Special Education Services Contract Given to EBS Over Oxford

PERTH AMBOY – Board
Member William Ortiz was
outraged on the contract for
Special Education Services
being awarded to EBS: Educational Based Services instead
of Oxford Early Childhood
Center (which had a contract
for 20 years with the Perth
Amboy School System) or
Tiny Tots Early Learning Center.

Ortiz stated, "My son likes the counselor he has, why are you changing his counselor 12 days before school starts?"

Superintendent Dr. David Roman answered Ortiz, "Tiny Tots is a quality company, however, we are looking for special services. I'm confident Oxford is a quality company. We're looking at specifics. Both Companies – Oxford and Tiny Tots: but EBS is the best company for the services we want."

Board Member William Ortiz stated: "I'm a little confused here. Tiny Tots took care of my child. (He used their services personally) We like them because they gave individualized care."

Superintendent Dr. David Roman said, "We did like that. My job is to be sure we have the greatest resources in place."

Oritiz argued his point, "Did

we consult with anybody with 12 days to go before school starts? Children don't like sudden changes. When did you consider this change for the children?"

Roman answered, "We have areas to move forward with. There are areas that need improvement."

Ortiz continued, "Did you consult with any parents? I don't see the wisdom in doing this in the late hours! My kid likes his counselor. We didn't consult the parents! The whole thing is a ruse! They want to shut me down! This was a disaster! — An unmitigated disaster! I want to see notes! My kid goes to this district! This is a sham!"

With that, an angry William

Ortiz got up and left the Meeting. The motion passed to hire EBS.

During the Meeting, representatives from Oxford Early Childhood Center spoke. A spokesperson stated that more than one company could be considered at the same time for the contract.

Representatives from EBS spoke as well. The spokesperson stated that they were happy to work with the district.

Tooker Announces Land Swap on Augusta Street

New Parking Lot Will Be Added on David Street

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - After receiving a number of calls from residents regarding the closed parking lot on Augusta St., South Amboy Business Administrator Camille Tooker announced a land swap that will lead to a new lot being opened on David St.

In the agreement with the David St. property owner, the current space facing Augusta St. will be turned into a residential complex and the property facing David St. will become a parking lot for people shopping and visiting Broadway.

"The parking lot will be constructed first, that was part of the deal that we made with [the owner]," Tooker explained. "That parking lot will be dedicated for Broadway parking and will not be permanent spaces that we sell."

Resident Barbara Pasternack asked if any cash was involved in the deal. Tooker explained that it was an even swap and Mayor Fred Henry noted that the city will gain 5 parking spaces that they did not have with the previous property.

"We are gaining parking spaces out of it and he is going to maintain it too," Henry said. When asked if the city would be paying the owner to

maintain the property, Henry added that it was part of the agreement that he would take care of it.

In addition to the parking lot discussion, multiple residents took the microphone to thank councilwoman Zusette Dato for her work regarding the C-Town property. Dato had been very vocal about moving the construction fence back so residents can walk on the sidewalk without going into the street, and residents came out to thank her for thinking of their safety.

All council members were in attendance for the meeting. The next city council meeting will be held September 16th at 7:00 p.m.

The Numbers Say It

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – During the public portion of the 8/20/15 BOE Meeting, Resident and Parent, Mel Knight asked some questions to the Board. "You stated when hiring Dr. Roman that you based his salary on the fact that we have over 10,000 students. When Dr. Caffrey was hired, we had over 10,000 students and you didn't pay her \$200,000. We hired her on June 9, 2011. As of 10/2009 we had 10,156 students; as of 10/15/2010 we had 10,841 students. You told us the salary cap was raised, when there were over 10,000 students when we hired Dr.

Caffrey." Board President Sam Lebreault later answered Knight's question. "There were not 10,000 active students (at the

time the BOE hired Caffrey."

Knight once again asked the Board when the Amistad Legislation will be enacted in the curriculum. The Amistad Legislation provides for a more well-rounded history program in the students' curriculum including Afro-American His-

Later Assistant Superintendent Dr. Vivian Rodriguez stated that this year there will be a Professional Development Day on the Amistad Leg-



islation and that Ms. Knight is invited to attend.

PERTH AMBOY - 8/10/15 stones or compliances." Caucus Meeting: Ordinance No. 10: Bond Ordinance providing for various improvements to the water utility in and by the City of Perth Amboy, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey, Appropriating \$7,275,000, therefore and authorizing the issuance of \$6,525,000 bonds or notes of the City to finance part of the cost thereof.

