Five Hours Behind Closed Doors Seventeen Minutes of Face Time

PERTH AMBOY - The Perth Amboy Board of Education had a special meeting on Tuesday, February 5, 6 p.m. at Perth Amboy High School. After the Pledge of Allegiance, reading of the Public Notice, the reading of the Special Meeting Announcement and roll call, the Board Members went into an Executive Closed Session. That session lasted from 6:05 p.m. until 10:51 p.m.

When the Board returned from behind closed doors to resume the public portion of the meeting Board Members Obi Gonzalez and Milady Tejada did not return.

When the meeting resumed, President Mark Carvajal stated, "No formal action will be taken tonight." The purpose of the students to be there that the Executive Closed Session was to discuss personnel matters and matters involving the litigation against the Superintendent.

While the closed session was taking place, some of the Board Members had to recuse themselves. Board Member Israel Varela had to leave the meeting because of discussion that involved the Richardson School where his wife is a teacher.

Superintendent Dr. Janine Walker Caffrey also had to excuse herself from the closed session when discussions involving her came up.

Board of Education President Mark Carvajal also appeared in the auditorium during the closed session to talk to some students enrolled in an Honor Program. Those students were there because there was a problem they were having and they wanted the Board and the public to hear their concerns.

Board President Mark Carvajal gave the student's representative his personal contact information and also asked for theirs so he could get back in touch with them asap.

Board Member Israel Varela also spoke to the students while he was away from the closed session. Carvajal knew that the closed session was going to be long and did not want late.

Some of the students lingered at the meeting in spite of being told of the length of the closed session.

During the public portion of the meeting two people spoke.

One of the speakers was Reinaldo Aviles. He spoke referring to the length of the closed session. Aviles said, "I feel for you guys, being in a meeting for a long time. But how productive can you be? I'm not saying that you weren't productive during the meeting but your brains have to be fried." Avelis named Board at least one Board Member who has to

get up early and travel quite a distance to get to their job on time.

"It's not courteous have people wait so long. Maybe you should break it up into several meetings instead of one long one. You have a list of goals displayed behind you on a screen. But how many of those goals did you accomplish? Kids were here to discuss a topic and they had to leave because of the late hour. If it's about the kids, why wasn't there a break to have them heard? It's up to the Board President to do this."

Stanley Sierakowski brought up the Inter-district School choice for public school students that he discussed at the previous Board Meeting. He said that the program was posted on the Board of Education Website at one time but it was no longer there. "Did Middlesex County choose not to participate?"

As the meeting was going into adjournment, Board Member Israel Varela raised his hand to make a last minute remark.

Board President Mark Carvajal said, "The meeting has already been adjourned."

Varela was able to get a quick comment in. In response to Sierakowski's remark. Varela said, "Students in Middlesex County are participants in this program."

South Amboy Sandy Victims Face Tough Decisions

SOUTH AMBOY - Besides the emotional distress of losing their homes due to Hurricane Sandy, residents had to contend with spending endless hours on the phone with FEMA.

One resident the Amboy Guardian spoke to said that online applications were also available. FEMA inspectors were sent out to inspect damage to properties. Based on the inspector's findings they determined if a dwelling could be reconstructed or would have to be demolished.

Inspectors came out directly after the flood. Residents are also faced with the rise of insurance cost, especially if they need reconstruction or if they are required to do elevations on their property.

FEMA money was provided for repairs for renovations. Residents can also appeal decisions if they feel that money that FEMA estimated that was owed to them was insufficient.

This resident also met with six different contractors. Documentation had to be provided to the Middlesex County Construction Office of the work the contractors determined needed to be done.

The Amboy Guardian also questioned this resident in regards to money raised during the recent telethon. The fundraiser was held at the Old Bridge High School was to benefit residents of Sayreville, South Amboy and Old Bridge.

The South Amboy Planning Board who was working in conjunction with the Chamber is in charge of calling residents about disbursing money from the telethon. This resident had been contacted by them.

Gov. Chris Christie had telephone press conferences which talked about new elevation areas based on what happened because of the storm.

FEMA Breaks Down Communication Barriers On The Road To Sandy Recovery

News Release 2/6/13

TRENTON - Hurricane Sandy survivors in New Jersey live in one of the most culturally diverse states in the country and communicate in numerous languages. The Federal Emergency Management Agency works to reach all of them.

People with disabilities and/ or access and functional needs are now the focus of the first full-scale operation by FEMA to offer ready access to valuable disaster assistance and recovery information in

all disaster recovery centers.

Survivors can visit any disaster recovery center to connect with American Sign Language or Signed English interpreters either face to face by requesting it ahead of time, or in real time using Video Relay Services or Video Remote Interpreters.

Assistive listening devices, amplified phones and caption phones for survivors who are deaf or hard

of hearing are available in the centers, as well as magnifying devices and printed information in Braille and large print for people who are blind or have low vision.

Teams of FEMA Community Relations specialists – armed with publications in English, Spanish, Chinese, Italian, Korean, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Urdu, French and Braille canvassed communities affected by Hurricane Sandy.
 The teams are going door to door to deliver valuable recovery information and to encourage residents with damaged property to register for assistance.

To date, FEMA has translated more than a dozen disaster assistance fliers, brochures and pamphlets into 23 different languages.

Since the major disaster declaration for Hurricane Sandy, more than 650 Community Relations specialists have been in New Jersey, including more than 220 FEMA Corps members. Four dozen

of these specialists were bilingual or multilingual, speaking a combined total of 24 languages including American Sign Language.

Multilingual specialists also maintain contact with media outlets whose audience consists mainly of

non-English-speaking readers, listeners, or viewers. Spanish-speaking public information officers from FEMA have given dozens of interviews to Spanish-language media, appeared on radio talk shows and spoken with community groups across the affected area

Hurricane Sandy recovery updates are available in English and Spanish on the agency's website,

which is also designed for use by people with sensory disabilities. Spanish-speaking survivors can choose to follow FEMAespanol on Twitter to receive recovery updates.

Groups, associations and businesses that have non-English-speaking members who sustained damage

as a result of Hurricane Sandy and who want to know more about federal and state disaster assistance can contact FEMA's Speakers Bureau for presentations in 13 languages, if needed. Sign language interpreters are also available.

Multilingual telephone operators are available to help non-English-speaking survivors register

for disaster aid and to get their questions answered. After dialing FEMA's helpline at 800-621-3362

or TTY 800-462-7585, callers can choose Option 3 for other languages. FEMA can provide interpretation services in 250 languages. Those who use 711-Relay or Video Relay Services can

call 800-621-3362.

FEMA's multilingual webpage at www.fema.gov/alllanguages offers a wealth of disaster assistance information and Ready.gov can be viewed in 12 languages.




