Pallone's SANDy Act Introduced in the Senate Legislation will help Improve Communications during Disasters

Press Release 5/27/16 WASHINGTON, DC – Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) applauded the introduction of the Securing Access to Networks in Disasters Act – or the SANDy Act- in the Senate by U.S. Senators Maria Cantwell (D-WA), Cory Booker (D-NJ), and Charles Schumer (D-NY). Earlier this week the SANDy Act passed the House of Representatives by a vote of 389-2. Pallone, the top Democrat on the House Energy and Commerce Committee, introduced the legislation last year to help ensure the resiliency of the nation's communications networks during emergencies.

"I want to thank Senators Cantwell, Booker and Schumer for their leadership in introducing the SANDy Act and taking another step towards helping first responders, businesses and private citizens communicate during disasters," said Pallone. "In New Jersey, we learned firsthand during Hurricane Sandy the

importance of communications during an emergency. We must do everything we can to be better prepared for the next time disaster strikes"

The SANDy act would make sure all communication providers-radio, TV, and phone—can fix outages faster, even across state lines. It would also begin a process to provide 911 services over Wi-Fi hotspots during emergencies. Pallone spoke on the House floor urging passage of the bill this week.

South Amboy Remembers Hugh Riley Rone and Jesse Flynn

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - South Amboy's city council mourned the loss of two young residents during last Wednesday's business meeting.

Hugh Riley Rone, 19, and Jesse Flynn, 22, both tragically passed away in consecutive days. Flynn passed away of a heroin overdose on May 30th, and Rone was involved in a motorcycle accident on the Garden State Parkway on May

"I can't imagine what [the families] are going through at this point," Mayor Fred Henry added. "We have to keep the parents in mind and keep them in our prayers."

"These two young men passed it's too much." away under two very different circumstances but both were tragedies," Business Administrator Camille Tooker added.

Rone, a lifelong resident of South Amboy, graduated from South Amboy High School in 2015 where he played varsity soccer, baseball, and basketball. He worked at The Gundrum Service "Home for Funerals", his family's business located in South Amboy, and was a communicant of St. Mary's R.C.

"It's no secret I'm quite friendly with the Rone family and this one hurts...It really does," Council President Mickey Gross said. "Riley was a great kid."

Flynn graduated from South

Amboy High School in 2012 and worked as an installer at his family's business Petra Overhead Door Co. He leaves

behind his eight month old daughter Charlee as well as his mother, father, and brother. Flynn's longtime battle with

addiction adds to the growing drug problem in New Jersey. The state has witnessed an increasing number of deaths caused by drugs, and the city of South Amboy is committed to coming up with a solution.

"I'd like to go on record as saying as a city I think that we should start to really try to do anything we can," Tooker said. "I don't know what the answer is with these heroin deaths but

"It's not only us, it's all over the country," she added. "I know it seems every decade has their drug of choice...this just seems to be hitting across the board no matter what your age is...We are losing too many good people."

"About a year ago myself and councilwoman Dato had a meeting about the issue in town here and it's serious," President Gross added. "Not just in South Amboy but all over. I am totally committed to do whatever we can do to save one life."

Donald Applegate and Christine Noble were not in attendance for the business meeting. The next city council meeting will be held on June 15th at 7

Vitale-Gill Legislation **Establishing** Standards for **Tiered Network Health Benefits Plans Advances**

TRENTON - Legislation sponsored by Senator Joseph F. Vitale and Senator Nia H. Gill that would establish certain standards for health benefits plans with a tiered network cleared the Senate Commerce Committee today.

The bill (S-296) would specify that a carrier must clearly state on its website and in plan documents supplied to subscribers the cost sharing differences for a covered person in various tiers of a health benefits plan with a tiered network. Additionally, under the bill, variations in cost sharing among provider tiers would have to be reasonable in relation to the premium charged for the plan.

