Pallone Statement on Court Ruling Approving Controversial ExxonMobil Settlement

LONG BRANCH - Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06), Ranking Member of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, decried today's state court approval of the Christie Administration's controversial settlement with ExxonMobil. The Christie Administration decided to settle New Jersey's \$8.9 billion environmental damage lawsuit against ExxonMobil for a mere \$225 million. The settlement comes after an 11-year legal battle to recover damages from ExxonMobil for the contamination of more than 1,800 acres of wetlands, marshes, meadows and waters in northern New Jersey.

"The Christie Administration's settlement destroys

years of hard work and sets an extremely dangerous precedent for future polluters to degrade our state with virtually no consequences," said Congressman Pallone. "New Jerseyans deserved nothing less than to be fairly compensated for the degradation of our land and resources. However, the settlement and the ruling, along with ExxonMobil's attempts – supported by the Christie Administration – to shirk responsibility, are an insult to New Jersey. I am further troubled that the settlement fails to hold Exxon accountable for pollution at 16 other facilities in the state. Today's ruling, which effectively lets big oil off the hook, is a reminder that those of us in New Jersey who are committed to

the environmental health and economic well-being of our state must redouble our efforts in the leadership void left by Governor Christie."

In June, Pallone wrote to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection urging the rejection of the proposed settlement.

In his letter, Pallone wrote, "I was sent to Congress in 1988 to put a stop to ocean dumping and the reckless industrialization of the Jersey Shore. Ensuring the ecological vitality of New Jersey's coastline and waterways has always been one of my top priorities. This insufficient settlement is an affront to the long term objective of cleaning up New Jersey's legacy of toxic contamination."

Pallone Holds 'Make It In America' Tour at NJ Businesses Discussion Focused on Ways to Build and Maintain a Competitive Economy

LONG BRANCH - On 8/27/15 Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) toured Oxford Superconducting Technology in Carteret to highlight and discuss the 'Make It In America' agenda. Congressman Pallone talked about the importance of American jobs and took input on how the 'Make It In America' jobs plan can be updated to reflect today's economic landscape.

"A commitment to American manufacturing is a critical component to improving the economy and creating jobs across the country," said Congressman Pallone. House Democrats launched the 'Make It In America' plan in 2010, centered on the goal of creating the best conditions for American manufacturing, innovation, and job creation. Five years later, several 'Make It In America' bills have been signed into law. Colossus: The Forbin Project was a fictional story (novel made into a movie) about a Master Computer that took over the world and ordered everyone to do what’s good for them.

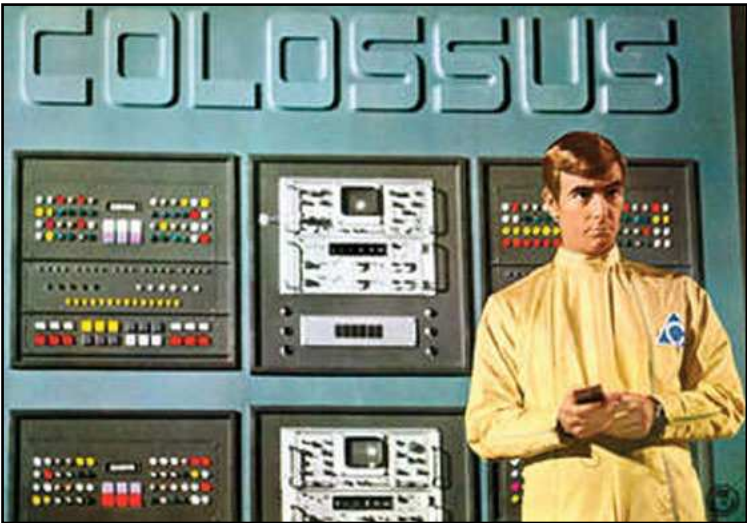
In the past years, government has been slowly chiseling away at our rights and freedoms. Government has been telling us what is good for us and what is bad for us. Recently there have been more and more proposed restrictions heading toward the eventual banning of soft drinks, yoga pants, cigarette smoking, etc.

Letter to the Guardian

At this juncture, I would be remiss in not commenting on articles appearing in the The Amboy Guardian. I will correct some grievous errors for the public.

June 3, 2015.

