### Fire Scare Halts Perth Amboy Board Meeting Electrical Issue Forces Evacuation at Perth Amboy High School

By: Joseph L. Kuchie PERTH AMBOY - The Perth Amboy Board of Education was forced to cancel their latest meeting midway through due to a fire scare that forced an evacuation at Perth Amboy High School.

The public meeting was brought to a halt when a lighting fixture above the auditorium began to sizzle and blow out above the audience. Board President Mark Carvajal requested a five-minute recess to assess the situation, but the police officer on duty ordered a complete evacuation right before the fire alarms sounded.

The Perth Amboy Fire Department arrived at the scene minutes after the alarm went off and quickly entered the building to find the source of the issue. Unable to return to the building until it was deemed safe, Carvajal and Superintendent Janine Caffrey decided to call off the meeting while waiting with spectators outside.

Things were heating up before the fire scare when Dr. Caffrey once again put the subject of AMIkids on the agenda for approval.

According to the agenda, Dr. Caffrey requested "the approval to enter into a contractual agreement with AMIKids, Inc. to provide Alternative Educational Services and support for at-risk students at a cost not to excess \$2.6 million for the 2013-2014 school year, funded through special education budgeted funds and federal funds".

The biggest concern was the amount of money the school district would be investing into the controversial service. Jean Franza, a teacher at the Richardson School, was neither for nor against the program but was concerned over what would be lost by giving

The graduation time change controversy arose when Dr. Janine Caffrey change the time honored tradition of holding the High School ceremony from 6:00 PM to 9:00 AM. The graduation ceremony has historically been held at 6:00 PM for almost 40 years. In changing the high school graduation ceremony time, the middle school's graduation ceremony was also changed to June 26th, when normally it would have

been scheduled on the same middle school," she said.

schedule and time has caused a financial hardship to individuals who are not able to take a day off of work or who cannot take two days off of work. "I have two graduations to attend, and I can only lose one day of work, [and] I am barely making ends meet, and surviving paycheck to paycheck" Elizabeth Morabito-Gonzalez said. "Being that the high school graduation time was held at 6:00 PM for so many years, I made the plans with my company around that time, and now may not be able to see one of my daughters graduate from

Concerned parents and students voiced their concerns publicly at the Board of Education meetings on May 23rd, and June 17th, presenting them with findings of a survey and petition collected on June 1st. The results of these findings were emailed to Dr. Caffrey on June 7, 2013, however, despite the survey and petition efforts, it was resolved by the school board and Caffrey that the graduation time controversy would not be voted on, or be placed on the June 20th agenda.

"I'm saddened that due to the time change, my own family can't see my daughter gradu-

### **Outrage Ensues over South Amboy Redevelopment Vote**

Ordinance Could Lead to Potential Drug and Rehab Facility

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - A packed house of concerned residents left in disgust last week when the South Amboy council approved an ordinance to revise the Memorial Medical Center redevelopment plan.

A key part of the revision for the new redevelopment was the permitted use of 13 different entities including an alcohol/substance abuse treatment facility. While mental health clinics are prohibited in the zone, drug and alcohol rehab could potentially still be added to the area.

The new ordinance and public hearing came after the city of South Amboy had its decision to block the impatient facility overturned in Appellate Court in favor of Rocky Top LLC.

The vote was unanimous amongst all councilmen and women, who were all in attendance for the meeting on Wednesday night. Board attorney John Lanza explained to the public before the vote that the ordinance was court ordered and, if the board voted no, they would be in contempt of court.

Resident Rick Spinelli of Ward Street was not pleased with the timing of the public

hearing considering the council was already preparing to vote yes. He also did not think it was fair that the meeting was held on the same day as South Amboy High School graduation, preventing many residents from coming out to speak their case.

Lanza explained that the council was under time constraints from the courts to get this ordinance passed so they could proceed. He told Spinelli that the courts were expecting the results of the vote on Thursday morning.

One of the main concerns about the new facility was the safety of the nearby residents who could be affected by the patients roaming the streets. Former councilmen and current resident Bill Schwarick asked questions about similar facilities in Kearny and Keyport and if the council had contacted those towns about their issues.

"Has any thought to security been issued? Is there anyway we can ensure the residents that there is some sort of qualified security in place?" he asked. "Has the Mayor and council looked into contacting Kearny and Keyport to see if

there's been a problem with Endeavor house there and has the Chief of Police contacted them to see if there was an increase in crime?"

