Will the Move(able) Walls Work? Water/Wastewater Presentation

Snow Removal Update and Much Needed Equipment for Public Works

Caucus & Council Meeting 1/22/14

PERTH AMBOY - Luis Perez Jimenez Director of Operations USAPA gave an overview of what needs to be done in the water/wastewater systems.

Jimenez' main concern was the replacement of the 4 inch water main pipes with 6 inch pipes. "This has to be done because of EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) regulations. There have been small leaks at the Florida Grove Road Reservoir that have been repaired before, but leaks are still occurring inside the reservoir walls. We have been talking to engineers about how to permanently fix this problem. The Runyon wall pipes need to be inspected, repairs made and cleaning. The sewer collection system (catch basins) need to be replaced per EPA requirements," Jimenez stated.

B.A. Greg Fehrenbach reminded the Council that there was 2013 Bond Ordinance that this item appeared on."

Jimenez continued, "There's been a reduction in the capacity of the mainline. That's why we have to clean the receptors. Another EPA regulation."

"With the Second Street Pump Station mitigation, we will be looking into elevating the motors and electrical equipment. We estimate that the cost of this will be around \$2.055 million."

B.A. Fehrenbach said, "This is where Mr. Jimenez and I have a slight disagreement."

Fehrenbach estimated the cost to be around \$1.6 million. Fehrenbach factored into FEMA funds that the City has requested but has not yet received. "The FEMA mitigation funds will come into about \$555,000 but it could be lower. We are eligible for the maximum of \$620,000. CDM Smith was awarded the contract."

Fehrenbach said, "The gen-

erator at the Second Street Pump Station would not be elevated but would be protected by a movable wall that can be used when necessary."

Perez Jiminez verified what Fehrenbach said in regards to the generator.

It was stated that the reason that these changes had to take place at the Second Street Pump Station is to prevent another occurrence of damage that happened when Superstorm Sandy hit.

Department of Public Works Director Frank Dann was the next speaker to talk about what additional funds will be needed in his department and the reasons why.

Before going into that topic Dann wanted to give an update on the snow removal procedures on Tuesday, January 21, 2014.

Dann started out by saying, "Our roads will have snow on them for a few days. This is due to the fact of very cold temperatures, high winds and drifting snow. Salt will not work if the temperature is 20 degrees or below. Some plows have rubber blades and some plows have steel blades, which sometimes break when hitting manhole covers. On emergency roads the police will go up and down the streets first with light and horns to let people know that they have to remove their cars off the streets. Any cars that remain after the first warning will be towed."

Dann then went into what is needed at the Public Works Department as a whole. "\$500,000 is needed for road reconstruction, resurfacing, repairing (which can include replacing the curbs). We can do 6 to 8 roads a year with this money. The engineers can give an exact cost. We need 3 tractor trailer trucks to transport materials that will end up in the landfill. One of those

tractor-trailer trucks is a 1996 model. We have 2 tractortrailers that run steady every day. This is a requirement by DEP (Department of Environmental Protection) that says we must move materials every day. We have one full time and three part time drivers who drive these trucks. We have a 8 to 10 year old truck that can be used as a backup, but it has a front load problem. We also need another automated garbage truck with containers. It will be 6 months before we get the 2 trucks already on order."

Dann also said, "If these trucks are approved by the Council, it will be 1 year to 16 months before delivery can be made on them. This is because trucks have to be built to our specifications and we will be looking at bids."


B.A. Greg Fehrenbach said, "We will need to have money for these trucks to be approved."

Dann continued, "In the meantime, we will go to other towns to see if there have been upgrades to trucks they have in operation."

"Front-loader garbage trucks are very quick and they are good for small areas. We pick up and do disposals for the school system. The school system says that they will perform this task. Currently we pick up trash everyday from the schools during the school year."

B.A. Greg Fehrenbach stated, "It's a quarter million dollar expense to pick up garbage from the schools. We hope that the schools can supplement or support part of the cost for the school garbage pickup. We approached them about doing this in 2014. Some municipalities have scavenger pickups."

