The Volley: The Ball is Back in Your Court Again

3/21/16 Caucus Meeting

PERTH AMBOY – Topic for Discussion: Handicapped Ordinance. Councilman Bill Petrick started the discussion regarding the revision of the handicapped ordinance. This has been bounced around for months. A committee had been formed in order to discuss how handicapped permits should be issued. That committee consisted of the City Clerk, the Police Department and Code Enforcement.

Petrick said, "The ordinance is ominous." He Echoed the same sentiments that City Clerk Elaine Jasko has said in the past about this handicapped ordinance. No one on a committee has the qualifications to determine if an applicant's medical conditions qualifies them for a handicapped space or sign in front of the residence.

Petrick continued, "Our former B.A. (Greg Fehrenbach) was concerned about too many handicapped spots in the business district. We need to rescind the last handicapped ordinance that we voted on and put it back to what it was before."

Councilman Joel Pabon, who was acting as Council President in the absence of Lisa Nanton interjected, "Handicapped spaces were being abused by people who I felt really didn't need it. There are handicapped persons who live in a house and they never leave

that house. Other family members residing with that person have handicapped parking placards in their own vehicle."

Petrick spoke again and said, "No one in City Hall wants to make a determination on a person's medical condition."

Law Director Arlene Quniones-Perez reminded the Council that they passed the amended handicapped ordinance, "But it is not in effect yet."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez said, "People are concerned about some of the specifics in the law. If we the Council are not comfortable about anything in the ordinance, then we should look at it and make the appropriate changes instead of rescinding it altogether."

Petrick spoke again and said, "This is not just for renewals, but for new applicants."

Councilman Gonzalez also cautioned that this amended ordinance is going to be in effect now since the old ordinance is not in effect."

City Clerk Jasko told the Council that in the past applicants would bring in their placards and proper documents to get their handicapped space reissued."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry said, "I understand that this ordinance is not asking the committee to review an applicant's medical diagnosis. We are just asking them to bring necessary documents from their physi-

cians, the Division of Motor Vehicles and any other agency that's required."

Law Director Quinones-Perez said, "The committee will review the documents of the applicants and make sure they are authentic. The committee can consist of one Council Member, a representative from the Police Department and three Non-Council Members.

Jasko also told the Council, "Applicants renew their handicapped licenses every 3 years."

Council Member Fernando Irizarry said, "At this point, I am not in favor of rescinding this resolution."

Councilman Petrick said he had concerns about the confidentiality when people on the committee are reviewing the medical information of applicants."

At this point, Deputy Police Chief Larry Cattano said, "If it makes those on the committee feel better, my department can make the final determination."

Councilman Gonzalez said, "Anyone who feels they really need a handicapped spot won't mind going through the process."

Law Director Arlene Quinones-Perez said, "Renewals will be up in December of this year."

Acting Council President Joel Pabon said, "The main criteria for an applicant getting a handicapped spot is mobility issues.

Bone of Contention

PERTH AMBOY - 3/21/16 Caucus. Resolutions R-167 and R-168 Approving Seasonal Fixed Location, Lease Licenses at the Perth Amboy Marina for Slavko Petric and Edgardo Lugo and Noemi Cardona D/B/A Bomba D'Food Truck, Respectively.

Councilman Bill Petrick and Fernando Gonzalez had differences of opinions about allowing these food vendors in the Marina area. Fernando Gonzalez said, "The existing restaurant owners had concerns that these seasonal food vendors would be taking business away from them.

Petrick said, "There were four permits available prior to us being on the Council. They are not taking away from the brick and mortar establishments. In the past there were restrictions placed on ice cream establishments selling food. This is a different base.'

Gonzalez said, "My main concern is there should be a balance."

At the 3/23/16 Council Meeting these two Resolutions were moved along with all resolutions on the agenda by Bill Petrick and seconded by Fernando Irizarry.

Council President Lisa Nanton was absent.

Law Director's Behavior Questioned 3/23/16 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Comments. during the public por-

Stanley Sierakowski questioned Law Director Quinones' behavior at the March 9, 2016 Council Meeting, "At one point during the Meeting, the Law Director got up from where she sits with the Council, sat down in the audience and came up to speak as if she was part of the public."

Sierakowski continued, "The contract on Resolution R-145-3/16 was a contract that would follow her if she was no longer employed by the City. It's her law firm (Decotiis) monev - not hers. Decotiis' bid for the contract was \$195/hr. Other firms were \$125/hr, You should investigate her (Quinones) actions."

