Off-Duty Police Officer Found Shot Dead

SAYREVILLE - An off-duty Sayreville Police Officer was found shot to death in the parking lot of the old Amboy Cinemas according to police (Parkway & Rte. 9 side of the former movie theater)

During a press conference from the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office, the following was stated: At 7:15 a.m. on Monday, March 21, 2016 a call came in to the Sayreville Police Department. When Police responded, they found a male body that appeared to have died of gunshot wounds. The victim was identified a Sayreville Police Officer who was in his personal vehicle.

The Prosecutor's Office had no further comments at the time of printing.

Fire at Los Kenton Grocery Store

PERTH AMBOY - There was a fire at the Los Kenton Grocery Store at 752 State St., Perth Amboy (corner of State and Chauncey Sts.).

PAFD Chief Abraham Pitre released the following statment: Fire was reported at 10:58 p.m. Upon arrival an heavy volume of fire was encountered outside in the rear of the building extending both to 752 state and the church located at 760 State St. The fire had already extended into the first and second floors and was running up the void spaces in the walls to the third floor and roof. We had two minor firefighter injuries and no civilian injuries. We received

assistance from Keasbey, Hopelawn, South Amboy, Sayreville, Fords, Edison fire departments. Units are remaining on scene throughout the day hitting hot spots and flare ups.

PAPD Briefing of the Victory **Bridge Incident by Deputy Chief Lawrence Cattano:** 3/18/16

PERTH AMBOY - At 8:43 a.m. Perth Amboy Police received a call of a man on the South bound side of the Victory Bridge on the outside of the rail and hanging on looking to jump. At 844 a.m. a police sergeant was on location and established a dialog with the individual. This sergeant was accompanied by additional Police Officers from the Perth Amboy and the Sayreville Police Department. The 25 year old resident was upset and threatening to jump to the water 110 feet below. The Bridge was secured of all vehicular traffic and marine units from our Police and Fire Departments responded and were in position within 10 minute. The negotiation continued for several hours until at 11:16 a.m. The individual indicated that he wanted to come over the rail to safety, then abruptly fought and pushed the assisting officers away and jumped to the water below. As the Police and Fire marine units were in position below, they were immediately able to retrieve the individual from the water and get him on aboard the fire vessel where they began tending to him medically prior to turning him over to the awaiting EMS units on shore. Fortunately, the outstanding coordination between all Police and Fire Units involved allowed for the immediate rescue efforts and to bring it to its conclusion as safely as possible.

South Amboy Remembers Ed Paczkowski

Lifelong South Amboy Resident Passed Away March 12th

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - The city of South Amboy held a moment of silence and reflected on the life of late resident Ed Paczkowski at last Wednesday's city council meeting.

Paczkowski, 78, was a lifelong resident of South Amboy whose family owned Frank's Meat Market and then Foodtown on Bordentown Ave. for decades up until his retirement in 2012. Mayor Fred Henry spoke highly of Paczkowski's dedication to both his family and the city.

"My condolences go out to the Paczkowski family. They lost a great husband, a father, and South Amboy lost a great friend," Henry said. "He will be missed."

The South Amboy council echoed Mayor Henry's comments, thanking Paczkowski for his dedication to the city.

"He was certainly a true South Amboyan," Business Administrator Camille Tooker said. "He was there for anyone who ever needed anything. He will truly be missed."

"Ed was a wonderful guy, a good volunteer, and a dedicated family man," Councilman Tom Reilly added.

Paczkowski was a member of a number of groups and organizations in South Amboy including the Cardinal McCarrick High School Advisory Board, the St. Mary's Hall of Fame Committee, the South Amboy Trust Company Board, and the St. Mary's Eagles Athletic Association. Paczkowski was also named South Amboy's Citizen of the Year in 1990, Chamber of Commerce Business Man of the Year in 2002, and was named the Middlesex County Grand Marshall of the 2007 Pulaski Day Parade in New York City.

Councilwoman Zusette Dato and Councilman Donald Applegate were not in attendance for the council meeting. The next city council meeting will take place on April 20th at 7:00 p.m.

PERTH AMBOY - Betsy Rodriguez, who was a 2010 alumni of Perth Amboy High School and a youth development specialist, spoke during the public portion. The holistic program that she is a part of is under the New Jersey Dept. of Children and Families. She emphasized that this program helps build academic, social skills and interview skills in students. "I work with the guidance counselors, and each of them has about 300 students."