Caption under a photo of Fernando Gonzalez being sworn in. The Guardian writes, “None of the other council members were present except for council President Lisa Nanton who stood outside in the hall leading into the council chambers.” This is unequivocally false. I introduced the swearing in ceremony at 4:15 from the council president’s seat. I invited Fernando Gonzalez and his family and Judge Rodriquez to come forward for the ceremony. I stood to the side when photographs were taken. This had been an ordeal for Councilman Gonzalez and he deserved this moment. It was not about me, so I stepped to the side. I left the room to get my paperwork for the caucus meeting, which needed to start at 4:30. Why The Guardian would infer –in a caption- that I stood outside in the hallway is beyond my comprehension, especially when the photo clearly shows otherwise.

August 19, 2015

“You Guys are Wrong About This” A very appropriate headline, except that it should be referring to The Guardian. All your quotes were incorrect. I would suggest you watch the

televised meeting before you decide to go to print. First and most importantly, you wrote that “When voting on an ordinance came about, everyone voted yes except for Councilman Irizarry who voted no.” This is wrong and it is a crucial error that totally misrepresents the process.

Your article did not explain that this was NOT a vote on hiring a new attorney. It was a vote on whether to add a “late starter” ordinance to the agenda, which would have allowed a vote on the attorney. Councilman Irizarry voted against putting the late starter on the agenda.

A “late starter” cannot be added to the agenda without a unanimous vote of the council. Councilman Gonzalez voted yes and Councilman Irizarry voted no, therefore it was tabled. You claim in your article everyone else voted yes. This is false. No one else on the council voted officially. Again, it was tabled after Councilman Irizarry’s vote.

In this day and age, when we have the council meetings televised and just about everyone has a phone that records; the constant misquotes and misinformation in The Guardian are increasingly disturbing.

Whether it be incompetence, carelessness, haste or intentional deception, the end result is still the same. The public is being deceived.



“Planting Seeds One Community at a Time”

NEW JERSEY - Hispanics in the State of New Jersey now comprise the largest minority, making up nearly 18 percent of the State’s population or roughly 1.5 million Hispanics in the State (US Census Bureau, 2010). However despite the nursing profession being represented by 3 million registered nurses in the country; only 3.6% of these are Hispanic, or of Latino origin (AACN Diversity in Nursing, 2015). At the local and state level the National Association of Hispanic Nurses-Garden State Chapter (Garden State NAHN) was formed to help bridge the gap by helping to address the equity and health disparities that exist within Hispanic communities in New Jersey (NJ). Garden State NAHN has adapted the motto, “Planting Seeds One Community at a Time”. The chapter’s focus is primarily on education, advocacy and collaboration. Garden State NAHN achieves its motto by forging relationships with community partners, schools of nursing, and local hospitals throughout the State. Garden State NAHN believes that by aligning our resources with community partners we can reduce redundancies, and help promote communication and team building that serves to enhance care for our most vulnerable populations. Nurses understand that we do not work in silos! This mindset is

carried into our partnerships so we can collaborate and pool resources to better serve our local Hispanic communities. Since the chapter’s inaugural launch in January, Garden State NAHN has been pro-active in alternating its monthly chapter meetings between a hospital and a school of nursing. We ensure to cover both the Northern and Southern regions of the State since these counties comprise the largest number of Hispanic residents. Garden State NAHN also stays true to its motto by contributing to each town or city that hosts its monthly chapter meeting. Community service is at the essence of caring for our most vulnerable populations. We do this on an on-going basis through various community events such as Food Drives - helping to restock the shelves at a local food pantry, serving hot meals at local soup kitchens, collecting granola bars and juice packs to donate to a local after-school program, or by gathering baby items to donate to a women’s local prenatal clinic. These joint efforts allow us to provide bilingual health education, and much needed resources directly to the most vulnerable communities in our State. It has also provided us a forum to promote nursing as a profession for our youth thus helping to increase diversity in nursing as well as promoting a culture of health for all Hispanics. These are just a few examples of activities completed to date by the Garden State NAHN team members. Additionally, Garden State

NAHN has partnered with Johnson & Johnson the Campaign for Nursing’s Future to offer scholarship opportunities to NJ nursing students. Striving to increase diversity and advance nursing education; Garden State NAHN will offer five scholarship awards at its first annual “Education Symposium, Scholarship Awards Luncheon & Cultural Celebration”. This event is scheduled to take place on Saturday, October 17th at the Prudential Center in Newark. We welcome hospitals, schools of nursing, community partners and local businesses to showcase their products and services at our event’s exhibit hall. Garden State NAHN is committed to being inclusive and it welcomes all nurses, healthcare providers and affiliate stakeholders to join the Garden State NAHN chapter. We recognize that nurses and health care providers from diverse backgrounds care for Hispanic patients [and their families] and we invite them to share their insight by joining us! Tax Facts: Supreme Court Issues Ruling on ACA Subsidies

In June, the U.S. Supreme Court decided the fate of the premium tax credit under the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The main issue before the court was whether federal subsidies could be offered to people who purchased health insurance through the federal health insurance marketplace rather than through a state-run exchange. Under a literal reading of the law, subsidies are allowed through exchanges “established by the state.” It was argued that the wording of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) prohibits subsidies from being granted in states that did not set up their own insurance exchange, but instead defaulted to the federal health insurance marketplace. More than half of the states use the federal exchange.

