

Perth Amboy Selected to Accelerate Water Infrastructure Innovation

Perth Amboy is one of three New Jersey cities selected to receive technical assistance and engineering support services to design innovative, financeable projects that reduce combined sewer outflows (CSOs) while also making neighborhoods and downtowns better places to live, work, and invest.

TRENTON - New Jersey Future today announced that Perth Amboy is one of three cities selected by the Build It Green (BIG) Competition to receive technical assistance and engineering support services. The BIG Competition, launched in partnership with re:focus partners and with the generous support of the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation and Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's New Jersey Health Initiative, will catalyze the design and implementation of an integrated, creative project that will reduce combined sewer overflows (CSOs) in the city while generating multiple local environmental and health benefits. For example, roads can be repaved with porous pavement when installing underground broadband infrastructure to improve the economic prospects of local residents and businesses and simultaneously reduce surface water runoff.

New Jersey's water infrastructure requires massive upgrades statewide, but nowhere is the problem more acute than in those communities with antiquated combined-sewer systems and economically distressed populations. The BIG Competition is an opportunity to empower these communities to design and finance projects that solve multiple problems at once, and that will act as replicable models for the rest of the state, positioning New Jersey as a national leader in implementing innovative approaches.

Perth Amboy will receive cus-

tomized technical assistance to design its CSO solution. It will also receive engineering services (valued at approximately \$17,000) to support the preparation of project implementation funding applications for submission following the BIG technical assistance process.

"Perth Amboy is proactive about environment and urban infrastructure initiatives. Working with the Re:focus team will reinforce these efforts to design a project that protects the Raritan River. These initiatives maintain and aid our local community in its preservation, " said Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda

Gloucester City and Jersey City are the other two awardee cities. An evaluation committee reviewed all applications submitted to the BIG Competition. Committee members included individuals from academic institutions, foundations, privatesector associations, former state and federal government officials and others.

"The Dodge Foundation's ongoing commitment to preserving and strengthening New Jersey's critical environmental assets, including its water, means we are eager to help our cities and towns do all they can to reduce sewer overflows in innovative, cost-effective ways," said Margaret Waldock, director of the foundation's environment programs. "We look forward to taking advantage of the lessons other regions of the country have learned about managing stormwater, and advancing their implementation here."

"It was gratifying to see the enthusiastic new thinking that went into all the BIG Competition applications," said Bob Atkins, director of New Jersey Health Initiatives. "With such a diverse set of cities awarded, these design projects will provide all New Jersey communities with a lesson plan for how they can implement similar initiatives, resulting in reduced stormwater runoff and flooding, leaving communities healthier and waterways cleaner and safer. We are eager to see these projects move from concept to reality."

"For New Jersey's cities, many of which have limited resources, investing in integrated solutions that address multiple challenges will bring the greatest return for both residents and the bottom line," said New Jersey Future Executive Director Peter Kasabach.

"The BIG Competition takes the approach that innovative thinking can lead to sustainable, cost-effective solutions for these large-scale water infrastructure problems - solutions that create exponential health and economic benefits to the communities where they are implemented," said re:focus Chief Executive Officer Shalini Vajihala.


Perth Amboy's Neil Lucey Honored Posthumously

Periodically the Amboy Guardian receives emails from the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Vietnam Era Museum & Educational Center. On May 28, 2016 I was looking at my emails and clearing out some of the old ones. As I was about to discard an email sent on April 28, 2016 from the NJVVMF, something told me to open it up before deleting it.

The second story listed caught my eye when it mentioned that Neil Lucey's 101 year old sister will be receiving a New Jersey Medal for Valor honoring her brother, Neil Lucey posthumously. This ceremony took place on May 7, 2016.

The following is an account of that ceremony that took place in Holdmel.

Sister of WWII Soldier Receives NJ Medal **During Remembrance Day Ceremony**

- 101-Year-old Marie Liston received the medal for her brother, Neil Lucey, who died in the attack on Pearl Harbor. She received this medal at a ceremony which took place at the NJ Vietnam Memorial Annual Remembrance Day Ceremony on May 7, 2016. Marie Liston is the sister of WWII Navy Seaman Neil Lucey who died in the attack on Pearl Harbor, accepted a medal on her brother's behalf. Neil Lucey was just 18 years old when he joined the United States Navy. He reported for duty March 12, 1940. Just 19 months later he would lose his life at Pearl Harbor, two days after his 20th birthday. His body is one of 1.177 entombed in the USS Arizona. Now, 75 years later, Neil's sister will accept a medal on his behalf during a Remembrance Day ceremony at the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation on May 7, 2016. Marie Lucey Liston is 101 and lives in Brick, NJ. She was born in 1914 in New York City and is the oldest of five kids. Her mother died in childbirth in 1924 and the siblings were sent to live with relatives in Perth Amboy. Their father, Timothy Lucey, worked for the railroad and would visit when he could.

