

Concerns About New Election Laws

PERTH AMBOY - Resident Stanley Sierakowski was again beside himself at the 8/10/16 Council Meeting. He was concerned about Senate Bill NJ S-2431.

Ordinance No. 2 An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance entitled "Public Contracting" (Ordinance No. 1427 and Amendments) adopted June 25, 2008 also known as Chapter 98 of the Code of the City of Perth Amboy. Re: Redeveloper Contributions.


He told the Council that Vitale (State Senator 19th District) wants to pass another bill to make this ordinance null and void. (NJ S-2431) and Assembly Bill A-3903.

The synopsis of the two bills is: "Increases disclosure of political contributions by business entities with public contracts; creates uniform law for contributions by such entities; repeals local option to set contribution limits for business entities."

Sierakowski also had concerns about NJ Senate bill S-3132 sponsored by Ray Lesniak (State Senator 20th District): "Provides that two members of board of education of Type II school district

will be appointed by mayor or other chief executive officer of municipality constituting district."

Sierakowski advised the Council to ask the Mayor, the

Law Director if they knew about this law (S-2431) being initiated by Vitale and Weinberg and A-3903 and S-3132 (sponsored by Ray Lesniak) Sierakowski also spoke about this and the bill S-2099/A-3728 at the 8/18/16 Board of Education Meeting.

Resident David Caba came up to speak about Ordinance No. 2. He wanted to know who is going to benefit.

Council President Lisa Nanton answered, "This Ordinance was amended to remove the \$3000 cap and make it a \$300 cap for political contributions. This is to have the redevelopment and City Ordinance the same."

When Resident Alan Silber came up to speak, he was a little bit confused. He asked Lisa Nanton to repeat what was just said.

opment and City ordinances were different (when it came to a cap for political contributions)."

Silber answered back, "All you had to do was get rid of the one ordinance that had the higher amount."

When Resident Sharon Hubberman came up to speak, she said, "There is a lot of double speak and no contributions should be allowed. I would just keep it to no contributions to make it transparent. This doesn't send a clear message. There's a lot going on pertaining to Pay to Play. Everything's related to campaigns currently going on. You should curb the Pay to Play. As a Municipality you can go to no contributions at all."

Bill Passed to Hold School Board Election in November

Press Release 8/19/16 PERTH AMBOY, NJ- Mayor Wilda Diaz announces that yesterday, the Governor for the State of New Jersey Chris Christie, signed Bill No. S2099/A3728 into law.

"I want to thank Governor Chris Christie for signing this bill and Senator Joseph Vitale for his initiative and support to our families and children on this urgent matter. I made it clear in January that I would have no choice but to challenge the board's resolution. We, as an administration, will not burden the taxpayers with this unnecessary expense. Our goal is to serve the public and it is in the voter's best interest to have a November election," said Mayor Wilda Diaz.

In January 2016, the Perth Amboy Board of Education presented a resolution to have the school board election changed from November back to April 2016. On February 10th, the Perth Amboy City Council passed Resolution R-83-2/16, "Resolution Moving the Election Date of the

Perth Amboy School Board Members to the First Tuesday after the first Monday in November" to avoid thousands of dollars in increased cost, ensure proper communication to the public and a higher voter turnout for the upcoming election.

As a result of the actions of the School Board, the City was forced to litigate the matter in court, where it was ordered by Judge Arthur Bergman to have the election in November 2016. Thereafter, in late June the Board of Education issued a second resolution to once again overturn the election to April after following all requirements for proper public notification.

The latest signing of Senate Bill 2099 will serve to maintain the local school board elections during the general elections, this year on November 8th.

Gonzalez was also concerned about the food trucks at the Waterfront, "I don't think we need more food trucks. We have to think about the aesthetics."

Council President Lisa Nanton wanted to know what happened to the monthly reports from Code Enforcement (listings of abandoned properties, violations, etc.), "There are a lot of people who have overflowing garbage cans."

The Need for Pet Education

While there are many responsible pet owners, with all the animal cruelty in the world, it's time for pet education. Anyone thinking of buying, adopting or rescuing a pet should learn the basics of how to take care of a pet.

I grew up with animals, from hamsters to lizards to aquarium fish and everything else in between. 95% of these animals lived to a ripe old age. I fight off tears when the ASPCA and Humane Society's commercials air on TV.

Just scrolling down Facebook, take a look at the amount of animal abuse or neglect cases. It's disgusting. How can someone do this to one of God's creatures?

