Cameras to be Installed in New Police Vehicles

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – Resolutions: R-217-5/15 authorizing a contract with L3 Mobile Vison for the purchase of six (6) rear seat cameras under State Contract NO. A81311 in an amount not to exceed \$31,192.20.

R-218 – 5/15 authorizing a contract with Patrol PC for the purchase of six (6) Patrol PC Rugged Fixed Mount Computers under State Contract No. A81300 T0106 in an amount not to exceed \$30,208.00.

R-219 – 5/15 authorizing a contract with East Coast Emergency Lighting for the purchase and installation of four (4) sets of emergency lighting and equipment in new marked police vehicles and two (2) sets of emergency lighting and equipment in the new unmarked police vehicles under State Contract No. A81336 in an amount not to exceed \$36,949.68.

Acting Police Chief Larry Cattano stated that there is a policy in place for regular standard recordings. "Patrol cars have a rear camera. Certain things trigger the camera. It's turned on when we are transporting prisoners. It's required by law that any new vehicles – any vehicle whether it be a patrol car or anytime we interact with the public (have cameras installed)."

Council President Lisa Nanton asked how long the data is


Cattano answered, "After a year it's purged."

Pot Holes an Issue 5/27/15 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY – During the public portion of the 5/27/15 Council Meeting resident Reinaldo Aviles stated, "The City has the worst streets. You don't know when one is coming before you. Why aren't we fixing the pot holes? In New York one of the Senators is nicknamed "Senator Pothole." He was famous for focusing on that issue. We should fix them immediately."

Councilman Bill Petrick answered "We are the City Council. We're not responsible for that."

"Should I be speaking to the Mayor about this?" Aviles asked. "All I'm asking is when I drive I can plainly see it. You should address the Council." Bill Petrick added, "We just purchase the equipment."

Department of Public Works Director Frank Dann came up to the Council. "We are very receptive of pot holes by reports. We have a system online. We have employees working. We're pretty much caught up. Every day we have that crew out. We can't know at all times. We have ability to patch potholes. We carry coal patches. Sometimes the (potholes) are very serious. Not only (this winter) we used more salt than ever, we used \$10,000 worth of asphalt."

Nanton added, "There's a spot on the website to report potholes. There are only 5 sets of eyes up here. After Sandy,

63 trees had to be taken down. It was a brutal winter. Our streets suffered."

Windows Broken in Hidden Village II Residents Outraged

By Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – During the public portion of the 5/27/15 Council Meeting, Hidden Village II Resident Maritza Criael came up to the podium complaining about kids climbing on the railroad tracks and throwing rocks and breaking the windows in Hidden Village II. "You (the Council) are not the government. You are the link between us and the government. Don't say you are not the government. Last meeting I spoke with the B.A. Where we live is a private property. Why do we pay taxes? Years ago we complained about the water. All of you represent us. I don't know why you are here when you say we are on private property."

B.A. Jillian Barrick said, "We had a conversation. Kids were throwing rocks (at Hidden Village II). Conrail owns the tracks. We don't have the power to force anything (to put fences up). It continues to be a challenge."

Pabon said, "I know a gentleman who had an issue (similar). It was with the school kids."

"I called the police. It was two young kids. It was 2:15 a.m. What can I do? We call. It's a small community. You are our eye. We have the problem every year. The City should send some letters to Conrail," Criael continued.

Council President Lisa Nanton said, "Can we send letters to Conrail to ask them to put fences up?"

"Is the police around - No!" Criael said strongly.

Nanton added, "Document every time you call."

The Amboy Guardian spoke

with Criael who has resided in Hidden Village II for almost 15 years. "We replaced the windows, the broken siding, the frame and screen. I spent a lot of money - over \$6000 (because of the damage). We have no reason to pay taxes when the job is not being done," Criael stated. "My husband is a DJ. One night (when he was coming home) they (kids) were here (throwing rocks). I called the police at 2:15 a.m. I waited almost 40 minutes and they never came. We are paying taxes. We are concerned about the City. I don't know what else we should do."

Criael told the Amboy Guardian there is a meeting with Hidden Village II Board Members at 712 Holly Drive on Thursday, June 11 at 6:30 p.m.

Back to the Drawing Board

Council, Mayor, B.A. Discuss Changing Times for Putting Out Garbage

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - Recent concerns raised from residents about the city's garbage code sent South Amboy's city council back to the drawing board at last week's business meeting.

