Appointment of New Acting City Attorney Receives Backlash; Diaz Defends Her Choice

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – The Caucus and Council Meeting were both held on Wednesday, 9/9/15 due to the Labor Day Holiday. Council President Lisa Nanton was not present so Councilman Joel Pabon conducted the meetings.

The appointment of Arlene Quinones Perez, Esq. of De-Cotlis, FitzPatrick & Cole, LLP as Acting Law Director effective September 1, 2015 at the 9/9/15 Caucus and Council Meeting received backlash from some Council Attendees.

Former Councilman Ken Balut expressed his displeasure, "I did research. We're hiring the firm – not her! The law firm is what you're hiring. There's the problem here. The taxpayers are paying her! This stuff has to change! How to spend the money!"

Local Businesswoman Virginia Lugo stated her feelings about the appointment, "Women should be in a position of power. The Mayor mentioned she hired a Latina Lawyer there's a due process." Lugo continued, "I started the Women's Open Center (a group for women helping women and to help provide resources for their specific needs) and gave the Mayor a proposal. She (Wilda Diaz) has been here since 2007 and nothing has happened. Ms. Quinones made a speech and she made no apologies. Kudos to her!"

Resident David Caba said, "The Hispanic Bar Association in New Jersey – You said you should contact that organization and interview a prominent Dominican Lawyer – not to get the job – or at least interview for that job."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez answered, "I do not hire anyone."

"You were quick to say yes!" (Referring to the 8/10/15 Caucus and Council Meeting where Fernando Gonzalez voted yes to the addition of the late starter approving the appointment of Quinones as City Attorney) "Did you research her? That's what you said at the last meeting!"

Caba continued, "Under Obama, the Labor Secretary is Dominican. You said you did research! When there's a position for a head coach – an African-American must be interviewed - even if he doesn't get the job! We want to be a part of the choice. It's a matter of the process. Go down the list! There are no Dominicans in a position of power in Perth Amboy - One Dominican – Irving Lozada (The Mayor's Aide)! It's a matter of the process!"

Councilman Joel Pabon answered, "If someone is qualified, we'll give them our time." Resident Stanley Sierakowski

spoke about Quinones, "Do we

have 90 days? (Probationary

Period)"

The Council answered, "Yes." Sierakowski continued, "Mayor Diaz vowed she would only run for two terms. It's down — the quality of life. She got into a fight with Senator Vitale who wanted to keep money in Perth Amboy so there could be a fundraiser. Make alliances for the Mayor. Mayor — get a dog to eat a dog! That's how it's done! I'll be Mayor for a third term. She could be worth millions of dollars. Mayor Diaz is just too blind to see it."

Pastor Bernadette Falcon Lopez made her statement: "I have a multicultural family. I make it my business to know who is in office. I asked to have a meeting. Her (Quinones) credentials are amazing. Everything I saw was positive. Her qualifications are impeccable. The same people are complaining - we should stop complaining. There are some amazing things here, too. Get to know this woman."

Local Businesswoman Susan Batista offered her opinion, "The appointment of the new Law Director - the way it was conducted – you're supposed to give adequate notice in the clerk's office. We want to know why. Is this the way you do business?"

Resident Alan Silber said, "The way Mr. Blunda was treated – why was Mr. Blunda let go? If you are going to hire an Attorney – this is an important decision - why are you making it a late starter? You don't have a late starter to hire a lawyer. You're lucky Mr. Irizarry voted "No." It's an inappropriate use of a late starter. I expect more professionalism than to let go of a Law Director in such a shameful manner."

Silber continued, "We're going through a process of hiring an Attorney for the BID who is extremely well qualified. Seven years as Mayor - are there no qualified Dominicans? Is there nobody here that recognized that fact? Fernando Gonzalez said that he will not vote for anyone that doesn't live in this City. Can I (Fernando Gonzalez) ask my son (Daniel Gonzalez) who is a lawyer) who is a qualified attorney? In seven years she hasn't found one?"

