Revitalizing the Site To Remove the Present Blight: Condemnation Issues 7/12/16 PARA Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - R:07:16:15 - Resolution of the Perth Amboy Redevelopment Agency authorizing the issuance of a Certificate of Completion to Gerdau Ameristeel, Perth Amboy Inc.

Joseph Hanrahan of Hammer Land Engineering came forward to speak about this proposal. "We're talking about \$100 million of development on part of the 91 acres of the Gerdau Ameristeel property located on Elm Street. There are two buildings: one with 1.3 million square feet of steel operation and one with 45,000 square feet for water dependent use. There will be an extension incorporating Riverview Drive for warehouse distribution, trucking, vehicles, and a loading dock. 21% of open space and existing utilities will be used incorporating storm water. We met with the DEP (Department of Environmental Protection). There will be different system basins for water retention."

After Hanrahan spoke, Michael McMullen from Catalyst Development Partners came forward to give a brief environmental summery of the existing site now. "The steel mill stopped existing in 2006. Prior to the 1970's, copper smelting had started in the 1890's. From the 1890's through the 1970's we didn't have the same environmental sensibilities that we have in place now. In 2013, environmental investigation began. Now remedial investigations are needed. There are 89 areas of concerns with the storage tanks. Many were removed during historic excavations. As far as the ground water, metals were spread throughout the site as well as organic compounds. We're looking to demolish all sites on the properties except for two historic buildings. We'll remove all remaining storage tanks. A lot of contaminants can be capped by placing clean soil on the site first. This will prevent on site

contamination which is widespread. The site can only be used for industrial use - not for hospitals or schools. It will take from six to nine months for demolition to take place. The remediation will start after that. Capping will take no more than 18 months."

PARA Board Member Geri Bolanowski was concerned about the vapors on the site. McMullen answered, "That will be taken care of."

Bolanowski also questioned the type of tenants that can utilize this property. McMullen answered, "Warehouse or logistic tenants similar to Amazon or those who deal in bulk material."

PARA Member Elaine Jasko wanted to know what the projected cost would be. McMullen answered, "In the 3 to 6 million dollar range. We use private money for cleanups."

Board Member Allan Jacobs mentioned the beautiful Water-front. He stated, "Given contaminants, the use for this site you presented to us is viable. Will there be a significant grade change? Please consider a walkway along the railroad level. Perhaps a road access under the railroad to Riverview Drive to Sadowski Parkway would be good to go along with the Master Plan of the Train Station."

One of the presenters said, "We will look at the Waterfront connection."

Board Member Mayor Diaz thanked Hanrahan and Mc-Mullen for looking at the site which has been abandoned for 20 years. "This will bring ratables to the City. Some of the positives were cleaning the site, initiatives for using this site remediations, and the investment of a \$100 million project. I welcome you. I'm glad you took our recommendations for the open space."

PARA Attorney Joseph Mara-

ziti gave a brief breakdown of what would be involved for approval of this project, "There has to be an interim cost and Designation Agreement and a conditional redeveloper of the site. There's also a funding cost of an agency, major elements of the project and more identification of commencement dates. This has to go through different agencies for evaluation."

After Maraziti spoke, Execu-

tive Director Annie Hindenlang spoke about Landings Developer Charles Kushner. "Kushner is responsible for trash along the Waterfront area of his property. As far as why rentals are needed, it's what the market demands. In reference to the E-Port Bridge buildings, the first one should be completed in September 2016. The next phase will start

Pallone Announces \$1,096,000 in Federal Funding for Perth Amboy Fire Department

WASHINGTON, DC —Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) announced that the Perth Amboy Fire Department has been awarded a \$1,096,000 federal Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant. The SAFER program is a part of the Department of Homeland Security's Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program. Funds under the SAFER program are intended to support the hiring of firefighters and the recruitment and retention of volunteer firefighters.

"I am very pleased that the Department of Homeland Security has selected the Perth Amboy Fire Department to receive this federal grant," said Congressman Pallone. "These funds will allow Perth Amboy to hire additional firefighters and first responders and to recruit new volunteer firefighters to join the department, making the community an even safer place to live."

