

Pay to Play; Boys & Girls Club; Street Cleaning and the YMCA Take Center Stage

PERTH AMBOY - Planning Board Attorney Joseph A. Marrazzo was a last minute addition to the 4/25/16 Agenda. He was there to talk about the Pay to Play Ordinance. He stated that it's an impediment, and improvements can be made to strengthen it. He was especially concerned how this would impact redevelopment projects. Furthermore he stated, "As it stands now, it prohibits anyone who made a political contribution of \$300 an up for doing a redevelopment project. Your ordinance dates from the 1990's. We looked at Pay to Play Laws from seven different municipalities. Some that he mentioned included: Newark, Woodbridge and Monroe Township. He further stated: This is not a legal issue, but a policy issue. This may further disqualify those who own property in the City."

Council President Lisa Nanton asked, "What year this ordinance was put on the books?"

Marrazzo answered, "It was 2008, but the economy has changed and this is why this issue is being addressed now."

Annie Hindenlang came up to put further input into the discussion. "This ordinance prohibits any contributions. More people want to develop in town and this ordinance is not favorable to those developers who are already in town."

Marrazzo also stated, "Your

Oritz said that would look into this and present some proposals. "I understand there's a lot of activity in that area. We are looking at a one year lease and the Boys and Girls Club are looking at another place to use instead of Brighton Avenue."

After Kenny Ortiz spoke, Tashilee Vasquez MPA. Chief Professional Officer, Boys & Girls Clubs of Perth Amboy came up to speak. She stated the importance of passing the resolutions. "The National affiliation needs to show that we are a true partnership and affiliate with the City so that we can be chartered nationally. The Boys and Girls Club were chartered in this City in 2007. We have serviced over 7000 children in that timeframe. There are 51 children that we serve from the First to Eighth Grades. Some of our programs include job training, recreational, academic, arts, healthy living, etc. We are more than one-stop shop. All of our employees are from Perth Amboy. We lost some of our funding. That's why we stopped using schools and we're looking to go to the Board of Education with some proposals. We still have latch-key kids. We have

Deputy Police Chief Larry Cattano came up to add to this discussion. He stated, "There are statures in place for emergencies for street cleaning."

Irizarry questioned if additional resources would be needed.

Cattano responded back, "We rotate cleaning in different areas of town. We will need additional manpower."

Councilman Bill Petrick added, "Every street will need signage for alternate side of the street parking."

Cattano remarked back, "We may just need to have signs posted."

Councilman Irizarry was adamant about this subject when he stated, "We need every street cleaned once a week and if necessary cars would have to be towed." This was in response to a remark that Petrick had made earlier about having cars towed when the streets were being cleaned.

Law Director Arlene Quinones said, "The ordinance may need to be updated."

Bill Petrick spoke after Quinones' comment, "I'm looking at what the additional cost will be."

Director Frank Hoffman made a couple of observations, "We have a sweeper, but we don't go to the curb. Every street is cleaned at least once a month and the Police have to be present when this is done. We have two large sweepers that will be coming with additional manpower. Police need to be there if cars have to be towed."

Irizarry spoke again and said, "We need to get more streets done. It's not fair. All of us deserve to have cleaner streets. I think the towing is going to be a problem."

Council President Lisa Nanton said, "The problem will be with people not having a place

to park their cars when the streets are being cleaned."

CY2016 Budget. A pubic hearing on Amendments and possible adoption of amended budget was to be held on May 2, 2016 at 4:30 p.m. at City Hall Chambers. Questions were asked about some of the items on the budget data sheet. A copy of the 2016 Municipal Budget was available for the public at the 4/27/16 Council Meeting. During the 4/27/16 Council Meeting CFO and Comptroller Jill Goldy reread the following statement regarding the cap. The first time this statement was read was at the 4/18/16 Budget Hearing.

In New Jersey, budget appropriations are generally subject to a year over year increase of 2%. The calculation of this increase is subject to various exceptions. As well, if an ordinance is passed by the local unit's governing body, the local unit can elect to use a 3.5% cap and may bank the available amount to which appropriations in the adopted budget are under the 3.5% cap. Two years' worth of cap bank are available for use in subsequent years' budgets.