A disgusted Mayor Diaz of-

fered her remarks at the end of the Caucus. "I just want to take you back to 2008. Not one person ever questioned my hiring of Mark Blunda (City Attorney). Not one question – neither for Greg Fehrenbach (B.A.) No one questioned the lawyer at that time. I have worked with Arlene Quinones in the Latino Community throughout the State of New Jersey. I find her to be an excellent lawyer. The fact that no one challenged Mr. Blunda . . . we were making changes. I believe in her abilities to represent the City. Arlene will be the next President of the Hispanic Bar Association of New Jersey. The Statewide Association Attorney of the Year – I did reach out. I did my homework. I was in Trenton and spoke to other Mayors. Not everyone is going to agree. A U.S. District Court of New Jersey Judge recommended her - Attorney of the Year! Read the recommendations!"

Diaz later stated at the end of the Council Meeting, "I welcome Arlene Quinones Perez. We have to be grateful that they are helping the City. Today (9/9/15) I spent the day in Trenton. We are planning the redevelopment of the Celotex property – Brownfield cleanups and bring rateable's to the City. We have so much going on here - the creation of jobs here in our City. That's what I've been working on! They think I'm all wine and cheese! They are so wrong! People come up here and disparage what we have done. I give them a better place than what we got in 2008. No one got a tax increase this year! No one ever questions men when they are hired! Her (Quinones) credentials are 100% by representing the Attorney General. I am working very hard. I looked at an entire law firm!" Councilman Joel Pabon commented at the end of the meeting, "We don't always mention the positive things enough. We have to mention the positive things. Out of 65,000 people we have 10 that make noise.





Press Release 9/11/15 METUCHEN- On Friday, September 11, 2015, the entire student body, faculty and staff of St. Joseph High School joined together for a prayer service in remembrance of the tragic events that occurred 14 years ago. Every year, the St. Joseph High School Community has come together to honor and pay tribute to the thousands of people who lost their lives, especially St. Joseph High School alumni: William Fallon '66, James Lynch '72 and R. Andrew Spencer '84.

Justin Fleetwood, the newly-appointed Principal of St. Joseph High School, began the ceremony with remarks about how difficult it is to capture what this anniversary means to us as Americans, as Catholic Christians. Mr. Fleetwood asked the assemblage, "As we come before the presence of God and one another with our prayers and petitions, our questions, our grief and our anger, we hear these words from the ancient prophet: 'Forgive your neighbors in justice; then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven. Think of the Commandments, hate not your neighbor; remember the Most High's covenant, and overlook faults'."

Lucas Pick, a member of the senior class, recalled, at the age of three, that he was sitting at home watching television while the screen went blank and his Mom tried to fix the set to no avail. Once the cable was restored, they changed the channel from PBS to NBC. Lucas said that he would "never forget the horrifying image that flashed across the screen that cloudless blue morning. While unable to comprehend the meaning of these attacks, I knew a tragedy had just transpired before my very eyes." Like thousands of families that day, his parents sat anxiously by the phone







waiting for news of friends and relatives who worked in downtown New York City.

Lucas shared the story of his Uncle Ted, a trained EMT, who made his daily commute into the city that day and after the attack spent his entire day caring for the wounded and comforting the distressed. It was not for over 24 hours that his family did finally receive word that he was safe. Lucas concluded his thoughts by saying, "As we recall the events of 9/11, let us keep in mind our roles

as Americans, students of a Catholic school, and members of the human race. This is why we gathered here today: to remember those who were lost, to pray for those who sinned, and to serve one another as Christ served us."

Student members of the school's Campus and Music Ministries led the student body in prayer and song. Mr. Fleetwood ended the concluded with the Prayer at Ground Zero by Pope Benedict XI.