The death of Neil, who was nicknamed "Buddy," was hard on the family. The first communication from the US Navy came on December 20, 1941, and informed the family that Neil was missing in action while the search for survivors at Pearl Harbor continued. The official death notice came on January 30, 1942 when it was determined that Neil had been one of those lost on the USS Arizona on December 7, 1941 after the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor.

He was awarded a Purple Heart posthumously for his valiant service as a Seaman First Class with the Navy. Neil was the first person killed in action from Perth Amboy in WWII. The City dedicated a park in his name and the park was renovated and rededicated in 2000. Gordon Pingicer is on the board of the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation, and is Marie's son-in-law. "This medal means so much to the family," Gordon said. "Just the recognition that New Jersey gives to people who served is very significant." Remembrance Day was created by legislation in 1991 as a day in New Jersey to honor those who served in the military during the Vietnam War from 1959 to 1975. More than 200,000 New Jersey residents served in the armed forces during that time.

Proposed Gun Legislation A recent letter in a daily

Union Proposes **Progressive** Solution, While **Board Would** Increase

Insurance Costs

PERTH AMBOY - Longstalled negotiations on an expired contract for educators hit a further snag as the Perth Amboy Board of Education filed for impasse, rejecting a union proposal to structure health insurance costs so lower paid workers would not pay as much. "When increased health insurance costs were implemented, they were progressive," said union president Patricia Paradiso, a third-grade teacher. "The union wants to see a decrease in health insurance costs for everyone," she

"All we want is a fair contract for hard-working Perth Amboy educators, who work with students in the schools every day," said Paradiso. "It is hypocritical that a well compensated administrator like the superintendent is paying 1.5 percent of his two hundredthousand dollar salary for coverage while a teacher making a third of that pays significantly

The money is available in the district according to Paradiso. She said the district just created four new top-level administrative positions allocating more than a half-million dollar in salaries, for personnel who will never see the inside of a classroom. "How much are these new administrative hires paying for health insurance while the costs for lowest-paid educators in the district continue to climb?" she asked.

Paradiso decried the board's move to impasse and called for a return to the bargaining table. She said the union has been active with pickets and protests outside of schools and parents are expressing solidarity with the students' teachers and school personnel. "Our members have great relationships with the community and many parents have signed on to our petition calling on the board to bargain a fair deal."

The Perth Amboy Federation - American Federation of Teachers represents more than 1,400 teachers, paraprofessionals and school-related personnel.

Curfew for Minors Established and Exceptions

Press Release

PERTH AMBOY - Curfew for minors established and exceptions.

A. Time limits. (1) It shall be unlawful for any persons twelve (12) or fewer years of age [under thirteen (13)] to be or remain in or upon the streets within the City of Perth Amboy at night during the period beginning at 10:00 p.m. and ending at 6:00 a.m., except that the curfew shall commence at 11:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday nights.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any person sixteen (16) or fewer years of age [under seventeen (17)] to be or remain in or upon the streets within the City of Perth Amboy at night during the period beginning at 11:00 p.m. and ending at 6:00 a.m., except that the curfew shall commence at 12:00 midnight on Friday and Saturday nights.

B. Exceptions. In the following exceptional cases, a minor on a city street during the hours for which Subsection A is intended to provide the maximum limits or regulation (and a clear general guide for minors. their parents and their fellow citizens) shall not, however, be considered in violation of this chapter: (1) When accompanied by a parent of such minor. (2) When accompanied by an adult authorized by a parent of such minor to take said parent's place in accompanying said minor for a designated period of time and purpose within a specified area. (3) When exercising First Amendment rights protected by the United States Constitution, such as the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech and the right of assembly, which includes but is not limited to school, church and social activities. Such minor shall evidence the bona fides of such exercise by having in his possession a written communication, signed by such minor and countersigned, if practicable, by a parent of such minor with their home address and telephone number, specifying when, where and in what manner said minor will be on the streets at night (during hours when this chapter is otherwise applicable to said minor) in the exercise of a First Amendment right specified in such communication. (4) When the minor is no more than fifty (50) feet from the minor's place of residence. (5) When the minor carries an employment certificate or work permit, pursuant to state law, and is en route to or from employment.