She wanted to thank Mr. Mosley and the Board of Education and would like to participate in planning of the new High School.

Board Member Anthony Bermudez said, "I heard that you do good work, help students get into college."

Rodriguez also fielded a quesition from a Board Member who wanted to know if they only help students who are college bound. Rodriguez emphasized that they also schedule trips for students who want to go to technical schools. "We have also worked with ROTC students."

Board Member Obi Gonzalez said, "Ms. Rodriguez also has an office in the High School. Besides helping with college entries and financial aid, this youth development program helps students with all kinds

Let Them Pay 3/9/16 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Resident John Kerry Dyke who is known for producing several documentaries on Perth Amboy's rich history gave a presentation at the 3/9/16 Council Meeting. He wanted to emphasize several historic sites that may be part of Perth Amboy's Redevelopment Plans. Dyke first talked about Perth Amboy's Historic Ferry Slip that at one point had gone into disarray and was restored under MoPA (Museums of Perth Amboy). Some of those members included Cathy DePow, the late Richard Pietkowski, the late Tom Ward and several others.

Now Dyke was here to speak about two other sites. The first site was the Thomas Mundy Peterson site which is located off of Commerce Street (on a street that no longer exists called Commerce Lane across the street from Hy Tavern). Dyke gave a brief overview of why the Thomas Mundy Peter-

son site is so important to the history of not only Perth Amboy, but of the United States. Peterson was the first African-American to vote after the passage of the 15th Amendment to the United States Constitution which gave African-Americans the right to vote. Dyke explained how Peterson became the first African-American to vote when Marcus Spring of Eagleswood happened to see

Peterson walking by City Hall.

The Thomas Mundy Peterson Site is located off of Commerce Street which is now part of the Landings at Harborside Property presently an ongoing redevelopment project owned by Charles Kushner.

The second site mentioned by Dyke was the property located

Perth Amboy's Self-serving Board of Education

As a resident of the City of Perth Amboy and as a parent of three children, who attend the Perth Amboy Public School District, it is truly astounding to see how self-serving the current Perth Amboy Board of Education members are. In January, the Perth Amboy Board of Education unanimously voted in favor of changing the date of its election to April 19, 2016 from the general election date of November 8, 2016.

Reasons for the sudden move, which is estimated to cost Perth Amboy taxpayers over \$30,000 unnecessarily, have been murky at best. It has been suggested that members of the current board do not want Board of Education politics in the mix with local, state and federal elections to ensure the public has an opportunity to be engaged in our school system. It would have almost been believable if the board did not decide to change the election in a matter of two days with virtually no public input.

In another blatant contradictory reason for the change in election dates, board member Mr. Israel Varela publicly claimed he found there to be litical motive for the Board of

higher voter turnout during school board elections held in April. However, when actually analyzing the voter turnout numbers, which are publicly available on the City of Perth Amboy's website, without making blanket statements to suit one's need, we see significantly higher numbers in November.

Simple research shows that in 2012, the first year the Board of Education election took place in November, the candidate who received the most votes tallied 2262. In 2011, the last time a Board of Education election was held in April, the highest vote total for a candidate was 693. In comparing those two elections alone, we see an increase of over 250% in November's favor.

There is one November election that saw less of a turnout than one April election in the last seven years - 2015, when there was historically low voter turnouts across the State of New Jersey.

In the November 2014 election, the candidate who amassed the lowest number of votes with a total of 1067 still toppled the highest vote getter in 2010 by over 300 votes.

The discrepancy between Mr. Varela's claim and the actual facts can be either one of two things: a total lack of understanding of the results or a deliberate attempt to mislead us.

An even more egregious po-

Education to want to change the elections so hastily and without public input comes in the case of its President, Mr. Samuel Lebreault. The last time Mr. Lebreault ran for a seat on the Board when running in a Presidential year he lost, overwhelmingly.

I applaud Mayor Wilda Diaz and the Perth Amboy City Council for acknowledging the Board of Education's decision for what it is – dirty, political maneuvering disguised as public service. Last month, the City Council voted in favor of a resolution moving the Board of Education election back to November, in an attempt to save taxpayer dollars. The board is now challenging the City's decision in Superior Court. An oral argument date has been set for March 21, which should definitively determine an election date.

