Code of Ethics: BOE Attorney Cautions Board Members

PERTH AMBOY - Board of Education Attorney Derlys Gutierrez addressed the Board Members at the 3/6/14 BOE Meeting on rules of the Code of Ethics. She wanted to make sure that they understood how to avoid any ethics violations during their meetings. This included how and when Board Members should abstain when voting on agenda items that may be a conflict of interest on their part.

Conflicts of interest would not only apply to Regular BOE Meetings. Presenting yourself in the capacity as a BOE Member at a private meeting involving School Personnel matters can be questionable.

Also included is how they should proceed when making statements that could be inflammatory to each other or to the public.

For each item that the Attorney spoke about, she gave an example. City employees that are Board Members need to be especially careful.

At the end of the Attorney's lengthy presentation, one of the Board Members skirted one of the ethic issues. Board Member William Ortiz read a letter that was on his cell phone. This letter pertained to a meeting at the Richardson School that was cancelled by Acting Superintendent Dr. Vivian Rodriguez.

Letters were sent to Board Members requesting their presence at this meeting which was to take place on 2/26/14 at the Richardson School. It was indicated that this meeting's purpose was in regards to the posting of the Principal's position at the Richardson School. Supporters of Acting Principal Karen Moffatt felt that Moffatt should be appointed the permanent Principal.

They wanted the Board Members to hear their concerns about why this position was posted.

Dr. Rodriguez was invited to this meeting but cancelled it an hour prior to it taking place.

At the 3/6/14 Board Meeting Dr. Rodriguez explained that the meeting at the Richardson School was in violation of the Open Public Meetings Act. Board Members in attendance would have been in violation of the Act.

Board Members Maria Garcia and William Ortiz were not satisfied with Dr. Rodriguez'

Board Member Sam Lebreault who is the Chair of the Personnel Committee stated, "The Superintendent had to give us approval for the meeting at the Richardson School. The Staff (of the Richardson School) wanted to discuss personnel matters, but it should only have been with the Per-

sonnel Committee (Board Members). "I contacted the Superintendent and our Board President. I was looking forward to this meeting (Richardson School). But it was out of the boundaries and a possible violation of the Open Public Meetings Act."

A Richardson School Teacher said, "Dr. Rodriguez confirmed that she would be attending the 2/26/14 meeting. Our NJS scores improved at our school. We wanted to highlight what we are doing. The staff rearranged their schedules to attend. Then the meeting was cancelled one hour before it was supposed to start. We are having a meeting on 3/19/14 at 2 p.m. and I am inviting you (Dr. Rodriguez) and the Board Members (Lebrault, Ortiz, Gonzalez and Garcia) to attend."

Red Cross Has Options for Sandy Victims 3/5/14 City Council Meeting

SOUTH AMBOY- Red Cross representatives presented options for those who are still being affected by Superstorm Sandy to the city council at the business meeting on March 5.

Representatives Zachary Chester, John Santana, and Vicky Seretis-Allen, hurricane recovery specialists for the American Red Cross, highlighted key services for residents of South Amboy who are still experiencing the effects of Sandy.

"Citizens can call 211 with their Sandy-related problems and they will receive information about the resources that the state has available for them," said Santana.

According to the Red Cross, the organization has spent or committed \$280 million to Sandy relief efforts across the east coast. This money has gone towards food and emergency housing, individual casework, and relief items primarily.

The after-effects of Superstorm Sandy may not be as visible as when the disaster first occurred, but the community will continue to have resources, such as those for mental health and wellness, all three representatives assured.

If a resident wishes to receive assistance, or simply talk to someone about their relief options, they may do so by dialing 211 from any phone. There is an option on the welcome menu that deals with Sandy relief, and choosing this option will connect the person to a live operator.

The council also heard from Business Administrator Camille Tooker about a resolution that will allow some residents to make improvements to the exterior of their homes.







NFL AllStars Visit Perth Amboy

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - On Thursday, February 27th at Perth Amboy's Raritan Bay YMCA Evan Junior Rodriguez, fullback and tight end for the Buffalo Bills and Kashif Moore, wide receiver for the Pittsburgh Steelers spoke about their choices that lead them to their professional career in the NFL.

The event was coordinated by Edison Jaquez, Program Coordinator for the Civic Justice Corps at the Jewish Renaissance Foundation, who also believes in the impact that motivation can have on someone's life. He invited two NFL players to share their personal story and photo opportunities with the audience. "The message to our kids is clear and direct; through testimonies of overcoming struggles, the choices one makes can impact your life for good." Mayor's Aide Irving Lozada stated, "It's good for the community - to keep kids with sports and in school."

