Accusations Fly Out

Varela Asks for Security to Remove Audience Member

PERTH AMBOY - At the 2/6/14 Board of Education Meeting the hiring of a new Varsity Baseball Coach overshadowed all other agenda items. Amid controversy Alex Perez was appointed the Head Coach. The appointment is effective March 1, 2014 to June 30, 2014 at a pro-rated stipend of the amount \$7,425.00

Board Member William Ortiz was the lone "No" vote. Board President Obi Gonzalez and Board Member Maria Garcia were absent. Vice President Israel Varela conducted the meeting.

15 year employee of the Perth Amboy School System Ryan Boyd is presently the JV Baseball Coach. He was a candidate for Varsity Baseball Coach when the position opened up a couple of months ago after Former Varsity Baseball Coach Ernest Kregeloh left.

At that previous Board Meeting, when it came time for the sitting Board to vote for Boyd as Head Coach, some Board Members abstained. The item was tabled.

At the 2/6/14 BOE Meeting Board Member William Ortiz was upset that Boyd was pushed out. He remarked, "Boyd was a dedicated employe for 15 years."

Jared Boyd, who is the brother of Ryan told the Board

Members during the public portion that they were influenced when they voted. Jared Boyd did not attack Alex Perez, and said that Perez was qualified, but added, "No one told my brother (Ryan) that he was not hired. Things are not getting better. This is wrong."

Resident Alan Silber made his feelings known about how the new Baseball Coach was picked. Silber started out by thanking Board Member Ortiz for what he said in regards to Boyd being passed over for the position. Silber continued, "I am not putting down the person who was picked as the new coach. I think 3 of the Board Members are conflicted on this appointment. You need to rethink that vote. You

should have a re-vote."

Resident Sharon Hubberman said, "There was a gentleman who spoke at a past meeting who was very adamant about who should be the new coach. If there is a conflict of interest, you should abstain. There should be transparency and a standardized test for all applicants."

A Richardson School teacher with 24 years experience said, "With hiring of new positions, I hope you will listen to us. I am disappointed that addendum's do not have more information."

Varela responded to the accusations. He called upon Acting Superintendent Dr. Viv-

Stolen, Retrieved, Missing PARA Meeting 2/4/14

PERTH AMBOY - During the PARA Meeting, there was approval for 3 meetings minutes: 9/6/11, 11/12/13 and 12/3/13. There was concern why the meeting of September 2011 was on the agenda.

City Clerk Elaine Jasko who is also a PARA Member said there was an OPRA request because this meeting was not transcribed.

In September 2011 City Hall was broken into during the Pink Ribbon Run. A laptop was stolen from City Hall that day.

Although the laptop was retrieved, the Closed Session minutes of that September 6, 2011 Meeting were wiped out. There were 2 transcripts of that 9/6/11 Meeting that were different.

Because of this, the PARA Members tabled the approval for the 9/6/11 meeting.

PARA Member and former Councilwoman Geri Bolanowski wanted this investigated.

There was also an extended discussion about Resolution R:02:14:169 authorizing adoption of the Third Amended Perth Amboy Redevelopment Agency Board of Commissioners By-Laws.

This resolution had to do with a time limit for the public to speak.

Jr. said, "You have an option to allow individuals to talk longer. This is a policy - not a legal decision. Perhaps you should extend time by the topic and not by each speaker."

Resident Alan Silber said, "This should not be an issue (limiting speakers). You should leave the limit as it is. But also allow the speaker an extension such as the City Council does."

Allan Jacobs who was reelected as PARA Vice-Chair said, "This was not an issue before we had the resolution introduced."

When the PARA members who were present voted, they all decided to adopt the resolution, except for Jacobs who voted: "No."

Jillian C. Barrick, Assistant City Administrator and Executive Director of (PARA) gave an update on the Delaney Homes Project.

"The Planning Board was supposed to have a meeting tomorrow (2/5/14) to discuss this." (The Planning Board Meeting was cancelled due to snow conditions.)

"The Housing Authority and a commercial realtor will be searching for a developer to look for a separate site for the Senior Housing." (Which was in the original proposal.)

Barrick said, "The Landings will be discussed in a closed session."

The consulting engineer for PARA Thomas Heritis said, "There was a punch list of item for the Landings Project. The Sea Wall work has started and the pipe work completed. The e-port work is being done on Sundays. This includes remediation of some of the surcharges and removing some of the buildings. Crushed concrete is reused. The anticipated completion date for this project is 2015."

PARA Attorney Joseph Maraziti Jr. said, "The developer for the 500 High Street location is

asking for a postponement because they are waiting for an environmental status report on the property first."

When the public was allowed to speak again, resident Steve Nascimento who is also a member of the Planning Board asked the members if there is a licensed site re-mediation person overseeing the 500 High St. site.

Nascimento continued, "There is ground water concerns, especially with the school across the street. (Middlesex Co. Vocational School)

PARA Attorney Maraziti said, "We've contacted the developer about the site concerns and the engineer from the consulting firm said an LSRP (Li-

censed Site Re-mediation Person) is needed."

