Accelerated Tax Sales R-67-1/14

PERTH AMBOY - This resolution appeared on the 1/22/14 Caucus/Council Meeting. The resolution authorizes the tax collector to conduct 2014 Accelerated Tax Sales.

Business owner Virginia Lugo was not happy to see this item. She spoke before the Council to let the residents know how this would affect their property taxes. This resolution would cause additional fees charged to the taxpayers if they don't pay their taxes on time.

"This should have been well advertised," said Lugo.

Business Administrator Greg Fehrenbach said, "I'm not a fan of accelerated tax sales. The City loses interest on these sales, but this has been going on since 1994. Warning notices started going out in October. And they were mailed to about 2200 people. During the actual tax sale, the amount of people that it will affect goes down to about 400 people."

Found on NJ.gov websites: If the property resides in town which has an Accelerated Tax Sale verses a Calendar Tax Sale he/she risks having a lien against his/her property obtained quicker.

An Accelerated Tax Sale can have ANY UNPAID TAXES sold to a lien investor at time of tax sale.

Calendar tax sales can only occur on properties with un-

paid taxes from previous calendar year. So if sale is held in 2009 - only unpaid 2008 taxes are eligible for lien.

Resolution R-67-1/14 passed unanimously.

PERTH AMBOY - It's been 7 years, but Harbortown resident and Planning Board Member Steve Nascimento can finally say that work is at last being done at Harbortown.

Meetings dealing with this issue have been ongoing through different administrations. There has been correspondence with the developer, Code Enforcement and the Council.

The developer was given a punch-list of repairs to be done. Business Administrator Greg Fehrenbach said, "The developer is working on the list. Because of the extensive work to be done, the deadline for some of the line items had to be extended."

There was a meeting with the Harbortown developers, the Harbortown Sail Board and Code Enforcement to iron out what repairs needed to be done and what should be given priority.

In July 2013, Council Members Joel Pabon and Lisa Nanton took a tour of the Harbortown Complex. They reported at one of the Council Meetings that they were surprised at the conditions that they saw.

Councilwoman Lisa Nan-

ton took a tour of other towns where the developer had similar units but were built with sturdier material.

At a recent Council Meeting, Councilmen Kenneth Gonzalez took Code Enforcement Director Ed Scala to task. When Gonzalez told Scala that it's his department that needs to step up in regards to Harbortown and the long delays in getting repairs done is when developers started to take immediate action.

Some items included unstable balconies, vinyl siding buckling, drainage and foundation problems.

A furniture donation from a company in Piscataway is expected this week. It is primarily bedroom furniture and will be available for sandy survivors and low income families. We are looking to move as much of the clothing donation received earlier out of the donation space, it is mostly jeans, cardigans and tote bags.

Unmet Needs Committee reviewed five construction cases, 2 in Woodbridge, 1 in South River, 1 in Sayreville and 1 in Dunellen.

Long Term Recovery Group and A Future with Hope are working together on a home in Carteret. All of the Sayreville Robin Hood Foundation grant money that LTRG has been administering is officially spent. The Woodbridge fund that is being administered by LTRG still have funding available. LTRG is looking to hire a marketing intern for Spring 2014 semester. NJ211 is assisting in the process. There has been allocated \$2,500 for the semester.

The LTRG has new office hours, MTW 9am-5pm, TH 9am – 7 pm, F 9am-4pm

Some buyouts have officially occurred in Sayreville and South River. In Woodbridge, about half the homes that expressed interest in the buyout have been approved for the process, approximately 89 thus far. DEP has said that they will be back for the other half. DEP is still working in South Amboy and Old Bridget but no major movement to report on. LTRG will assist folks with settlement/attorney fees. It was also shared that the Middlesex County Bar Association has a reduced fee panel that should be referred to as well.





Why Your Heart Needs A Good Night's Sleep

By Dr. David Goldstein Sleep disorders and heart disease are not uncommon bedfellows. Untreated sleep disorders can interfere with the heart, and heart disease can disturb sleep. Sleep disorders have been linked to cardiovascular disease and high blood pressure. Cardiovascular disease is a general term for diseases of the heart or blood vessels, such as coronary artery disease, stroke, and peripheral arterial disease.

Sometimes heart disease is a

cause of poor sleep. For example, people with heart failure sometimes wake up at night with trouble breathing, which stems from fluid buildup in the lungs. There's also evidence that heart failure leads to central sleep apnea, a breathing problem in the brain's respiratory center that can awaken a sleeper many times at night. Some people have nocturnal angina (chest pain), which can interrupt sleep. Bouts of atrial fibrillation or palpitations (the sensation of a racing or pounding heart) can also disturb sleep. According to a recent study published in the European Journal of Preventive Cardiology, a good night's sleep boosts the benefits of a healthy lifestyle on the heart. Researchers found that not smoking, regular exercise, a healthy diet, and moderate alcohol consumption protects against cardiovascular disease. However, they also found sufficient sleep (defined as 7 or more hours per night) further increases the heart benefits of these four traditional healthy lifestyle habits.

We are usually not aware of our breathing and movements while sleeping and may never

think to talk to our doctors about issues that might be related to sleep problems. Yet, sleep disorders often can be treated, improving our heart and overall health. Make an appointment with your doctor if you snore regularly or feel very tired while at work or school most days of the week. You should also tell your doctor if you often have trouble falling or staying asleep, or if you wake up too early and aren't able to go back to sleep. These are common signs of a sleep disorder.

Your doctor may be able to diagnose a sleep disorder based on your sleep schedule and habits. However, sometimes the results of a sleep study are needed to diagnose a sleep disorder. Sleep studies are tests that measure how well you sleep and how your body responds to sleep problems. These tests can help your doctor find out whether you have a sleep disorder and how severe it is.