As it historically does, the City elected the 3.5% cap for 2016, not because it excepts to exceed the 2% cap on appropriations but merely to allow for the banking of the higher amount should capacity be needed for either the 2017 or 2018 budgets. In fact, if the 2016 budget is adopted as was introduced, such budget is well within the 2% appropriations cap.

The 2014 cap bank is \$2,406,958.18 and will expire upon adoption of the 2016 budget. The 2015 cap bank is \$1,220,358.53 and will remain available for use in the 2017 budget if needed. The 2016 cap bank, should the 2016 budget be adopted as introduced, would be \$1,076,521.67 and would be available for either the 2017 budget if needed, or could be available for the 2018 budget.



It Doesn't Only Apply to Elevators

The Dominican Festival will go on as scheduled with the location that it has been held for the past 3 years. There were heated discussions both pro and con as to why it should or should not have been held at Wilentz field. The Council voted that it was all systems go.

Suggestions were made on how to improve this years Dominican Festival. Shuttle Service, utilizing public and private parking lots, more security and port o' potties. The hours when entertainment should cease was discussed. It also was determined that the festival organizers did everything that was required under the present ordinance.

City Clerk Elaine Jasko said, "When the new Business Administrator Adam Cruz came aboard, he immediately took charge of some of the problems discussed by the residents who wanted the Festival moved. Cruz was not here when that petition was first presented by those residents."

I'm not surprised at the outcome, because let's face it - it was handled very poorly from the beginning. This issue had been festering for at least 6 months. What surprised me is that the Council Meeting was held in the Council Chambers with a crowd that surpassed the occupancy of the room. There is as sign posted on the doorway before you walk into the Council Chambers. I have been to at least 2 meetings in the past where the meetings had to be relocated because of large attendance. Clearer heads prevailed at these meetings and they were moved to either Olive Street Community Center or McGinnis School.

I thought it was a gentleman's agreement between the Board of Education and the City to make larger spaces available if such incidents would occur. Was that agreement voided? If so, when did this happen? Everyone has a right to go to public meetings and to stay at those meetings until they are adjourned. There had been times when people

have attended meetings with no intention of speaking. After hearing comments (either from the Council, public or administrators) many individuals have decided to speak.

Whose decision is it to call the shots when they see that the Council Chambers will not be sufficient to hold the crowd? Perhaps when they read the Notice of Meeting they should add, "If the occupancy of the room is exceeded then the following have the authority to change the location of the meeting in a reasonable amount of time to accommodate the public. It can be any one of these individuals: the presiding Council President, the Police and Fire Department. I suggest that this be added immediately.

I can't remember if it was the Planning Board or PARA, but at the meeting when the City was deciding whether or not to build King Plaza, there was such a crowd that the first thing spoken by one Board Member was, "There is a such a large crowd here that there is a fire hazard. We must move the meeting to McGinnis School and reconvene in an hour." They voted and the meeting was relocated to McGinnis School. In fact, at that meeting so many people came up to speak, they had to continue the meeting later on in the week. At the beginning of the 4/27/16 Council Meeting, Council President Lisa Nanton asked those who spoke in regards to the resolution on

the Dominican Festival if after they were finished if they could kindly leave to give others who wish to speak on this matter a chance to sit.

This is not right. Everyone who comes to a Council Meeting or any Public Meeting for that matter has a right to stay to hear what others say until the meeting is adjourned (Unless you are extremely disruptive). If there is insufficient space, the meeting should be relocated that night.

It's refreshing to see this amount of people at a public meeting. It's been crowded before. More people should attend public meetings and stay informed.

One woman who sat near me during the meeting came specifically because she wanted to hear about the controversy over the Dominican Festival. Later in the evening, a discussion came up in regards to the YMCA. She became concerned because she uses the Y for her child to attend the afterschool programs. She turned to me and asked me what was going on in regards to the Y. When I gave her a history about the money issues that some people that are concerned about, she said, "Perhaps I should come to more meetings."