Willow Pond Park Project Presentation 5/23/16 Caucus Meeting

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – There was a presentation at the 5/23/16 Caucus on the Willow Pond Synthetic Turf Field Construction. The presentation was made by Joseph D. Perello, LLA, ASLA, PP Principal Vice President of Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc.

"The City of Perth Amboy wanted us to design a synthetic turf field. One field will be striped for football and soccer (other fields for baseball). The Project will include a state of the art field that is the same synthetic turf used by colleges and universities. NJIT uses this turf. It will have a drainage and collection system. We've received excellent bids. The original savings was \$60,000; the total savings is \$86,662. We've received excellent bids from certified turf installers."

Councilman Bill Petrick asked, "The bid includes the turf?"

Perello answered, "The total price is \$745,000. That's \$86,662 less than the lowest priced bid."

Petrick then asked, "What sort of materials are in a synthetic turf field?"

Perello answered, "Synthetic turf is built with sand. With the bid is included a groomer and a scraper. It's recommended to groom the field around 4 times a year or every 4 to 6 weeks if it is heavily used."

Council President Lisa Nan-

ton had concerns about fencing.

"A concrete edge/walkway and a 4 foot chain-link fence on the end," Perello said. "We also have a sweeper. The chain-link fence is also to keep spectators off the field. We also have a pipe for drainage. There are existing pipes on the east and west. All of this is going to be addressed. Natural grass drains (over a course of time). Synthetic turf drains right way. You don't have rainouts unless it rains very hard. Nowm there's a drain underneath (the turf)."

Councilman Joel Pabon wanted to know how safe the synthetic turf is.

"The infield is standard recycled rubber. For more information on synthetic turf go http://www.syntheticturfcouncil.org/ for FAQ. Nobody is getting sick or have cancer from it. I am referring to studies that have been done. There are different types of infields, some of which are more money. You don't need anything so expensive even on synthetic turf. It's not like the old astroturf which went out of business. Now the field feels like grass. It has give; it can turn and cut. You don't have issues like before when you were playing on a carpet (astroturf). This is top of the line synthetic turf. It has the highest ware and durability. We research the work. This is the latest product," said Perello.

Nanton asked, "What is the life span (of synthetic turf)?"

"I've had seen it last 17-18 years. We warrantee the turf for 8 years, but like a car, do you need to replace it just because the warranty runs out? I recommend every 10-12 years. You will just have to replace the turf. When you replace it, (just the turf), it costs much less. It costs \$292,000 to for the turf and installation."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz stated, "We should consider thinking outside of the box. You can have a great field and after 2 years it needs repairs."

Pabon added, "A the end of the day – who is going to be watching? Who do we go to?"

"You go to me to make sure stuff is going to get done," B.A. Cruz stated.

"You are getting the same product as the NFL," Perello

Councilman Fernando Irizarry said, "The product may be fine. What concerns me is the construction."

Perillo reassured Irizarry, "We will have biweekly meetings with the contractors. There is no flaw in the design."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez asked, "When will it be completed?"

"90 calendar days from the notice to pursue," Perillo answered.

Waterfront Improvements

Beach Showers Questioned; Clean Communities Act; Litter Education 5/23/16 Caucus

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – Councilman Fernando Irizarry questioned the proposed installation of showers on Waterfront beaches. "All this is going to do is to encourage people to swim. There are people who don't follow signs. I don't see why we are putting this in the design. Next, the City will be recommending putting lifeguards on the beach."

Annie Hindenlang - Executive Director Office of Economic and Community Development Perth Amboy Redevelopment Agency who was in the audience came up to speak, "It is to be provided for volleyball (on the Waterfront) – not swimmers."

"People are going to go swimming," Irizarry insisted.

"The shower has been in the works for a number of years," Councilman Bill Petrick stated.

"One of the reasons there is no swimming is the condition of the water," Council President Lisa Nanton stated.

