



PERTH AMBOY - At the Caucus Meeting of 3/25/13 one of the Councilmen asked Mark Blunda if there can be limits on the amounts of licenses and permits issued to new businesses when there are already an over abundance of the same kind of businesses existing.

At the March 27 City Council Meeting, resident Reinaldo Aviles stated that if these types of businesses are successful in Perth Amboy there is nothing wrong with healthy competition. He said that people that come into Amboy are expecting a certain type of business then let it be.

At a previous Council Meeting some of the Council Members said that local established businesses wondered about competitive businesses opening up unexpectedly close to their business. These established businesses were concerned if the new businesses

and permits issued.

Blunda said that municipalities can limit the amount of licenses and permits issued to the same types of businesses. "Ours can also be restricted."

Blunda further stated that existing businesses can be grandfathered in. New businesses are subject to new regulations.

Police Chief Benjamin Ruiz spoke at a previous meeting in references to some businesses that have been investigated by State or Health Agencies and answered additional questions in an interview the Amboy Guardian at a later date.

The Inspectors make sure that businesses are following proper policies.

When a business is under suspicions of unlawful practices the inspectors notify the police department. The Perth Amboy Police work in conjunction with these agencies.

One example that he gave concerned barber shops. Not only is the owner supposed to have a license if they will be working there, but each individual that they employ must have their own license.

"Some businesses have been temporarily closed down due to violations concerning illegal drug activity," Ruiz stated.

When questioned if the police ever went into a business very late at night to investigate illegal activity, Ruiz replied,

When a business is open very late some of the illegal activities may include gambling besides sometimes drug related issues.

Throwing Our Hats into the Ring Challenging Newark Mayor Cory Booker

Can one person survive on \$33 a week for food? That is a little more than \$4 a day for food. This past December Newark Mayor Cory Booker accepted a challenge from a North Carolina Woman Tweeting who challenged the Mayor to live on food stamps for a week.

Cory Booker accepted the challenge and agreed to live on \$33 for a week (\$4.71/day). Some people took the challenge with him.

Could you live off \$4.71 a day? Would you be able to eat healthy?

We're going shopping. Many local smaller stores may have higher prices than national chain grocery stores, so let's take a look at where we can go. Locally there's ShopRite, Wegmans, Pathmark, Walmart

The cheapest food I can think of is Mac & Cheese. If your lucky, you can get a box on sale for 39 cents. But you need milk and butter to mix in it.

\$2.60 for 4 sticks of butter \$2.73 for 7 boxes of mac and cheese, \$3.00 for 2 lb of broccoli. Some canned peas & carrots \$2.50. 2 dozen eggs \$4.00. \$4.40 for organic milk (it will last the week) Oodles of Noodles at 50 cents a package, so buy 8 packages roughly \$4.00. Spaghetti and sauce, roughly \$5.00. Maybe some cereal store brand Cheerios around \$3.00 a box. Some chicken legs \$3.00. That's roughly \$33.

You could ration cereal and for the mornings. Hard boil eggs for snacks. Have the Oodles of Noodles for lunch and make macaroni/chicken stir fry for dinner. One or two days have Spaghetti. If you're thirsty drink tap water.

I don't think this is very healthy. Pasta is very cheap but too much pasta is no good

I personally think I would have a difficult time doing this. Cory Booker said he bought yams and ate that. The trouble is that many Americans live like this all the time.

According to the US Department of Health and Human Services, U.S. Department of Commerce, CATO Institute there are 4,300,000 people in the United States on welfare, 46,700,000 on food stamps, and 5,600,000 people on unemployment. That's 4.1% of the population of the United States that is on welfare. The total government spending on welfare annually (not including food stamps or unemployment) is \$131.9 billion.

That is a lot of people in this country on federal assistance. An individual can make a total of \$1000 a month and still collect welfare. In 40 states it is more beneficial to be on welfare than work an \$8/hr. job. In 9 states it pays more than being a teacher.

