Parking Permits, Transit Village, & 2nd Street Park 5/27/15 Caucus & Council Meeting

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - There were many topics of discussion at the 5/27/15 Caucus and Council Meeting which was held on the same date due to Memorial Day. First on the agenda was addressing traffic on State Street. Councilman Joel Pabon suggested there be an opening to Rudyk Park to alleviate traffic. Annie Hindenlang Executive Director Office of Economic and Community Development Perth Amboy Redevelopment Agency proposed to use the area behind High Street where the railroad

tracks are. "The Second Street Grant has some additional funding and we can use that. There's accessibility issues and I'm processing those proposals. The Rudyk Park High Street Tracks are not active."

There was an ordinance proposed to give parking permits to portion of High Street, Smith Street and Fayette Street residents. During the public portion of the Council Meeting Resident Reinaldo Aviles asked about the permits. "What are the specifics?"

Honorary Co-Chairs are Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda Diaz, South Amboy Mayor Fred Henry and Staten Island Borough President James Oddo.

City Officials, Sponsors, and the Media attended the press conference. Staten Island Borough President James Oddo was unable to attend the press conference due to Fleet Week events in New York.

Perth Amboy Councilman Bill Petrick spoke next. "For many years Barry Rosengarten has put things together at no cost to the taxpayers. B.A. Jillian Barrick stated, "The current residential parking permits has no cost or time restrictions."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez stated, "We're doing it for this area at this point. Are there any other areas where residents are getting ticketed and so on? Are we doing this in every area?"

Councilman Bill Petrick answered, "Market Street."

Fernando Gonzalez stated the residential stickers benefit the town as a whole. You owe it to them to represent them. People have been coming up to me. (about residential parking permits in other areas)

Council Lisa Nanton stated, "Now we are amending the ordinance. Why didn't you come to me?" (about the parking complaints)

Gonzalez had no response to Nanton's question. He reiterated, "I'm urging anyone out there to come forward and we will hear them."

The ordinance passed unanimously.

Another Ordinance to allow for Hardship exemptions for

handicapped parking in business districts was proposed. A handicapped resident on Market Street had previously complained about the lack of parking on Market Street causing a hardship for him.

During the Council Meeting, all the Council Members voted "Yes" but Fernando Irizarry who voted "No," stating he did not feel comfortable with the ordinance.

The third ordinance was to create some new positions replacing older ones. One position is a Sanitary Inspector who would drive around and

see if trash is put out after 5 p.m. and whether or not it is in the right type of cans, etc. This position will be a part of the Department of Public Works. Another position is a Senior Housing Inspector who will be in charge of all the other Housing Inspectors. This employee will be a member of Code Enforcement.

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez questioned the \$80,000 salary for the Senior Housing Inspector. Councilman Joel Pabon questioned about it not being a "second tier."

"Perth Amboy is a Diamond in the Rough"

One of our past contributors of the Amboy Guardian was Tracy Jordan. Tracy was not born in Perth Amboy but seems to be the type of person who would be active in any community which she would reside in. In one conversation I (Katherine) had with her, Tracy described Perth Amboy as: "A Diamond in the Rough." But the diamond needs "polishing."

Perth Amboy is a unique town. Many residents often feel that we can handle our problems and don't need the help of "outsiders."

Sometimes it takes an outsider to see a different perspective on how to solve problems than a person who has lived here all their lives.

Tracy was an "outsider" who became an "insider," and in turn was one of the assets to our town. She revitalized part of the train station by opening up a successful coffee shop/café (Raritan Bay Coffee Shop) which featured open mic, artists and musicians. Tracy wanted to help bring out Perth Amboy's native talents and showcase them. By doing so, other "outsiders" were drawn in to see talent that was showcased at her venue.

A second individual not born here (but her father was) is Carolin Pozycki. Pozycki is the Chair of the Perth Amboy's Art's Council created months ago. They had a successful Art's Festival on Sadowski Parkway on Saturday, May 23. The Arts Council was the brainchild of Pozycki. She had been an advocate of Perth Amboy for many years. Every time she has come to a Council Meeting to talk about the City, she has never uttered a negative word.