The Court ruled that the credit applies to health insurance exchanges established by individual states as well as exchanges established by the federal government.

What does that mean for you? Essentially, the decision means that nothing has changed. If you qualify for the health insurance premium tax credit, you will continue to be able to claim it on your federal income tax return.

The premium tax credit is

an advanceable, refundable credit that helps offset the cost of health insurance policy premiums when your income is within established ranges. The determination of your eligibility to receive the credit, and the amount you qualify for, is calculated when you complete your insurance application on an exchange.

You choose how much of the credit to apply to your premium. If you elect to use some or all of the credit to offset the premium, that amount is paid directly to the insurance company. You pay the remaining premium out-of-pocket. When you complete your federal income tax return, you calculate the actual credit you are eligible to receive. The difference between the actual amount and the amount advanced to the insurance company affects the tax on your return.

Because the credit is based on income, any changes in your financial situation during the year can affect the amount you’re eligible to receive. Please call us if you need more information.

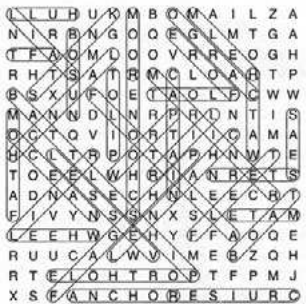

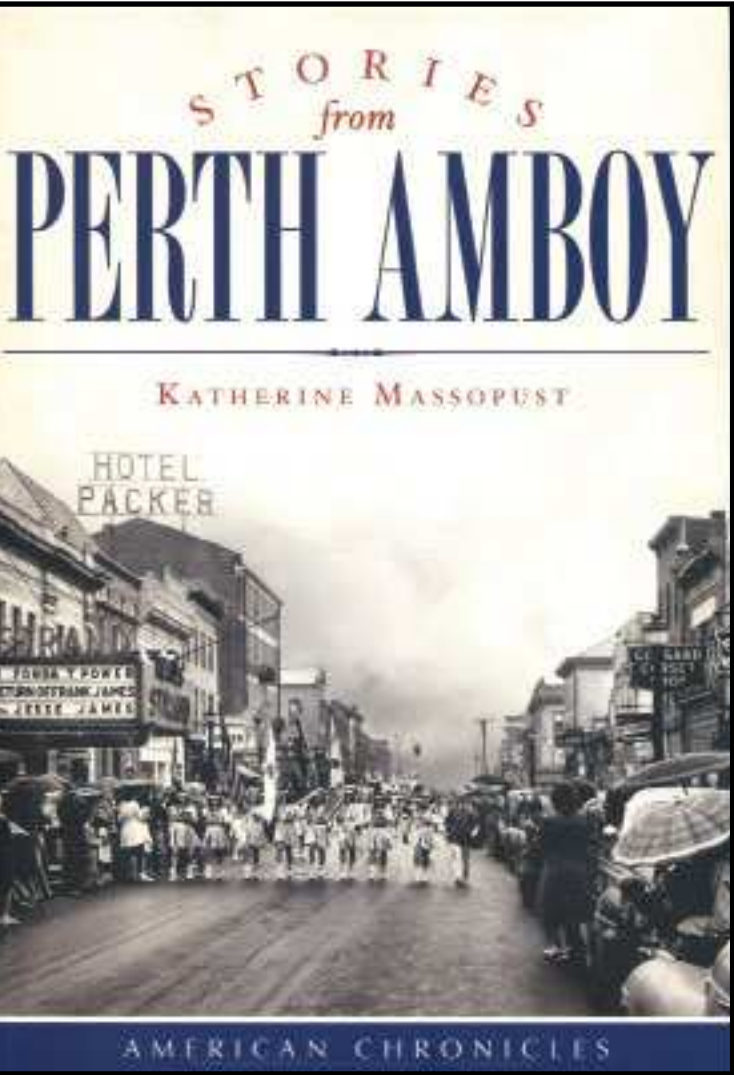