Mayor Diaz thanked the two NFL stars for coming to Perth Amboy."

Evan Rodriguez was born in 1988 and is a fullback for the Buffalo Bills. He was drafted to the NFL in the 4th round in 2012. He spoke of his childhood and how football was a positive influence on his life. "I was raised by a single parent, my mother Frances with my brother and my grandmother. I found male role models through sports. It was an outlet."

Rodriguez spoke about his hardships, "At age seventeen, I was stabbed in the throat. God

gave me a second chance."

When asked why he was stabbed, Rodriguez answered, "I got hooked up with the wrong crowd."

Rodriguez decided to focus on football and was a 4th round draft pick by the Chicago Bears, he was then traded to the Miami Dolphins and then to the Buffalo Bills. Rodriguez played for the Bills in the 2013-2014 season. He said, "In college I made 15 to 20 touchdowns but none yet in the NFL."

He spoke of how he received a football scholarship, "I love the game, but grades are important. I've been playing sports since I was seven years old. By 8th or 9th grade I knew I saw my vision (of the NFL) and said 'Why not put 100% into it?"

When asked why he loves football, Rodriguez answered, "Football is a team sport. You take your frustrations out at someone and not get in trouble for it."

When asked if he was rich, Rodriguez answered, "I'm comfortable."

Rodriguez continued, "If you believe in yourself, why not? It's hard to play, but it's competitive. You have to compete in your career, whatever you

One kid asked: "40 yard dash?"

"4.56."

Kashif Moore who plays wide receiver for the Pittsburg Steelers was born in 1988 in Burlington, New Jersey. He went to the University of Connecticut. In 2012 he was drafted by the Indianapolis Colts, then the Houston Tex-

ans. When he was free agent he signed with the Pittsburgh Steelers. It is his 3rd year in the NFL.

"Everyone's journey is different. Stay focused. Have a strong support system. It takes hard work and dedication. Whatever it is you want, to do if it's your passion. (5% of all high school players make it to college. 1% of college players make it to the NFL. It's a great feeling to be in the NFL. It's like waking up on Christmas and your house is filled with presents.)

Moore continued, "You get no days off. If you get hurt, you get back up and get better from it."

When asked what sports he played, Moore answered, "Track basketball and football. Sports helped me with academics. Your grades need to be good. Anything you do, you make sure you do right."

40 yard dash? "4.3" When asked what role models he had, Moore answered, "My father and older brothers." He was asked who is the best quarterback in the NFL? "Ben

Roethlisberger (Steelers)."

Both players stated that the young people in the audience should, "Be inspired." They signed autographs and took photos for anyone who came to the event.



This School District still isn't seeing that Special Needs students are entitled to the same tools and resources as any other regular student.

It was nice to see Stephanie to be playing prior to Shrek movie at Xmas time and at the Xmas concert, but for the South Amboy St Patrick's Parade there was no one available from the School District to wheel her during the parade. We went out to our community in search of help and got what was denied to her from her own School District. She can't travel back and forth with the Band due to the lack of a handicapped accessible bus to fit everyone into it. This District has to stop this practice of discrimination/segregation.

When will our community stand up for our Special Needs Students and fight for the Rights that the Federal and State laws have given them after so much fighting that started since the Civil Rights Movement. Since it seems that this School District doesn't see the big picture yet. But President Obama did last year when he reinforced the law of keeping and modifying the work setting for our handicapped/ disabled workforce. If our special needs students aren't prepared for our workforce by this School District, how do you think they could benefit and be productive taxpayers in the future?

Resolution 58-2014 allows excess money from the Citizens Advisory Committee to be allocated to residents who meet certain criteria so that they may repair the sidewalk in front of their home or the exterior of the dwelling.

To be eligible for this program, residents can make up to \$78,000 per year, which is a high income threshold, according to Tooker.

Applications will be dealt with on a first-come, first-serve basis. The applications will be numbered and funds will be allocated based upon the length of the sidewalk or amount of exterior repairs that will occur, based on an average cost for the repair work as determined by the council.

While Tooker explains that the program will be publicized through the city's social media accounts, local newspapers, and the city website, councilwoman Suzette Dato had a more personal approach.

"We should have people knock on doors and explain to people how the program works," said Dato. "This will get the word out better than some of the other methods."

If approved, the program will begin in July, when the funding is available from the Citizens Advisory Committee.