Lanza responded by saying those towns had not been reached out to and wouldn't be unless a problem ensued with the facility or its patients. He reminded those in attendance that the facility was for patients who had already gone through the detox phase and were considered nonviolent.

Schwarick later showed his disappointment in the council when a young boy who lives next to the facility address his fear of walking to school everyday and the traffic that prevents him from crossing the street.

"That young man stood up in an adult forum with that courage and said he was afraid to walk to school down Bordentown Ave. and I looked up there and all I saw was vacant stares," he said. "Shame on you."

Resident Todd Christiansen has lived right across the street from the facility for over 20 years and was disgusted that this ordinance was up for a vote to begin with. He feared for his own safety and for the safety of other families in the area.

"There is no security being thought of yet and that is ridiculous. You should have that in place no matter what type of facility it is," Christensen said. "I wouldn't feel safe having a child in that neighborhood...I was a child in that neighbor-

hood...and the fact that it's turning into this embarrasses me and should embarrass you too."

Another concern about the facility was the parking problems that may ensue. According to local neighbors, the parking on Bordentown Avenue is bad as it is and residents like Tim Walczak wanted to know if solutions like parking permits would be put into place.

"In the past when the hospital was opened we had permit parking...can we have that reestablished?" he asked. "Parking by my house right now is like living in Hoboken...my kids have to park three blocks away. It's already a problem."

Lanza and Council President Joseph Connors said that residential parking permits were discussed by the council earlier in the day and Business Administrator Camille Tooker said that the ordinance for parking permits would likely be put back into effect to prevent any parking issues for residents in the area.

Tension grew later in the night when resident Adam Horezga spoke and presented his support for the new impatient rehab facility, which he believed presented less of a risk helping people with a problem than there would be with people leaving a bar late at night.

Rick Spinelli attempted to address Horezga directly, asking if he was a politician in town and where he lived in terms of the facility. He then went on to tell the stories of a family member who has suffered with drug addiction for 25 years and the toll it takes on

everyone who surrounds him.

"Nobody in this room knows what I know and lived with it for 25 years," Spinelli said. "The 12 step approach says they will get clean when they are ready and not a moment before. I think it's an injustice what this whole board is doing tonight by putting this on the floor by voting it."

Spinelli, visually affected by the evening's discussion, voluntarily left the meeting after the council asked him to calm down. Horezga later spoke about how he lost his grandfather in a DUI accident and regardless of his position he still wanted what's best for South Amboy's residents.

Lanza reminded the crowd numerous times that a drug and alcohol rehab facility is just one of the potential uses for the new space but would not necessarily be used in that aspect. Residents believed that it would become a treatment facility because of the money it would potentially bring into the town.

When the vote was passed around 8:30 p.m. despite the public outcry, the council saw nearly 30 residents walk out of the room at once, many of them making their feelings heard. One resident was heard yelling "We'll remember this on Election Day!"

Mayor Henry was not in attendance for the meeting in order to attend South Amboy High School's graduation. He will be present for the next South Amboy council meeting on July 17.

The South Amboy business meeting originally scheduled for July 3rd has been moved to July 10th.

Continued from Page 1 ate from high school," Vanessa Fernandez said, "Considering this is a milestone event, and she is the oldest grandchild, and the first to graduate high school," she said. "We did the superintendent's job, and gathered a survey, that should've been done at the beginning of the school year so that the parents and families could have planned accordingly," Fernandez said. "In our survey, over 90% of the participants believe the new time of 9:00 am is an inconvenience, and favored a 6:00 PM time."

The petition filed before the the New Jersey Commissioner of Education alleges policy violations, and seeks the Commissioner to intervene on the parents and pupils behalf: "We

brought up this graduation issue numerous times to both the board of education members and to Dr. Caffery but our voice fell on deaf ears," Anthony Bermudez said. "Dr. Caffrey never contacted the families to discuss the issue of changing the graduation time, and how it would impact families and students. She made the decision on her own to change the graduation time, which is why we had to take this matter to the next level." This hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, June 25, 2013 at 1:30 PM in Newark, NJ. The next board of education meeting is scheduled to be on Tuesday, June 25, 2013 at the McGinnis School at 6:00 PM because the previous June 20th meeting had a fire alarm evacuation.


Some people say the reason that they don't say the Pledge of Allegiance is because the words are not true.

their families?"