"Cost-prohibitive practices have no place in our health care system, especially in emergency situations, when consumers are most vulnerable," said Senator Vitale (D-Middlesex). "Ensuring transparency by requiring carriers to disclose cost sharing



*Continued From Page 1 information on their websites is crucial to protecting consumers in New Jersey."

"Providing clear and direct access to information on costs within various levels of a tiered network health plan for consumers ensures that the tiered networks are created in a way that protects patients against exorbitant cost sharing," added Senator Gill (D-Essex, Passaic).

The bill defines a tiered network as a managed care plan provider network with more than one level or tier of in-network benefits, based on different levels of cost sharing accepted by the health care providers in that network. It also defines carriers to include an insurance company, health service corporation, hospital service corporation, medical service corporation, or health maintenance organization authorized to issue health benefits plans in this State, the State Health Benefits Commission and the School Employees' Health Benefits Commission.

The legislation is part of a three-bill package sponsored by Senators Gill and Vitale. Two additional bills, S634 and S635, would ensure transparency in tiered networks and guarantee that consumers that purchase tiered network plans understand the health care benefits they will receive. The bills establish a framework for carriers, providers and the state to work together to protect consumers and guarantee that patients receive the best quality and most costeffective care.

S-296 was released from the Senate Commerce Committee by a vote of 6-0. It next heads to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee for consideration.

These women were given Veteran Status and allowed for their ashes to be buried in Arlington National Cemetery. Unfortunately, that ruling was recently overturned and so were their benefits.

My Side of the Story

The City Clerk, Elaine Jasko and members of the Perth Amboy Council have fraudulently attempted to remove myself from the Perth Amboy Zoning Board. The City Clerk as stated by the Municipal Attorney Arlene Quinones Perez was the Sponsor of a Resolution slated to remove Ms. Batista from the Zoning Board which is not permitted by the Charter of the City of Perth Amboy. Ms. Batista was never directly mailed any official letter from the State of New Jersey informing her of any fines, actions or hearings pending against her. Ms. Batista is presently involved in a Federal Lawsuit against the Mayor and the City of Perth Amboy. It appears that the City Clerk has committed fraud by inventing her own rules in retaliation against Ms. Batista. Ms. Batista was single out by the City Clerk in this matter which is clearly grounds for a civil lawsuit based on "Disparate Treatment" which is a violation of Federal Civil Rights Act. The City of Perth Amboy's actions are unethical and fraudulent. Ms. Batista will be filing Ethics Violations against the City Clerk, the Mayor and City Council Members for fraud and acting outside of the authority and preparing false documents and statements. Ms. Batista will also be filing Ethics Violations against the City Attorney Arlene Quinones Perez with the New Jersey Office of Attorney Ethics. The Resolution is fraudulent and will be appealed if not immediately withdrawn. All matters will be appealed. Ms. Batista addressed all of these matters at the May 23, 2016 City Caucus Meeting and awaited further commits from the parties at the Council Meeting concerning the City Clerks fraud. The City Attorney Ms. Arlene Quinones Perez and the City Clerk, Elaine Jasko were notable absent at the May 25, 2016 Council Meeting and gave no further comments on their actions. It should also be noted that the City Council did not follow their usual protocol and read the Resolution out loud to remove me. It is still unethical because it appeared in writing on the Agenda.

The Mayor, Police Director and other City Officials are alleged of further fraud in a Federal Lawsuit. Ms. Batista hereby demands that the City Clerk, Elaine Jasko, the City Attorney Arlene Quinoas Perez, Esq. and the City Council member resign from the positions immediately. All Resolutions must be posted and published in the newspaper under the Public Notices section by the City Clerk's Office. The Resolution being recited in the newspaper by a news reporter does meet the legal requirements of public notice. 

The four candidates understand the need for new, motivated, and resourceful leadership. The current leadership has its methods mired in the past and this will stop. New ideas and methods will be adapted. The statement that "we've always done it that way" will no longer be operative. SANDY HOOK - Sandy Hook / Highlands History: Originally discovered by the famous Sea Captain Henry Hudson in the early 1600's, Sandy Hook was a beautiful, 1,665 - acre barrier peninsula within view of the Manhattan skyline.