Don't let sleep problems keep you up at night. A good night's sleep is a necessity for better cardiovascular and general well being.

As part of the events, women and men will be receive free training on how to perform Hands-OnlyTM CPR and use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), a device that checks heart rhythms and delivers an electrical shock to restore its natural rhythms when needed. Blood pressure screenings and signs of stroke healthy heart education will also be provided. Raritan Bay Medical Center professionals will be at the Woodbridge Community Center, Sayreville Borough Hall, Raritan Bay Area YMCA, Northfield Banks in Woodbridge and Avenel and the Provident Banks in Perth Amboy and Iselin from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. They will also be at the Old Bridge YMCA, 3 to 5 p.m., and Vito Mazza Salon & Spa in Woodbridge, 4 to 6 p.m.

"Stroke and heart disease are still the number four and number one killers of women," says registered nurse Mirian Medina, coordinator of Raritan Bay Medical Center's (RBMC) Stroke Center. "As proud annual supporters of the

News Release - January 31, National Go Red for Women movement in conjunction with the American Heart Association, we want to empower women about living heart healthy and help them learn how to become a lifesaver," says Medina.

"Stroke occurs when blood flow to the brain is interrupted," says neurologist Rafiya Khakoo, MD, medical director of the Stroke Center at RBMC, noting that "stroke is more common among men than women, but the fact is at all ages, more women than men die from stroke."

Symptoms of stroke can be remembered by thinking of F.A.S.T., facial drooping, arm weakness, speech difficulties followed by time to call 9-1-1. "It's crucial for everyone to learn the warning signs of stroke and quickly activate 911," says Dr. Khakoo. "If stroke is suspected, note when symptoms begin, because the clot-busting medication Tissue Plasminogen Activator referred to as TpA - must be given within three hours of the onset of symptoms."

"Phone 911 immediately, even if symptoms seem to improve," says Medina. "Also, be aware that women are more likely than men to report unusual stroke symptoms, such as sudden nausea or pain in the face, arm, or leg."

Most cardiac arrests occur in homes and public places, and many are witnessed by a family member, co-worker or friend. When the heart stops beating

in cardiac arrest, it no longer pumps blood to the body. The brain and organs can be seriously damaged without oxygen and nutrients from blood, and the person can die within minutes if not treated immediately. CPR can help maintain blood flow and ventilation in a victim of cardiac arrest. AEDS are commonly available in shopping malls and other public venues. They are safe and very easy to use.

"Knowing how to perform Hands-Only CPR and use an AED before first responders arrive can increase the chance of survival for heart attack victims by up to 75 percent," says Medina.



Pallone Announces Agreement Signed to Begin Port Monmouth Flood Control Project

News Release 1/31/14 WASHINGTON, DC — Тоday, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) announced that this morning, Jo-Ellen Darcy, Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works), signed the Port Monmouth Project Partnership Agreement, the contract between the Army Corps of Engineers and the state of New Jersey formally outlining the terms and conditions of Port Monmouth flood control project. Construction on the project will move forward in the coming months. The project will be constructed by the Army Corps of Engineers with federal dollars from the Sandy relief package passed by Congress in January 2013.

"I am glad to hear that the Army Corps of Engineers and the state of New Jersey have reached an agreement

and that construction on this crucial project, which will protect homes and businesses from future flooding, can begin," said Pallone. "Many in Port Monmouth faced serious flooding during Sandy. All along the Bayshore, flooding has become an increasingly common phenomenon as severe storms have become more frequent and residential and commercial development has increased. I am pleased that this project will finally be underway."

Pallone announced that the Army Corps of Engineers will address major flood prevention to protect the low-lying residential and commercial areas in the Port Monmouth section of Middletown Township. The plans will include the construction of nearly 7,070 feet of levees, 3,585 feet of floodwalls and 2,640 feet

of dune and beach renourishment. The entire \$91 million project will be funded by the Sandy relief package and will offer significant protection to the area, which has suffered frequent flooding, erosion and damage from rain and coastal storms.

The Army Corps of Engineers will likely begin advertising the first portion of the project in March 2014, with the contract scheduled to be awarded in May 2014. This phase of the project includes dune restoration, beach replenishment, the construction of a terminal groin and extension of the fishing pier, involving roughly 400,000 cubic yards of sand. The larger flood control aspect of the project, which includes levees, floodwalls, a pumping station and a tide gate, is slated to begin construction in 2015.

Pallone Announces \$2.89 Million to Complete Sayreville Buyouts and Demolitions

News Release 1/28/14 WASHINGTON, DC - Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) announced that the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) will receive an additional \$2,896,000 to finalize buyouts and demolition of 196 flood prone properties in Sayreville. This grant will fund the remaining 25% of the buyouts that are already planned.

The project, started in 2013, was originally awarded \$43,293,713.80, which covered 75% of the project's total costs. However, the state has now decided to cover 100%

of the full cost of the project. This grant is awarded through the Federal Emergency Management Agency Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, and was made possible through the Sandy Aid package Congressman Pallone fought for in Congress.

"This grant will help to lessen the financial hit that our local governments still face as communities continue to recover from Sandy," said Congressman Pallone. "This funding will bring much needed relief to homeowners in Sayreville who have repeatedly suffered and struggled to put the pieces back together after each flood. As extreme weather becomes more and more frequent due to climate change, I'm pleased that the Sandy Aid package has allowed for steps like these buyouts to mitigate future storm damage and costs."

Pallone has met with a number of Sayreville homeowners who have faced severe and repetitive damages to their homes from flooding, and he fought to secure funding for their buyouts. In a March 2013 letter to Governor Christie on the State's proposal to use Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding, Pallone called for full funding to aid the homeowners.
