# Code Enforcement Director Scala Gives Overview of Activities



Ed Scala Director Code Enforcement

PERTH AMBOY - At the 4/22/13 Caucus Meeting Director of Code Enforcement Ed Scala said, "There are 300 line items pertaining to enforcement and action on the City Budget for Code Enforcement. These items pertain to Building, Zoning, Fire Prevention and Housing. We also work with the City Engineer, Ernest Feist. We are currently looking for one vacant position for an Inspector. There are five Inspectors, some are full time; some are part time. The area that we must cover includes 10,000 properties in a town of 50,000 residents. When we issue notices in the field none are left on the property or in mail slots. If a citizen complains about a property, they usually call anonymously. Sometimes they may call someone at the Mayor's Office or even Council Members. Because of the economy and of the City being in an urban area, illegal housing is very prevalent. Sometimes we may get complaints from the Fire and Police Departments. We are trying our best to take care of all of this."

Scala continued, "When there is a citywide issue, our entire staff will go out starting around 6 a.m. These could be

hazardous and non-hazardous complaints. We also conduct yearly and quarterly inspections depending on the number of occupants. On the issue of property maintenance and housing: there is a review and an inspection and if there is a complaint that is valid, we may issue a summons to the owner."

Scala continued, "If there is a violation, they are given a notice, then a summons is issued. There are \$100 to \$150 fines for garbage violations, overcrowding and more serious offenses."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry was concerned about a memorial at the intersection of Penn and Washington Street that no one is paying attention to. He also said, "At 284 Washington St. there was way to much litter."

Irizarry had complained about the same property at previous Council Meetings."

Scala told Irizarry that he had not personally gone to that site to see the litter in question.

Ed Scala also talked about building permits. "Our Department will come right away to do inspections. If the property fails an inspection, we let them know what had to be correct-

# Flood Victims Face South Amboy Council

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - On January 2, 2013, U.S. Senator Chris Smith reported that 346,000 homes in New Jersey were damaged by Hurricane Sandy, with 22,000 of them being declared uninhabitable.

Residents have been displaced, families have been separated, and lives have been lost over the course of the past six months, and many cities and towns in New Jersey continue the struggle of getting life back to normal.

A number of affected South Amboy residents turned out to last week's business meeting to express their frustration with the city. Andrew Horezga, who has been the most vocal resident since the storm hit last fall, spoke from the heart for nearly an hour about what the city looked like after Sandy hit and the lack of effort made by city officials.

"The morning after the storm brought shock and dismay as we awoke to an apocalyptic environment which resembled a movie set," Horezga began. "Our streets were covered in storm debris, homes had foundations washed away, personal possessions were scattered around our neighborhood like a bomb blast, and everything was covered in raw sewage."

Horezga noted the appearances of Mayor Henry and Councilwoman Noble during the tough times, but explained the anxiety of local residents who still haven't been helped has gone up and they continue to struggle even today. He acknowledged that South Amboy was blessed compared to other cities but more needs to be done to help those suffering.

"South Amboy was blessed in that we lost no life or had no serious injuries, but we have missed so many opportunities to shine as a city in

the recovery of this disaster," Horezga said. "I have met with mayors, business administrators, and councilmen from our neighboring towns and I was amazed to see what was being done and saddened to see South Amboy was missing the mark on so many levels."

Neighboring towns like Perth Amboy, Sayreville, and Woodbridge have all held meetings to hear from storm victims, created programs to help local families recover from losing their homes, and developed a task force made up of residents to help rebuild.

Horezga was concerned about the lack of communication between the city of South Amboy and it's residents. He discussed one of the only updates from city officials that came on April 10th, which in his mind was nothing more than a blog post taken from a letter from the Mayor.

"That blog post was nothing more than a 255 word summary rehash of the Mayor's letter to the city with an attached sentence at the end to flood victims," Horezga explained. "It's not the size of the letter that is pathetic, it's the reality of the situation."

"In our eyes, you have done very little. It's insulting to try and say otherwise, and I hope you can see how delusional you are at the moment," he continued. "It is embarrassing to show up in other towns and answer the question 'why are you here?' like the kids of delinquent parents who parlay their responsibilities on someone else or dump them in latchkey."

