Will Transit Village Get On Track?

Revitalization of Downtown Perth Amboy a Factor


PERTH AMBOY - The City of Perth Amboy was awarded a \$90,000 grant specifically to improve the area around the train station. This was announced by Mayor Diaz as she sat beside Annie Hindenalng (Senior Planner, Office of Economic and Community Development) during the Caucus portion of the 11/13/13 meeting held at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Hindenlang was there to talk about the Together North Jersey Grant and to introduce those participating in helping the City towards the goal of becoming a Transit Village District.

The Together North Jersey Website states: Together North Jersey, a project administered by the Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, is the recipient of a \$5 million U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Sustainable Communities Regional Planning Grant award.

The grant will develop a Regional Plan for Sustainable Development (RPSD) for the 13-county NJTPA region. The plan will use sustainability, transit system connectivity, and transit-oriented-development as the central framework for

integrating plans, regulations, investments, and incentive programs at all levels of government to bring jobs and create additional economic development opportunities in the area.

Several speakers were present to give an overview of how Perth Amboy's Train Station and downtown area's specifically Smith, Market and High Streets and New Brunswick Avenue can become the anchors to revitalize Perth Amboy's commercial and financial growth.

The advantage that Perth Amboy has is that the downtown area (Smith Street) has a number stores and businesses within walking distance.

Some of the wider streets (such as High Street) would be ideal for bike paths. The goal is to make bike paths one of the main modes of transportation within the City to the downtown area.

One of the oldest buildings in Perth Amboy is occupied by a furniture store which has a large empty second floor. The owner of that building showed interest in possibly converting that second floor into loft apartments.

The speaker said that Perth crowding in the data Amboy's assets make it ideal area has been a main for cultural and civic activities. But there's also a lot of term on the Council.

under-utilized space.

Market Street and New Brunswick Avenue should be targeted for redevelopment.

The Train station at South Orange was used as a possible example of what Perth Amboy's Train Station could become. "We need to attract people who are more geared towards an urban lifestyle. Parking is the most problematic, especially at the Five Corners Intersecting, New Brunswick Avenue, State and Smith Streets. It needs to be used in a more efficient manner.

The Jefferson Street Parking Garage also came into play. There was talk about having an area there for recreational use, utilizing some of the area as an expansion to a seating area for an outdoor area for dining or relaxation.

For these changes to be feasible, zoning would have to be revised.

Former Councilman Kenneth Balut spoke during the public portion about what was said during this presentation. He stated, "This town is too congested." He mentioned the 37 apartments that will be included when a building on Hobart Street is renovated. Overcrowding in the downtown area has been a main concern of Balut's during and after his term on the Council

Project Read a Major Concern at Board of Education Meeting 11/14/13

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - At the Public Portion of the 11/14/13 Board of Education Meeting Leslie Morrow from Project Read at Rutgers University voiced her opinion on Project Read. "Dr. Caffrey did not solicit us for Project Read. We solicited her. The one day workshops (training the teachers in Project Read) will have little effect on the teachers. They need more training. I implore you to continue Project Read."

During the meeting, Acting Superintendent Derek Jess proposed to approve Project Read through November 2013. He stated that the cost is \$54,000 for the 5 elementary schools utilizing Project Read.

Board Member Israel Varela said, "If we approve this now, there is nothing to stop it. I hate to be blackmailed - not by Rutgers - They're nice people. Every school should give a report on it."

Jess then decided that the Chief Literacy Officer, Dr. Damian Medina should have a look at the program and that way the Board will have honest feedback.

Varela said, "It (the feedback) should come from the staff."

Jess answered, "I'll make sure if the staff gives their ideas and not anyone else."

Board Member Dianne Roman then added, "We shouldn't take something out. These are taxpayer's dollars. We have a responsibility to do that."

Board Member Milady Tejeda said, "It's very difficult to make a decision when you hear both good and bad things about a program. Reading is very important."

Board Member Obi Gonzalez said, "I agree what is said about its problems. We need a pencil and paper survey. I'm glad that Dr. Medina is here. I don't think it's a terrible thing to pay for something if we have the money - and we do. Let's do it for this month and for December and put it forward in January."

The Board decided to amend the agenda item to include the month of December. A final decision will be made in January at the next Board Meeting. Later in the meeting Rutgers

This was our custom in the fifties. Many of us who had cars would drive through town on Friday night which was the big shopping night to see and be seen. Those participating, met at the Terrazza Restaurant parking lot on High Street. Perth Amboy police officers Rogers and Martinez were there to guide us on the historical trip. With their lights flashing and the sirens whooping, they stopped traffic and led us around the city hall circle, through the downtown, turning into the train station and back on to Smith Street. We danced to the music of the fifties by the Moonrakers. There was a huge cake with the logo of our yearbook in the

Pallone Announces Beginning of Long Branch Beach Replenishment Project

News Release November 12, 2013 WASHINGTON, D.C.—Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) announced that the contract has been awarded and work will begin next week on a \$40 million beach replenishment project in Long Branch. This Army Corps of Engineers project, which is funded at full federal expense, will restore beaches in Long Branch to conditions better than prior to Sandy. The project is expected to be completed by spring, 2014. Pallone was joined by Colonel Paul Owen, Commander of the

New York District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

"Sandy severely damaged our beaches and caused serious erosion that needs to be repaired to protect us from future storms," said Pallone. "With this critical beach replenishment project getting underway, we are moving a step closer toward recovering from Superstorm Sandy and rebuilding the Shore."