Former Business Administrator Greg Fehrenbach came forward to give a more detailed explanation of what this ordinance covers. This pertains to the Water Treatment Sewer Separation on Outer State Street. This would include: Interceptive Line Cleaning that CSO (Combined Sewer Overflow) Communities have to comply with under the new State Regulations.

"There was a time line of 36 months to meet the deadlines. We have a 50% Forgiveness Reduction after only 5% of the system is separated. New Brunswick used grants when updating their Water/Wastewater System. That's why they are not a CSO Municipality. We are 47 days behind meeting some of the State's mile-

After Fehrenbach finished talking, Councilman Fernando Gonzalez voiced some concerns. "We need to have in place, the posting of major dates of deadlines that the City must meet for CSO Compliances to avoid penalties."

Fehrenbach added, "The City is in complete compliance with the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency)."

From www.nj.gov (CSO Communities) The paragraphs below explain part of what CSO stands for and the rules, regulations, compliances and purpose:

The Department is committed to working with Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) permittees and CSO communities to reduce or eliminate CSOs. The Department will assist permittees in meeting their permit obligations by providing technical assistance, guidance, and training.

The individual CSO permits, effective on July 1, 2015, encourage permittee and community collaboration on the planning and development of projects that will provide urban redevelopment opportunities, improve water quality,

beautify neighborhoods, and improve the overall quality of life in our urban communities.

The Nine Minimum Control Measures 1.) Proper operation and maintenance 2.) Maximum use of collection system for storage 3.) Review of pretreatment requirements 4.)Maximization of flow to POTW for treatment 5.) Prohibition of CSOs during dry weather 6.) Control of solids and floatables 7.) Pollution prevention 8.)Public notification – new signs, website, public notices 9.) Monitoring of CSO impacts and efficacy of controls.

PERTH AMBOY - 8/10/15 Caucus Meeting - R-359 - Authorizing the City to submit applications and enter into agreements with the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development for 2015-2016 CDBG Funds and HOME funds in the amount of \$820,791.00.

Annie Hindenlang - Exec. Dir. Office of Economic and Community Development Redevelopment Agency spoke about this Resolution: "This is for affordable housing units and also for the JRF (Jewish Renaissance Foundation dealing with the Boys Club). Some of the funds will be for Risk Factor Youths between the ages of 8 to 13 and the Board of Education will be involved in this."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez appreciated the work that the JRF does with the Boys & Girls Club but he wondered, "Why isn't the Board of Education funding this program? Ms. Hindenlang had stated earlier that only \$40,000 would be used for this At Risk Program." Gonzalez still thought that it should be financed through the Board of Education.



What Were They Thinking?

On August 9, 2015 Football Legend and Sports Announcer Frank Gifford passed away just short of his 85th birthday. I happened to catch Kathy Lee Gifford (Television Personality) and Gifford's wife as she paid tribute and thanked those who remembered her late husband.

What moved me is when Gifford related details about her husband's early life. Frank Gifford, was born in 1930 and lived through hard times during the Great Depression with his family. In his youth, his family was so poverty stricken that they sometimes ate dog food and were thankful for that. Gifford lived in 29 places before he even attended high school because his father couldn't find work. Kathy Lee said her husband; Frank said that his mother would always mark in the bible the day they would be leaving one town to go find work in another place. The one thing that was constant in their family back then was that they attended church every week. That influenced Frank Gifford for the rest of his life.

Kathy Lee related that when Frank was accepted into college, he came with one pair of pants and one shirt.

Kathy Lee also told about a visit that she and Frank along with some other friends went on to the Valley of Elah where David killed Goliath. If you don't know that story -Google it!

The tour guide told Kathy Lee and Frank that David had 5 stones in his hand because he didn't believe he could bring down Goliath with just one stone. The guide also told them they should take a stone home with them because of the importance of using the "stone" God gave you. The miracle was not that David had the skills but he trusted in the Living God and threw his stone killing Goliath.

Frank and Kathy gave their daughter a stone when she graduated from High School. Their son received a stone upon graduating from col-

lege. They said to their kids, Back Ray Rice and his then "Where are you going to throw your stone for the Kingdom of God."

"Everyone has a talent. Where are you going to throw your stone to help make the world better?"

Frank Gifford thought more of that stone from their trip than any his trophies and awards. Whenever anyone would come to visit them for the first time, that's what Frank would show with pride.

I relayed this story because I want to compare it to some of these athletes of today. Many of them sign very lucrative multi-million dollar contracts straight out of college or even sometimes right out of high school. Some proceed to do one stupid or irresponsible act or behavior to throw it all away.