Now, this picturesque 2,044 acre barrier beach peninsula located on the northern tip of the New Jersey shore offers a variety of environmental, historical, and recreational resources. Featuring 7 miles of ocean beaches and sand dunes, salt and freshwater marshes, hiking and biking trails and 264 acres of maritime forest, Sandy Hook is rich in ecological diversity. Historic sites include the Sandy Hook Lighthouse, the oldest surviving lighthouse in the United States. Birding, hiking, wind surfing, fishing and exploring the park's natural and cultural resources are available year

April 1 - October 31: The park is open from 5 a.m.- 10 p.m. daily, except by permit or as noted below. Through the summer of 2015, there is a \$15 charge per day for beach parking from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. Parking at Fort Hancock is always free.

November 1 - March 31: The park is open from 5 a.m. - 8 p.m. daily, except by permit. All navigable marine waters within the park boundary are open 24 hours. Visitor centers and contact stations - open every day EXCEPT Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day (Dec. 25) and New Year's Day (Jan. 1). Sandy Hook Lighthouse and Lighthouse Keepers Quarters / Visitor Center

Lighthouse Tours: Offered first come, first served, from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Children must be at least 48 inches tall to climb the tower. A video in the adjacent barn is always open.

Lighthouse Keepers Quarters/ Visitor Center: Open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. Rangers are available to answer questions, discuss the natural and cultural resources of the park and sell Senior/Access passes. Interpretive exhibits and a gift shop are available. The visitor center phone number is 732-872-5970.

Group Tours of the Sandy Hook Lighthouse: Reservations must be made prior to the group's visit to the lighthouse. Reservations must be made three weeks in advance of the requested tour date. Can I bring my pet to Sandy Hook? - Pets and their owners may visit bayside beaches throughout the year. Pets can visit oceanside beaches from Labor Day through mid-March only. Pets are not permitted on oceanside beaches during the spring and summer because that is when the threatened piping plover builds nests in those locations. Pets must always be on a leash.

Beach Info:

Fees & Passes: Entrance fees? No. Parking fees? Yes, in the summer. There are no entrance fees for Gateway National Recre-

ation Area. But fees ARE charged for expanded amenities. That includes beach parking to access beach centers. From Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day, an expanded amenity fee for beach parking is charged per vehicle Collection hours vary; Fees posted here are for 2015; they will change in 2016.

For most vehicles, beach parking is \$15 per day or \$75 per season. For oversized vehicles (more than 20 feet), charge is \$30 per day or \$150 per season. Hours of collection are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Does Gateway offer any Discounts or Free Beach Parking? - Yes. Access Pass (Golden Access) and Senior Pass (Golden Age Passport) holders receive a 50% discount. Please note that the America the Beautiful Pass holders do NOT receive a discount on expanded amenities fees such as beach parking. As of May 19, 2012, Active Military Members who own an America the Beautiful Annual Pass will receive free beach parking at Gateway where parking fees are charged. Active duty military photo identification will be required at all times to verify ownership of the Annual Pass. Vehicle Hang Tag is to be displayed at all times. (Hang tag is issued with annual pass.)

Camping Rates and Details:

Effective immediately, rates are as follows for all NEW reservations: \$30.00 a night; \$210.00 a week; \$15.00 a night with the Senior or Access Pass; \$105.00 a week with the Senior or Access

Length of Stay: No day use, you must camp overnight. 14 nights is the maximum number of nights permitted. Size limits: Up to six people may camp at a single site. Larger families and groups will need to reserve multiple camp sites. Sites are large enough for one large tent or two small tents.

What to bring: Your own tents and sleeping bags. A pad underneath your sleeping bag may cushion you better for a better night's sleep. Bring sunscreen and insect repellent as well.