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is repairing and restoring the entire Sea Bright to Manasquan beach erosion control and storm risk reduction project with funds from the Sandy aid package, which Pallone fought for in Congress. The Long Branch portion of the project, which is the third of four phases, will pump approximately 3.3 million cubic yards of sand along the beaches in Long Branch. The work will be done by Manson Construction using the largest hopper dredge in the United States, the Glenn Edwards.

Beach replenishment will begin in Long Branch at Pier Village and continue south to Takanassee Lake. Upon the completion of that section, replenishment will continue from Pier Village, north to Monmouth Beach. The newly constructed beach berm will be at an elevation of 9.3 feet above the mean tideline with width of 140 to 250 feet.

The section of the coast from Elberon to Loch Arbour will move forward under a separate contract in autumn of 2014. Sand has not previously been placed along this section of the coast. Easements and design work for the project need to be completed including the outfall at Takanassee Lake.

The Army Corps of Engineers is completing the beach replenishment work from Sea Bright to Manasquan under five contracts. The Army Corps recently completed the first replenishment contract in Sea Bright and Monmouth Beach and plans to begin replenishment from Asbury Park to Avon-by-the-Sea in January. Construction on the section from Belmar to Manasquan began last week. The last contact will cover work from Elbron to Loch Arbour.

The FDA's Move to Take Artificial Trans Fats Entirely Out of the Food Supply is a Lifesaving Step

News Release -November 15, 2013 By: Dr. Ayotunde Adeyeri PERTH AMBOY & OLD BRIDGE - The Food and Drug Administration recently announced it is beginning a process that will take artificial trans fats entirely out of the food supply. This move is correctly being hailed as "lifesaving" by health experts. A recent USA Today report included a statement from the food industry saying that since 2005 manufacturers have already lowered trans fats in products by more than 73%. Today, the FDA says, 12% of all packaged foods contain trans fats. These food groups include many widely-consumed products such as candies, frying oils, baked goods, microwave popcorn and other snacks,

stick and tub margarine and coffee creamers. It's important to note in nutrition facts panels on food labels that trans fats may be listed as partially hydrogenated oils.

Numerous studies have shown that consumption of trans fats can cause many adverse health risks, including elevating bad cholesterol (LDL), lowering good cholesterol (HDL) and increasing the potential for developing type 2 diabetes. Small amounts of trans fats occur naturally in some meat and dairy products but it is not known if naturally occurring trans fats have the same negative effects.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that 5,000 Americans die every year from heart disease because of artificial trans fats found in food. While an FDA rule, in force since 2006, requires food companies to list trans fats on nutrition labels, it's still often confusing to understand which foods are good—or bad—for us.

Fortunately, for individuals who have serious weightrelated health problems, weight loss surgery and ongoing support have proven to be effective in overcoming obesity when combined with nutrition and lifestyle counseling. Weight loss surgery, also known as bariatric surgery, can help these individuals with type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease or sleep apnea, or who have been unsuccessful losing weight on their own, to achieve their goals of better health.

CTE Diagnoses for NFL Greats Reinforces Need for Concussion Safety

News Release November 14, 2013 By: Dhimant J. Balar, DO PERTH AMBOY & OLD BRIDGE - The recent announcement that Pro Football Hall of Famers Tony Dorsett and Joe DeLamielleure and former NFL All-Pro Leonard Marshall have been diagnosed as having signs of chronic traumatic encephalopathy has again brought sports and head trauma to the forefront in the national consciousness. This degenerative condition, also known as CTE, is believed by many scientists to be caused by blows to the head and is linked to depression and dementia. CTE is a pathologic neurological disease of the brain characterized by the buildup of tau protein complexes, an abnormal complex of cells that destroy areas of the brain that are important in memory, emotion and other important functions. Research has shown that traumatic brain injury, including concussions, may be one etiology

of the development of these toxic proteins. Autopsies of more than 50 ex-NFL players including popular perennial all-pro Junior Seau, who committed suicide last year, found concentrations of tau.

The professionals at Raritan Bay Medical Center and its Human Motion Institute understand the implications of the data and research on the relationship between head trauma and sport and are working hard to educate the public, promote wellness and build a strong prevention program, especially through the ImPACT program. ImPACT is designed to help trainers, coaches and physicians monitor athletes' symptoms so they do not return to sport before their brain has healed, hopefully preventing neurological damage. It is important to understand that the key to preventing concussions is recognition. Recognizing symptoms, close monitoring, helped with ImPACT can enable a safe return to

Immediate Post-Concussion Assessment and Cognitive Testing (ImPACT) was first developed at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center and is widely recognized as the gold standard for concussion evaluation. ImPACT testing provides a baseline record of a patient's cognitive function, attention, memory, reaction time, and visual processing speed. In the event of a concussion. the patient is retested and the results are compared to the original readings. Patients involved in physical activity such as sports will not begin a stepwise process of return to play protocols until they meet their baseline test score. This process reduces the potential for further injury and long-term damage.