Resident David Caba came up to speak about the Caucus Meeting of 3/7/16. He made reference to Perth Amboy Democratic Chair Billy Delgado's comments at the 3/7/16 Meeting when Delgado said what the Law Director did was legal (When she drew up the resolution appointing Peter Pelissier as Assistant B.A. after his position as Interim B.A. was up). Maybe if he (Delgado) would spend more time in

Perth Amboy he would know what is going on. Quinones admitted she made a mistake. Where are all those lawyers who defended Quinones before? They're not here when Quinones admitted she made a mistake. We go out of state and to Newark to get a Business Administrator. I will continue to fight for my people."

Former Councilman Ken Balut had a comment about the budget appropriations, "Does that include money for an independent lawyer? There are letters from Civil Service violations going on. You can't have paid personnel volunteer to do work at the State of the City Address. \$1.7 million that is included in the Employee Contracts – at the end they will lose that money. The budget doesn't have salaries and the Mayor's budget went up \$20,000 last year. City employees shouldn't be here at the Council Meetings."

Resident Alan Silber wanted to know, "Did we change the Meeting? The Law Director went and changed a Resolution when the Charter School was here at a Meeting. That Resolution that dealt with Charter School issues was revised before the end of the

Meeting. From January 5, 2016 was there an acting administrator here up until the time when Adam Cruz was hired as a permanent Business Administrator?"

Joel Pabon who was the Acting Council President in place of Lisa Nanton verified that Adam Cruz became the new Business Administrator on February 11, 2016. Silber argued the point that you can't have a person who became an Assistant Business Administrator have the same duties as when they were the Acting Business Administrator. Silber also had the same concerns about Quinones' actions at the March 9, 2016 Meeting when she spoke as if she was part of the public instead of a City Official. "Shame on Arlene, the Mayor and the Council."

Businesswoman Virginia Lugo came to speak, "They should make sure that the previous Meetings are broadcast on video streaming before the next Meetings take place. She (the Law Director) was grandstanding. The Mayor made a big deal about the \$20,000 that the Council requested for an independent attorney. Now, I see it's tabled."

Stricken

PERTH AMBOY - For the closed session pending litigation, Law Director Arlene Quinones-Perez took one of the items off of that session. The Board of Education vs. The City of Perth Amboy. She explained the reason for this, "The judge determined that the Board of Education failed to issue and send proper notice of the proposed change the date of their Election from November 8, 2016 to April 19, 2016. Therefore it was void-

Quinones added, "On the City's part, \$10,000 was spent for this specific litigation. Part of this cost was for briefs and certifications." Ms. Quinones thanked City Clerk Elaine Jasko for her help in this matter.

Agree to Disagree 3/21/16 Caucus

PERTH AMBOY - 3/21/16 Caucus - Resolution R-150- back and replied, "I have the 3/16 – Introduction of Calendar Year 2016 Budget.

Business Administrator Adam Cruz was happy to report, "There is a zero percent tax increase. We are able to maintain the same level of services."

Despite this, Fernando Gonzalez had some concerns, "Employee salaries are not included. I need that information before I make my decision. This was part of the Best Practices in the past."

Jill Goldy, Chief Financial Officer came up and told the Council, "Employee Salaries were not in the Best Practices List."

Fernando Gonazlez came information that had this (Employee Salaries) in the past."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz said, "We went by the 2015 guidelines."

At the 3/23/16 Council Meeting, Councilman Fernando Gonzalez still wanted a list of all employee salaries in the budget, "Maybe the last time it was done because of union negotiations."

Councilman Bill Petrick also responded to this item when he made his Council Comments, "You're entitled to see the list of salaries even when union negotiations are going on."

Let's face it, there's a couple of places that most people dread going to. Two of those places are the Department of Motor Vehicle and the Post Office.

What's said here is my own personal experiences when dealing with these two businesses.

Once a week, I mail out subscriptions to the paper at the Perth Amboy Post Office. Every single clerk that I have encountered at the window has always been consistent in three things when dealing with me: They're courteous, efficient and always leave me with a smile on my face.

While standing in line waiting to be served, I am always aware as to how they treat the customers they serve before me. In my experience, they have been very patient and helpful, especially when customers are bringing in large boxes or items to be mailed.

The only small complaint I have is that there are not always enough clerks on duty during the busiest time of the day. It could be because of a smaller workforce.