If this woman had left the Meeting as requested, she would have never heard about issues going on that affected her. I had no idea the amount of people that were in the corridor (upstairs and downstairs) and outside City Hall until someone told me the next day. Thank God that an emergency had not occurred. Proprietary House Open



Council Has Questions Pertaining to Volatile Resolutions 4/27/16 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - R-204 involving the YMCA - There were concerns about the service agreement.

Resident Ken Balut said, "You are subsidizing a private organization. "How can you make a decision on the Y without an audit? The UEZ gave the Y money. The UEZ money was misused."

R-204 was tabled to the next Council Meeting.

Y CEO Steve Jobin was confused as to why the Council tabled R-204. "We (the YMCA) met with the City in closed session on April 11, 2016. We answered many of the questions presented to us on Monday (4/25/16) at the Caucus Meeting. Now we want our questions answered. What is the status? And why can't we get this Resolution done today?"

Council President Lisa Nanton told Jobin, "The contract has a different language and it will be put on the next Regular Council Meeting."

Council President Nanton, he stated, "It's very disheartening how Balut is spewing lies about the Y. In December of 2008 we occupied in the new location (New Brunswick Avenue) with a 20 year lease and renewable with another 20 year contract. The contract was \$1 million in 2007."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez was concerned when he stated, "The City has paid utilities on that facility and they have been bearing the cost."

The Amboy Guardian contacted Steve Jobin for some clarifications.

Steve Jobin gave a breakdown on the monthly cost (The Y pays the City \$8700 a month). "In April 2011, a lump sum of \$40,000 was paid the City. After that point, we have doubled that payment to \$15,000/mo to help pay on the arrears. This is which is \$140,000 more than the contract calls for."

Gonzalez retorted back with the following statements: "It's running \$28,000 to cover the cost of the Y. Now you'll be paying \$22,000 for a cost of \$34,000 that the utilities alone are costing now. The previous mayor had a poor agreement with the Y. I think the Y should do the original 20 years, then renegotiate. \$12,000 a month for the next 12 years - I have to protect the citizens."

Steve Jobin gave a comparison, "The Little League gets grants and a lot of maintenance of their fields are done by public works besides other free amenities."

Gonzalez gave these parting words, "I appreciate that you are fighting for the Y, but I am fighting for the citizens of Perth Amboy."

The Amboy Guardian requested that Steve Jobin read at the 4/27/16 Council Meeting. He provided us with an outline of the YMCA's contribution to the community. (See Below)

ed to know who is responsible for the cleaning.

Danny Cleaver from the Department of Public Works came up to answer this question, "Once a year, the exterior and interior windows are cleaned for a total of \$8000 a year. This is the contract."

Law Director Quinones also said, "The YMCA can do minor alterations without the City's consent. For any major alterations that they have to do, the Y will send a certified letter to the City which we would have to respond to in 30 days. The Y can also do required alterations and deduct the cost of those alterations from the monthly fee that they owe the City."

Council President Lisa Natnon said she would rather have the YMCA bill us separately for any alternations instead of them deducting that cost from the monthly payments to the City. I want a separation of those two to be made."

CEO Steve Jobin responded to some of the statements made, "Every Perth Amboy family gets a \$120 discount. We are engaging them in a healthier lifestyle. The Fire Department does some of the training there. City Employees get a discounted rate. 85% are family memberships that subsidize at no cost. I'm glad that the Boys and Girls Club is using the Brighton Avenue Community Center. \$8700 is paid on a monthly basis to the City. This is a partnership that was a contract with the City."

As soon as Jobin finished that statement, Gonzalez said, "I haven't seen a true audit."

Jobin stated, "I had sent information to Fehrenbach (Former B.A.) The Runvan Water Shed Property was used for outdoor sports activities. The City sold that property and we need another site for these activities. We can see if we can change the wording in the contract."

After Jobin spoke, Law Director Arlene Ouinones asked the Council, "Let me know what wording would make you more comfortable."

Pallone Applauds Treasury Department Funds to Prevent Foreclosures and Stabilize NJ Housing Market

Press Release 4/20/16 WASHINGTON, DC – Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) applauded the allocation of more than \$45 million through the Hardest Hit Fund to the state of New Jersey to help stabilize the housing market and prevent foreclosures. "I was proud to support the Hardest Hit Fund in Congress and am pleased that these funds are contributing to New Jersey's economy recover,"

said Pallone. "Thousands of New Jersey families suffered greatly during the great recession through no fault of their own and the Hardest Hit Fund will help ensure that more New Jerseyans can stay in their homes. A stable housing market is essential to the American Dream and we need to continue to work to make sure that home ownership is within reach for working families."