If this year's Board of Education election were to happen next month, Mr. Lebreault, Mr. Varela and their running mate, who are all supportive of this sudden and costly change in dates will run unopposed - meaning they will essentially be granted another term to continue using our school system for their own political agenda. When are they actually going to care about the education of our children?



Casa Argentina de New Jersey "1000 Books Program"

Press Release 3/4/16 PERTH AMBOY - "1000 Books" completes a very successful cycle of bilingual reading and mentoring, honoring great creative minds in children's bilingual literature and much more.

"1000 Books" is a grassroots collaboration between the Perth Amboy Public Library, Casa Argentina de New Jersey and School Based Youth Services Program (a project of the Jewish Renaissance Foundation funded by The New Jersey Department of Children and Families). This program provides an opportunity and a place for high school students to read to younger children in both English and Spanish.

While dual language exposure and bilingualism are common experiences for 95% of the children in Perth Amboy, New Jersey by the time these children reach adolescence, only about 10% of them remain fluent in both languages. Research supports Selman's Theory on Interpersonal Understanding that bilingualism enhances executive function performance, metalinguistic awareness, abstract thinking and perspective taking.

Most children that lose their ability to speak in their native language do so because they do not have the environmental incentive to speak in their mother tongue. As a result, fewer second generation immigrants can be described as bilingual.

In the 1000 Books program, students find an environment where they can feel proud of their heritage by reading books in both, English and Spanish. "I particularly like that we are given a chance to restore pride in the community we live," says Marialis Savinon, a program participant and high school junior at The Perth Amboy High School.

When children lose their mother\'s language as they learn English in school, the bond between parents and children is damaged according to Victoria I Puig from Montclair State University.

In the 1000 Books program, children are afforded opportunities to develop a love of reading in English and Spanish, which brings pride and connection back to the community. When there are high levels of bonding and high levels of feelings of belongingness, as children grow, they are less likely to engage in risky behaviors. In addition, youth and children are also more likely to stay in school, and experiencing greater overall success, according to the Youth Thrive Framework developed by The Center for the Study of Social Policy.

About the Collaborators,

Casa Argentina is a New Jersey based non-profit organization passionate about cultivating bilingual readers, writers, and engaged citizens. In collaboration with the Perth Amboy Public Library and School Based Youth Services Program, the 1000 Books program provides children in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, with a high school mentor who reads to them in English and Spanish, fostering a sense of belonging, love for reading, and a venue for positive youth development.

The program provides a unique and meaningful way to develop a love of reading, as well as multicultural awareness by incorporating crafts and dramatic readings.

This program works on many levels. High School students increase their school readiness and job readiness skills while they also learn to value diversity. By participating in cultural continuity, high school aged students learn the value of community service. The children participating in the program get the extra incentive to read while generating a sense of pride in their heritage through the reading of bilingual authors and bicultural books. At the same time, both children and teenagers improve their reading skills. According to Jusleine Daniel, Casa Argentina rector of Cultural Affairs and Community Development, "it is incredibly rewarding to see the children and teens develop an understanding of who one is and where one comes from while bonding with each other over books and readings."

The children love to have the high school mentors read to them in Spanish and English. They also love listening to stories that are representatives of their cultural heritage. \"We know our program is having an impact when we have the children who, at the beginning would not speak in Spanish, want to learn more about their native language," says Raul Pretto, Casa Argentina Presi-

off of Convery Boulevard and Smith Street (The former site of Celotex, which was formerly known as Eagleswood). Eagleswood was the historic school in the Raritan Bay Union. He noted several wellknown individuals who studied or visited there. Among those included: Frederick Douglas, a prominent African-American social reformer, abolitionist, orator, writer, and statesman; Henry David Thoreau, a well-known author, poet, philosopher, abolitionist, naturalist, tax resister, development critic, surveyor, and historian who wrote Walden and Ralph Waldo Emerson, an essayist, lecturer, and poet who led the Transcendentalist movement of the mid-19th century.

"The Underground Railroad ran through the Eagleswood Site. Slaves who escaped from the South were fed there and received medical treatment before continuing their journey up to Canada. Perth Amboy encouraged Blacks to vote. They were way ahead of everybody else."