Dann talked about a 1990 Mason dump truck with a spreader that needs to be re-

placed. "Six spreaders went out during the storm. One is now down. Salt has corroded some of the motors and other parts of the equipment. All of our drivers do pre-trip forms to check for the safety of the equipment they will be taking out. There is a list of 30 items to be inspected on the vehicles - including brakes. We do not send out any unsafe trucks. There is a 1995 pickup truck that is not in good shape. These trucks are needed to go

PERTH AMBOY — The public is advised that on December 30, 2013, the Middlesex County Board do Chosen Freeholders adopted Resolution #13-2307-R, official vacating Maurer Road in the City of Perth Amboy as a public right-of-way.

Maurer Road has been vacated from a point on Maurer Road approximately one hundred (100) feet east of the New Jersey Transit railroad tracks to the terminus of Maurer Road at State Street.

As such and for the safety of drivers, Maurer Road is now a private roadway and as of Wednesday, January 29, 2014 can NO LONGER be used as a thru-street to travel between Amboy Avenue and State Street in the City of Perth Amboy. The roadway will continuously be occupied by truck traffic and for the use of Buckeye Partners.

The public is advised to plan an alternate route.

into cul-de-sac's and dead end streets."

"Work needs to be done in the City Hall building. The windows need to have sealants or replacement windows. These would be wooden windows taking into consideration the historic aspect of the building. The outside of the windows would have an aluminum protective. Dan Cleaver is very protective of the historic value of the building."

Dann continued, "We need \$18,000 for storage bins. The bins that we have now contain topsoil, crushed concrete and asphalt. We are concerned about cross-contamination. The \$18,000 will be used for concrete blocks for 3 bins (To separate the materials). The

gazebos at the Waterfront need to be replaced. We can put a temporary wall around them in the event of another Superstorm Sandy. We're looking at \$20,000 for each one. The gazebos have a lot of vandalism and the ones that we need can be built with materials that can be easily cleaned. At the Public Works Department we need to get updated software for the front security gate. This would include getting special keys. The software that is in place now is 20 years old. We have shared services with the school system."

B.A. Greg Fehrenbach wrapped up the discussion of the Capital Improvement Program and the Capital Budget 2014 with the following: "\$440,000 is needed for the 911 system for the Police Department."

He then told the Council the steps they need to take when adopting a temporary Capital Budget starting in January which would be for 3 to 4 months. An introduction of bond ordinances is needed. There would have to be an application to the local Finance Board to adopt a bond for this in the budget.

"On the agenda for February 12, 2014 there will be an item for the approval of the Capital Budget, a Temporary Budget of \$300,000 for Capital Improvements and \$300,000 Appropriation. There will also be an intro of 2 bond ordinances in the Capital Budget plus Water/Wastewater. This will enable the City's debt reduction to go down from \$203/\$207 million to \$197/\$198 million of debt."

PERTH AMBOY - Attorney Daniel Gonzalez, son of former Councilman Fernando Gonzalez made a rare appearance at the 1/22/14 City Council Meeting. During the public portion, Gonzalez talked about a statement that his father made about a recent shooting and a letter the Mayor wrote about the school system.

Daniel Gonzalez said, "Sometimes Council Meetings turn into a political forum and can become contentious. I wish for more people to come, but we need to be more respectable. I ask all to respect each other and move in a positive way. My father was approached after the last Council Meeting outside the hallway and some things were said to him. My father has a heart condition and has to be careful, but right now he's in Puerto Rico."

Leslie Dominguez who is also the Perth Amboy Democratic Chair was more to the point. Dominguez read from a prepared statement (see page 6) during the public portion of the Council Meeting. She said that Fernando Gonzalez was verbally attacked after

the 1/8/14 Council Meeting by the Mayor's husband. I'm asking for the Middlesex County Sheriff's Office to protect the citizens during and after the meetings."

Leslie Dominguez then spoke freely about an incident that happened after one of the Zoning Board Meetings. She had to wait to be escorted out by some of the other Board Members to her vehicle. She was verbally attacked during and after this meeting by some of the people attending.

At the Regular Council Meeting on 1/22/14 Resident Stanley Sierakowski said that the Mayor's husband starts arguments after meetings. Sierakowski said that Fernando Gonzalez was approached by

the Mayor's husband after the meeting. He stated that the Mayor's husband said to Fernando, "How dare you criticize the Mayor after all the favors she's done for you?"