One time I went to Keasbey to mail out the newspapers and they had a sign on the door that they were closed for two hours. Unfortunately at that location, they only have one clerk working there. I was so shocked they would close down for two hours during their working hours. I only hope it was for that one particular day. All in all I have to give kudos to the clerks in the Perth Amboy Office. They have to service a large population that still prefers the human touch over mailing online.

The Department of Motor Vehicles is one operation that I or most people don't depend on that much unless you buy a new car every single year. I am one of the lucky ones who every four years by mail. This year, I decided I wanted a new photo and went in person. On Thursday, March 24, 2016 when I arrived at the Rahway Office, the line was ridiculous-

ly long. A short time after I arrived, one of the workers came out and made an announcement: "The computers statewide are down." They had no idea when they would come back up. Just what I wanted to

The next day was Good Friday and all the DMV Officers were closed. He also told the people standing outside that the DMV Office would be open on Saturday, but the previous Saturday, there wer 180 people standing outside waiting to be serviced.

So yesterday (3/28/16) I decided to venture to the Rahway DMV again. The good news is that the computers were working; the bad news was the line was just as long as when I was there on 3/24/16.

My sister who had driven me to Rahway suggested we go to the Edison DMV instead. The line there was half as long and it moved very quickly. An employee came outside to apologize for us having to stand outside, especially because the weather was bad, but there was plenty of coverage. Once I was inside, I was pleasantly surprised. There is a system where there is a screen where you input your name, you cell phone number and then up top you touch on the screen why you're here.

They called you by the last four numbers of your cell phone. If you don't have a cell phone you are provided a ticket with the number. Inside of the waiting area, there are two screens which display the numbers that are about to be called and the line that you would go to. There is also an employee who calls out the same information on the PA

Every employee that I encountered that day was courteous, efficient and had a smile on their face. On the way out, I thanked each one I encountered. C.M.

When John referred to the restoration of the historic ferry slip in his remarks, he in no way gave credit to MOPA (Museums of Perth Amboy) or the three individuals you men-

The Waterfront Association to Effect Restoration (W.A.T.E.R.) was formed by the late Rose Macan Booz in

1977 for the express purpose of restoring the decaying ferry slip at the foot of Smith Street. After her untimely passing in 1980, Barbara Rokicki-Booz was elected President and John Dyke, Vice-President. We applied and received historic site status, and our membership was close to 200 members.

We entered into an Agreement with the USN Seabees who were stationed at the adjacent Naval Armory and they provided construction assistance. The ferry slip was stabilized, and in 1998 it was completely restored with the

help of the City administration and a Federal Grant provided by the late Sen. Frank Lautenberg.

After the W.A.T.E.R. organization was dissolved, the City of Perth Amboy appointed a Director. The ferry slip housed a "Welcome Center" and a Maritime Museum. However, much to my disappointment, the jewel that we worked so hard to restore is rarely open.

Statement on Election

"Today, the Honorable Arthur Bergman sitting in Middlesex County Superior Court heard oral argument on the Perth Amboy Board of Education's ("Board") petition to restrain the City of Perth Amboy ("City") from moving school board elections back to November 2016. Judge Bergman issued a decision from the bench, finding that the Board's January 12th resolution was not valid, in substantive part, because based on his interpretation of N.J.S.A. 19:60-1.1 and school laws, a board of education may never shorten

the terms of its board members by moving elections to April. Instead, the Judge outlined specific procedures for moving the November elections to April moving forward. The Judge is expected to issue an order consistent with his bench ruling by end of the week, which will detail those requirements.

The Perth Amboy Board of Education is very satisfied with Judge Bergman's findings, and looks forward to the opportunity to move elections to a time where it benefits the community the most, and when educational issues can be the focus. In light of Judge Bergman's decision, the Perth Amboy Board of Education takes this opportunity to advise the public that school board elections for the Perth Amboy Board of Education will not be held on April 19, 2016. The Board would like to thank the public for its patience in handling the confusion surrounding the election, created by the City's actions. The Board continues to work tirelessly to ensure the interests of its students and the constituents it represents are being served, and that school issues are not overshadowed by political parties or city interests."

Dear Dr. Roman,

It has come to the attention of the Federation that new procedures and/or practices are being enacted in the district regarding student participation in various events. Recently New York Yankee outfielder Carlos Beltran was denied access to the students of Perth Amboy High School because of this issue. It was explained to me no actual denial took place however: "the message conveyed centered more on our protocols and procedures set under the public school domain, which is to seek proper board approval. As a result, the timeframes for both parties were not in alignment, which then made it rather difficult to fulfill the request."

