Honor Students Voice Their Opinion As Messengers of Peace

Students State their Case to Keep Honors Program

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – The Messengers of Peace, a student run non-profit organization held their first meeting at Perth Amboy High School on Thursday, August 15. The group consists of Honors Students who want to voice their concerns on the redefinition/elimination of the Honors programs in the Perth Amboy Public School System. The students: Rafael Tafur, May Bileye, Stephanie Rodriguez (President and Founder), Rosemary Nivar, Henry Rosado, Haliee Baez, Maitta Harris and Randy Rivas all spoke. They presented their feelings and concerns about how eliminating the Honors Programs in the early grades and grades 9th & 10th would affect them.

Student Rosemary Nivar spoke first, "We are trying to make a difference. We all spoke out about the removal of Honors. We're just a bunch of students who want to have their opinions heard."

At the past special meeting called by Superintendent Caffrey to discuss the Honors Program took place at the Barracks Street Administration Building. At this meeting, Board of Education Members, Union Representatives and certain community members were asked to leave. The Head of Security stated that Dr. Caffrey instructed him to ask the

se people to leave. Some parents were allowed to enter. Students were only allowed to enter if they had their student ID on them.

The students want their voices to be heard. "We're the future of Perth Amboy. My parents want to be here to find the American Dream. I have an opinion to be heard and we all are to be taken seriously," Nivar stated.

Student Henry Rosado stated his feelings, "Dr. Caffrey made a blog on PAPS.net. On that page she lists the new Common Core Curriculum Standards (CCCS) and she wants to increase the rigor. I understand her opinion and I know where she is coming from. But you are forcing kids to take classes that they are not ready for."

Rosado continued, "We are missing motivation (in the school system). Nobody is going to want to do the work. Honor students will lose their drive. I'm going to be with students who can't work as the same pace as me. If you have a classroom full of standard kids, the Honors kids could get bullied. They (Honor Students) can lose their chance for admission into college. With a lot of colleges, if they don't see Honors on your transcript, they don't even look at you. What am I working for? Also,

a standard kid will get bullied in a class full of Honor students."

Rosado continued, "We shouldn't be deleting our tracks, but make them more effective. There should be better motivation. We should enforce student morale. We should have fundraisers and have field trips starting in elementary school. We need to increase school spirit. We need more than discipline; instead of sending you home we should have more counseling. There should be motivation - not force."

Student Haliee Baez stated, "This summer I worked with kids from eight years to high school age. I tell them to get into the Honors Program. It motivates them and gives them a boost later in life. It's a 21st Century Program. It opens our eyes to the generations of tomorrow. We have our voices - we need to remember the younger kids. Honors did a lot for me - not only academically but personally. The Honors Program made me what I am today. It's a reward to us. We don't need to be brought back - we need to be brought a forward. I took a regular English class. There, I was an outcast. Everyone looked down on me."

BID Budget Approved

By Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – Public hearing and adoption of the operating budget for the Perth Amboy Business Improvement District, Inc. (BID) for the new fiscal year (starting July 1st) was discussed.

City Attorney Mark Blunda stated, "For years the BID did not follow its own by-laws; this is going back to the prior administration. The Chairperson was appointed by the mayor – not elected by the Board." This was questioned by one BID Board Member and found out that the BID should elect their own Chair."

During this election, the BID elected Barry Rosengarten as Chair and Enrique Hernandez as Vice-Chair.

Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez stated, "The Chair can appoint committee chairs and committee members."

A question came up about how the BID budget is spent and what the allocations in the budget are utilized for."

BID Chair Barry Rosengarten stated, "We'll examine what our needs are. We do not have enough money to oper-

ate. There is an insufficiency through the tax levy."

B.A. Greg Fehrenbach stated that although the tax levy which has been the same for approximately 10 years is approximately \$230,000. The BID budget is approximately \$320,000. The surplus money over the years will make up the difference for the BID budget.

Councilman Fernando Irizarry asked if the BID can change the allocations.

Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez said, "The BID is an independent non-profit agency."

Handicapped Parking Spot on Market Street at City Hall Limited

PERTH AMBOY – At the 8/14/13 City Council Meeting there was a discussion over the handicapped parking space on Market Street in front of City Hall of whether or not to limit the time for parking in that particular space. The ordinance was originally written to limit the time to thirty minutes.

In the 7/17/13 issue of the Amboy Guardian City Attorney stated that he is the one that initiated this limitation on handicapped parking. "We want to limit the time so other handicapped people can park there. I've seen people park there for hours."

Resident Alan Silber stated, "Are you going to limit a handicapped person's right?

What if a handicapped person wants to meet with someone like the Mayor or B.A.? One half hour does not meet with ADA requirements. I think that two hours will fit. Other cities do it for four hours."