In one recent case in the news there was a dog who was beaten for eating a chicken. This dog eventually died due to this abuse.

When disciplining a dog or cat, all you need is a light tap on the nose or a slight tug on the leash if you are walking them. It has to be done immediately after said crime or the animal has no clue what he/she is being disciplined for. ONE SHOULD NEVER, EVER HIT A PET - PERIOD. If you hit a dog or cat an hour after it committed said crime, the dog or cat has no clue what he/she is being disciplined for and all he/ she knows is that you're hurting him/her. Pets should never be hit, tormented, teased, starved or neglected.

Animals think differently than humans. Their love is unconditional. They sense if you love them back and they sense fear and anger. They know if you love them; they know if you hate them and you can't hide it from them. Recently, a dog's love was demonstrated in the news. A family dog protected his best friend, a baby from being severely burned in a house fire. Despite efforts from firefighters and the family, the dog would not leave the house. He stayed and protected the baby, costing him his own life.

Many kids think puppies or kittens are cute, but in many cases the novelty wears off after the second day. A pet is a big responsibility. Pets need to be fed. Water should be available always,

etc. Dogs need to be walked and routine Veterinary care is needed. Be prepared to pay for Veterinary bills and they can get expensive. However, there are many programs for low cost spaying/neutering which is available through many charitable organizations. Pet Insurance is also available to help with Veterinary bills.

Many kids want pets for Christmas or for their birthdays. Many of these kids have no clue how to take care of their newly acquired pets, nor do their parents. How many people chain their dog up outside regardless of weather conditions and forget about him or her? People forget their pets have feelings.

It's about time there should be pet education starting on a local level. These classes should be given by Veterinarians and Animal Control Officers. The class should include learning about the importance of spaying and neutering your pets, basic lessons in caring for your pet including house training and exercising your pet, the proper food to give a pet, etc. One should know what type of breed of dog or cat or any type of pet and whether or not it is right you and your children. Also, people need to be taught what is good and bad for your pet. For instance, most people do not know that chocolate (especially baker's chocolate) is deadly to dogs. This is one of many facts that pet owners should be aware of.

"March2Success is the Army's gift to public education," said Tony Castillo, chief of education for U.S. Army Recruiting Command at Fort Knox, Kentucky. "We want students to stay in school and be qualified for life, whether they decide to join the Army or not. We want them to have every opportunity to become productive members of society."

The free online academic readiness program, featuring curriculum designed by Peterson's and the College Options Foundation, provides students easy access to test preparation materials to help improve their scores on standardized tests, like state exit exams, college entrance exams and military entrance exams.

While March2Success does offer assistance with improving scores on standardized tests, which includes the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery, this program is not part of a military recruiting effort, according to Castillo. There is no obligation to use the service, and no personal information is collected or shared. "So, yes, this program can help increase the number of young people who are eligible for military service, but more importantly, it helps improve the opportunities for success for all students, regardless of their desired career path."

The STEM tab alone provides tools to improve skills for a variety of career paths. It offers support for those interesting in improving skills in economics, financial accounting, calculus and physics, and it also offers nursing entrance exam practice test for PAX-RN, PSB Registered Nursing School Aptitude, and more.

Site content includes self-paced study programs in math, English and science, with materials focused primarily on grades 8 to 12. March2Success.com is available for free to anyone over the age of 13.


I met with Eddie Trujillo, Angelo Lenetti and Contractor Russ Fazio (also a former student of Mr. Lenetti) at Trujillo's office on King Street. Also present was Eddie Trujillo's family which included his wife, Brenda and their sons, Edward Jr., Sebastian and Christian. Brenda said, "Mr. Lenetti made an impact on his students and our families and their future."

Russ Fazio interjected, "And on our businesses."

Eddie Trujillo said, "Mr. Lenetti not only made a positive influence on me, but he also guided me. I first wanted to be a police officer and then an architect. Because of his influence, I want to establish a scholarship in honor of Mr. Lenetti. After 37 years, I decided to contact him."

Fazio interjected and said, "I wish my kids had an opportunity to have Mr. Lenetti as their teacher. Because of his guidance of what he taught me in his class, I used that knowledge and was able to get a couple of U.S. patents."

The Amboy Guardian asked Mr. Lenetti what he taught in his Industrial Arts class. He responded that the most important element were drafting architecture and using the proper machinery.

that Mr. Lenetti always had his "guns" (tools) in his jacket pocket. At this point Eddie showed what he was talking about (a pencil and an eraser).

