
### Mayor Diaz's Statement on Police Chief Allegations

"I have been informed by the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office that it has charged the Chief of Police with allegations announced in a statement by Prosecutor Andrew Carey.

Throughout my six years as Mayor of Perth Amboy, I have prided myself on running an open and ethical administration. I have taken immediate action to ensure the best interest of the residents of our community.

Although we live in a society where each one of us is innocent until proven guilty, the Middlesex County Prosecutor's charges are serious enough that I am immediately moving to suspend Chief Ruiz

B.A. Camille Tooker responded to Samuelson by saying, "This only pertains to one property, which is taking longer than expected. This accounted for the increase from \$35,000 to \$55,000."

Samuelson questioned, "What services that the City requires to be done by contractors have to go out to bid?"

Council President Joe Connors said, "Requests go out for vendor qualifications first."

B.A. Tooker followed up with, "Then we meet with the qualified vendors to negotiate for a contract. Projects have to go to bid, but for professional services, it's a different process."

Bauman stated, "The Manhattan Beach Project is private property (Amboy Aggregates). They still have to go to the Planning Board and utility reports have to be shown. Our agency decides if they are acceptable redevelopers. As far as private property, it would be the owners of that property who deal with the developers."

Ms. Pasternack wanted to know, "Will this project involve any bond issuances?"

Bauman said, "The developer will be paying \$3.8 million, which will help the town."

B.A. Camille Tooker responded to a question regarding the town's low bond rating. "We've got a new bond rating from MOODY and we are out of a negative rating."

Tom Kross, from the Me-

chanicsville Fire Department was concerned about a safety issue. "We need a better signaling and traffic lights by our location. The Business Administrator told me to meet with the Chiefs. There are safety issues that need to be addressed at he fire house to protect us and the public."

B.A. Tooker said, "We have gotten many things done for the Fire Department and one of our Councilmen has addressed the issue. We will look further into it."

A John Street Resident was concerned about the eight story buildings going up for the Manhattan Beach Project."

Bauman said, "We have standards, and the new buildings cannot go above eight stories. Parking unit sizes and other criteria are considered."

That same resident talked about a \$500,000 donation earmarked for a public safety complex. It was acknowl-

edged that safety complex will take awhile.

That same resident from John Street had a question for Mayor Henry: "I hear there's a rumor going around that some firehouses are slated for closing and to build another one for consolidation."

Henry replied, "We brought it up and there have been talks to see if it could be cost effective. I will not do anything until then."

Before the Meeting began, it was acknowledged that this would be Council President Joe Connors' last Meeting.

Councilwoman Zusette Dato said, "Joe is a devoted family man, smart, kind and I remember how welcoming he was when I was appointed the first female on SARA."

Connors was also thanked for his service on many City Boards, and on his terms as a City Councilman.

### Perth Amboy Police Chief Charged With Theft

Middlesex County Prosecutor Andrew C. Carey announced that the chief of the Perth Amboy Police Department was charged today with using a department mechanic to repair personal vehicles while the mechanic was supposed to be fixing police vehicles for the city.

Benjamin Ruiz, 53, of Perth Amboy was charged with one count of theft of services for authorizing the repairs on various occasions between December 8, 2013, and July 29, 2014.

Ruiz was released in his own recognizance after he surrendered at the Middlesex County Sheriff's Department in New Brunswick.

He was charged after an investigation by Sgt. Michael Daniewicz of the Middlesex

County Prosecutor's Office determined that the chief had the city mechanic make repairs to two of the chief's personal vehicles, as well as having repairs performed on a vehicle privately owned by a personal acquaintance of the chief.

After being charged, the chief was suspended without pay. He began working as a police officer for the city on May 23, 1988, and was appointed chief of police on September 10, 2012.

The investigation is active and is continuing. Anyone with information is asked to call Sgt. Daniewicz of the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office at (732) 745-4018.

As is the case with all criminal defendants, the charge against Ruiz is merely an accusation and he is presumed innocent until proven guilty.

With the use of small incisions, customized instruments, and innovative imaging techniques, minimally invasive spinal surgery (MIS) may be performed with less pain, blood loss, and hospital time as well as reduced risk. This muscle-sparing approach leads to rapid recovery, high patient satisfaction, and the best possible outcome.

The goal of minimally invasive spine surgery is to stabilize the vertebral bones and spinal joints and/or relieve pressure being applied to the spinal nerves — often a result of conditions such as a spinal instability, bone spurs, herniated discs, scoliosis, or spinal tumors.

Minimally invasive spine surgery was developed out of the desire to treat disorders of the spine with minimal muscle related injury, and with a more rapid recovery. ter visualization and magnification of internal organs and structure. For patients, this translates into a more accurate and definitive procedure. Because of the reduced trauma to the muscles and soft tissues - compared to open spinal surgical procedures - benefits include:

- Reduced risk of muscle damage since less or no cutting of the muscle is required
- Reduced risk of infection and postoperative pain

In addition, some MIS surgeries are performed as outpatient procedures and utilize only local anesthesia, so there is less risk for an adverse reaction to general anesthesia.