NEW CAR SEAT LAW

the new rules:

What Parents Need to Know about N.J.'s New Car Seat Law

Researchers say keeping babies and small children in rear-facing seats as long as possible drastically lowers their chance of dying in a car crash. Under New Jersey's old law, every child under age 8 riding in a motor vehicle with seat belts must be in the back seat in either a car seat or a booster seat. (School buses are exempt.) The revised law adds additional regulations with specific age and weight limits. Among

Birth to age 2: A child under age 2 and under 30 lbs. must be in a rear-facing car seat with a five-point harness. Toddlers who are tall or have long legs will be rear-facing with their feet are pressed against the back seat of the car. Once a child reaches either age 2 or 30 lbs., the car seat can be turned around to face forward. (Best Practice: If a child has not met the ht, and wt. limitations of their car seat, keep them rear-facing until they do. Research demonstrates that rear facing children do not suffer more leg injuries that forward-facing kids.)

Ages 2 to 4: Children must remain in either a rear-facing or a forward-facing car seat with a five-point harness in the back seat of a vehicle at least until they are 4 years old or 40 lbs. Then, they can move to a booster seat. (Best Practice: If the child has not met the ht. and wt. limitations of their car seat, keep them in the harnesses until they do. A 5 point harness is the SAFEST WAY TO RIDE)

Ages 4 to 8: Children must remain in a booster seat in the back seat of a vehicle until they are at least 8 years old or 57 inches tall. Once they reach that age or height, they can use the regular adult seat belts. (Best Practice: Children should be moved to a seat belt only if the seat belt fits them correctly. The shoulder belt should come across the middle of the chest, not on the neck. The lap belt should ride low on the hips, not in front of the belly, and the child should be able to bend their legs over the edge of the seat. If even one of these is not met, the child should stay in their booster seat until they do).

Front seats: If a vehicle doesn't have a back seat (like a pick-up truck or a sports car), a child can ride in the front seat in a car seat or a booster seat. But the vehicle's passenger-side airbag must be disabled or shut off if a baby or toddler is using a rear-facing car seat strapped into the front seat of the vehicle. The force of air bags can injure small children if they deploy. (Best Practice: Children should remain in the back seat until they are at least 13.)

DOWNTOWN IMPROVEMENTS

MAYOR DIAZ SHARES HOW PERTH AMBOY USED LOCAL RESOURCES AND CREATIVITY FOR DOWNTOWN IMPROVEMENTS

Mayor Wilda Diaz is proud to announce the improvements and repairs in the downtown district to enhance our commuter environment and shopping experience for our residents and visitors alike.

In the past several months over \$750K of both capital budget and grant funds have been invested in milling and paving roads and ADA compliant upgrades to curbs throughout the City. The Department of Public Works has also power washed downtown streets and completed the gum buster program this summer.

Repainting and landscape improvements have also beautified the historic Perth Amboy Train Station through the work of the Parking Utility.

"I want to thank all of the volunteers and staff members who help make these small projects, a big difference in our community. We are taking advantage of the City's prime location, local resources and creativity to develop economic opportunities that can serve as a source of revitalization, said Mayor Wilda Diaz."

Traffic Maintenance has re-launched a city-wide street repainting program and the street sign replacement program will follow. The Perth Amboy Police Department is also strictly entorcing Noise Ordinance Chapter 304 to ensure the quality of life for residents, as increased reports of loud noise tend to occur during the summer months.

Additionally, the \$2M new Hobart Street mixed-use project is now complete. The project included the conversion of office space to 36 residential apartments and retail space on the first floor. The building is now leasing and will support the City's efforts to revitalize the downtown area and better utilize the train station.

The Business Improvement District granted over \$20K to nine local businesses for façade improvements and will soon be releasing the in-house designed 2015 Eateries Guide (wallet-size) to the public. In addition, the Urban Enterprise Zone and the City Council approved the installation of 400 city customized banners throughout the various commercial districts that each represent the character of the Perth Amboy. In addition several art billboards installed in the downtown district thanks to our Perth Amboy students!!