Eddie Trujillo then talked about winning first prize at the 1979 Central Jersey Fair held at Woodbridge Center Mall for High School Students. There were over 200 competitors. Fazio reminded Eddie that the competition required that you design and build a whole model of a house.

Eddie Trujillo could not say enough about how much he learned here in Perth Amboy High School and what a positive influence Mr. Lenetti made on him. "I wanted so much to be an architect, but that would have taken even more additional college that I

what was involved designing the house from the nuts and bolts, the rebar's, the footing, the framing and all the calculations which were done by hand and the estimations of what it would cost. "This is the only class (Mr. Lenetti's Industrial Arts Class) that I wanted to do. I went to Middlesex County College for two years for business, and then to Rutgers University. To be an architect I would have needed four more years which I didn't do. I now sit with architects and sometimes have to correct them. This is all due to what I learned and the way Mr. Lenetti taught us."

Mr. Lenetti reminded Eddie some of the other lessons they were taught when building the model homes was how to calculate the concrete and the number the cinder blocks needed to complete a project. Mr. Lenetti proudly remembered that one of his students sold his plans to an architect for \$500. This prompted Eddie to remember that when he was 19 years old, that a Jewish Synagogue paid him a \$160 for drawing plans for them. Trujillo's oldest son, Eddie Jr. joined in the conversation, "Coming from Cuba, my Dad never imagined what you can do. If you can build, it strengthens your creativity." He took this time to compliment Mr. Lenetti on what he meant to his father and all the students that he taught.

Mr. Lenetti then related how he had two weeks on the job training when he landed his teaching job at the High School. "I have a Master's and a Bachelor's Degree. I taught from 1965 to 1981 at the High School."

Fazio remembered that Mr. Lenetti was also a friend to his students. "If he saw that there was something wrong or bothering a student, he would tell us to get our act together."

At this point, Mr. Lenetti started to smile and related that there was one Spanish word that Eddie Trujillo taught him that he never forgot. "That word was Porqueria (no good). I'll never forget that word."

After the interview was completed, we all went to La Terrazza Cubana Restaurant which Trujillo co-owns with Head Chef Jay Lopez, and is connected to Supremo Supermarket (which Eddie Trujillo owns) in Perth Amboy. Trujillo proudly told Mr. Lenetti how the lessons he learned is his class enabled him to be successful not only in business but in life.

Trujillo said, "When I first tried to contact Mr. Lenetti, I didn't have much success. It was my sister, Xiomara who through social media was able to get the right person. My assistant, Raquel reached out to Mr. Lenetti and I asked her if she was sure this was the right person and she assured me that it was. One thing I remembered about Mr. Lenetti is that in his class he would always find a fault in our projects."

Fazio responded to Eddie's comments, "Mr. Lenetti didn't want our heads to get too big." Trujillo also remembered had after I finished Rutgers."

Fazio said to Eddie, "You went above that and now you hire architects to do the projects for you."

Eddie went back and remembered that competition when he was 17 years old. He proudly remembered putting heated lamps, a pool and irrigation system for recycling in that house that won him first prize. "Mr. Lenetti pushed us to use our imagination."

Mr. Lenetti then talked about how that contest was judged by architects and how they were impressed with the swimming pool and the plumbing that was involved with the plans.

Vitale-Sweeney Bill Extending Unemployment Benefits to Workers on Strike Advances

News Release 8/1/16 TRENTON – Legislation sponsored by Senator Joseph F. Vitale and Senate President Steve Sweeney that would extend unemployment insurance benefits to workers on strike during a labor dispute cleared the Senate.

"Every worker deserves fair compensation and to be treated with dignity. When a breakdown in contract negotiations happens and workers are left with no choice but to go on strike, there should be some protections in place to provide sustenance for the workers

and their families," said Sena-Vitale (D-Middlesex). tor "This bill would provide that security while negotiations continue."

"When hardworking New Jerseyans are trying to earn an honest living but can't because of unfair compensation, it adds insult to injury to leave them flat with no income at all because they are finally standing up for justice," said Senator Sweeney. "This will bring some balance to the equation going forward."

Under the bill, S-2160, unemployment benefits could be triggered for striking workers through several pathways. They would be immediately available if the labor dispute is caused by the failure or refusal of the employer to comply with an agreement or contract between the employer and the claimant. This would apply to claims for a period of unemployment commencing on or after April 10, 2016.