What NOT to bring: Alcohol, pets, and charcoal grills are NOT allowed at tent camping sites. Glass containers are not allowed anywhere in the park.

Recreational Vehicles (RVs) at Floyd Bennett Field only: There are presently nine RV camp sites with another 11 planned for the near future. Water, sewer and electrical hookups are NOT available. Tents are not permitted in RV sites. Neither Fort Wadsworth nor Sandy Hook can accommodate RVs.

Showers: Showers are not available at Sandy Hook. At Fort Wadsworth, a cold-water shower is available to campers during the camping season.

Locations to obtain passes at Gateway: Visitors may obtain Access or Senior Passes at: You must instead visit one of national parks charging entrance fees or visit the USGS store online.

Please note: the America the Beautiful annual interagency pass is sold only at parks with entrance fees; Gateway does not charge an entrance fee, so this pass is NOT sold at any unit of Gateway. You must instead visit one of national parks charging entrance fees or visit the USGS store online.

How do I obtain an Interagency Pass?: AMERICA THE BEAU-TIFUL PASS SERIES: As of January 1, 2007 the old Golden Eagle and Golden Access Passes were replaced with a new series of interagency passes called the America the Beautiful - National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass. All Golden Access and Golden Age Passports will continue to be honored according to the provisions of the pass. Only paper Golden Age and Access Passports may be exchanged free of charge for new plastic passes. The America the Beautiful Pass Series includes the Annual Pass. Senior Pass, Access Pass and Volunteer Pass and the free annual pass for active military and their dependent families, introduced in 2012. Please visit the USGS Store website for more information or to purchase online.

Swimming - Sandy Hook has lifeguards on duty from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Memorial Day Weekend to Labor day at oceanside beaches. The guarded beaches are South Beach Areas C, D, E, Gunnison and North Beach. The southern portion of Gunnison Beach is clothing optional. For your safety, please only swim at guarded beaches and follow lifeguard instructions. Swimming and alcohol don't mix. To protect nesting shorebirds, pets are banned from ocean beaches from March 15 through Labor Day. Areas along the beach may be closed to park visitors as well. Open fires and metal detectors are prohibited. Rip currents are powerful currents of water flowing away from shore. Before you go to the beach, learn what you need to do to Break the Grip of the Rip!®

Multi Use Trails - The Multi-Use Pathway (MUP) is a five mile paved trail that starts at the park entrance and ends in Fort Hancock at the ferry dock in front of the Chapel. It is shared by hikers, bicyclists, and in-line skaters. Hikers can also enjoy the Old Dune Trail that begins at the Sandy Hook Visitor Center and South Beach Dune Trail that winds to the north end of the trail and continues to Atlantic Drive. Refer to the park map for more information.

rishing - Fishing is permitted at all beaches except when life-guards are on duty. An annual pass for nighttime fishing can be purchased at the Ranger Station or Visitor Center. Surf fishing is permitted at all beaches, except: at oceanside beaches when life-guards are on duty, and; when sections of the beach are closed to protect nesting shore birds (typically March to September). When areas of the beach are closed due

to safety concerns. Salt water fishing in New Jersey requires a permit from the state of New Jersey. Registration is free. The New Jersey Saltwater Recreational Registry Program is part of an improved data program to help protect long-term sustainability of recreational fishing. Annual passes for nighttime fishing can be purchased from the park. Unless otherwise stated below, payment is permitted by cash, credit, check or money order. Your Social Security number is required on all checks. Due to changes in staffing over the seasons, the times and places to buy annual fishing passes vary as well. For more information, please e-mail us. Fish Smart, Eat Smart is a guide for eating fish caught in New Jersey coastal waters from the New Jersey State Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Fish and Wildlife. Please read this before eating what you catch.

Boating - Non-motorized car top boats can be launched from Beach Area C and Horseshoe Cove. Horseshoe Cove is popular with recreational boaters. Landing on beach with a motorized boat is prohibited.