Leslie Dominguez spoke again during the public portion of the regular meeting. "I'm asking that we just abide by policies and follow the rules and regulations." Speaking to the Council she said, "I thought you knew what happened at the 1/8/14 meeting. I was out of town at the time but I got texts and messages about the Mayor's husband verbally attacking Fernando Gonzalez. I love and respect our Police officers but the Mayor's relatives are exempt from the rules."

Same Questions - Same Answers Time to Take a Different Route

Since the December 4th shooting of Dixon Rodriguez there have been peaceful marches asking that justice be served.

One march that took place shortly after Dixon died started from Hall Avenue and at one point the marches proceeded down Smith Street and stopped at City Hall.

At City Hall some of the marchers had signs that they carried demonstrating their discontent with the investiga-

At one of the City Council Meetings, a representative speaking for the Dixon Rodriguez family stated that they are not blaming the police. She said that she doesn't even know if Dixon was to blame, but they just need their questions answered.

There have been speakers at the Council Meetings who were not related to the family who have shown their frustrations at the slow pace of the investigation.

The Latino Leadership Alliance of New Jersey (LLANJ) has filed an OPRA request asking for an investigation into the shooting.

The speakers have addressed the Council and Mayor asking them to push for a quicker resolution to the shooting, especially having the video surveillance tapes released.

One resident even brought it to the attention that the Prosecutor's Office has stated that

the officers acted accordingly.

Some wanted to know why the Mayor and the Council couldn't send a communication to the Prosecutor's Office for an update of how the investigation was progressing.

Police Chief Ruiz explained at the last Council Meeting on January 22 as he has done in previous meetings, that the case is out of the jurisdiction of the local Police.

Perhaps it's time for all of those concerned to write a letter to the Prosecutor and Attorney General's Office. If the letters have signatures attached, it will show how concerned the citizens are.

It's a possibility both or either of those offices may respond and provide more answers to the family and community.

It's up to the Council members if they choose to speak to the community about what happened.

The bottom line is no matter how many times people have come before the Council to speak about the shooting, the answers to their questions have remained the same: The investigation is out of the City's hands. City Attorney Mark Blunda said he could draft a letter asking if an update could be provided.

If you do the same thing over and over again and getting the same results, maybe it's time to take a different approach.

Reascending My Application to Be Reappointed to the Housing Authority

PERTH AMBOY - Since 1989 I have proudly served the Perth Amboy Housing Authority Board of Commissioners with good standing.

I am very proud of the many accomplishments of the Perth Amboy Housing Authority, such as the construction of the Otlowski Gardens on Convery Boulevard, the Dzema Gardens on Penn Street, the Sofield Gardens on Catherine Street, and the Parkview Building across from Washington Park.

I am also very proud to be one of the Commissioners who voted yes to sell the Stockton property to the Board of Education so the Richardson School could be built there.

One organization that I am not proud or happy with is the Perth Amboy Redevelopment Team for Neighborhood Enterprise and Revitalization better known as PARTNER.

In 2003 using \$600,000 from the Section 8 reserved (tax payers money) the Perth Amboy Housing Authority formed a nonprofit corporation named PARTNER to provide economical opportunity as well as housing to low income families and individuals.

At the end of 2010, I became outraged when I found out that from the beginning the majority of the funds spent by PART-NER went to pay dual salaries to two top Perth Amboy Housing Authority employees. The same people who suggested the formation of PARTNER in the first place.

From 2003 to the end of 2010, approximately \$252,000 was spent. Only \$21,000 were used for 21 scholarships to 21 High School Students, and the rest went for salaries and other administrative expenses. (This to me is outrageous adn unacceptable.)

I brought this information to the attention of my fellow Commissioners and to the PARTNER Board of Directors. All refused to see anything wrong with the way the funds were being spent. (Unbelievable.)

At the end of 2011 and the beginning of 2012, the office of HUD Inspector General audited the Perth Amboy Housing Authority and PARNTER, and in June 2012 presented

a 25 page Audit report to the Housing Authority.

The Audit found that while PARTNER was formed to provide economic, social and housing opportunities to low income families and individuals. The majority (86%) of the funds had been expended for PARTNER salary and administrative expenses, with limited accomplishments.

Even with this information in front of them, my fellow Commissioners and PARTNER Board of Directors saw nothing wrong. (Incredible.)