They come from diverse economic backgrounds. In this day and age a lot of people are eligible for assistance so they don't have to eat dog food.

This does not excuse the extreme stupidity of these acts. What are some of these people thinking? – They're not!

Here's 2 examples of people playing with fireworks on the Fourth of July this year:

Let's have couple of examples: NY Giants Defensive End Jason Pierre-Paul had to have his right index finger amputated along with suffering fractures to his thumb and other fingers. His comeback to playing football is still iffy.

Tampa Bay Buccaneers' Cornerback C.J. Wilson lost 2 fingers. He may never return to football because of his injuries.

Jay Williams was the second overall pick in the 2002 NBA Draft by the Chicago Bulls. Some saw him as a future NBA All-Star. His playing days were over when he suffered severe injuries in a crash while riding his motorcycle without a license and not wearing a helmet. His playing days were soon over a few years later because he was unable to overcome his injuries.

mestic violence in an elevator in Revel Casino, Atlantic City. Rice was suspended and fined, eventually ending his career due to this incident.

Recently Quarterback Geno Smith was punched in the jaw by Linebacker Ikemefuna "I.K." Enemkpali in a locker room fight over \$600. Enemkpali was subsequently released by the Jets. Enemkpali was the Jets' sixth-round pick in the 2014 draft. Geno Smith's broken jaw needs surgery and he will be out at least until Octo-

Len Bias was described as the next Michael Jordon. He was a star at the University of Maryland. He was the Number 2 Pick in the 1986 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics. According to sources he felt a lot of pressure and wanted to escape. He left his dorm room, met up with some friends and went to a party. At that party some of his friends and teammates used cocaine. Bias died at 8:50 a.m. the following morning due to cardio-repertory arrest. The hospital did not determine the actual cost of death, but it was revealed that Bias was using cocaine. There were traces found in his urine during treatment. at Brown University Professor of Neurology stated the following: "Cocaine probably caused Bias' brain and heart to undergo major alterations and changes in function."

The poverty of Gifford's youth is much different than today. Gifford had a gift and treasured it. He understood his athletic ability was not anything to take lightly. His faith from his early childhood carried him through his adulthood until the day he died. Athletes that show their faith are often put down. A perfect example of this is Tim Tebow. Perhaps some of these athletes could use a dose of that faith that Frank Gifford had instilled in him by his parents.

It's a shame that the athletes we wrote about didn't think before they acted. Maybe their actions will serve as a lesson to others. As Kathy Lee said, "You were given talent. How will you throw your stone?" C.M. & K.M.





PERTH AMBOY - During the 50th Anniversary of Voting Rights Act, there was a living testimony given by Ms. Corinne Spencer who was born in Charleston, South Carolina. She talked about the discrimination that she faced while living there. When she moved up north, she found discrimination there, but she did recall casting her first vote in Perth Amboy and that was for President Kennedy. She was pleased to let everyone know that she has 3 granddaughters, - one who is a Doctor, another in the Navy and a third one in the Air Force.

When Congressman Pallone talked, he spoke about how those who fought for the right to vote stressed that they were willing to do anything. "Over 20 States have placed







restrictions since the Voting Rights Act was struck down. Some said that the Act was outdated and that updated laws were place to protect voter rights. Congress has taken no action to reauthorize the Voting Rights Act. The Act can be revised to cover all the States - not just the Southern States. We can encourage people to vote by allowing voting on Saturday and Sunday as some places do. I appreciate you coming here in the middle of the day. I commit to you that I won't rest until the Voting Rights Act is reauthorized!"

After Pallone spoke, the Master of Ceremonies Dot Daniel who also put the program together spoke. "I rather that the Voting Rights Act be an Amendment along with an Amendment protecting women against domestic violence."

The Benediction was done by Pastor Bernadette Falcon-Lopez. She recalled as she was growing up, her parents were political activists and marched for people's Civil Rights. She remembered on her parents' walls was the picture showing President Kennedy, Robert Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Other participants included Mayor Diaz, who read: "Perth Amboy: City of Firsts," Melvinia Knight (First VP of NAACP - P.A. Branch) who read the highlights of the 1965 Voting Rights Act. Stephanie Rodriguez (Senior at Colonia High School) read an original essay on the importances of voting. City Council President Lisa Nanton read the biography of Thomas Mundy Peterson. Dot Daniel acknowledged some of those in attendance which included: members of the Housing Authority, the NAACP, Council Members and other Members of the Clergy. The last photo is of the site of the grave of Thomas Mundy Peterson and his wife, Daphne Peterson, located in the Church Graveyard near a large tree.






