Staffing Changes Highlight Busy Perth Amboy Board Meeting

By: Joseph L. Kuchie PERTH AMBOY - A number of important staffing concerns were addressed during last Thursday's Perth Amboy Board of Education meeting.

The board supported Superintendent Janine Walker Caffrey's recommendation to name Michael Heidelberg the new Principal of Samuel E. Shull School. Heidelberg served as the school's Vice Principal and will replace Lorraine Morgan.

One representative of the school district referred to Heidelberg as a "young, energetic, innovative leader" and expects him to change Shull from a "focus school to a unfocus school". The new head of the Shull School thanked the board and Superintendent Caffrey for their support and addressed his plans for the future.

"I'm very excited to lead an unbelievably dedicated staff," Heidelberg said. "My whole goal and our goal as a school is to make Shull School a great place for kids to come to learn and a great place for teachers to come and teach."

However, there were a few recommendations that the board did not approve.

One of the big recommendations to be shot down involved swapping three Vice Principals from the Shull School,

Perth Amboy High School, and William C. McGinnis Middle School.

In the potential transfer, PAHS Vice Principal Edwin Nieves would move to Shull School, Derrick Kyriacou of Shull would move to PAHS, and Brian Rivera from McGinnis School would move to the Shull School.

Board member Dianne Roman appreciated the effort and thought that went into the recommendations, but felt that the high school was being neglected in the process.

"I'm concerned that although we are looking to help support the needs at the Shull School, I want to make sure that we don't neglect the support of the high school," Roman said. "I want to make sure this board thinks about what is best for both schools."

Board Member Obi Gonzalez agreed with Roman and also added her concerns about a lack of a bilingual male administrator at the high school.

"I see there will be no male bilingual person at the High School and I think that's something we need to look at more carefully," Gonzalez said. "This is the last stop on the train [the high school] and I want to make sure this staff gets the support it needs to show the improvement that we

Perth Amboy Board of Education Holds Public Donaldson Hearing

Former Perth Amboy High School Robotics Teacher Tells His Story

By: Joseph L. Kuchie PERTH AMBOY - A rare public Donaldson hearing was held at the beginning of last week's Perth Amboy Board of Education meeting for former robotics teacher Gerald "Gerry" Brady.

A Donaldson hearing, named after the 1974 New Jersey Supreme Court case Donaldson v. North Wildwood Bd. Of Ed., allows a teacher the right to appear before the district board to contest the decision not to have their employment renewed.

The length of the hearing is determined by the Board of Education and is usually held in private session. However, Brady took on his former employer with parents, teachers, and residents looking on.

Brady, who was hired in Sept. 2010, explained to the board that he was not given the proper textbooks or tools he needed to teach four full-year courses. He went on to say that a number of requests to his administrators were not properly answered.

"I met with [STEM Academy Vice Principal] Mrs. [Esperanza] Anastasio and Dr. Collazo asking for materials in these classes such as course curriculum, textbooks, software, robot kits, etc.," he said. "I indicated to both administrators that I needed at least some of these items to help provide instruction for these four full-year courses...none of this was provided."

Brady also believed that he did not receive a fair observation from the school's staff. He pointed out that despite having five classes with an average grade of 85 or higher, the school only observed the class that had a low-C average.

"My classes performed very well and, compared to a lot of classes being taught, my classes did really well," he explained. "The observation which was used to not renew my contract was done only in my first period class that had the worst average. Why doesn't the rest count?"

PAHS Principal Dr. Nestor Collazo was in attendance for the hearing and took questions from the board. He stated that Brady did receive the equipment he needed in a timely fashion and the observations made took place during two different class periods.

"The fact is he did receive equipment and he got it in a timely fashion," Collazo said. "Mrs. Anastasio proceeded to do the observation again in either Brady's third and fourth period classes. She walked into that different classroom and observed the same practices and issues that had raised serious concerns."

Collazo added that there are many components to effective instruction and that many of the issues that led to Brady's release involved his teaching methods.

"Frankly a lot of the issues raised here in the observations had to do with [Brady] as a teacher," Collazo said. "We can talk about the kits, which he did receive because I made sure the kits got to him... but clearly what got everyone's attention was what was happening inside the classroom."

After a lengthy closed session that lasted nearly two hours, the board returned to the auditorium and finished with a 4-4 vote, meaning that Brady will not be reinstated for the 2013-14 school year.

Brady was disappointed that he was not brought back because of a tie. Vice President Ken Puccio was not in attendance for the meeting, and Brady believed there should be another vote with all board members present.

"Since when in America does one side win in a tie vote and the other side loses?" Brady

asked after the meeting. "This should be put up for a vote again with the full nine members present. I feel I really got cheated there."

Some of Brady's students were also in attendance and made their opinions heard in support of one of their favorite teachers. Brady was grateful but believed they did not get a proper say until after the decision was made.

"It was nice to see students come out and support but again, the board fixed this in their favor by voting before hearing from the students, parents, and the general public as well," he said. "They were not allowed to talk until well after the vote."

Superintendent Janine Walker Caffrey pointed out that the board's attorney was present and advised them on the proper procedures for a Donaldson case. She was, however, disturbed by how the audience reacted during the case.

"This was a very serious matter to determine a man's future," she said via email. "Some members of the audience cheered and jeered in a way that they would at an entertainment or sporting event. He deserved dignity and proper decorum from the public."

After a long discussion, the board voted against the transfer 6-2 and will keep Nieves, Kyriacou, and Rivera in their

current roles.

The ongoing situation of the open head baseball coach position was also discussed during the athletics portion of the meeting.