2 Commissioners who are also members of PARTNER Board of Directors plainly stated that the HUD Inspector General Audit was just a waste of time. (Just a waste of time, they should be ashamed of themselves.)

And while this was going on in Perth Amboy, I learned that the Housing Authority of Rochester, NY was going through a similar situation.

There the Commissioners with the help from city elected officials took action, and the end result there, is that the top people that were receiving dual salaries are no longer with the Rochester, NY Housing Authority. (Gone.)

I was hoping for the same result in Perth Amboy. So on August 3rd and September 5th 2012, I met with some city elected officials. At those meetings the elected officials appeared to be outraged and promised to help. But after 16 months of waiting for help, it is clear that help is not coming, and if it is coming, it is too late

So, because I cannot tolerate PARTNER's financial record and lack of accomplishments from 2003 to the end of 2010, and since I did not receive the help promised by some elected officials to do something about it, and also, because I no longer trust the people in charge of running the Perth Amboy Housing Authority, I have sadly decided to withdraw my request to be reappointed to the Perth Amboy Housing Authority Board of Commissioners. I am sad, outraged, frustrated, and very, very disappointed.



Sweeney Calls On Christie Administration To Provide Answers For Sandy Victims

TRENTON – Senate President Steve Sweeney today called on the Christie administration to disclose how it plans to proceed with the critical task of getting Sandy victims back into their homes now that it has cancelled a contract with the Louisiana firm Hammerman and Gainer (HGI).

The Christie administration awarded a multi-million dollar contract to HGI last year to help victims of Hurricane Sandy return to their homes, but during legislative hearings we heard from victims who complained about the firm losing their applications and failing to answer the simplest of questions.

The administration reportedly cancelled the firm's contract in December, but failed to disclose the action despite testifying at legislative hearings. The decision was ultimately disclosed by New Jersey Public Radio.

"This is exactly why we need to provide transparency, honesty and answers to the thousands of New Jersey residents who continue to suffer from Hurricane Sandy well over a year later. It's troubling that the administration was silent on the move and I can only hope that the wave of news that is plaguing this administration does not adversely af-

fect the needs of New Jersey's residents," Sweeney said.

"The victims and the public need to know who to hold accountable, not in three weeks or three months, but today," Sweeney said. "Last week I announced that I am currently drafting a Hurricane Sandy Bill of Rights that would help victims get the information and answers they desperately need and clearly deserve. Today's news reiterates the importance of getting answers for our residents."



Use IRS Adjusted Numbers For 2014 Tax Planning

Courtesy of Tom Ploskanka Certain tax numbers are adjusted by the IRS for inflation each year. Here are some of the 2014 tax numbers you'll need to use as you get started with this year's tax planning.

- The standard mileage rate for business driving decreases to 56¢ per mile for 2014. The rate for medical and moving mileage decreases from 24¢ per mile to 23.5¢ per mile. The general rate for charitable driving remains at 14¢ per mile.
- The maximum earnings subject to social security tax in 2014 increases to \$117,000. The earnings limit for those under full retirement age is \$15,480. For those at full retirement age, there is no earnings limit.
- The "nanny tax" threshold increases to \$1,900 for 2014. If you pay household workers more than this amount during the year, you're responsible for payroll taxes.
- The "kiddie tax" threshold for 2014 remains unchanged at \$2,000. If your child under age 19 (under age 24 for stu-

- dents) has more than \$2,000 of unearned income this year (e.g., dividends and interest income), the excess could be taxed at your highest rate.
- The maximum individual retirement account (IRA) contribution you can make in 2014 remains at \$5,500 if you're under age 50 and at \$6,500 if you are 50 or older.
- The maximum amount of wages employees can put into a 401(k) plan remains unchanged at \$17,500. The 2014 maximum allowed for SIM-PLE plans remains at \$12,000. If you are 50 or older, you can contribute up to \$23,000 to a 401(k) and \$14,500 to a SIM-PLE plan.
- For 2014, the maximum amount that can be contributed to a health savings account (HSA) increases to \$3,300 for individuals and \$6,550 for families. Those 55 and older can contribute an additional \$1,000.
- The alternative minimum tax exemption for 2014 is \$52,800 for singles and \$82,100 for couples filing joint returns.