Windsurfing and Kite-boarding - Windsurfing and kite-boarding is best on the bay across from Beach Area C. For safety, please only swim at guarded beaches and wear life jackets when in boats.

Birding - Sandy Hook is a prime spot for birding. Good viewing locations include Plum Island, the Spermaceti Cove boardwalk, the Horseshoe Cove Salt marsh, North Pond or the fields at Fort Hancock. The NJ Audubon Society's Sandy Hook Bird Observatory has the latest birding information. They are located on Officers' Row in Building 20.

Camping: Overnight tent camping is available at Sandy Hook.
Reservations are available at www.recreation.gov under "Camp Gateway."

Picnics: The North Beach Observation Deck has tables and a view of New York Harbor. Guardian Park has piicnic tables, shelters and grills. Grilling is only permitted at Guardian Park in Fort Hancock.

Food Trucks: Sandy Hook is embarking on a new path with mobile food trucks this summer. Throughout this year's beach season different mobile food vendors will be offering an array of food to visitors. Vendors will be located in various parking lots throughout the beach during the summer season.

The Gateway Museum Collection - The Gateway National Recreation Area museum collection contains a great variety of objects ranging from artillery shells to sea shells. Aircraft to insects, this collection contains something of interest to everyone. The museum holdings relate to the history of the park and include significant archival and historical collections related to the military, aviation and recreational stories and sites throughout the park. These holdings also include an archeological and a natural history collection. Archival holdings include photographs, architectural drawings, manuals, maps, menus, newspapers and more. The history objects in the collection include a wide variety of items such as uniforms, insignia, cups, plaques and jewelry. Through the generosity of the Sandy Hook Foundation, the National Park Service has been able to purchase items and add them to the museum collection. 





News Release 6/6/16 TRENTON – Senate Majority Leader Loretta Weinberg, Assemblywoman Annette Quijano and advocates for working families today announced an effort to prevent wage theft by employers in New Jersey, a practice which often affects some of the lowest paid and most vulnerable workers.

"Workers who are most at risk of wage theft are often times among our most vulnerable populations," said Senator Weinberg (D-Bergen). "Our current laws are not strong enough to prevent this kind of conduct by unscrupulous employers. We hear that in some cases those who violate the law consider the risk of getting caught and accepting the penalty the 'cost of doing business.' Strengthening our laws will better ensure that companies are not taking advantage of workers, and that employees are paid the wages they are owed."

"Wage theft is a serious issue that we need to address right now," said Assemblywoman Quijano (D-Union). "This legislation will give all the hardworking people of New Jersey an opportunity to have a fair review of wage theft claims."

Wage theft can include failing to pay the minimum wage, overtime rates or withholding payment for work performed. According to a 2013 New Labor household survey of low-wage workers in New Brunswick, one in six workers reported that wage theft had occurred to them in the previous two years; 85% of those individuals were unable to recover the lost wages. In addition, a 2011 Seton Hall University School of Law report from the Immigrants' Rights/ International Human Rights Clinic found more than half of its respondents were paid less than promised at least once in 2010, almost all were not paid overtime when they worked more than 40 hours a week, and almost half were not paid at all at least once.

Under current state law, victims of wage theft can challenge the loss of wages of up to \$30,000 in proceedings before the Department of Labor and Workforce Development Division of Wage and Hour Compliance. If the lost wages ex-





Weinberg, Quijano & Advocates Announce Effort to Prevent Wage Theft by Employers

ceed that amount, the claimant must either forfeit the amount above the \$30,000 threshold or file a civil lawsuit to seek compensation. A victim is only eligible to recover the amount of wages lost.

Senator Weinberg and Assemblywoman Quijano are sponsoring legislation, proved today by the Senate Labor Committee, to strengthen state laws. Key provisions of the bill (SCS for S-1396) would provide triple damages to wage theft victims – the wages owed plus liquidated damages equal to 200 percent of wages owed – and provide additional avenues for individuals to challenge wage theft and recover wages.