Despite already making numerous changes to the garbage codes over the past month, the council heard complaints from citizens about the 8:00 p.m. wait time to put their garbage to the curb. After speaking with Mayor Fred Henry, Council President Mickey Gross, and Law Director John Lanza, Business Administrator Camille Tooker suggested that the city change the time to 6:00 p.m.

"You may recall [at the last meeting] we had people saying the time to put it out was too late," Tooker explained to the council. "[After discussion] we have no problem changing the time to maybe 6:00 p.m."

One of the issues brought up by Lanza was daylights savings time. The main reason why citizens disliked the 8:00 p.m. take out time was because they had to bring their garbage out in the dark, and during the winter months it would still be dark at 6:00 p.m.

"What we can do is say 6:00 p.m. for daylights savings time and 5:00 p.m. for standard time," Lanza said.

Councilman Tom Reilly noted that many residents in his zone wanted the time changed to around 6:00 p.m. The entire council agreed with the time change and Lanza added that he will likely make a new ordinance rather than amend it because of the numerous changes to the original.

All council members were in attendance for the business meeting. The next city council meeting will be Wednesday, June 17th at 7:00 p.m.

The Garbage Patrol

Perth Amboy made by residents of Perth Amboy, the most common is the garbage problem. Even with the new garbage cans, they fill up very fast. Sometimes when they aren't completely filled, people will put garbage on top of the cans creating a smelly mess.

When the garbage from Perth Amboy is delivered to the landfill in Edgeboro, the workers at Edgeboro can't believe that this amount of trash is only from Perth Amboy. At a City Council meeting Department of Public Works Director Frank Dann stated, "Sometimes Perth Amboy has more garbage than much larger municipalities in Middlesex County."

Who are these dumping offenders? Some of the "dumpers" are from New York. Some are from other New Jersey towns and some are from Perth Amboy. How many times have I seen residents go to City garbage cans and put their own household garbage in them?

Why do people illegally dump garbage - especially in Perth Amboy? That's the magic question.

- 1.) One reason is that certain garbage is not accepted by the Department of Public Works. This may cause someone who would dispose of this garbage legally if the option was more readily available to dispose of certain items.
- 2.) Fines for illegal dumping are not enforced. People believe they can get away with dumping. Sometimes individuals found dumping are given warnings. Some fines are so minuscule that they don't leave a dent in the wallet.
- 3.) Individuals and some businesses can't be bothered disposing of certain types of garbage legally.
- 4.) The Department of Public Works is only open for dropoff from 8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. 5 days a week. The lines are long and often cuts into time that could be spent working.
- 5.) The illegal housing problem creates a significant amount of

Possible solutions:

- 1.) Open the Department of Public Works one Saturday of each month. Accept more variety of garbage to make waste disposal easier.
- 2.) Inform the public of every possible waste disposal contin-
- 3.) There should be a Garbage Patrol - perhaps several members of Code Enforcement, the Department of Public Works and the Police Department. Their only job should be to drive around town from around 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. and patrol for illegal dumping, especially areas which are hotspots or favorites for the "dumpers."
- 4.) Crackdown on illegal housing. As long as this problem is allowed to exist, Perth Amboy's resources will always be
- 5.) Enforcement of laws on the books regarding dumping will make a significant difference.
- 6.) Install cameras at hotspots.



Summer at the Hook/Jersey Shore

SANDY HOOK - Sandy Hook / Highlands History: Originally discovered by the famous Sea Captain Henry Hudson in the early 1600's, Sandy Hook was a beautiful, 1,665 - acre barrier peninsula within view of the Manhattan skyline.

Now, this picturesque 2,044 acre barrier beach peninsula located on the northern tip of the New Jersey shore offers a variety of environmental, historical, and recreational resources. Featuring 7 miles of ocean beaches and sand dunes, salt and freshwater marshes, hiking and biking trails and 264 acres of maritime forest, Sandy Hook is rich in ecological diversity. Historic sites include the Sandy Hook Lighthouse, the oldest surviving lighthouse in the United States. Birding, hiking, wind surfing, fishing and exploring the park's natural and cultural resources are available year

April 1 - October 31: The park is open from 5 a.m.- 10 p.m. daily, except by permit or as noted below. Through the summer of 2015, there is a \$15 charge per day for beach parking from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. Parking at Fort Hancock is always free.

November 1 - March 31: The park is open from 5 a.m. - 8 p.m. daily, except by permit. All navigable marine waters within the park boundary are open 24 hours. Visitor centers and contact stations - open every day EXCEPT Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day (Dec. 25) and New Year's

Day (Jan. 1).
Sandy Hook Lighthouse and Lighthouse Keepers Quarters / Visitor Center

Lighthouse Tours: Offered first come, first served, from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Children must be at least 48 inches tall to climb the tower. A video in the adjacent barn is always open.