"Before we proceed with this I suggest we form a committee of all interested people including teachers, parents, administrators, and board members," she said. "We have to understand what we're doing. We're spending \$2.6 million that everyone has to be comfortable with."

Board member Anton Massopust also believed that there were too much information that wasn't certain and urged the rest of the board not to pass the vote unless things were better understood.

"There are too many questions about this program about financing and staffing," he said. "We did do this program in house very successfully for many, many years and I agree with my other board member that we shouldn't pass this tonight."

There was also a question of whether or not there was a conflict of interest between AMIKids and Dr. Caffrey. Caffrey spent 10 years as the Education Director with AMIKids and both her husband and children have contributed to the program as well.

After a long discussion with nearly every board member having a say, a motion was made to table the item until the board could have a better understanding of the process. However, the motion to table was denied after the vote was split four to four.

Dr. Caffrey defended her decision to put AMIKids on the agenda, but after hearing the complaints from the crowd and the board's worries about the issue, she withdrew the item from the agenda once the motion to table did not pass.

The board also tabled two other items in order to better understand where the district's money was going and how it would be used in the next school year. The continuation of the meeting was held on June 25th.

### Christie Administration Announces Opening of "re-New Jersey Stronger" Housing Recovery Centers

Housing Recovery Centers Will Open 8:00 A.M. Saturday, June 8, in Each of the Nine Counties Most Impacted by Superstorm Sandy

News Release Friday, June 7, 2013 Colin Reed 609-777-2600 TRENTON – The Christie Administration today announced that "reNew Jersey Stronger" Housing Recovery Centers will open at 8:00 a.m. tomorrow morning in each of the nine counties most impacted by Superstorm Sandy. Eligible homeowners whose primary residences were damaged or destroyed by the storm can visit any of the nine Housing Recovery Centers to apply inperson for two grants designed to encourage them to resettle in their homes and help them repair, elevate or rebuild their residences.

Sandy-impacted homeowners can apply for grant assistance at www.renewjerseystronger. org or by calling 1-855-SAN-DYHM (1-855-726-3946). The Housing Recovery Centers are an additional option homeowners have to apply for assistance.

"We want to make applying for our 'reNew Jersey Stronger' grant programs as easy as possible for Sandy-affected individuals whose lives have been anything but easy since the storm made landfall," said Governor Christie. "Homeowners should continue to apply online and through the call center, but these recovery centers are there if they need in-person assistance."

Sandy-impacted homeowners do not need to come to the Housing Recovery Centers if they previously applied to the "reNew Jersey Stronger" grant programs online or over the phone. In the next few weeks, applicants will be contacted directly about the status of their application and any necessary steps that they must take.

Under the "reNew Jersey Stronger" housing initiative, homeowners whose primary residences were damaged by the storm in the nine most-impacted counties (Atlantic, Bergen, Cape May, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean, and Union) are encouraged to apply for both of the following grant programs:

• Homeowner Reconstruction, Rehabilitation, Elevation and Mitigation (RREM) Program: This \$600 million program provides eligible homeowners up to \$150,000 grants to help repair, elevate or rebuild their primary residences.

• Homeowner Resettlement Program: This \$180 million program is aimed at encouraging eligible homeowners to remain in the nine counties that were most seriously affected by the storm by providing \$10,000 grants to encourage them to resettle in their existing primary home or resettle in the same county.

"We urge all eligible homeowners to take advantage of both the RREM and Resettlement programs if they haven't already," said Richard E. Constable, III, Commissioner of the NJ Department of Community Affairs (DCA), which is administering the 'reNew Jersey Stronger' initiative. "These grants are meant to help homeowners affected by Superstorm Sandy rebuild stronger and remain in their homes, but funding is limited."

Funding for the "reNew Jersey Stronger" grants comes from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery program. To date, HUD has approved \$1,829,520,000 in CDBG Disaster Recovery funds for New Jersey. The 'reNew Jersey Stronger' housing initiative will utilize \$780 million of the allocation.

Eligible homeowners are

strongly encouraged to submit an application on or before June 30, 2013. Applications that are received on or before this date will be processed electronically and subsequently prioritized focusing on factors such as degree of damage, income levels and communities that suffered the greatest impact from Superstorm Sandy. Residents can apply after June 30, but applications received after this date will be processed on a first-received, first-processed basis. Notwithstanding, priority will continue to be given to those homes with the most damage and to homeowners who are most in financial need.