Now I have been informed that students district-wide are being denied access the Perth Amboy Student Showcase. This is an art showcase our students have participated in for years where they gain rec-

ognition for their artistic talents. Staff was informed that students will not be allowed to participate as the event was not Board approved.

I have worked in this district for the past sixteen (16) years, serving as both Senior Class Advisor and Student Council Advisor and have conducted events where Board approval was never an issue. Similarly I have had guest speakers in my classes which did not require Board approval.





Residents Concerned About Handicapped Parking, Ordinances, Salaries and Titles

PERTH AMBOY - 3/21/16 Caucus - During the public portion, Resident and former Councilman Ken Balut commented, "We had a Councilman who violated the Handicapped Law and he was appointed a Judge. If I was turned down for a handicapped spot, I would sue you."

Balut also questioned Pelissier's last paychecks of \$5000 and \$6000. Then he went into some of the questionable billing of the DeCotiis Law Firm. He brought up an article from the Bergen Record where the DeCotiis Law Firm had to pay back \$115,000 for overbilling. "We are catching the heat. We had to raise taxes to get back revenue. You can get \$80,000 for the temporary budget. The Mayor's budget went up \$20,000 last year.

Resident Stanley Sierakowski said, "At a previous Meeting Councilman Fernando Gonzalez stated that the City sold 6,000 acres of property for a dollar. What did you get back 4,000 acres for? Also, did the Board of Education agree not to appeal the decision by the Judge requesting their change of date for the election? Taxes were not paid for that particular property that was sold for a dollar. Taxes for those eight years would come out to \$800,000."

Resident and Business Owner Susan Batista still had questions about her suit against the City of Perth Amboy, "I filed an OPRA request for the law firms that bill the City pertaining to my case. I have the bill for the DeCotiis firm. I'm waiting for the two other law firms. You're voting for this money to be spent. I started talking about the foreclosures in this town in 2008. I reduced my fees to help people. I helped people get their foreclosures stopped."

Resident David Caba spoke about the Meeting of March 9, 2016 when the room was packed. "We have a large Latino community. I was criticized when I said Dominicans should get jobs. I said we should have a say in this. A lot of my friends are Puerto Ricans. Two Dominicans were put on the Redevel- knew that election was a great

opment Agency. A third of the population is Dominican. The Labor Secretary is Dominican. The Dominicans have no positions of authority in this City. The Dominicans are not the majority in the votes. Obama could find a Dominican to put into a position of authority, but we can't find a Dominican in the City for a position of authority.'

Resident Sharon Hubberman spoke, "There was a process that a person qualifies for to get a handicapped placard in the first place. Now, you are adding additional paperwork for them to go through. You need a tier system. Are some of these ordinances legal I find it difficult to see what transpired in some of these ordinances. It states you can appoint separate counsel if there's a conflict of interest. There is also a process as to how bills are processed."

Resident William Mason came up to speak. He asked B.A. Cruz about the OPRA request by Batista and he also inquired about the new computers that were recently purchased by the City, "What departments will be getting those computers?"

Resident Alan Silber came up to speak about the last Meeting on March 9, 2016. "There are a lot of City Employees here. Why were 90 day deadlines ignored. I hope you got the point when Caba was talking about Dominicans not in positions of authority. The City Code required that the Mayor draft a resolution about the B.A. position." Silber inquired about a job listing paying \$40,000 for an community organizer. "It must be legal if the Law Director said it was - the Assistant B.A. position was never advertised and it says that it must be a resident. No one ever gave him (Pelissier) a waiver. You (the Council) should get a separate lawyer. You have a right to that money (\$20,000 that the Council placed in the budget for a separate attorney). You may have to sue to get it."

Mayor Wilda Diaz came up to speak in response to some of the inquiries from the public. "We

disservice to the community (BOE election that was requested to be changed to April). The cost, the participation would be low, and there was not enough notice given." City IT Tech John Alleman answered questions about the new City computers, "Of the 32 new computers, 16 were put in the Police Department. The other 16 were placed in other departments that had (Windows) XP machines."

Annie Hindenlang, Executive Director Office of Economic and Community Development Perth Amboy Redevelopment Agency answered Silber's question about the Community Organizer's position. "This person would help to get grants for community events and has nothing to do with union or political organizations."