Hindenlang then added, "There will be totally new tennis courts where the old ones are and rest-rooms, the kind that can be moved if another storm comes along like Sandy."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry asked about R-250 Authorizing the insertion of revenue in the CY2016 Budget pursuant to NJSA 40A:4-87 (Chapter 159, P.L. 1948) for a Clean Communities Grant in the amount of \$77,475.18 from the State of

New Jersey.

Irizarry asked, "What are these excess funds for?"

Recycling and Clean Communities Coordinator Geri Barcheski answered, "The money is used for Ambassadors. 3-4 Ambassadors are employed for the season - while it's still warm enough (to around October). All non-profits can apply for \$500 for their organization. All they need to do is clean for 3 hours and have at least 25+ people participating in the cleanup. This teaches children to clean. We supply the bags for cleaners. Part of the grant money goes to environmental education. We try to get to every elementary school. In other programs we outreach to the community."

Council President Lisa Nanton said, "In England, they have trash receptacles that are in shapes of frogs or puppies. They are near ice cream shops or fast food restaurants."

Barcheski answered, "I think that's an excellent concept. We've made great pushes to get receptacles in front of every bodega. In the beginning, it's a learning process and a learning curve. It doesn't happen overnight. You must educate and teach. They're starting to get it. Most litter is recyclable: plastic, cans, etc. The overall recycling tonnage has increased from 40,000 tons to 170,000 tons. That's quite an improvement. The Litter Critter makes his appearance as much as possible."

Pay to Play: Campaign Contributions from Developers Addressed 5/23/16 Caucus Meeting

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – Ordinance #2 on the 5/23/16 Agenda: An ordinance to adopting an amendment of Article II of Chapter 98 of the Code of the City of Perth Amboy. Re: Public Contracting.

Council President Lisa Nanton's main concerns were how the ordinance was explained to the Council. "Any developer who contributes to a campaign can never develop in Perth Ambov."

B.A. Adam Cruz explained, "You can't separate contracts if you contribute - if you give one single dollar (to a political campaign)."

"This is how it reads now?" Nanton asked.

Andrew M. Brewer from the Maraziti LLP law firm who was present at the meeting came forward to speak about the Pay to Play Ordinance, "For Pay to Play in 2008 you if you contributed or gave anything you can't develop in that municipality for a 12 month period. It's pretty standard. That I've never heard of (not being able to develop in a town forever). There always is a defined period of time. Right now there is only a City Ordinance for your contractors. The

proposed ordinance is for less than \$300. Theoretically there is a certain aggregate you can give. You don't have to file for contributions under \$300 – not in an election report. The time period is a judgement call. The time frame is 12 months standard. When you give money, you influence officials."

Councilman Bill Petrick asked, "Is there a blanket policy for the City? Can there be one pay to play?"

The attorney answered, "The city I dealt with, there was more pay to play with developers."

Petrick asked, "Does it cover all of the City?"

"Separate from the City," answered Brewer.

Petrick continued, "I didn't look at a time period to appear to be the same?"

"Is the City the same as the State which generally has a \$300 threshold?" Council President Nanton asked.

The attorney continued, "In Perth Amboy, if you give \$1 towards a political campaign you qualify."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry added, "It's a little vague." (when referencing interim contractors). Once you start talking about it, you can't contribute

anything."

Law Director Arlene Quinones Perez said, "When contractors come, is this the language you want to keep?"

Councilman Fernando Irizarry demanded to know, "Can they or can't they? I'm asking for clarification."

"They can contribute under \$300. A lot of Pay to Play Ordinances have an allowable contribution. \$300 is a blanket," Brewer answered.

"This is the current law that's the amended?" Nanton wanted to be certain.

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez said, 'This is the First Reading. By the Second Reading, we should get this cleared up."


During the Public Portion, Resident Ken Balut spoke about the Pay to Play Contract. "It's the same law firm on PARA. We're going to have money and reduce the deficit. Eliminate the Pay to Play contract. Politicians go to jail all the time. It's got to stop. How many lawsuits are there in the Police Department? You've got to do something. You should rule on this for your own benefit. The Administration did that. One of the Mayor's Staff - is he going to benefit from the

Dominican Festival? It really has to change – The Mayor is Acting Police Director. Lawsuits are coming down."