"I want to thank Congressman Pallone and Senator Booker for supporting the City and helping expand services to our residents," said Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda Diaz. "Our Fire Department is progressive and proactive, not only in protecting our families through public safety, but also in fire prevention and community outreach. This grant will allow us to reach staffing levels that we have not seen in over 20 years."

The goal of SAFER grants is to enhance the ability of fire departments across the country to maintain 24-hour staffing and to assure that their communities have adequate protection from fire and fire-related hazards. This funding allows departments to increase the number of front-line firefighters on staff, as well as enlist and retain volunteer firefighters who are properly trained in the operations of firefighting and emergency response. The SAFER program provides approximately \$320 million in competitive grants to fire departments and statewide or local volunteer firefighter support groups.

The AFG program is part of a coordinated ongoing effort by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Department of Homeland Security to improve the nation's ability to respond to emergency situations.





in the Summer of 2017. The Board of Education will not give us the piece of property for the connector road. (Rte. 440 and Amboy Avenue.)"

When Hindenlang mentioned the school property, the Mayor was not happy. Diaz stated, "It will alleviate the traffic if we had that piece of property."

After the Mayor spoke, Board Attorney Maraziti made a suggestion, "You can apply condemnation to get that piece of property. I don't know why the Board of Education would need that piece of property. The power of the City to condemn is unfettered. Board Member Allan Jacobs questioned if the connector road is in the Master Plan."

Hindenlang answered, "Yes." Diaz asked about the study involving the train station.

Hindenlang gave a brief report, "The North Jersey Grant Program were used for the Pedestrian and Bike Friendly areas. We pulled back some of the areas for the transit village around the train station."

Diaz said, "Some of the residents and businesses were concerned that their properties were being taken."

Hindenlang explained, "The Redevelopment Area would expand to incorporate the existing properties if they fit the criteria."

Diaz said, "The businesses were concerned if this was going to be introduced."

Board Attorney Joseph Mara-

ziti spoke about these concerns, "Two years ago, condemnation didn't exist in the study, but now laws have changed. Concerning the Kusner Property, condemnation was used. In the dry dock area condemnation was used for investigation area purposes. The power does exist for condemnation. That's why notices by stature have to say this. The Planning Board will have a hearing about the recommendations. The City Council makes a final decision on the Planning Board recommendations based on sites if they meet certain criteria. The Planning Board has to look at each site. The City Council can adopt, but it has to go back to the Redevelopment Agency,

The next person to speak was Thomas J. Herits who gave the Engineer's Report. He was surprised that the Board of Education did not approve giving up the property to connect the road to the E-Port Center. "There are bonds proposed for that site."

This prompted Mayor Diaz to state, "It's important that City Residents get employment with these new facilities being built."

Board Attorney Joseph Maraziti made a comment about the Gerdau Ameristeel Project. "When a Certificate of Completion is issued, all redevelopment powers will be gone.

Cleanups will provide benefits for public health."

During the public comments, Frank Salado who has a twenty year business on Smith Street came up to speak. He thanked the PARA Attorney for doing a great job when speaking. "If people decide to sell their businesses, we will have nothing left. At any point they may have to use it (for redevelopment), the tenants will be up in the air. Will you be able to buy a business if your not certain if it will still be there? Is there some way that you can understand our concerns? We are a City that needs jobs. I'm happy to see development on the Elm Street site."

After Salado spoke, a Resident from the Landings came up to speak. She wanted to know if there was any preliminary voting left for the Kushner Plans for a new development."

Mayor Diaz responded, "No plans are on the way until we get clarity from Kushner." Diaz also made comments about the projected plans for the Ameristeel Property. "This area has been blighted for over 20 years and will be brought back to life. I want to thank the public for coming out and I want to reassure you. We are working on projects to bring ratables and employment (for our residents). I hear what the small businesses are saying. I also want to thank all the Commissioners on the Board."

Really??? It's Not on the Books!

Some people have been upset since Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda Diaz decided to run for a third term as Mayor. This was in spite of the fact that she had publicly vowed early in her first term that she would impose on herself a two term lim-

We can understand people being upset when they felt the Mayor has played loose with existing City Ordinances, etc. But people harping on her going back on her word about only running for two terms is a moot point.

There are far more pressing issues to be concerned about.