Horezga told stories of local residents helping their neighbors after the storm by providing food, supplies, and shelter while the city government did nothing. He spoke about a local Krausers employee who offered a customer a lease-free place to live until he was back on his feet.

"It is disgustingly beautiful how the man from Krausers who sells paper towels and coffeecakes has shown a better capacity for response than our officials, whose job it is."

Toward the end of his remarks, Horezga proposed a three-step process for the city to use to help flood victims get through this tough time. It included establishing a hurricane recovery team made of residents, refunding any permit fees charged to residents during the rebuilding phase, and invite people from mental healthy facilities to help prevent suicide amongst those who lost their homes.

Mayor Henry directly ad-

ed. Once the corrections are done, it is up to the people who owned the property to call our office and set up an appointment to do a re-inspection. We schedule the re-inspection for 2 or 3 business days after the call is made. There are different levels of Inspectors, each level having different qualifications."

Councilwoman Lisa Nanton asked, "What is a building permit issued for?"

Scala answered that it would be issued for only certain kinds of work. "For instance, renovations. We have to make sure that any renovations being made fit the requirements for that zoned area."

Scala continued, "Our Plumbers check hot water temperature to make sure they meet our standards. We only do testing of hot water. They witness the Contractor doing the testing on the sewer, waste lines, gas lines, etc. The State has registered contractors. The City only has a registration procedure but I meet with all contractors (that have or may be dealing with the City)."

**Business Administrator Greg** Fehrenbach said, "There is so many complaints, it is hard to keep track of them. There was an updated list given to Inspectors in early April with the status of violations. We will try to update that list every 2 to 3 weeks."

Councilman Ken Gonzalez said that he met with a local business owner on Smith Street who had received a summons from Code Enforcement. "This summons was about a blinking sign and a rented out counter space at their establishment. This business owner said that other stores had similar violations and thought that she had been targeted and there was a complaint specifically against her. She said that enforcement offi-

cers should take action against other violators, also."

Scala said, "She never had approval from us to sublet and other businesses may have gotten a summons, too."

Gonzalez also wanted to know the minimum fines for housing violations.

Scala replied, "I don't know, You will have to ask the courts."

City Attorney Mark Blunda said, "The Council can set fines."



# **BAIT SHOP REPORT**

PERTH AMBOY - Despite the windy conditions this week. Fishing remained strong. Beachside has been reporting the most action from High St. to 2nd St. followed by the bridges, the old docks on the Kill, & Carteret pier, many catches have been reported. Boaters are also doing well, Kevin Barasky stopped in and said large schools of bass are at the Shrewsbury Rocks.

The stripers are hungry and are being caught on fresh or salted clams, fresh or frozen bunker, sand and blood worms. Fishermen are using high lows, fish finders, & reef rigs weights 4 to 6 oz depending on location. I use whichever weight keeps a firm hold to the bottom. It is to ensure that when fishing along side of other fisherman, my line will not cross theirs.

Many new fisherman fail to use the proper weight or gear when fishing in tight quarters using this simple tip will save a lot of time and frustration.

On the subject of gear, a few things come to mind worth mentioning: "COURTESY" many of the things I'm about to say should go without saying. It should just be a standard. Every year many new fisherman and woman start fishing. They might not know

the proper fishing etiquette:

For example if you are fishing on a pier it is courteous to use only two poles at a time. There is no need to use your pole collection all at once.

Keep it clean and respect those around you.

The real reason I've delved on this subject is because of an unwritten rule about cows (female stripers.) Almost all cows at this time of the year have a big fat belly of eggs. One can tell at a glance, the belly is huge. It is bigger than normal, a pinkish color, and very soft. This is a moral suggestion: take a picture of this beautiful Mama, throw her back so she may her lay her eggs. Helping to ensure our children will be given the opportunity to catch their own striper in the future.

I will stress that this is just my opinion of what I feel is right. I would like to think others agree with me.