Lighthouse Keepers Quarters/ Visitor Center: Open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. Rangers are available to answer questions, discuss the natural and cultural resources of the park and sell Senior/Access passes. Interpretive exhibits and a gift shop are available. The visitor center phone number is 732-872-5970.

Group Tours of the Sandy Hook Lighthouse: Reservations must be made prior to the group's visit to the lighthouse.

Reservations must be made three weeks in advance of the requested tour date. Maximum group size is 35 participants. Email us to make a reservation. Go to: http://www.nps.gov/gate/planyourvisit/sandy-hook-hours.htm

Can I bring my pet to Sandy Hook? - Pets and their owners may visit bayside beaches throughout the year. Pets can visit oceanside beaches from Labor Day through mid-March only. Pets are not permitted on oceanside beaches during the spring and summer because that is when the threatened piping plover builds nests in those locations. Pets must always be on a leash.

Beach Info:

Fees & Passes: Entrance fees? No. Parking fees? Yes, in the summer. There are no entrance fees for Gateway National Recreation Area. But fees ARE charged for expanded amenities. That includes beach parking to access beach centers. From Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day, an expanded amenity fee for beach parking is charged per vehicle Collection hours vary; Fees posted here are for 2015; they will change in 2016.

For most vehicles, beach parking is \$15 per day or \$75 per season. For oversized vehicles (more than 20 feet), charge is \$30 per day or \$150 per season. Hours of collection are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Does Gateway offer any Discounts or Free Beach Parking? - Yes. Access Pass (Golden Access) and Senior Pass (Golden Age Passport) holders receive a 50% discount. Please note that the America the Beautiful Pass holders do NOT receive a discount on expanded amenities fees such as beach parking. As of May 19, 2012, Active Military Members who own an America the Beautiful Annual Pass will receive free beach parking at Gateway where parking fees are charged. Active duty military photo identification will be required at all times to verify ownership of the Annual Pass. Vehicle Hang Tag is to be displayed at all times. (Hang tag is issued with annual pass.)

Camping Rates and Details:

Effective immediately, rates are as follows for all NEW reservations: \$30.00 a night; \$210.00 a week; \$15.00 a night with the Senior or Access Pass; \$105.00 a week with the Senior or Access

Length of Stay: No day use, you must camp overnight. 14 nights is the maximum number of nights permitted. Size limits: Up to six people may camp at a single site. Larger families and groups will need to reserve multiple camp sites. Sites are large enough for one large tent or two small tents.

What to bring: Your own tents and sleeping bags. A pad underneath your sleeping bag may cushion you better for a better night's sleep. Bring sunscreen and insect repellent as well.

What NOT to bring: Alcohol, pets, and charcoal grills are NOT allowed at tent camping sites. Glass containers are not allowed anywhere in the park.

Recreational Vehicles (RVs) at Floyd Bennett Field only: There are presently nine RV camp sites with another 11 planned for the near future. Water, sewer and electrical hookups are NOT available. Tents are not permitted in RV sites. Neither Fort Wadsworth nor Sandy Hook can accommodate RVs.

Showers: Showers are not available at Sandy Hook. At Fort Wadsworth, a cold-water shower is available to campers during the camping season.

Locations to obtain passes at Gateway: Visitors may obtain Access or Senior Passes at: You must instead visit one of national parks charging entrance fees or visit the USGS store online.

Please note: the America the Beautiful annual interagency pass is sold only at parks with entrance fees; Gateway does not charge an

entrance fee, so this pass is NOT sold at any unit of Gateway. You must instead visit one of national parks charging entrance fees or visit the USGS store online.

How do I obtain an Interagency Pass?: AMERICA THE BEAU-TIFUL PASS SERIES: As of January 1, 2007 the old Golden Eagle and Golden Access Passes were replaced with a new series of interagency passes called the America the Beautiful - National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass. All Golden Access and Golden Age Passports will continue to be honored according to the provisions of the pass. Only paper Golden Age and Access Passports may be exchanged free of charge for new plastic passes. The America the Beautiful Pass Series includes the Annual Pass, Senior Pass, Access Pass and Volunteer Pass and the free annual pass for active military and their dependent families, introduced in 2012. Please visit the USGS Store website for more information or to purchase online.