Resident Alan Silber questioned the funds received by the Housing Authority for the development of part of the former Delaney Homes site.

Silber wanted to now if the Housing Authority was entitled to what he believed to be about \$6 million designated for Sandy relief. He was especially interested in the one residential project.

Vice-Chair Jacobs recused himself from the closed session meeting because he owns property at the Landings. Commissioners Kenneth Gonzalez and Thomas Haborak were not present.

The Superintendent (Vivian Rodriguez) makes sure everyone has a voice."

Board Member William Ortiz asked, "Was a committee present for all the other coaching choices?"

Dr. Rodriguez responded, "It's impossible to sit through all interview processes. I found out today, that in the past 30 years, interview committees did not exist."

Newly appointed coach Perez came to the podium to thank the Board for their support. He said, "I have a plan to help our kids. I've played proball. I have a network system and a lot of contacts to help the kids. I've done it as a player and as a coach. I will not let you down."


According to posted information: Perez was born in Puerto Rico but raised in Perth Amboy and is a graduate of Perth Amboy High School. He was a pitching star in Perth Amboy High School and continued to be a star player in college. He also played pro and semi-pro ball

After suffering injuries which ended which his baseball career, Perez became a baseball coach. He has a B.A. in Criminal Justice.

Leslie Dominguez-Rodriguez welcomed Dr. Rodriguez back and the new Board Members. She said, "Alex Perez is giving back to his community."

Towards the end of the meeting, Varela asked security to remove a relative of Ryan Boyd after he made an outburst.



Snow Job

The big snow came on Monday, February 3 and the next day was not that terrific. Wednesday of the same week we had an ice storm. This editorial was written on Saturday, February 8. The photo on this page (top right) showed an extreme case of ice still on the sidewalk. (Back of the Jefferson Street Parking Deck)

I don't know who owns this property or whose responsibility it is to clear it. I only know it is dangerous. The parking lot for the Amboy Mall (which is now closed because of new ownership) is completely blacktopped. A beautiful job was done in that lot. Even if you cut through that parking lot, you eventually have to go onto the sidewalk and that's where the problem lies.

On Page 11 we took photos in the busy downtown area of Perth Amboy showing the difference between businesses that put a little more effort in removal of snow and ice and those who did not.

Some properties were very clean and some were dangerous. There's a possibility that some of these properties could be abandoned or have an absentee owner. If the City has has records of the owners they should be notified of these conditions.

There is an Ambassador Program in Perth Amboy. I don't know if they have been out that week. The businesses from the Five Corners to Madison Avenue have done a pretty good job of clearing their walks. That is, until you come to the sidewalks on Smith Street and Madison Avenue (bordering Fink Park) — the busiest intersection in the heart of town — All I can say is it's embarrassing to see that it hasn't been touched. It is filled with ice and if it weren't for the foot traffic there would not have been a path at all.

Many people complain about the high fines in Perth Amboy. In this case high fines are justifiable because of the dangerous conditions present. If a cleanup is not done within the time frame of the City Ordinance, I think a very stiff fine is in order. If \$5000 a day is on the books - double it! This should do the trick. Perhaps some of the owners think that's nothing. They soon would have a change of heart if someone fell and sued them for millions of dollars. It's their choice.

Some businesses might blame the consistent freezing temperatures that impeded them from doing a thorough job. This does not hold water. In that case, your neighbors who had a very clear sidewalk would have the same problem. I think they had the same weather conditions to deal with that you did. It has nothing to do with the coldness or if you had sun or shade on

your side of the street, properties on both sides had good and bad snow removal.

Another argument might be you don't have it in your budget or have anyone to do snow removal for you. Perhaps you are out of town when the snowstorm occurred or you couldn't make it into town, because the snow was worse where you live.

Here's my suggestion: It snows every winter. You can have a contingency plan with an adjacent business or businesses on your block. Approach them about making sure that snow is removed from your property in an emergency. Throw them a couple extra bucks. There are always people walking around with shovels who need to make a couple extra dollars. Use them. In the long run, you'll be glad you did.

Some people might say, "My, God if someone gets hurt while they are shoveling the snow on my property, I'm libel."

A couple of years ago I was talking to Wilma Matey from Hugo Fleities Insurance. She said that she has insured people for short term events. You should talk to your insurance companies about insuring seasonal workers.

As far as intersections in Perth Amboy - this is what I would do – if I had a business on the corner, I would make sure that the crosswalk path is cleared leading to my business.

There were times when I wanted to go to a specific store to buy something. When I looked across the street and saw mounds of snow in front of that store. I said, "No way," and went to another establishment where the pathway was clear.

Sometimes you can't wait for the City to clear that path. It might do you well to just go ahead and do it for the better-

Handicapped & Senior Unawareness during Winter Storm Days

Last Monday 2/3/14 the City of Perth Amboy was paralyzed due to the winter storm and a lack of cleaning of the sidewalks and streets of most of the Perth Amboy Business District. Another Winter Storm hits the City on Wednesday 2/5/14 with more slippery conditions and snow accumulations. Most of our handicapped and Seniors receive their Social Security checks on the 3rd of every month and near that time, it's when they go out to the banks, cashier, post office, etc. inside to pay their bills. So once they have a chance they leave their homes to do so before the weekend storm arrive as they leave their homes early Thursday morning to do their errands, sometimes the last thing in their minds is to put a quarter in the meter once the prior quarter time has expired.