Law Director Quinones-Perez Gives Detailed Report

PERTH AMBOY - 3/21/16 Caucus Meeting - Exasperated by constant questioning of her legal abilities and billing methods, Law Director Quinones-Perez decided to lay everything on the line. She had given the Council Members that were present at the meeting a detailed record on how she bills the City for her services.

.Quinones said, "We get many OPRA requests." She asked City Clerk Elaine Jasko, "How many OPRA requests do we receive a week?"

Jasko responded, "Between 20 and 30."

Councilman Joel Pabon, who was acting as Council President in the absence of Lisa Nanton asked Perez, "Why did you not advise the Mayor when Pelissier's time was up?"

Quinones responded, "It was my mistake, and I apologize for that and also for the residency requirement. Adam (Cruz) worked with Peter Pelissier for 2 weeks. You have to understand - this is a huge corporation (the City). We were doing a lot of litigation and working on a lot of cases. Some of this included: the Sergeant's list and YMCA litigations which I am pleased to say we're at the tail end of that one. I put in 75 hours a week."

Quinones gave each Council Member a memo which was a breakdown of her responsibilities. "I do extra billing for litigation. I will not do anything to lose my license."

On the particular sheet of paper provided by Quinones there were different columns. Quinones stated, "I will be glad to discuss my bills in public if you want."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez had a couple of question about the billing paper supplied by Quinones.

Quinones stated, "The Decotiis firm set up its own number system for different cases which included: the lawyer's responsibilities on each particular case and anyone else who did work on the case.

Gonzalez questioned where it said, "There is a bill for

\$600 for a Caucus Meeting. You are supposed to be working only 18 hours a week."

Quinones responded, "If you want to pay me for work done after my regular hours, then my cost will be triple the amount."

Gonzalez responded back, "I thought that Department Head should go through the B.A. for any questions that they needed answered."

Quinones responded back, "I am also a Department Head. I will not risk losing my license for you, the Council or the Mayor. Your City Code is clear on what is billable. The rate is \$175/hr."

Fernando Gonzalez stated back, "I've talked with the City of Patterson. (on how their City Lawyers do their billing)"

Arlene Qinones-Perez responded back, "Their (Patterson) City Budget is much bigger than ours."

Acting City Council President Joel Pabon said, "The Customer is a Director for Arlene Quinones. I can see how she is breaking the bills down."

Business Administrator came to the defense of Ms. Quinones, "I asked Ms. Quinones for a breakdown of her billing (to present to the Council). No other Director has done this. The memo you are looking at is a 72 hour report and is just an example. She (Quinones) is not charging \$600 for a Caucus Meeting. This is what the cost will be if she had to bill for it."

Council Comments 3/23/16 Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Acting Council President Joel Pabon responded to Residents' questions on how he conducted the meeting.

"In the past, when a Resident asked a question of the Council, they would respond to the Resident right after the question was asked. At this Meeting, all questions posed were answered after the closing of public comments."

Pabon stated, "This change was made because there was a lot of chaos during the last Council Meeting of March 9th."

After Pabon spoke, Councilman Fernando Irizarry read a lengthy statement that was given to him with comments from Council President Lisa Nanton. In the statement she talked about how the Meetings are conducted, the public's right to free speech and the disruptive behavior exhibited by the public. She especially chastised some of the City Employees who displayed unprofessional behavior at the March 9, 2016 Meeting.

After the Meeting, the Amboy Guardian approached Councilman Fernando Irizarry to get a copy of the statement that Nanton wrote and he read. He told the Amboy Guardian that he would make sure that Nanton would send a copy to the paper.

As of yet, no copy of the statement was received.

Irizarry was also concerned about the various potholes in the City. He would like the Business Administrator to have flyers printed up to distribute to local businesses to have the public report any serious potholes.

Irizarry also wanted a bill list from Former City Attorney Mark Blunda for the last few months. "I have been instructed by the last three City Administrators not to contact City Employees."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez wanted a list of all Employee salaries in the budget. "Maybe the last time the sala-

ries were omitted because of union negotiations going on. There also seems to be a discrepancy about vehicles that are ticketed, especially on Gordon Street."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz said, "I'll handle this matter."

Fernando Gonzalez continued with his comments, "A gentleman came here who was paying \$3000 a month to park his vehicles at the Jefferson Street Parking Deck. I believe that this gentleman is no longer paying those fees, and now the vehicles are being parked on the street."

Councilman Bill Petrick addressed the omission of Employee Salaries in the budget. "In the past, Employees names, salaries and titles were listed."