The bill would allow a citizen complaint to be filed directly with a municipal court. An employer or agent of an employer found in violation of the law would be guilty of a disorderly persons offense and, along with triple damages, required to pay additional fines.

Wage theft victims would also be able to file a civil claim in Superior Court under the bill.

The legislation would empower the state Labor Commissioner to hear cases where the amount in dispute is above the current \$30,000 threshold. It would expand the commissioner's authority to conduct audits of businesses in certain circumstances and to order license suspension and revocation for violations of the law found in court, in addition to current authority to act on violations determined by the department. The commissioner could also issue a stop work order or license suspension if an employer fails to comply with a wage theft case decision.

The bill would extend the current statute of limitations to allow an employee to file a wage claim with the Department of Labor for wages owed up to six years prior – up from the current two-year statute of limitations on claims of unpaid minimum wage and overtime for unknowingly failing to pay wages and three years for knowingly failing to pay wages. It would also enhance retaliation protections and pen-

Additionally, the state would seek the assistance of community-based and legal services organizations to disseminate information to day laborers, migrant laborers, temporary laborers and other workers regarding the laws, and to help or represent employees in wage theft actions. The legislation would also require employers to provide information to their employees about their rights under New Jersey's wage laws.

"It's not enough to have a strong minimum wage. We need laws on the books that deter shady employers from violating those laws and taking advantage of their own workers," said Analilia Mejia, executive director of New Jersey Working Families. "Unfortunately, wage theft is rampant and pervasive in New Jersey, disproportionately impacting women and people of color. I commend Senate Majority Leader Weinberg and Assemblywoman Quijano on their efforts to ensure that a day's work equals a day's pay."

"I know firsthand what it's like to have tens of thousands of dollars in hard earned wages stolen from you by law-breaking employers. On behalf of the members of Make the Road New Jersey, I applaud the introduction of this very important legislation that will help New Jersey crack down on wage theft and build a stronger, more fair economy for all of us," said Felix Lema, member of Make the Road New Jersey, an immigrant and workers' rights organization.

"Wage theft comes in many forms. Whether it's failure to pay over-time, not being paid for all hours worked, or stolen tips, wage theft is a serious violation that hurts workers and families," said Kevin Brown, 32BJ Vice President and NJ State Director. "We need to strengthen New Jersey's anti-wage theft law and enforcement to protect workers so they're not exploited and to ensure hardworking men and women get what they deserve—full and timely pay for their hard work."

Currently five cities and towns have local ordinances which all revoke licenses of businesses found to have committed wage theft: Jersey City, Newark, New Brunswick, Highland Park, and Princeton.

"Municipalities across the state have taken action to protect low wage workers and high road employers from wage theft, a pernicious practice. Senator Weinberg and Assemblywoman Quijano's bill will create a disincentive to profiting from stolen wages in New Jersey and adopts best practices from across the country," said Princeton Councilwoman Heather Howard.

Perth Amboy Launches Zika Prevention Awareness Campaign

News Release 6/1/16 PERTH AMBOY, NJ—Mayor Wilda Diaz and the Middlesex County Mosquito Commission have partnered to bring awareness about Zika virus prevention to the residents of Perth Amboy during the summer months of travel, outdoor activities and for expecting mothers.

"It's extremely important to get this information to our families. We are being aggressive about the outreach,

as summer is just around the corner and we know that many of our families travel to the Caribbean and other areas that have unfortunately been impacted by the Zika virus," said Mayor Wilda Diaz.

According to the Middlesex County Mosquito Commission, currently there are 16 travel-related and zero locally acquired Zika cases in New Jersey. The Commission does not expect widespread outbreaks, however isolated cases of travel and locally acquired cases is possible due to some infected people returning from areas with Zika virus outbreaks such as Puerto Rico and South American countries.