It's so hard for them to live off a monthly check to check mode, so that when they are done paying their bills to return to their vehicle to find a \$30 ticket on their windshield even though the winter conditions, and slippery sidewalks are against them despite the handicap license plates.

We have to consider the State and City Staff, but how does anyone consider the less fortunate. Even Gov. Christie said not to be outside, but these people have to go out once they have the opportunity to pay bills and get their basic needs. I could understand a ticket during regular weather, but it upsets me greatly when it's done in-between storms especially if they are a Senior or handicapped.

Please have some consideration because one day it could be even you that is reading this message. This happened to me at 9:22 a.m. on Smith Street on 2/6/14. I packed and placed the quarter at 8:15 a.m. after taking my handicapped child to school.

Bell Rings Breakfast Time

The Home News and Courier ran an article back in 2010 about students being served breakfast prior to the start of classes. This was in Edison, N.J. This didn't seem to be working out since less than 1% of eligible students were receiving breakfast. That was in 2010 so a time on the clock was made. Let's serve breakfast after the bell rings. By 2013 70% of these kids were having breakfast, plus the Federal Meal Reimbursements were covering the cost.

In the year 2013, New Jersey was giving low income children a good healthy breakfast to about 50,000. I think this number will climb during 2014. I would like to see that percentage climb to 100% not only in New Jersey but in the entire United States.

I'm not asking you to agree with me, but you must understand and feel what it is like to be hungry.

I'm not going to cry the blues or give you a bunch of sad stories but I want to share some hunger with you. In 1940, I was in a public school and I stayed back in Grade 6. Guess they call that repeating a grade now - if there is such a thing. That's the year my Dad became very sick. I believe God took care of me after this. The following year in 1941 I transferred to St. Francis School in Metuchen. My Father died that year. The Pastor of that little wooden church was Father John J. Foley. He made me his Altar Boy and we would say Mass every morning at the Convent on Main Street at 7 a.m. (Mass was in Latin back then and I'm lucky I could speak English). After Mass, the Nuns would always have breakfast for Father Foley. He would say to me every morning, "Sonny, go into the dining room and have breakfast. My Housekeeper in the Rectory will have something for me." I had a Breakfast Program before the bell back some 70

Dissolution of Museums of Perth Amboy MOPA

To: Honorable Wilda Diaz, Mayor City of Perth Amboy

In July of 2013, due to health reasons, I had to retire from public life. Since that time MOPA has had no meetings or activities such as fund raising or planning activities. I was contacted recently about dissolving MOPA so I called a meeting of the group for January 30th. Among those who attended the meeting and those I spoke to by phone it was unanimously agreed that MOPA should disband.

At this time I cleared the bank account by paying a required debt, but left a \$3.00 balance so that I could fulfill the requirements of our bylaws and share any leftover funds with the three historical groups in the City. The Proprietary House – In Exile; the Kearny Cottage and the Ferry Slip Museum each received \$1.00.

The following day, with the help of Annie Hindenlang, we accessed the computer website of the State of New Jersey to officially dissolve the organization. I also visited Investor's Savings to close out our account. Mildred will receive the final statement as soon as the checks clear.

MOPA was able to do many fine things during its short life. Upgrade and publish the "Old Amboy Walking Tour"; help with the "9-11 Monument" and construct the "Founder's Monument" (The Scottish Cairn at Caledonia Park); sponsor the Dinner/Dance Gala at the Armory for the July 3rd fireworks display; give grant monies to the other three museums and most of all to help the Ferry Slip Museum recover from the damage of Super Storm Sandy.

We also helped the Mayor

revive the Fourth of July ceremonies to include the ringing of the 'Liberty Bell'. As president of the Proprietary House I made the House available to the public on the 4th as a place to gather, have refreshments and organize a march over to City Hall for the main activities.

If you'll remember that on July 4, 2012 the 250th Anniversary of the Proprietary House, the re-enactors called to say the House was empty with a scrap of paper on the door saying, "Closed for July 4th." A call to Cheesequake State Park and Superintendent David Donnelly sent a park ranger with duplicate keys to open up. The ranger encountered some illegal padlocks on some doors, went to his truck, and used a bolt-cutter to gain access.

The re-enactors changed into their costumes, the catered food was delivered and the public and dignitaries were able to visit the House on this most important historical day. Channel 12 news came to video the House and interview some of the visitors. The Hispanic version of Channel 12 news was able to interview our Council President. All in all it turned out to be a great event. At 1:00 p.m. we organized and marched over to City Hall to complete activities.

In December the State of New Jersey changed the locks on the Proprietary House Museum effectively putting that organization on the street. Let's all hope that with a change of leadership in the PHA will again become a vital part of our as well as the State's community.