Swimming - Sandy Hook has lifeguards on duty form 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Memorial Day Weekend to Labor day at five ocean beaches. The guarded beaches are South Beach Areas C, D, E, Gunnison and North Beach. The southern portion of Gunnison Beach is clothing optional. For your safety, please only swim at guarded beaches and follow lifeguard instructions. Swimming and alcohol don't mix. To protect nesting shorebirds, pets are banned from ocean beaches from March 15 through Labor Day. Areas along the beach may be closed to park visitors as well. Open fires and metal detectors are prohibited.

Multi Use Trails - The Multi-Use Pathway (MUP) is a five mile paved trail that starts at the park entrance and ends in Fort Hancock at the ferry dock in front of the Chapel. It is shared by hikers, bicyclists, and in-line skaters. Hikers can also enjoy the Old Dune Trail that begins at the Sandy Hook Visitor Center and South Beach Dune Trail that winds to the north end of the trail and continues to Atlantic Drive. Refer to the park map for more information.

Fishing - Fishing is permitted at all beaches except when lifeguards are on duty. An annual pass for nighttime fishing can be purchased at the Ranger Station or Visitor Center.

Boating - Non-motorized car top boats can be launched from Beach Area C and Horseshoe Cove. Horseshoe Cove is popular with recreational boaters. Landing on beach with a motorized boat is prohibited.

Windsurfing and Kite-boarding - Windsurfing and kite-boarding is best on the bay across from Beach Area C. For safety, please only swim at guarded beaches and wear life jackets when in boats

Birding - Sandy Hook is a prime spot for birding. Good viewing locations include Plum Island, the Spermaceti Cove boardwalk, the Horseshoe Cove Salt marsh, North Pond or the fields at Fort Hancock. The NJ Audubon Society's Sandy Hook Bird Observatory has the latest birding information. They are located on Officers' Row in Building 20.

The Gateway Museum Collection - The Gateway National Recreation Area museum collection contains a great variety of objects ranging from artillery shells to sea shells. Aircraft to insects, this collection contains something of interest to everyone. The museum holdings relate to the history of the park and include significant archival and historical collections related to the military, aviation and recreational stories and sites throughout the park. These holdings also include an archeological and a natural history collection. Archival holdings include photographs, architectural drawings, manuals, maps, menus, newspapers and more. The history objects in the collection include a wide variety of items such as uniforms, insignia, cups, plaques and jewelry. Through the generosity of the Sandy Hook Foundation, the National Park Service has been able to purchase items and add them to the museum collection. 

Press Release 6/6/15 PERTH AMBOY - The AJ Meerwald, New Jersey's Official Tall Ship, will be coming to Perth Amboy's municipal marina on Thursday, June 18th, to kick off a Father's Day weekend of public sails along the Arthur Kill and Raritan Bay.

The series will start with a public open-deck reception on Thursday afternoon, June 18, where people can learn more about the 115-foot restored oyster schooner, tour its deck and talk with the ship's crew.

Beginning on Friday, a series of 3-hour morning, afternoon and evening cruises with various themes will depart from the marina:

Friday, June 19 – 1pm sail narrated by the Raritan Riverkeeper, Bill Schultz; 5pm sail with NJ singer-songwriter Christine DeLeon

Saturday, June 20 – 9am children's sail; 1pm sail with speaker Dr. Beth Ravitt on efforts to reestablish the oyster fishery in the estuary; 5pm sail with local folk singer Spook Handy

Sunday, June 21 – 9am sail featuring a Father's Day pancake breakfast served by the crew; 1pm sail with historian Douglas Aumack telling the story of pirates that once roamed the Raritan Bay area.

The sails are hosted by three New Jersey nonprofit organizations in collaboration with the City of Perth Amboy: The Association of NJ Environmental Commissions (AN-JEC), Crossroads of the American Revolution, and NY/NJ Baykeeper. The AJ Meerwald launched in 1928 as an oyster fishing vessel, operated along the Delaware Bay. In 1942, she was commandeered by the Coast Guard to serve in the World War II effort as a fireboat. Returned to her owners in 1947, the ship was sold to a new owner who adapted the vessel for dredging, and renamed it the Clyde A. Phillips. The ship was sold again in 1959, operated for a time as a clam dredge, and then left idle. The Bayshore Center at Bivalve (bayshorecenter. org), a nonprofit organization established in 1988, acquired the ship as a donation. They transported the vessel to Bivalve, NJ, and began the process of restoration. In 1995, the restored schooner was rechristened and launched as the AJ Meerwald, and listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The organization now offers public sails, charters, family and youth camps, and other educational events around the Delaware River and Bay, and along the Atlantic coast.