"Fortunately, the primary mosquito species (Aedes aegypti) that spread Zika, is not present in New Jersey. However local transmission can come from the Asian tiger mosquito, an aggressive daytime biter that is commonly seen occurring in residential

backyards and businesses in the county," said Superintendent Dr. Deepak Matadha. "The Asian tiger mosquito breeds in a wide range of manmade containers that hold water for more than seven days. It is found in all neighborhoods, from the poorest to the most affluent. For effective control of this species, we urge the residents to practice good water sanitation on their properties. Once every week, eliminate or manage all sources of standing

water to discourage mosquito breeding".

To reduce the risk of mosquito bites, wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants; stay in places with air conditioning or that use window and door screens to keep mosquitoes outside; use EPA registered insect repellents according to label. To stop the spread of Zika, travelers diagnosed with Zika should avoid mosquito bites for 3-weeks and use condoms when having sex.

The Mosquito Commission is proactive in their surveillance and control efforts with regards to the Asian tiger mosquito in the Perth Amboy community. They are conducting city-wide monitoring for the Asian tiger mosquito population, treatments for mosquito larvae control in all catch basins and other habitats, spraying for adult mosquitoes and source reduction through scrap tire abatement in the City.

Zika prevention information will be distributed to the public and is currently published on the City's website. Public Service Announcements (PSAs) will be aired in the upcoming weeks. Many organizations have partnered in Zika prevention efforts in the county, including the NJ Health Department, Raritan Bay Medical Center, NJID, MC Mosquito Commission, the MC Department of Health and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention.





This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

British Commonwealth troops cross the Omo River in southern Ethiopia on June 6, taking 2,000 Italian prisoners and capturing 14 guns. In Washington, President Roosevelt signs a bill authorizing the government to seize foreign ships "idling" in U.S. ports; 84 vessels are affected. In Berlin, Hitler issues the "Commissar Order," mandating that captured political officers of the Soviet Red Army are "to be disposed of by gunshot immediately."

In New York, Whirlaway, ridden by Eddie Arcaro, wins the Belmont Stakes on June 7 becoming the first Triple Crown winner in U.S. thoroughbred horseracing since War Admiral in 1937. In Egypt, a night raid on Alexandria by Axis bombers leaves 230 dead.

The next day, the Egyptian government begins evacuating 40,000 residents from Alexandria. Also on June 8 a combined force of British, Australian, Indian and Free French troops, along with Jewish units from Palestine, invade Vichy French controlled Syria and Lebanon. The Germans have been basing aircraft in those countries.

In the U.S. on June 9 over 2,000 soldiers with fixed bayonets enter a North American Aviation plant at Ingleside, California, to end a strike there. Their authority is Executive Order 8773. President Roosevelt explains that the work stoppage cannot be allowed to continue, as it has shut down about 25% of the nation's capacity to produce fighter aircraft, which, he points out, is "detrimental to the defense of the United States." In Lebanon, Australian and Scottish troops clash with Vichy French forces at the Litani River. The Vichy troops are forced to withdraw, but not before inflicting some damage on the Allies.

On June 10, Indian troops land at and capture Assab, in southern Eritrea, the last Italian-held port on the Red Sea. In Ethiopia there is fighting near Galla Sidamo, southwest of Addis Ababa.

Raids on numerous targets in England are launched by the Luftwaffe on the night of June 11. It is also the first of 20 consecutive nights that RAF Bomber Command conducts raids on the Ruhr industrial area, the Rhineland, Hamburg and Bremen in Germany. In the Dutch East Indies, trade negotiations come to a halt because the Dutch will not accept Japanese demands for raw materials.

The German heavy cruiser *Lutzow* is damaged on June 12 in a torpedo attack by a British aircraft off the coast of southern Norway. *Lutzow* returns to its base at Kiel, Germany, where it will undergo repairs until January 1942. In Munich, Hitler and Romanian leader Ion Antonescu reach an agreement whereby Romania will participate in the invasion of the U.S.S.R. In London, representatives of 14 Allied governments and governments-in-exile pledge mutual assistance and to not conclude any separate peace treaties with an Axis or Axis-aligned country.