It isn't just a sport, it's a lifestyle. It is our lifestyle. The actions of ONE, reflects on all of us. It is our duty as a whole to teach and be willing to be taught. If you see a fellow fisherman can use a hand, give him one. If you can teach him or her something teach it. Take your children or a neighbor's kid fishing. The memories will last a lifetime.

I won't sit here a pretend I know everything about fishing, because that wouldn't be true. What I do know, I'd like to share with you the readers of my column.



#### Fernando's Unisex Styling LLC

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - An Interview with Anita Pires, owner of Fernando's Unisex Hairstyling, 639 Amboy Ave., Perth Amboy.

Amboy Guardian: Did you always want to be a hairstylist or did you start in another profession?

Anita Pires: I have a B.S. in Education and a minor in math. I love math. I was in an accounting department at Sizzler International in Secaucus. It was a temp job that was supposed to be six months but it lasted six years. I loved it and worked there as an accounting clerk.

Amboy Guardian: Did your father (Fernando Viegas, the original owner of Fernando's) influence your career choice? Anita Pires: No, he always told me to seek higher education. My mother, Marilla Viegas worked at Revlon for 28 years. My father started out as an apprentice in Joe's Barber Shop on State Street. He worked there for a bit of time. Joe Baena (the owner) passed away and left the business to my father. My father opened Fernando's at 175 Hall Ave. from '68 to '77. He has been in the business since I was born. From 1977 to present, Fernando's has been located at 639 Amboy Ave. Sizzler International downsized and closed the office and at the same time my father had no one to take over the business. He offered the business to my brother, but he was studying computers and he didn't want the business.

I said, "What about me?" He said to me, "You'll have to go to school for it."

I said, "I don't mind. I always wanted to do hair." I took over the business in 2003.

Amboy Guardian: Who school did you attend?

Anita Pires: I went to Reignbow Academy in Perth Amboy. I always wanted to do hair. I've always done my own hair. I got my license in 1997. I started working at Fernando's and have been here ever since. Amboy Guardian: What process do you enjoy doing the best?

Anita Pires: I love everything. I don't get up in the morning and hate going to work. We do everything from hair color to hair replacement. Just give me a picture and I can do it.

Amboy Guardian: What is the longest hair that you ever worked on?

Anita Pires: Probably to the butt. For one client, her hair was that long; She wanted a curly perm. There were from 400 to 500 rollers in her hair. It took 7 hours.

Amboy Guardian: Did you ever have a customer that surprised you (going from very long hair to very short hair)

Anita Pires: We do extreme makeovers all the time. I question the client many times before he/she goes through with it to make certain of the decision

Amboy Guardain: What is the most rewarding aspect of being a beautician?

Anita Pires: The smile after the hair is done. I don't need words - just the look after the hair is done and to see that the client likes it.

Amboy Guardian: Did you ever have a customer who asked for a specific style that you knew wouldn't work on that type of hair? How do you solve that problem?

Anita Pires: I try to duplicate something as close as possible. Amboy Guardian: Do you have a signature cut?

Anita Pires: No.

Amboy Guardian: Who does What your hair?

Anita Pires: Patricia (one of Fernando's stylists) does my hair. Patricia has free reign.

Amboy Guardian: What is the most unusual thing you did

with your hair?
Anita Pires: I've dyed my hair every color. One New Years

Eve I went from long to short

(shoulder length to pixie). Amboy Guardian: How many hair stylists or barbers are at Fernando's?

Anita Pires: Four. All are full service cosmetologists.

Amboy Guardian: What is the total experience combined?
Anita Pires: 13+18+56+17 =

Amboy Guardian: Do you take apprentices?

104 years.

Anita Pires: I haven't taken one in 13 years. There were a few over the years. Aida started her own salon. She took over a business in Carteret. There's not much turnover in Fernandos. It's like family here

Amboy Guardian: Who is more difficult to work on: men or women?

Anita Pires: Children are the hardest because of the movement.

Amboy Guardian: What age groups do you take?

Anita Pires: As early as 2 months. You'd be surprised at some who are born with a lot of hair.

Amboy Guardian: Over the years, what processes changed and are easier now?