Conditions using MIS procedures include degenerative disc disease, herniated disc, lumbar spinal stenosis, spinal deformities such as scoliosis, spinal infections, spinal instability, vertebral compression fractures, and spinal tumors.

Your spine specialist will be able to tell you which MIS surgeries, if any, may be a treatment option for your spinal condition. In some situations, MIS surgery may not be as safe or effective as traditional

open surgery. If so, your doctor will be able to inform you about the relative risks and benefits.

## Studies Show Bariatric Weight Loss Can Improve Fertility

There is a strong association between obesity and infertility, and several recent studies are showing that weight loss can increase fertility in obese women. In one study from the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in Iowa City, 100 percent of women who were diagnosed with polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), a condition that can occur with weight gain and cause infertility, successfully achieved bariatric pregnancy after weight loss surgery.

Obesity, especially centered in the abdomen, among infertile women seeking pregnancy is also associated with poor response to ovulation induction and with decreased pregnancy rates. Doctors usually tell obese women who want to get pregnant to lose weight. For women who have struggled with weight gain and loss throughout their lives, this is no easy task.

Though this is a small study it has a big result, one that morbidly obese women who are having trouble conceiving should discuss with an experienced, board certified bariatric surgeon.

These studies overall suggest that women with morbid obesity, who are infertile due to PCOS, may have a new surgical option to help them conceive. Many other studies have shown bariatric surgery can improve or resolve a multitude of diseases and conditions. Infertility now joins that list.

Bariatric surgery is an increasingly popular, safe, and effective approach for achieving sustainable weight loss, as well as reducing infertility and other health problems associated with severe obesity, such as diabetes, heart disease, cancer, high blood pressure, sleep apnea, and joint problems.

### Tax Facts: Deductible Medical Expenses

As medical costs continue to soar, it might be a good idea to reconsider whether or not you might benefit from a medical expense deduction (page 3). If so, you'll want to start keeping track of your medical expenses. Attached is a list of many deductible medical expenses, some of which you may not have realized were allowable as medical deductions. This list can help you get an idea as to how much you are spending on unreimbursed medical expenses. Keep in mind that only expenses that aren't reimbursed are deductible.

To receive a tax benefit from unreimbursed medical expenses, you'll need to jump two hurdles. If your unreimbursed medical expenses will exceed these hurdles, you may benefit from keeping up with them. The first hurdle is the 10% (7.5% if you or your spouse are age 65 by the end of the year) of your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) hurdle. Only unreimbursed medical expenses exceeding this hurdle are deductible as an itemized deduction. You can use the following chart to get a rough idea as to whether your unreimbursed medical expenses will get over this hurdle.

Expected AGI \$80,000-99,999 \$8,000-10,000 \$10% Limitation (Under Age 65) that Expenses Must Exceed \$6,000-7,500

\$80,000-7,500 \$100,000-119,999 \$10,000-12,000 \$120,000-150,000 \$12,000-15,000 \$15,000-250,000 \$15,000-25,000 \$15,000-25,000 \$11,250-18,750

The next hurdle is the itemized deduction hurdle. Here, medical expenses that exceed the 10% or 7.5% limit, as applicable, are combined with other itemized deductions (such as, interest, taxes, and charitable contributions) to determine total itemized deductions.

You'll benefit from your itemized deductions only to the extent they total more than your standard deduction for the year. The 2014 standard deductions are generally as follows:

Filing Status Basic Standard Deduction

Married filing jointly \$12,400 Single or married filing separately \$6,200 Head of household \$9,100

If you are married, your standard deduction is increased by \$1,200 for each spouse who is blind. It's increased by another \$1,200 for each spouse who is age 65 or over. If you are single, your standard deduction is increased by \$1,550 if you are blind/age 65 or over.

Finally, high-income taxpayers are subject to the phaseout rules, which cause a taxpayer to lose itemized deductions. For 2014, the phaseout begins when AGI exceeds \$\$305,050 for a married filing joint (\$152,525 for married filing separate) filers, \$254,200 for single filers, and \$279,650 for head of household filers. Because the mechanics of this limitation is complex, we will not try to explain it here. If your AGI exceeds these amounts, you may want to give us a call. To the extent that you have control over the timing of medical expenses or other itemized deductions, you might consider bunching deductions into a lower income year in order to lose fewer dollars to the phaseout.

Bottom Line: If it looks like your unreimbursed medical expenses will be high enough to jump all these hurdles, it's time to start keeping up with your receipts. Please give us a call if you have questions or want to know more about medical deductions.