Dyke pleaded with the Council to incorporate archeology into Redevelopment Sites. "After all the historic sites are documented, then they should be developed, if needed. Don't let these developers forget these sites. Let them pay for the documentation before developing on these historic sites."

Topics like these were discussed at the Historic Preservation Commission when it was first reactivated under Mayor Wilda Diaz. John Dyke had come forward at one of the PAHPC meetings in the past to discuss the importance of having archeological digs, especially at Eagleswood to document the history of that prominent site.

The Board Attorney cautioned the members, "We can't talk in public about activities concerning security."







This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

In East Africa, troops of the British 11th (African) Division attack strong Italian positions in the Marda Pass, west of Jijiga, in eastern Ethiopia, on March 21, 1941. After some resistance, the Italians pull out and fall back. In Philadelphia, Joe Louis again successfully defends his heavyweight boxing title, defeating Abe Simon by a technical knockout in the 13th round.

On March 22 the German battleships Scharnhorst and Gneisenau enter the shelter of French waters. The two vessels have wreaked considerable havoc on the British convoy system, sinking 22 ships totaling 115.600 registered tons. In East Africa, British forces overrun another Italian defensive position west of Jijiga, Ethiopia, at Babile Pass.

Accompanied by fighters, German Stuka dive-bombers on March 23 raid Malta. As a result of the attack, the British withdraw all RAF bombers and flying boats from the island.

On March 24 German Lt. Gen. Erwin Rommel launches his first offensive in Cyrenaica (Libya), recapturing El Agheila from the British. With significant numbers of veteran British desert troops sent to Greece, Lt. Gen. Phillip Neame is left to hold Libya with the under-strength 2nd Armoured Division, the 9th Australian Division and an Indian brigade. In addition, their tanks are mostly old and worn-out. (Neame has replaced Lt. Gen. Richard O'Connor, who has been made commander of British Troops in Egypt.) Rommel, on the other hand, has one German division — the 5th Light Division, with a strong tank component — and parts of four Italian divisions under his command. But Rommel, too, has his problems: the German High Command has forbidden him from attacking and has notified him he will receive no extra forces until May.

In Vienna, Austria, on March 25, Yugoslavia's Prime Minister Dragiša Cvetković and Foreign Minister Dimitrije Cincar-Marković, yielding to German pressure, sign the Tripartite Pact, joining the Axis. Germany agrees to respect Yugoslavian sovereignty and not demand passage for its troops. In Belgrade, civil disturbances break out when it becomes known that the country has joined the Axis. In Eritrea, in the Horn of Africa, the 4th and 5th Indian Divisions renew their advance toward an Italian blocking position along the Keren road.

Following claims by the Luftwaffe that it has sunk two battle-ships of the British Mediterranean Fleet (not true), and with the promise of air cover and reconnaissance, Adm. Angelo Iachino on March 26 leads the Italian fleet into the Aegean Sea with the intent of disrupting British convoys to Greece. His force comprises one battleship, six heavy cruisers, two light cruisers and 13 destroyers. The same day, British forces occupy Harar, Ethiopia. During the night, an attack by a special Italian naval unit's explosive motorboats penetrates Suda Bay, Crete, in the Greek islands, sinking one tanker and crippling the British heavy cruiser HMS York

On March 27, the British Royal Navy moves out to engage the Italian fleet. Adm. Andrew Cunningham leads three battleships, one aircraft carrier and nine destroyers out of Alexandria, Egypt, while Vice Adm. Henry Pridham-Wippell sorties four light cruisers and four destroyers from Piraeus, Greece. In Yugoslavia, an anti-Axis coup d'etat by air force officers deposes Prince Paul and forces him into exile. King Peter II, a minor (he's only 17). assumes the throne, with Royal Yugoslav Air Force Chief of Staff Dušan Simović as the head of government. In response, a furious Adolf Hitler issues "Führer Directive No. 25" that orders an immediate invasion, with the objective "to destroy Yugoslavia militarily and as a state." In East Africa, Platt's Allied advance clears roadblocks in the Keren area of Eritrea, with the Italians falling back toward Asmara. The fighting is brutal, with the Indian divi sions suffering 4,000 casualties and the Italians losing 3,000 dead and many wounded.