Resident Alan Silber came up to speak. "Pay to Play is not on the agenda. (questioning the presence of the lawyer in the audience) Ali Rada made a \$15,600 contribution to the Mayor (in 2012). He is redeveloping a project right now. In August 4, 2015 PARA Meeting, the Chair of PARA (Mayor Wilda Diaz) recused herself along with Joel Pabon (a member of PARA at the time who also received campaign contributions from Ali Rada) citing poten-

tial conflict of interest. There are lists of proposals made by George Otlowski (who was representing Ali Rada who is developing 44 units of apartments 418 Washington St.). At the August 4, 2015 PARA Meeting, Rada requested 15 parking spaces in the hospital parking deck and 12 spaced from the **Public Safety Complex parking** lot. The City was working out for 12 spaces already. When the Mayor came up, and said what I said was all twisted. Since that ordinance was passed on November 9, 2015, not one person applied for those spaces."

National Days of Remembrance 2016 for Victims of the Holocaust

By: Carolyn Maxwell PERTH AMBOY - The National Day of Remembrance was held on Wednesday, May 18, 2016. It started with a brief ceremony at 6 p.m. at City Hall Circle culminating in the raising of the Israeli flag. Rabbi Ari Saks of Beth Mordecai Synagogue, 226 High Street spoke of the love of Israel and the United States and the special bond between the two countries. He looked lovingly at his son whom he held in his arms when speaking. He knows that his son represents the future of those who will carry on the traditions of what Israel represents as a peace loving nation.

Prior to the Flag Raising, remarks were made by the Mayor and Hershel Chomsky. Chaim Meir Erps sang a traditional Israeli song. Raising the flag with Rabbi Saks were Mayor Wilda Diaz, Hershel Chomsky.

Just as the flag raising was concluded, special guest speaker Dr. Mosche (Maurice) Katz along with his family appeared and was warmly greeted by the Mayor, Chomsky, Rabbi Saks and others in attendance.

The ceremony continued in the City Council Chambers. Chomsky welcomed all who attended and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Msgr. John Gordon read the invocation followed by the Mayor's opening remarks and a presentation of a proclamation to Dr. Katz.

Candles that were on the bannister were lit by Dr. Katz, Mayor Diaz, Msgr. Gordon, Councilman Bill Petrick and Fernando Irizarry. Students, friends and relatives of Dr. Katz.

Mayor Diaz asked for a moment of silence in memory of those who perished in the Holocaust. A prayer for the victims of the Holocaust and Israel's national anthem was sung.

Dr. Katz presented signed copies of his book, "9 out of 10" to Mayor Diaz and Hershel Chomsky.

Before Dr. Katz came up to speak, Chomsky made a couple of comments: "We need to remember every day." He mentioned the 200 + missing girls in Nigeria. "They were missing 2 years ago today and then it was forgotten. One of the girls was found today. Hatred is still happening today."

With that Chomsky related something that happened to him a couple of months ago. Chomsky who works in the Perth Amboy Public Library said he approached some people who were eating in the library and told them there was no eating allowed. "As I turned my back to leave, I heard one of them say, "Is it because the food is not Kosher?" "Yes, I was hurt, but I'm glad that we live in this country.

Chomsky also explained the significance of the 12 candles that will be lit. "6 of the candles signifies the 6 million

Jews that were killed and the other 6 candles represent an additional Non-Jewish People who also were believed to have been killed in the Holocaust."

Mayor Diaz made comments after Chomsky. She welcomed all to Perth Amboy's Historic City Hall, "The United States Congress designated a National Day of Remembrance. It's important to listen to the words of Holocaust survivors. We can't sit back and see any person persecuted. We can't tolerate this. We need to be a voice." Addressing the students in attendance, Diaz said, "You can take this back to your student body and share what you heard today to them." She thanked Herschel for putting this program together and said, "It's a true honor to have Dr. Katz here with his beautiful wife."