Anita Pires: Hair color, permanents, blow drying methods. It's an ever changing business. Amboy Guardian: How much can you tell about a person from their hair?

hair loss/weight loss. Everything comes out in hair. You have to ask these questions when doing a chemical process. It's a very personal business. You have to be brutally honest with people.

Amboy Guardian: Is hairstyling an ongoing learning process?

# **AMBOY SPOTLIGHT: Sciortino's**

#### A Recipe for Success: Love and Family for Four Generations and Counting

**SOUTH** AMBOY/PERTH AMBOY - Sciortino's Harbor Lights is located at 132 South Broadway, South Amboy. Lou Seminski Sr. owner of South Amboy's Sciortino's and his Sheri Seminski daughter, shared their memories with the Amboy Guardian.

Amboy Guardian: How long has Sciortino's been in busi-

Lou Seminski Sr.: Since 1934 in Perth Amboy. We are happy to be in business 80+ years.

Amboy Guardian: Sciortino's is a family run business. For how many generations has it been in business? Who started Sciortino's?

Lou: My grandparents: Frances and Paulo Sciortino lived in New Brunswick and had a small business. The family was growing and were planning to move to Brooklyn. Frances' family, the Coffaros had a business in Perth Amboy on New Brunswick Avenue. They had a pizzeria, butcher shop and a bakery that made Italian bread. They opted to stay in Perth Amboy. Uncle Cosmo was visiting from Italy and helped my grandparents buy the property outright.

Amboy Guardian: When did your grandparents immigrate to America?

Lou: They came in January 1923 and went to New Brunswick. They came from Bagheria, Sicily from the south side of Palermo.

Amboy Guardian: Where the name Seminski come in?

Lou: Mary Sciortino married William Seminski.

Amboy Guardian: When did you take over the business?

Lou: Mary, Isabelle and Helen and Lucy were the four sisters who originally ran the pizzeria. Because of the different businesses run by the family it was a 24 hour operation. (Someone from the family was always there.) Around 1988-89 Isabelle and Helen were getting older and asked if anyone would be interested in taking over the business. Lou Sr. partnered with Joe Misiewicz to do so. When the City took over the property through eminent domain in the early 2000's Joe and I dissolved the partnership. My son Lou Jr. and daughters Sheri and Sandra got involved with the South Amboy business. We are all involved in both loca-

Sheri: The younger generation (Sheri, Louis Jr., Sandra, Sarah & our cousins) really helped with the pizzeria in Perth Amboy since childhood growing up as the Aunts were getting older. Louis, Sr. and Joe Misiewicz partnered up because all of us kids were too young to take over. Now, we are old enough to carry on the family legacy and happily still work both locations in Perth Amboy and South Amboy.

Amboy Guardian: What is the origin of pizza in the United States?

Sheri: It was originally known as a tomato pie. It was dough with a lot of sauce and cheese sprinkled over it. Pizza became more prevalent in the United States after World War II because of the soldiers that were stationed in Italy and were used to the tomato pies there. After WWII they used to deliver tomato pies and sandwiches to factories. Then they started putting more cheese on it and it became pizza. Pizza parlors started to open. Sciortino's is either the 2nd or 3rd in the State of New Jersey and the 12th documented in the country as a pizza parlor.

Amboy Guardian: What makes Sciortino's sauce so tasty?

Sheri: I tell everyone the secret ingredient is love.

Lou: Grandmother Sciortino's recipe (sweet sauce). Sicilian sauce is the sweetest sauce. Originally they grew their own tomatoes and jarred and bottled them. The tomatoes were picked at the ripest time of the season. We use California tomatoes: Saporitos and Full Red.

Amboy Guardian: Why the brick oven?

Lou: It bakes a little better. You see the difference in the cheese when it's baked and its evenly cooked. The old oven was fueled by Anthracite coal. The new brick ovens are powered by gas.

Amboy Guardian: What's the most popular item on your menu?

Lou: Pizza with sausage. We make our own homemade sausage. The most popular dish is spaghetti with meatballs. We use the same ingredients as Grandma Frances made.