Something to think about. How many people do I see going to the food pantry on New Brunswick Avenue on Saturday mornings? It is quite

Whatever your financial situation is, coupons are important. Take advantage of the cards issued by the grocery stores. Stock up on nonperishable items. Store brands are usually made by the same company as the name brands. ShopRite has can-can sales. Catch these items they're hot. Homemade soups are great money saver. Look in your refrigerator - there's probably items you can put in it. Sometimes in the aisles there are coupons for instant savings.

The circulars are a good source for everything on sale. Coupons are in the paper every weekend.

Are you up to taking the Cory Booker challenge? Can you live off of \$33 for 7 days for food? I see this being more difficult than it seems to be. I think I'll pass. Carolyn will do the challenge





National Flood Insurance Program Community Rating System

News Release

NEW JERSEY - • The Community Rating System is a program for communities to lower the cost of flood insurance premiums paid for property owners by adopting community floodplain management activities that exceed the minimum standards required by the National Flood Insurance Program.

- The goals of the program are to reduce flood losses, strengthen the insurance aspects of the National Flood Insurance Program and to promote awareness of the importance of flood insurance.
- Participating communities earn a reduction in flood insurance premiums based on the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System.
- Nearly 3.8 million policyholders in 1,211 communities participate in CRS by implementing local mitigation, floodplain management, and outreach activities that exceed the minimum NFIP standards.
- 52 communities in New Jersey are receiving flood insurance premium discounts based on their implementation of local mitigation, outreach and educational activities. The Meadowlands Commission is also participating in CRS.
- Participating communities earn points in the program based on 18 creditable activities, organized under four categories: (i) Public Information, (ii) Mapping and Regulations, (iii) Flood Damage Reduction, and (iv) Flood Pre-

- pareaness
- For CRS participating communities, flood insurance premium rates are discounted in increments of 5 percent. For example, a Class 1 community (at the highest level of compliance) would receive a 45 percent premium discount, while a Class 9 community would receive a 5 percent discount. Communities rated as Class 10 are participating in the CRS but do not yet meet the minimum standards needed to qualify for lower flood insurance premiums.
- Compliance with the New Jersey Dam Safety program, new state storm water management requirements, and the development of all hazard mitigation plans provides CRS credits to all municipalities. Communities can also qualify for CRS credits by adopting freeboard elevation requirements.
- The reduction in flood insurance premiums represents an annual savings in premium costs for policy holders and will take effect at the time a new policy is written or a policy already in effect is renewed.
- In addition to premium reductions, participating communities realize additional benefits from the program because local officials and property owners become more knowledgeable about flood plain management, flood insurance and ways of reducing risk.

Tax Tips For Sandy Survivors

News Release April 8, 2013 PERTH AMBOY - If you have experienced a loss as a result of Hurricane Sandy, here are a few things to keep in mind as you prepare to file your 2012 taxes:

- Personal property losses that are not covered by insurance or other reimbursements may be deductible on your tax return. For details on eligible deductions, see IRS Form 4684, Casualties and Thefts, and read the instructions.
- IRS Notice 2013-21, Section 165(i) states that affected tax-payers in a federally declared disaster area have the option of claiming disaster-related casualty losses on their federal income tax returns for either this tax year (2012) or the previous tax year (2011).
- According to IRS Notice 2013-16, taxpayers who reside outside the disaster area but whose books, records, or tax professionals are located in the areas affected by Hurricane Sandy may also be eligible for tax relief.

- The IRS may waive their usual fees and expedite requests for copies of previously filed tax returns for affected taxpayers. Taxpayers should put the assigned Disaster Designation in red ink at the top of IRS Form 4506, Request for Copy of Tax Return, or IRS Form 4506-T, Request for Transcript of Tax Return, and submit it to the IRS.
- Taxpayers impacted by Hurricane Sandy can access IRS information related to Sandy online at www.irs.gov/uac/Tax-Relief-in-Disaster-Situations.
- •Visit www.irs.gov/uac/ Contact-My-Local-Office-in-New-Jersey for information on the nearest IRS Taxpayer Assistance Center.
- Taxpayers may download forms and publications with information on tax relief from the official IRS website, IRS. gov, or order them by calling 800-TAX-FORM. The IRS toll-free number for general tax questions is 800-829-1040.