When Dr. Katz came up to speak, he was overwhelmed and grateful that he was able to speak to such a warm and receptive audience. Dr. Katz stated, "I've been doing this (Telling his personal story) for over 30 years. I have never had a reception like this. It' over 70 years that this tragedy happened. I may not remember everything that happened, but most of the things I tell you are 100% true. There were 10 of us children, but 9 of us survived." (One if the books authored by Dr. Katz is titled Nine out of Ten which told the story of how nine out of ten of his brothers and sisters including himself survived the Holocaust." He was grateful that many Jewish people were helped by several Gentile families out of the goodness of their hearts. "No money was

ever exchanged. One of these



families was a Mrs. Margaret Poli and her husband who risked their lives to save my brother and I. They had love and kindness in their hearts to save others. Around 1942/43 the Jews lost their rights. Those who came to Perth Ambov were helped by Dr. Toth who defended the Jewish people. In March 1944, the German Army marched into our town and imposed a curfew on the Jews. We were not allowed on the streets from 9 p.m. to 9 a.m. Then that was changed to 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., but we never gave up hope. Toth smuggled over some of my brothers and sisters. Before coming to the United States, the Gentile people that I lived with had rented one of their rooms to a Nazi nurse. In April 1944, they had to hide me in the attic where there was little comfort. The nurse who was renting out the room was told not to come back. She was OK with that because she owed one month of back rent. Thanks to them and 5 other families and the help of

I knew that he was in the army, but didn't realize it was the Vietnam Era where he was stationed in Germany. After serving 22 months, he received an honorable discharge. The army taught him a lot and gave him a lot of advantages. He was the type of person that took advantage of everything the army offered him, especially when it came to education.

I knew he spoke at least 2 languages, but was surprised to hear he was fluent in 5. Tyrone was also very fortunate as a Veteran, that whenever he needed medical services, he was attended to immediately. It's just very shocking today when you hear it's just the opposite, with some Veterans waiting so long for treatment, many dying before receiving much needed treatment.

Tyrone said he wanted to write a long letter to let the politicians know this should not go on. Every Veteran should be at the top of the list and be treated immediately.

Tyrone and I had our ups and downs. When he was surrounded by family or friends (such as at reunions he was always full of joy and happiness.

He joins his oldest siblings: Bennie, Franklin and Jeanette along with his father, Ben Franklin Nelson, his mother, Essie Nelson Maxwell and stepfather, Rockwell Maxwell in heaven.

Other survivors include his son, David Williams, granddaughter Laquisha Mills, great granddaughter, Aubree Mills, sisters: Joan and Brenda (Willingboro), myself (Carolyn) and Audrey (Perth Amboy), Renna (Ralph, Somerset) and brother, Rocky Jr. (Woodbridge), special nephew Lance Nelson (Felicia) of Perth Amboy. and several nieces, nephews, friends and cousins. 



God, we were able to survive. My sisters wore crosses. The German Soldiers had the men pull down their pants to see if they were circumcised. If they were, they would be targeted to be killed. One of Hitler's Generals defied him because he didn't want to kill any civilians. Hitler had that General demoted and then jailed."

Katz proudly stated he was an honor student in geography. "I gave my teacher a compliment and she really appreciated it. Today, the children tell their parents what to do."

He related that a child will tell a parent I want to do this or go here because that's where my friends are going. Katz emphatically stated, "The worst thing in America is better than the best thing there is in Russia. In Russia, they will not give you your birth certificate if you needed it to go to America. This Country (USA) is the best in the world, and I owe everything to it. Don't underestimate the kindness of Gentiles. Some people were offered 5 lbs. of sugar (which was in high demand) to turn over Jews. In Budapest, Hungary I saw them shoot and tie up children and then throw them in the water. I would take in another person and risk my life to save them. Everyone is God's children."

One of the questions asked of Dr. Katz was, "How did you meet your beautiful wife?"

"My first wife died 20 years ago but I was introduced to my current wife by a mutual friend. Before I married her, it had to be with my children's approval. I came to America because that's where my older brother decided to go. When my brother found work in this country, my brother had 20 Germans who worked under him and he was never mistreated by them. Anyone who worked in the supermarket was exempt from the army. Growing up in a Christian home, I had to pretend to be a Christian. During that time, we had no idea of the harsh treatment that others were receiving. 5 of my relatives ended up in Auschwitz but survived. 6 of 7 family members were burned

At one point when he was talking, someone in the audience offered a chair to sit in,

but Dr. Katz refused saying, "When I talk to ladies and gentlemen, I stand because it shows respect."

Someone asked a question as to how he held onto his faith during those difficult years. Katz related what transpired when he said goodbye to his mother and father. His mother told him, "Remember there is God, and I will also pray for you. When I was younger, I always saw my mom work hard every day. We had an icebox but some food would spoil. My Mother was overworked. I made a deal with God: if I survived I will make a school for both girls and boys and I've done so in America. There are many people who didn't believe that the Holocaust happened. It was only after 1962 that people started to believe that the Holocaust existed. I never knew during the time of the Holocaust where my other brothers and sisters were placed. The Gentile families who helped my brothers and sisters knew each other. This is how we were able to reunite after the liberation of the camps."