The latest funding brings the Hardest Hit Fund total assistance to \$9.6 billion for 18 states and the District of Columbia. 



CTIA & Pallone Announce "Wireless Network Resiliency Cooperative Framework" for Disasters and Emergencies Agreement Meets Wireless Resiliency Provisions in SANDy Act

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06), senior Democrat on the Energy and Commerce Committee, and CTIA, together with wireless providers AT&T, Sprint, T-Mobile, U.S. Cellular and Verizon announced today the "Wireless Network Resiliency Cooperative Framework" [PDF] to share information and advance wireless network resiliency before, during and after disasters and emergencies.

Today's agreement comes after ongoing discussions for five months between Pallone, FCC Chairman Wheeler and CTIA. The discussions began after Pallone introduced the Securing Access to Networks in Disasters Act – or the SANDy Act, which improves the resiliency of the nation's communications networks during disasters and emergencies.

Specifically, the Framework:

ers have access to wireless service during an emergency even if their wireless network goes down."

"I am pleased that CTIA and the wireless providers created a set of common-sense solutions to improve coordination and network recovery during disasters and emergencies. This Framework will benefit consumers and help limit the impact of future disasters, while avoiding unworkable and unnecessary mandates," said CTIA President and CEO Meredith Attwell Baker. "I also commend Representative Pallone and Chairman Wheeler for their leadership, which will help keep Americans safe and connected during the next storm."

"For millions of Americans, mobile devices have become the primary way to communicate. Consumers need confidence that wireless networks will be there when they need them the most," said FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler. "I applaud Rep. Frank Pallone for keeping the spotlight on this issue and the wireless industry for stepping up for the needs of their customers by proposing voluntary solutions aimed at improving reliability when natural disasters and other emergencies strike." During and after Superstorm Sandy there was a major breakdown of telecommunications networks, including cellular and home telephones, television and internet services. This created a dangerous barrier to emergency response and recovery for residents and towns. Pallone's SANDy Act will be voted on by the Energy and Commerce Committee this week.

Most recently, he served for ten years as rector of the Pontifical North American College, the American seminary in Rome. He succeeds Bishop Paul G. Bootkoski, 75, whose resignation from the pastoral care of the Diocese of Metuchen was accepted by Pope Francis on March 8. On Tuesday, the Feast of Saints Philip and James, a Mass of Episcopal Ordination and Installation for Bishopelect Checchio is scheduled for 2 p.m. at the Church of the Sacred Heart, 149 South Plainfield Ave. The worship site was selected for its size. Approximately 1,200 people are expected to attend, including cardinals, bishops, priests, deacons, seminarians, religious brothers and sisters and laity representing each of the 90 parishes of the diocese, Catholic school communities, Catholic Charities, Saint Peter's Healthcare System, and the Catholic Center at Rutgers. Due to limited seating at the Church, attendance is by ticket only.

The Most Reverend John J. Myers, Metropolitan Archbishop of Newark, will serve as the principal consecrator, also referred to as the ordaining bishop, at the Mass.

Co-consecrating bishops will be The Most Reverend Paul G. Bootkoski, who has served as fourth bishop of the Diocese of Metuchen since April 2002, and The Most Reverend Dennis J. Sullivan, who has served as eighth bishop of the Diocese of Camden since Feb. 2013. The homilist will be The Most Reverend Bernard A. Hebda, Apostolic Administrator and Archbishop-designate of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, who will formally be installed May 13. The New Jersey bishops will be joined by Archbishop Carlo Maria Viganò. Apostolic Nuncio to the United States from Oct. 19, 2011, to April 12, 2016, who represents Pope Francis; His Eminence Cardinal Theodore E. McCarrick, Archbishop-Emeritus of Washington, D.C. and the founding Bishop of Metuchen; His Eminence Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan, Archbishop of New York; His Eminence Cardinal Edwin F. O'Brien, Grand Master of the

Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem; His Eminence Cardinal Seán P. O'Malley, Archbishop of Boston; His Eminence Cardinal Roger M. Mahony, Archbishop Emeritus of Los Angeles; His Eminence Cardinal William J. Levada, Prefect Emeritus of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith; and The Most Reverend James Patrick Green, Apostolic Nuncio to Peru.