I remember one time when she came up to speak about the Train Station and one thing that Caroline doesn't do is compare apples to oranges. When she talks about a vi-

sion for Perth Amboy, she will use a city that has similar attributes to what part of town she is talking about. She spoke about murals in Orange, New Jersey where old fire houses were converted to art galleries.

As we walk past the Historic Buildings on High Street with overgrown shrubs and trees, you could still see the beauty of their exteriors. This is especially so in the springtime when the buds on the trees start blossoming. This makes a beautiful frame and backdrop for the architecture of the building.

We acknowledge some of the negative comments said about the Waterfront, especially where there are broken lights near the Yacht Club, and garbage polluting the beaches. Yet the Waterfront is still beautiful.

Someone had made a comment at a recent Council Meeting that our Waterfront was disgusting in comparison to the Waterfront in Hoboken and another one down the shore. I (Carolyn) have never been to either of these waterfronts, but I'm sure those two waterfronts took a big hit from Superstorm Sandy just like ours did.

In comparison you have to remember that our Waterfront had suffered damage from two major storms a few years apart prior to Sandy. Just ask the owners of the Barge and Armory. The Waterfront is one of the most important assets that Perth Amboy has.

After the May 23 Arts Festival, I decided to take a walk by the Barge and Armory Restaurants. The parking lot along Front Street were filled. I could not find one space available. So I say if Perth Amboy's Waterfront is so disgusting, why were there so many people there? I guess a lot of people didn't get the memo.

In addition Perth Amboy is



B.A. Jillian Barrick explained that these are non-union positions and are not in union titles. "There are some full time and some part time."

Pabon asked, "What is the salary range of an employee placed in this title in that salary range?"

"If you feel uncomfortable with the title and that it is given the wrong impression, the language can be revised," Barrick stated.

Gonzalez then stated, "These are all new positions in the City. We're spending this kind of money. We have the highest taxes in Middlesex County."

Pabon asked, "Are we looking to promote from within? Is that set in place?"

B.A. Barrick answered, "Each one of these titles is being filled by existing employees."

Pabon then asked, "Is the Sanitation Inspector going to have set hours? Is this person going to be flexible? Are you adding on to Code Enforcement during the day and weekends and after 5 p.m.?"

Councilman Fernando Irizarry added, "We should emphasize why we are creating this position? We've had a number of people express concerns with garbage."

Barrick again asked, "Would you like this ordinance to be revised? (not in short steps the proper language)

All of the Council Voted "Yes" to the ordinance except for Fernando Gonzalez who abstained. (due to his affiliation with PARTNER)

Resolution R-216-5 –Authorizing the Planning Board to investigate the properties (from Elm Street to Maple Street, Market Street to New Brunswick Avenue. This proposal will be a study using \$7000 which is available. City CFO/Comptroller Jill Goldy stated, "We can approve a certain amount of money not used for Bayview Park. We can use it for a down payment (for some necessities) in the future."

City Council President asked, "The money was not used at Bayview Park? What was not done at Bayview Park?"

Goldy explained, "The money was used for many things: animal shelter improvements – not all was done in Bayview Park."

Annie Hindenlang stated, "This is only a study. We've been looking to achieve a transit village. The Best way is to look at a core area around the train station. The first step is putting into effect where we're planning to build."

Irizarry asked, "Is there a clause for Eminent Domain?"

Hindenlang answered, "It's the fairest approach, if you approve. It's mostly parking lots. They are owned by three large owners. We hope not to use

Fernando Gonzalez asked, "Were there any public input? Any community meetings?"

Hindenlang stated, "We had one community meeting. A lot of students from the High School met with us for that project."

Irizarry asked, "Is this the study that was done with Rutgers?"

Hindenlang answered, "It was one of the studies done with Rutgers and a culmination of a lot of projects. We've already got the grant."

Councilman Bill Petrick asked, "The Grant will fund the process?"

"The grant and the Redevelopment Agency," Hindenlang answered him.

The Resolution passed unanimously.

Council President Lisa Nanton asked about the Second Street Park.

Hindenlang answered her, "We are resolving funding for the cleanup process. I feel by hoping that cleaning will happen during the year and will be finished."

"When it came to what was on the ground - the contaminates that is." Councilman Pabon added.