Pallone Led Support for Community Health Center Funding that Provides for Cost-Effective Preventative Care

Press Release April 4, 2013 NEW BRUNSWICK - Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06), Senior Democrat on the Energy & Commerce Health Subcommittee, visited the Jewish Renaissance Medical Center (JRMC) Thursday, April 4 to tout the preventive care benefits and other important services that Community Health Centers provide for many residents in need of a wide array of health care resources. Specializing in providing cost-effective and high-quality primary and preventive health care, Community Health Centers generate \$24 billion annually in savings to the health care system, due largely to their success in reducing the need for patients to seek care in costlier health care settings (like emergency departments and hospitals). These centers deliver care at a total cost of just \$1.67 per patient per day and serve as drivers of economic activity in the communities where they are located.

Community Health Centers are locally-controlled, non-profit entities that provide primary care, oral, behavioral, and pharmacy services in our most underserved rural and urban areas. New Jersey is home to 20 federally supported health centers serving 454,243 patients and 23% of the low income uninsured population in New Jersey.

Nationwide, there are over 1,200 Health Centers operating in 9,000 local communities, serving more than 22 million people who would otherwise not have access to primary care in their communities. Health Centers serve as the "health care home" for America's most vulnerable populations, including one in seven of America's uninsured, one-third of individuals living below poverty, and one in seven Medicaid beneficiaries.

PERTH AMBOY - What happens when passion and purpose unite for a cause? When there is a vision and a plan, the momentum lays the groundwork that can move mountains, make communities stronger, and give the inner city kids a positive message to keep kids off the street and on the right path. This is the dream that fuels the heart of Edison Jaquez.

In his role as Vice President of Young Men Can #YMC, a youth mentoring program, Edison works with at-risk youth in a non-traditional setting. "I learned at an early age the value of a strong community. I came here (to the United States) when I was 7 from the Dominican Republic. There, everyone looks out for each other. But today, that bond of community has been weakened. When kids see that they can be a positive member of a community, attitudes change, and opportunity grows."

In February, Young Men Can held its first program, YMC Weekend at the Perth Amboy Recreation Center. Here, 21 young men got together to discuss the issues facing them, from gangs to education to job opportunities. Jay Morrison, of the Young Millionaires Club, and Mohammad Wilkerson of the NY Jets talked with the youth about what they had to deal with on their road to success. And each participant was hooked up with a mentor.

On April 20th to the 21st, Young Men Can is sponsoring its second mentoring event. But this time, it will be geared toward young women. There will be a variety of speakers to discuss the issues inner-city women have to overcome. The highlight of the program will be matching the participants up with a mentor. "It's important that the young ladies have a positive role model, who has dealt with the same issues they are now facing. It shows them that people cannot only overcome the bad stuff, but succeed."

Edison earned his BS in Business Management. "I chose Berkeley for the simple fact that it was a great business school close to home & very convenient with my work schedule since I was working 2 jobs at the time." And he could still be active in the community.

This became a mission for him and he is actively involved as a big brother, mentor & father figure to the youth he teaches on a daily basis. "I'm not that old but I don't remember having such good programs as I was growing up." Currently, as the Program Coordinator for the Civic Justice Corps, under the umbrella of the Jewish Renaissance Foundation, he works with at-risk young men, ages of 16 & 24 to help them anyway he can. The program is designed to get the kids off the streets and into the classroom by providing GED classes and Construction education.

Edison is also the Commissioner of the CJC Basketball League, which had over 70 youth participate in the winter league. Due to the overwhelming success, and local interest, the league has expanded. Edison is currently accepting teams for the spring league and hopes to add a summer league to the calendar.

The ideas and ideals that are inside Edison are genuine, as is his passion. "I just want to leave a legacy for all the youth's with a dream,' says Edison. "I tell my kids don't let anyone say you can't become whoever you would like to become." And the dreamer passes along another valuable lesson.