Resident Stanley Sierakowski felt that one particular resident (John Siberry) was targeted by placing a time limit on that handicapped space. He referred to a past incident involving Siberry, (who often parks in that particular handicapped spot) and the Mayor's husband. Sierakowski stated, "Mr. Siberry was verbally abused by the Mayor's husband (during that incident). All of this is retaliation. Mr. Siberry is a target. If you are

Student Randy Rivas stated, "We now have a choice: Regular or A.P." The students stressed the fact that it is too difficult to take a full course load of A.P. classes even if it is schedule permitting. The students pointed out that other schools have an Honors Program so why can't Perth Amboy?

Student Maitta Harris said, "This is a community issue. We need the right classes to give us knowledge."

The students held up signs and explained the math track for regular and Honors students. It clearly showed that Honors Students were on a more advanced level of mathematics for college, including Calculus in the 11th and 12th grade. "We're at a different level. It makes no sense to be pushed into one class. Everyone looks down at Perth Amboy but we really are a good school. Some of us want to go to Harvard. Keep Honors so I can go," Maitta stated

Student Rafael Toffera stated, "I want to apply to Harvard. It's not fair that the Honors Program is being taken away from us. We should have the best education possible."

Student May Bileye spoke about bullying issues, "It's demeaning to both groups of students. A generalized student was placed in one of our Honors classes. She wasn't happy. She looked like a lost puppy."

Student Rosemary Nivar stated, "We didn't always have the same experience. There is Spanish II Honors and Spanish II Regular. When I was in the Honors classroom we spoke Spanish. In the Regular class we were supposed to be speaking Spanish. I couldn't work at my pace; I had to take it notches down."

The President of the group, Stephanie Rodriguez said, "Dr. Caffrey is leaving Honors for Juniors and Seniors and taking away everything else. Honors had changed the way I see life. I don't think it's fair to the 2nd, 3rd & 4th Grade. I've been in the hospital recently. I got to meet a psychologist. He asked me how I was doing emotionally. He said what Honors meant to him back in the 1970's and it wasn't a big deal back then. I also got to meet Miss America. She went into Honors in the 10th Grade. She regrets she didn't have Honors earlier because she felt she would have won more pageants. Why do you want to take away our opportunities? Honors teach you to become independent. It is going to make us better doctors and better lawyers. You can't take that away. We should expand the Honors Program."

The meeting was opened to the public to speak. Maria, a student said, "I never knew the Honors Program. I would like to be somebody, to be in an Honors Class and to go to college. I would like to try it."

Resident Lee Darden stated, "I have a four year old daughter and an eight year old son. What is your call of action?"

Rodriguez answered, "What we want is to spread the word. It's your education; it's your future."

Student Haliee Baez stated, "We want other student's opinions. Let the kids be heard!"

Resident Karen Varela stated, "I have gone to Shull School from 1960 to 1969 and PAHS from 1969 to 1973. I was in the accelerated classes. The same people were in all of my classes." Varela also stated that the Board of Education members present at this meeting should speak.

Rodriguez stated that Superintendent Dr. Caffrey explicitly forbid any Board of Education Members from speaking at this meeting. "I have the email," Rodriguez stated.

Resident Sharon Hubberman asked what she could do to help. "I can be an advocate for your case. I want you to achieve what your goal is. Don't give up. Each and every one of you is a leader. Keep an open mind. Seize the moment. Seize the opportunities."

Rodriguez repeatedly stressed the point that the Messengers of Peace was strictly a nonpolitical group. "Politics has played with my education."

The next Board of Education meeting is on Thursday, August 29. The Messengers of Peace students plan to attend.

B.A. Fehrenbach answered, "The BID Board can change any one of the allocations. The fiscal year is July 1st to June 30th. The process should have taken place in May. The budget is determined on how much is collected from property taxes. It is the levy that you (the Council) are acting upon. The levy is on property value within the business district. If you don't support the reallocations that they (the BID) make, it is within the authority of the Council to recognize the levy on property value within the business district."

The Council approved the BID budget for 2013-1014 fiscal year.

so concerned, there should be 2 spaces there. Any public place allows two handicapped parking spaces for 2 hours."

Blunda stated, "30 minutes is sufficient. The limitation is appropriate. The time limit will assist the handicapped. There should be a limitation."

Council President Joel Pabon stated, "After Monday's (Caucus) Meeting I came back with someone who is handicapped; we came upstairs and bought a candy bar (from the vending machine). It took 20 minutes with my assistance. I'd like the Council to think about this. Whether it's to come to see the Mayor or B.A. it's going to take long."

Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez stated that the parking spots in front of City Hall have a 15 minute time limit. "If someone is going to meet the Mayor or B.A., 15 minutes is not enough."

The Council amended the ordinance 2 hour time limit. The amended ordinance passed.