Additionally, if the unemployment is caused by a labor dispute, including a strike or othemployee er concerted activities, but not by a lockout or a labor dispute caused by

the employer's non-compliance to an agreement or contract with the claimant, benefits would be denied only during the first 30 days following the commencement of a labor dispute, allowing time for negotiation and resolution. An exception to the 30-day waiting period would apply if the employer hires a permanent replacement for the claimant's position.

"Hardworking residents, like those at the Taj Mahal, who are fighting for fair labor treatment shouldn't be punished," said Senator Vitale. "They de-

serve fairness, respect and dignity in return for their service." The bill is modeled after similar laws in New York and in Alaska. It cleared the Senate by a vote of 22-15 and next heads to the Assembly for consideration.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

In Occupied France, the German occupation authorities announce on August 22, 1941, that anyone working for or aiding the Free French will be sentenced to death. In addition, anyone detained by the occupying authorities will be considered a hostage and hostages will be shot if attacks on German troops continue. About 20,000 German troops are engaged in searches for suspects. In central Ukraine, German forces capture Cherkasy, on the right bank of the Dnieper River.

On the Eastern Front, German Panzer Group 2 and troops of the 2nd Army from Army Group Center on August 23 begin attacks southward in order to link up east of Kiev with the forces of Army Group South. Most of the German generals on the scene are opposed to this move and would prefer to maintain the drive toward Moscow but Hitler insists on this change in strategy.

On August 24 there is much activity. A Luftwaffe bomb hits an Estonian steamer transporting 3,500 Soviet-mobilized Estonian men, killing 598 of them. The Soviets launch a new counterattack in the Gomel area; it makes little progress. In the north, Finnish attacks continue to press forward and Viipuri is surrounded. In the Mediterranean, aircraft from *HMS Ark Royal* attack the Italian airfield at Tempio, in northern Sardinia. Mines are also laid off Leghorn. The Italian cruiser Bolzano is torpedoed by the British submarine *HMS Triumph*. In Germany, Hitler — pressured by public protests and condemnation from churches — formally shuts down the Nazi program of forced euthanization of medical and institutional adult patients judged to be "incurable." By this date, over 70,000 persons have been killed in hospitals and psychiatric institutions in Germany and Austria.

On August 25, the British and the Soviets invade Iran. The two countries have been worried by reports of large numbers of German "tourists" being in the country and have decided to demand that Iran accept their "protection" of its oil supplies. There is little Iranian opposition to either the British or the Soviet forces. British and Indian troops capture the Abadan oil refinery, and the cities of Khorramshahr and Ahwaz. The Soviets bomb Tabriz. British, Canadian and Norwegian commandos raid Spitsbergen, an island off northern Norway, and find no German troops present. They destroy coal mines, equipment and supplies. Then they evacuate the residents of the island (some 2,000 captive Soviet citizens, who are repatriated to the U.S.S.R, and several hundred Norwegians, who are sent to Great Britain) and free 50 French prisoners of war.

In Iran, British forces take complete control of the Abadan area on August 26, while the Soviets, moving down from the north, enter Tabriz. The Soviets bomb Tehran. In Ukraine, German forces capture Dnipropetrovsk, the country's thirdlargest city. Chernobyl also falls, to the German 6th Army.

On August 27, former Vichy cabinet member Pierre Laval is shot in an assassination attempt at Versailles, France. The incident is used as a reason by the Vichy government to round up its opponents, labeling them as "communists." On the Eastern Front, the Germans begin an all-out assault against the Baltic port of Tallinn, Estonia; the Soviets begin the evacuation of 23,000 troops from the city. In Iran, British advances continue toward Kermanshah, with British and Indian forces taking Shahabad and Islamabad. Meanwhile in the south, British troops are preparing for an attack on Ahwaz. The Iranian government resigns. The Soviet Union announces on August 28 that it had blown up (on August 18) the massive Dnieper hydroelectric station and dam at Zaporizhia, Ukraine, to prevent its capture by the Germans. It is believed that the resulting flood wave killed between 20,000 and 100,000 civilians and soldiers (of both sides). In the Baltics, the Soviets withdraw their garrison, the 10th Rifle Corps, from Tallinn, Estonia, by sea. The city is taken over by the German Army's 42nd Corps. Several convoys of vessels attempt to get through to the Soviet naval base at Kronstadt, but incur heavy losses to mines and air attacks. Almost all the transports and many of the escort vessels from the Soviet Baltic fleet are sunk. In Iran, a new government, headed by former prime minister Mohammad-Ali Foroughi, an opponent of the Shah, takes office, declares a ceasefire and begins negotiating with British and Soviet officials.