PERTH AMBOY - On Monday, May 23, the Woodbridge Historical Association will present a film documentary produced by John Kerry Dyke, The British Bombardment of Perth Amboy in 1776, as well as a discussion of the patriots' defense led by Donald Johnstone Peck. This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

Fighting around Tobruk, Libya, continues on May 2, 1941. A large Iraqi ground force attacks the British airfield at Habbaniyah, Iraq, about 55 miles west of Baghdad. The base houses around 80 obsolescent planes, used mainly for training, and has only a small contingent of ground troops for defense. Despite their unsuitability and age, the planes are launched and used against the Iraqis with some success. Several skirmishes occur closer to the Persian Gulf, especially at Basra, where rioting breaks out among the civilian population.

In East Africa on May 3, British Commonwealth forces attack very strong Italian positions at Amba Alagi, Ethiopia. The Italian lines guard mountain passes on the road between the capitals Asmara, Eritrea, and Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. Defenders are dug into many caves on the sides of the steep hills. In North Africa, Australian troops launch a counterattack from Tobruk, Libya, but it is repulsed by Italian forces.

On May 4 Lt. Gen. Rommel halts his attacks on Tobruk and instead lays siege to the city. Both sides adopt a strategy of sending out offensive night patrols to discourage rest. An airfield at Mosul, Iraq, staffed by a small German force, is bombed by the RAF. The base has been supplying the Iraqis with provisions and armaments from Syria with the cooperation of Vichy French authorities in that country. At Amba Alagi, the 29th Indian Division drives the Italians off three hills in the western portion of their positions.

Emperor Haile Selassie returns to his capital, Addis Ababa, taken from the Italians, on May 5. At Amba Alagi, the Italians are being pushed out of the center of their defensive positions. At Tobruk, a Royal Navy destroyer slips into the city's harbor overnight, delivering needed supplies and taking away wounded Allied defenders. Two destroyers will alternate on this mission and, roughly weekly, reinforcements will be brought in and the wounded evacuated.

The British attempt to run a convoy of five transports carrying supplies and tanks to Egypt for use in an offensive in the desert. On May 6, the convoy, code-named "Operation Tiger," passes Gibraltar and is ultimately joined by an escort of two battleships, an aircraft carrier, four cruisers and 13 destroyers. In Iraq, the British consolidate their hold on the Habbaniyah airfield, pushing the Iraqis toward Fallujah, nearer Baghdad. In the U.S., at March Field, a U.S. Army Air Corps base in Riverside, California, actor-comedian Bob Hope puts on his first USO show.

On May 7, the Royal Navy destroyer *HMS Somali* intercepts the German weather trawler *München* off Iceland. Before British sailors can board her, the German crew throws an ultra-secret Enigma signal-coding machine overboard in a weighted bag. However, they do not have time before boarders arrive to destroy operating manuals for the Enigma and code books, all of which will prove invaluable to Allied code-breakers. To deceive the Germans about the operation's success, Somali sends a clear (i.e., uncoded) message that *München* was scuttled by its crew before a boarding party could be sent over. In northern China, the Battle of South Shanxi begins between Japanese and Chinese forces. The fighting ends 20 days later in an overwhelming Japanese victory. Although the Japanese lose over 20,000 troops, the Chinese lose over 100,000.



convoy heading for Egypt but are fended off by British carrier aircraft. In Ethiopia, the fighting continues around Amba Alagi, with Indian troops taking a pass and three small hills south of the city. The British heavy cruiser *HMS Cornwall* finds and sinks the German commerce raider *Pinguin*, an auxiliary cruiser, near the Seychelles, in the Indian Ocean around 930 miles east of Africa. *Pinguin* had captured or sunk 28 Allied ships totaling 136,550 tons during its 357-day voyage.
