation FEMA needs. It does not necessarily mean "case closed." The letter explains what additional information is needed or how to appeal a decision that you do not qualify for assistance.

Ask for help if you don't understand the letter. Call the helpline at 800-621-FEMA (3362) or

TTY 800-462-7585 OR visit a Disaster Recovery Center where you can talk with a FEMA representative about your particular situation.

To find the nearest disaster recovery center, log on to www.fema.gov/drclocator.

You may not have qualified for financial help right away, but that decision may change if you submit additional documents. Some of the reasons for an initial ineligible decision can be that you:

• You haven't submitted a settlement or denial determination from your insurance

company.

- FEMA needs more information to process your application
- You have not provided proof of ownership or occupancy.
- You did not provide records that showed the damaged property was your primary residence at the time of the disaster.
- You did not sign essential documents.

FEMA can never duplicate assistance from insurance or other government sources, but FEMA may be able to cover some of your uninsured losses. Providing the requested information or taking the required actions outlined in the letter might change FEMA's determination. The letter also explains how to appeal a determination. Appeals must be filed within 60 days of the date of the ineligible decision.

Remember: the letter from FEMA is a starting point. You should:

- Read the letter carefully.
- Ask questions and ask for help.
- Tell FEMA if you think the decision is incorrect. You have the right to ask FEMA to reconsider the decision.

Review The Pros And Cons Of Drips

Appropriately enough, investors may notice a slow trickle in earnings from "dividend reinvestment plans" (DRIPs). But these investments may end up providing a steady stream of income over the long run.

The concept is relatively simple. More than 1,000 companies and closed-end mutual funds around the country offer DRIPs to their shareholders. These programs enable shareholders to purchase stock directly from the company by automatically reinvesting dividends in additional shares. Many DRIPs also allow you to voluntarily make cash payments directly into the plan to buy even more shares.

Here are some of the main attractions of DRIPs.

- Most DRIPs don't charge any fee, or only a nominal fee, for purchasing shares.
- Participants may be able to purchase stock at a discounted price. The discount usually ranges from 3% to 5% and could be as high as 10%.
- The DRIP may allow you to send optional cash payments (OCPs), often for as little as \$10, directly to the company to buy additional shares. OCPs are often used to purchase fractional shares, thereby enabling investors to acquire blue chip stocks they might not otherwise be able to afford.
- It's easy to join in. Once you've chosen a particular stock, check to see if it has a DRIP. The company will furnish the specifics, including a prospectus and the appropriate application forms.

But that's not to say that investing in DRIPs is without drawbacks. There is a growing trend within the industry to charge a small fee for acquiring shares. Minimum amounts for purchases may be required. Also, the dividends that are reinvested are treated as taxable income, even though you don't currently receive any cash.

Consider all of the implications of investments in DRIPs before including DRIPs in your portfolio.



for each child with the name in large print to the lobby of the airport. If you have several children, wrap the gifts in the same paper and tie them together to expedite the distribution. Gifts should be no larger than 12" to accommodate Santa.

On the day of the event adults are advised to bring the children prior to 11:00 A.M. and wait in the Maintenance Hangar. While waiting, members of the Princeton Airport Flying Tigers will be serving cocoa and cookies. Ms. Pat McKinley, a local folk singer, will lead the audience in a variety of holiday songs. Chris Maslanka will provide the sound system. Santa will call in on the airplane's radio to confirm his ETA (estimated time of arrival).






Kiddie Keep Well **Christmas Donation**