"One of my brothers was so emaciated that I did not recognize him. I had been feeding someone and it turned out to be him. If it was not brought to my attention to someone who was

withe me, I would not have guessed it was him."

Dr. Robert Lichtenstein who is a nephew of Dr. Katz was very grateful that his Uncle wrote this book to tell how others helped his Uncle and others survive this terrible tragedy.

There was also a special appearance and a musical interlude performed by Chaim Meir Erps who is the grandchild of a Holocaust Survivor.

The Benediction was given by Shabsi Ganzweig from the Perth Amboy Chaplain Corps.

Chaim Meir Erps led the singing of God Bless America.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On May 30, 1941, the main British force in Iraq is stalled at Ur and the small British force from Habbaniyah is only slowly making its way toward Baghdad. Despite this, Iraqi leader Rashid Ali al-Gaylani gives up the fight, abandons the country and flees to Iran.

The next day, May 31, British troops complete the re-occupation of Iraq. The Hashemite monarchy is restored, with Prince 'Abd al-Ilah to serve as regent for King Faisal II, a minor. An armistice is signed between the countries, confirming Great Britain's right to station troops in Iraq. Over the British Isles, a Luftwaffe flight en route to bomb Bristol and Liverpool, England, gets lost and mistakenly bombs Dublin, in neutral Ireland, killing 29 and seriously injuring 87. In Belgium, expropriation of Jewish property begins.

In Greece on June 1, German forces complete their takeover of Crete. The Luftwaffe sinks the light cruiser *HMS Calcutta* off Alexandria, Egypt. In Iraq, British troops enter Baghdad. In the North Atlantic, the U.S. Coast Guard begins patrolling the southern coastline of Greenland. In the Middle East, Air Marshal Arthur Tedder takes command of the RAF Middle East Command, responsible for operations in the Mediterranean and North Africa. In the United Kingdom, the rationing of clothing is imposed. In Germany, all Catholic publications are banned by the Nazis.

On June 2, Hitler and Mussolini meet at the Brenner Pass, on the Italian-Austrian border. Despite spending five hours together, Der Führer never tells Il Duce about his plans to invade the Soviet Union. On Crete, German Gen. Kurt Student orders his paratroopers to massacre the male residents of several villages in reprisal for civilian participation in the recent fighting on the island. Around 112 men are summarily executed by firing squads. Vichy France grants the Axis powers permission to use the port of Bizerte, Tunisia, for the unloading of non-military supplies for their forces in North Africa. In the U.S., Baseball Hall of Famer Lou Gehrig — "The Iron Horse" of the New York Yankees — dies of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (to become widely known as Lou Gehrig's Disease) at the age of 37.

British forces enter Mosul, Iraq, on June 3, capturing a few German pilots they find there. (The Germans, supporting the Iraqi anti-British coup, had established an airbase in Mosul for flying in supplies for Rashid Ali's forces.) On Crete, German occupation troops enter the village of Kandanos, kill 180 of the residents, slaughter all the animals and then burn all houses and barns to the ground. They erect signs in German and Greek on each road entering the village: "Here stood Kandanos, destroyed in retribution for the ambush murder of 25 German soldiers by armed men and women . . ." Finland's military command gives the German High Command permission to use northern Finland as a staging area for the attack on the Soviet Union.

British Intelligence on June 4 intercepts and decodes a message sent to Tokyo by the Japanese ambassador in Berlin. The communication includes details of the German plan to invade the Soviet Union. Inexplicably, the message is not forwarded to the British Cabinet's Joint Intelligence Committee for eight days. President Roosevelt transfers overall command of U.S. Coast Guard ocean-going cutters to the Navy.

On June 5, the Japanese conduct a three-hour bombing raid of the provincial capital of Chungking, China. Over 4,000 residents are asphyxiated in a tunnel in which they have taken shelter. On the outskirts of Belgrade, Serbia, an ammunition dump explodes, killing 2,500 and injuring another 4,500. In the Middle East, Vichy French planes bomb Amman, the capital of Transjordan.