In the absence of Law Director Arlene Quinones-Perez, Attorney Daniel Antonelli answered some of the Council Questions: "In reference to the gentleman who was paying \$3000 a month in the Jefferson Street Parking Deck, you have to look at the terms and conditions of the contract. There may be zoning issues. There can be a grandfather clause. Documentation is needed to see what kind of terms were being used for parking there. You (the Council) are entitled to see the Employees' salaries, even while contract negotiations are going on."

Since this is a major project and Hedberg's home borders one side of that park, he feels that his home is in great danger of being damaged (the foundation).

He stated at the March 9, Council Meeting, "Residents were not notified about construction within 200 feet of their homes. My homeowners insurance will not cover sinkholes. I respect you (the Council) and have had good interactions in the past, but you are not taking my issues seriously."



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On March 28, 1941, off Cape Matapan, Greece, there is a long-range engagement between the British cruisers from Piraeus, Greece, and cruisers of Admiral Iachino's Italian fleet. Suspecting that a large British force may be present, the Italians begin to retreat. In the afternoon, planes from the aircraft carrier HMS Formidable, out of Alexandria, Egypt, find the Italians and attack, damaging the battleship Vittorio Veneto and the cruiser Pola. Veneto is able to continue on at reduced speed, but Pola is dead in the water. In the evening, Adm. Iachino dispatches two cruisers — Zara and Fiume — and four destroyers back to Pola to assist her. Pursuing VENETO, the British fleet spots the three Italian cruisers at night on radar. Approaching unseen in the dark, the British get within close range and begin firing. After a brief gun battle, the three Italian cruisers and two of the destroyers are sunk. In California, Glenn Seaborg's research group shows that newly discovered plutonium is fissionable and can potentially be used as

On March 29, the British fleet gives up chasing the Italian battle-ship Vittorio Veneto and returns to its respective home bases, ending the Battle of Cape Matapan. Over the entire operation, the sum of British casualties is the loss of two aircraft. In East Africa, Lt. Gen. Cunningham's South African troops take Diredawa, Ethiopia, in their advance westward toward Addis Ababa. The local Italian populace appeals to the South Africans for protection, alleging that deserters from the native forces have been committing atrocities.

All German, Italian and Danish ships anchored in U.S. waters on March 30 are taken into "protective custody" by the U.S. government. In North Africa, Lt. Gen. Rommel correctly interprets that British forces are weakly dispersed in locations that are not mutually supportable. Accordingly, he orders his forces forward from El Agheila to Mersa Brega, Libya. In Berlin, Hitler addresses a conference of 250 commanders who will have important assignments in the invasion of the Soviet Union. The German leader tells them that the war in the east is to be conducted unlike any previous operation: commissars and communists are to be treated "with the utmost severity." Expecting the Soviet Union's defeat within a couple of weeks, Der Führer says: "We have only to kick in the door and the whole rotten structure will come crashing down."

Rommel's forces attack the British 2nd Armoured Division on March 31 at Mersa Brega. The British fare the worst in the resulting fierce battle, but are able to stop the German advance.

In Iraq on April 1, a coup led by nationalist politician Rashid Ali al-Gaylani overthrows the regent, Faisal, who escapes to Transjordan. By April 3 a new, anti-British government is installed in Baghdad. In response, the British move troops into Iraq from India and elsewhere in the Middle East to ensure continued access to vital oil supplies. In North Africa, the British pull back from Mersa Brega, abandoning the last defensible position before the open spaces of Libya's Cyrenaica Plateau. In East Africa: Lt. Gen. Platt's forces take Asmara, Eritrea.

The Axis advance in North Africa gains momentum on April 2. Abegabia, Libya, is taken. Rommel's force splits into three columns: two take the main roads to Msus and Mechili, while the third column — Italians and a small German unit under a German commander — are sent along the coast road to Benghazi. In Europe, Hungary's prime minister, Count Pál Teleki, not wishing to collaborate with the Nazis, commits suicide. The country's regent, Adm. Miklós Horthy, and Teleki's replacement, László Bárdossy, continue to work with the Germans.

On April 3, German diplomats depart Belgrade, Yugoslavia, in advance of the coming invasion. In London, the British government severs diplomatic relations with Hungary. Germany activates "Operation Rheinübung": the battleship Bismarck and other German raiders are to attack British shipping in the Atlantic while avoiding engagement with warships, if possible.