Amboy Guardian: What is

your favorite item on the menu?

Sheri: I love the plain pizza. I have a slice of pizza every day. There is nothing like a family sharing a pie together. It makes for a family atmosphere. My favorite dish is the eggplant and garlic. I like the taste.

Amboy Guardian: Why is lasagna not on the menu?

Lou: We have stuffed shells and manicotti. It has cheese and sauce. We'll put lasagna on the menu once a week. Some people prefer the meatless, some prefer with meat. For the Tour of Italy Event we do have lasagna.

Amboy Guardian: Does Sciortino's do any catering for parties?

Lou: We cater, but it's not full service. The customer will pick up the food. We don't have full time staff that stays at the event.

Amboy Guardian: What makes the atmosphere in Sciortino's so pleasant?

Sheri: We are blessed to have a family business because we love it. When the business closed in Perth Amboy, we looked around Middlesex County. By word of mouth we heard about the location in South Amboy. When we saw the property in South Amboy we took it. It didn't even go on the market. It's 9 years ago this May that we opened in South Amboy. When we opened up in South Amboy the old business here had Harbor Lights in their name. We kept Harbor Lights in the name when we opened Sciortino's. We find

the people in South Amboy are friendly and family orientated. Amboy Guardian: Does Sciortino's sponsor any charity events?

Sheri: We're always a part of the community. We've done events for the YMCA and for children with disabilities and with cancer. One of our former workers was hit by taxi in New York. He is still recovering. We've had a fundraiser for him. He's in our prayers.

Amboy Guardian: What is the best part of owning your own restaurant?

Sheri: Why are we doing what we do? It's something that's a part of you. It's very rare nowadays. It's seeing your family being able to be with your family and having them close by. I am so fortunate to know all my relatives. The only one I didn't know was Aunt Katie who passed away before I was

Amboy Guardian: Why did Sciortino's come back to Perth Amboy?

Lou: Lou Jr. proposed moving back to Perth Amboy. Most of the customer base was coming

from Perth Amboy. We don't deliver from South Amboy. It's not practical. Now, we have a delivery base in Perth Amboy. There is a possibility we may open up a second location in Perth Amboy.

Amboy Guardian: What advice do you give to young people aspiring to have their own restaurant?

Lou: To work in one first. Let me tell a funny, but true story. My son's father-in-law is a retired Sheriff from Camden County. He was thinking about opening up his own restaurant. He came here and helped out for five weeks. From the time we opened up until the time we closed. He didn't realize how hard it was. He said, "God Bless You, but no thanks."

Most of our wait staff, servers and bartenders are putting themselves through college, and then they move on. We do have some long term employees. One of our staff, Bobby Gardella has been with us since the age of 17.

Chris Straille who makes the pies has been here for about 15 years.

Some of our former delivery people from our original location in Perth Amboy included: Mike Kohut (former Perth Amboy Deputy Police Chief), Ken Puccio (who is now a Perth Amboy Detective and Board of Education VP) and Elaine Kiczula (Jasko) (who is now the Perth Amboy City Clerk). There is a lot of second generation employees. Some of the people who worked for us have their children work here.

Amboy Guardian: Do any of you have other career interests?

Lou: Lou Jr. is a lawyer at the Wilentz Law firm.

Sheri: I teach in the Department of Human Ecology, Rutgers (Cook Campus).

Comments from the interview: Not only were recipes past down, but so was the recipe for love. All throughout the interview Sheri was beaming from ear to ear whenever she talked about all of her aunts and uncles. I remarked to her



that some families have a reunion perhaps once a year, but her family had a reunion every day. Looking around the restaurant after we finished what I now call a conversation, I noticed that all the family was there. The walls have pictures of all of the generations of the Sciortino's and Seminski's. I am positive that the relatives up in heaven heard every word that Lou and Sheri said sitting around a huge table enjoying a plain pizza pie.

This spotlight was also a dedication to those who started this tradition. Raise a glass to Uncles: Pete, Tony, Joe, Micheangelo, and Fred, Aunts: Dora, Rose, Isabelle, Lucy, Helen, Katie and Mary.