Housing Authority Chair Dorothy Daniel states, "The Housing Authority makes that decision. As far as the property on Lawrie Street, there is a Middlesex County Habitat for Humanity in name only. The Morris County Habitat for Humanity was good enough to engage in partners with us in this venture. The Perth Amboy Housing Authority will decide who will become the homeowner. It will be done by lottery. An independent party will pick it."





Wisniewski, Prieto, Moriarty & Conaway "Nikki's Law" to Erect Signage on Roadways Promoting No Texting, While Driving Law Now Law

News Release 8/14/13

TRENTON - Legislation sponsored by Assembly Democrats John Wisniewski, Vincent Prieto, Paul Moriarty and Herb Conaway, Jr. to erect signage warning motorists that text messaging while driving is prohibited under state law has been signed into law.

The law, designated "Nikki's Law", is named after Nikki Kellenyi, an 18-year old National Honor Society for Business student and champion equestrian from Washington Township, NJ who tragically died in an automobile accident in 2012.

"The typical text message takes 4.6 seconds – that would be the equivalent of driving a car blind at 55 mph the entire length of a football field," said Wisniewski (D-Middlesex), who chairs the Assembly Transportation, Public Works and Independent Authorities. "A quick look away while driving may seem minor, but it can be fatal. This law honors Nikki's memory and will hopefully help save others by reminding drivers that current state law prohibits texting while driving."

The law (A-3873/S-2406) requires the Commissioner of Transportation, in consultation with the Director of the Division of Highway Traffic Safety in the Department of Law and Public Safety, to erect appropriate signage and use variable message signs, informing motorists that text messaging and sending electronic mes-

sages via wireless telephone or electronic communication device while driving is prohibited under state law. The law takes effect immediately.

"Many people fail to realize the great risk they take when they look away from the road for even just a few seconds to respond or send a text message," said Prieto (D-Bergen/Hudson). "Some may not even be aware that under state law texting while driving is a crime. Having signage reminding drivers that texting while driving is illegal will hopefully help curb this dangerous behavior."

"According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, text messaging creates a crash risk 23 times worse than driving while not distracted. Your life is not worth a text message," said Moriarty (D-Camden/Gloucester). "We passed a law prohibiting this behavior. Erecting signage reminding motorists that texting is not only dangerous, but illegal is the next logical step."

"Texting while driving does not only endanger the driver, but the driver's passengers and other motorists on the road," said Conaway (D-Burlington). "There is no text message worth dying for. Seeing signage on the road pushing the message that texting while driving is illegal will hopefully make drivers think twice about taking their eyes off the road to respond to a text on their phone."



- A "Veterans' Coffee House" provides a forum for veterans to meet once a month, to dis-

cuss their military experiences and to bond with other veter-

- An "After-School" program to instruct children how to use a computer for educational purposes, to complete their homework properly and to develop good "study habits".
- A "Food Pantry" to assist those in need with food to feed their families.
- A "Soup Kitchen", which operates during the last 10 days of every month, serves men, women and children with a warm lunch.
- A" Summer Camp Program" that provides the opportunity for low-income families to send their children to The Salvation Army's Camp Tecumseh located on almost 400 acres of rolling hills in rural Hunterdon County, New Jersey (http://camptecumseh.com).
- A "Thanksgiving Meal" program in which over 100 turkeys and all the associated food items are provided each year to low-income families.
- The "Angel Tree Program" enlists large companies and corporations to give requested gifts to the children of low-income families and children whose parent(s) are incarcerated during the Christmas season.
- The "Christmas Kettle Program" that collects money at specific business locations in Middlesex County. These ket-

tles are manned by volunteers and are the primary source of funds for The Salvation Army. The goal is to raise \$35,000 to \$50,000 to support all the services provided.

• "Emergency Disaster Services" (EDS) responds to all types of fires, explosions and natural disasters like Hurricane Sandy. The Federal Office of Homeland Security paid for the 18 foot Canteen which is capable of serving 1,000 meals a day. The Middlesex County Coordinator, Jesse Rivera, recruits volunteers, makes provisions for their training and supervises the Canteen operations as well as obtaining food supplies. Mr. Rivera, who also serves as the Chairman of the Advisory Board, was among 20 individuals out of more than 1,000 recommended, conferred with Gov. Christie's prestigious Jefferson Award for outstanding volunteer service.







Continued from Page 1 was in the water Jorge Ortega-Romero approached and began playing with one of the children a 7 year old female in the water. It appears they were pulled out by the under currents at which time Romero attempted to push the young girl towards the shore, at this time a 12 year old male which was also with Lozada went into the water with Romero and the young girl. Lozada not seeing Romero began yelling for help. Several fishermen that were in the area called 911 as a 14 year old male which also resides in the City ran in to assist the children. At this time an Auxiliary Police Unit which was patrolling the area was flagged down. 