"If you stand on the ground for more than seven hours, you'll turn into a light bulb!" Councilman Gonzalez joked.

"There's hot spots depending on the location. They have it marked," Pabon stated.

Hindenlang continued, "There is a certain level of cleanup. We're not going to cap where we're going to clean up."

Nanton added, "I still have concerns about a community garden without an irrigation system. I would like more basketball courts."

Councilman Joel Pabon agreed.

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez stated, "We need to bring in rateable's. I don't think the Waterfront is a place for parks."

B.A. Jillian Barrick answered, "You will get no bigger cheerleader than me for rateable's. This money is green acres funding. It has to be used as a park. We're in great need for parks. Because of this park, two developers are interested in mixed use buildings."

Gonzalez added, "The waterfront has a tremendous amount of park area. I'm just concerned."

Hindenlang continued, "In January we designated a developer for that area. (For creating a park under the Victory Bridge)



Narrative on Blemur Home Contamination and Legislator's A Tour

News Release 5/8/15

SAYREVILLE - On Friday, May 8 Assemblymen John Wisniewski and Craig Coughlin toured the home of Mr. Herve Blemur of Sayreville, which is undergoing remediation work through the NJ Department of Environmental Protection's Publicly-Funded Site Remediation Program. The contamination at the home is thought to have resulted from industrial activity that had previously been conducted in the area.

Mr. Blemur has lived in his home for 16 years. After Hurricane Irene and an earthquake in Virginia which affected New Jersey, he noticed an increased volume of water in his basement and visitors commented on an odor. As a result, Mr. Blemur sent samples of the basement water and his tap water to an independent testing facility. The results showed high levels of VOCs (volatile organic compounds). Mr. Blemur sent the information to the USEPA, which then contacted NJ's Departments of Environmental Protection (DEP) and Health. DEP undertook a site investigation to determine the cause of the VOC contamination while the Department of Health reviewed testing results to assess whether there was any threat to the health of residents in the home. While the Department of Health determined there was no health threat, the DEP characterized indoor air quality to be at a level of concern and has begun work to lower vapor levels, which is ongoing. DEP also made a determination that the area's previous industrial activity was the likely cause of the contamination though no specific liable party has yet been identified.

The primary contaminant of concern is the cancer-causing tetrachloroethene (PCE). In addition, benzene and ethylbenzene have been identified in indoor air samples at the Blemur residence. The Department is working to correct the problem so that the residents can continue to live there. Mr. Blemur, however, has ongoing concerns about both the cumulative effect of the contamination on the health of his family as well as the diminished value of his property. Mr. Blemur has six children, two who were born while living in the house and both have respiratory problems.

With the commencement of remediation work in March of this year, public notice was sent to area residents, one of whom contacted the offices of Assemblyman Wisniewski and Coughlin. The legislators then reached out to Mr. Blemur to discuss the work being done and Mr. Blemur's concerns. As a result of those discussions Mr. Blemur invited the assemblymen to tour the site. Following their discussions with Mr. Blemur, the Assemblymen announced their intention to introduce legislation that would allow the DEP to buy out homeowner properties that are discovered to have industrial-related contamination after the homeowner purchased the property and which occurred through no fault of the homeowner. Any residential structure on such land would be demolished and the land would be permanently preserved.

The legislators pointed out that, under current law and given the previous industrial activity at the site, the property would have been evaluated prior to any sale of the property and would have been cleaned to residential standards prior to home construction. Mr. Blemur's home, however, was constructed prior to these requirements.

"Mr. Blemur, through no fault of his own, has seen the value of his property significantly diminished," said Assemblyman Wisniewski. "He has acted responsibly and it is only fair that he be made whole given the previous industrial contamination at the site, about which he knew nothing."

"For most families, a home represents a major investment and, in hindsight, we now know that this home should never have been built here," added Assemblyman Coughlin. "It is only right and just that the state take responsibil-

Both legislators pointed out that the state currently has responsibility for cleaning the property to residential standards and that, under their proposal, the state may actually save money. By permanently preserving the land, the cleanup would likely cost significantly less.

The legislation proposed by the Assemblyman is currently being drafted and is expected to be introduced in the coming days. In the meantime, the Assemblymen have begun discussions with DEP and will be monitoring the work at the