The board originally chose to table the decision to appoint Ryan Boyd to the position back in June and discussed it again last Thursday. Board member Milady Tejeda believed that because Nephtaly Cardona was named new Director of Physical Education that night, the job should be reposted to allow the new director to have a say.

Despite support from board

members William Ortiz, Maria Garcia, Anton Massopust, and Mark Carvajal, the vote did not pass after Tejeda, Roman, Gonzalez, and Varela all abstained. The decision will once again leave the position open.

Cardona was the Supervisor of Special Services for Grades 5-12 in Perth Amboy and the former PAHS girl's basketball coach. He will replace Julie Schick.

The meeting was delayed nearly a half-hour when the fire alarm forced an evacuation from Perth Amboy High School. It is the second time this summer that the meeting was brought to a halt due to a fire alarm.

Vice President Kenneth Puccio was not in attendance. The next scheduled board meeting will be held on Sept. 19 at 6:00 p.m.

The City of Perth Amboy, the UEZ/BID, the NJ-SBDC and, SBA and Rutgers Business School presented a seminar called, "Could Your Business Survive Another Sandy?" on Thursday, August 29, 2013.

The program was very informative for all businesses no matter what size. Although the emphasis was on those businesses that suffered damage during Superstorm Sandy, there was a lot to learn beforehand in case another superstorm hits the area. a representative from FEMA was there to hand out literature along with the others.

We asked some of our advertisers who were present how they found out about the seminar. Two of them said Roxana Troche called them and she always calls when she feels there's a program that could be beneficial to them.

Developer Barry Rosengarten who is chair of the BID spoke from his personal experience. After the storm he assumed that his insurance policy covered flooding and was shocked to find out it didn't. He said, "It pays to read your policy over carefully." His main computers were located on the first floor of his office which was hit hardest by Sandy and all of his data was lost.

Another business located on the Waterfront suffered a major loss when most of his equipment was washed out to sea. He wanted to know what he could do because all of his invoices and records were in a computer that no longer exists. By attending this seminar he found out how he can have some of his vital information recovered.

Lori Matheus, Managing Dir. of NJ EDA (NJ Economic Development Authority) gave an overview of what monies were available to businesses affected by the storm and the criteria that has to be met to qualify.

Elayne P. McClaine from the SBDC (Small Business Development Ctr.) stated that her agency does not give out money. Her department had people that helped in the following areas: cyber security insurance consulting (CPA's, lawyers), marketing, strategic and business consultants. Folders with vital information were handed out by all of the sponsors present.

Perth Amboy Mayor Diaz ears perked up when she heard about the program for neighborhood and community revitalization. Diaz told them that "You will be getting a lot of calls from my office."

Personally, for myself I was very interested in attending several of the NJ Small Business Development workshops at Rutgers University. There is a nominal fee for most of them. Looking at the description of the courses, I feel they are well worth the cost. An Open Letter to the People of Perth Amboy

On August 29th, at the Perth Amboy Board of Education meeting, President Mark Carvajal announced that the Board would be initiating a search process for Superintendent of Schools. He also stated that this process would not exclude me, indicating I could potentially apply for my own position. There has been much rumor and speculation about my intentions regarding my position here, so I would like to take this opportunity to clear things up.

I came to Perth Amboy over two years ago with one purpose; to work with the community to improve our public school system. Almost immediately, long before the infamous tenure article, the former Board president began relentless attacks against me that resulted in my retention of an attorney. This was just a couple of months after I started my job here. As you may remember, this continued until February 9, 2012, when Lebreault announced a sort of truce when he made his public statement. This statement can still be viewed on the paps.net website under the BOE Overview tab. The next couple of months were very productive, and I was confident the worst

was behind us. However, this was not the case. In late April, with no warning, I was contacted by my attorney and informed that the Board would be placing me on leave unless I would agree to quit. A long list of ridiculous accusations was made, and a special attorney was hired to investigate them. However, once it became apparent that the list was without truth, most BOE members knew that an investigation would backfire. So, no investigation ever occurred. I filed a petition for emergent relief to the Commissioner of Education and was sent back to work due to the illegality of the process. The Board tried two more times to put me out, and I was returned again and again. The last time was on September 22, 2012. The resolution approved on this day also included a "non-renewal" clause which means that the Board was putting me on notice that I would not get a new contract after my current contract expires on June 30, 2014.

In January, 2013, I was delighted to begin working with a new President and several new members. This new Board would have plenty of opportunity to offer me a new contract, thus overturning the actions of the previous Board, and allowing us to continue with our work on behalf of our children and community. However, many months went by, and it became quite apparent that a new contract would not become a reality. When

I began to question this, and sought legal assistance to get a firm answer from the Board, there was a misunderstanding that I had resigned. As you can tell, I have not resigned. However, as President Carvajal stated last night, the process for searching for a superintendent is quite lengthy. It took me nearly a year to find my position here, and I know that I must start looking now in order to be gainfully employed by next July. So, I have begun exploring my employment options. I just want to do good work and continue helping kids.

It is clear that a majority of BOE members are not supportive of offering me a new contract. The people of Perth Amboy elected these officials to make this decision, and I respect their decision. Therefore, I will not be applying for my own position. I will continue working to the very best of my ability and focus on the students and families I serve, through my last day in Perth Amboy. Although the politics here have been challenging, I have enjoyed every moment of the real work of providing a great education to our students. Thanks to all of you who continue to support our children and all efforts to improve our school system. Our kids need you now more than





In emotional interviews, they describe the experience of fighting together in vivid detail.