In the past, there have been other politicians who changed their minds on how long they wanted to serve in office. Some have even decided to leave their office before their term was up. Diaz simply changed her mind. As far as I know, there is not an ordinance or resolution on the books that limits the term of the Mayor in Perth Amboy. As far as I know there is not a "If I break my vow, I'm breaking the law" ordinance on the books.

We have written editorials in the past supporting term limits for all political offices. If it's good enough for the President, it's good enough for every political office to follow suit.

As we have stated before, look what Mayor Michael Bloomberg did in New York. He challenged and was able to change the term limit of the Office of Mayor from two terms to three. New Yorkers went to the polls twice demanding term limits for the office Mayor of New York City. Once in 1993 and again in 1996. In 2008, Bloomberg stating the financial crisis in New York was a reason to need his expertise and went to the City Council to make his plea. The Council overturned the law without voter consent and changed the Office of Mayor of New York from two terms to three. In 2010 the voters overwhelmingly restored the two term brows about something, let's make a chart: (see below)

the chart (see above) is "Wilda Diaz." The exception was Joel Pabon in 2010 who ran independently his first run for Council and was the top votegetter that year.

You simply have a choice. You could vote for the candidate of your choice, write in a candidate's name or simply don't vote at all.

There is another alternative which would be for the future. Perth Amboy follows Faulkner Plan B (From Wikipedia) which lists several municipalities where residents have a choice to institute an ordinance for term limits.

As in all Faulkner Act municipalities, citizens in the mayor-council system enjoy the right of initiative and referendum, meaning that proposed ordinances can be introduced directly by the people without action by the local governing body. This right is exercised by

If you want to raise your eye- preparing a conforming petition signed by 10% of the registered voters who turned out in the last general election in an odd-numbered year. Once the petition is submitted, the local governing body can vote to pass the requested ordinance, and if it refuses, it is then sub-

Pallone Calls for Protection of Retirement Savings in Edison

News Release 7/21/16 NEW BRUNSWICK - Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) held a retirement security forum with representatives of AARP New Jersey at the Edison Senior Center. Pallone discussed the importance of ensuring a Social Security Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for Seniors and protecting retirement savings through the Department of Labor's fiduciary rule. Representatives from AARP New Jersey, Edison Mayor Thomas Lankey and Assemblywoman

As the American retirement system has moved away from defined benefit pensions and toward defined contribution plans, seniors' private investments have become all the

more critical to ensuring their financial security in retirement. However, financial advisers' conflicts of interest currently cost American families an estimated \$17 billion a year. Among other challenges seniors face, they will discuss the Department of Labor's so called "fiduciary rule" which seeks to close this loophole and ensure that financial advisers act in their clients' best interest when they provide investment advice.

"We simply want to hold all financial advisors to the same, commonsense standard - if you provide investment advice to people, they need to be able to trust that that advice will serve their best interests," said Pallone. "We expect the advice we get from doctors and lawyers to serve our interests,

and they are both held to professional standards that make sure this is true. Why wouldn't we expect the same from those we hire to help ensure that we are financially secure in retire-

Congressman Pallone also expressed his continued disappointment that there was no Social Security Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) in 2016. He has called on the Social Security Administration to reevaluate the formula it uses to determine yearly cost of living. By adopting a formula referred to as the "CPI-E', the program could better respond to how inflation impacts seniors' actual expenses, so that in retirement, they can continue to live in dignity and receive the benefits they have earned.



Movie Review: Star Trek Beyond

The crew of the Starship Enterprise returns to the big screen. They face a new enemy and are forced to confront new questions. Captain James T. Kirk (Chris Pine) debates whether or not he should be exploring outer space as a Starship Captain or accept promotion as an Admiral within Star Fleet. Spock (Zachary Quinto) questions his own mortality and debates whether he should leave Starfleet altogether and pursue further studies on New Vulcan.

In the midst of the crew's personal issues comes a new villain, Krall (Idris Elba) a mysterious alien who uses a new form of technology that can devastate starships.

Directed by Justin Lin (director of several installments in the Fast & Furious franchise) helms the project. The scenes are filmed tight for a fast action movie, sometimes a little too fast, sacrificing meaty



dialogue that Star Trek is famous for more action. Of course, there are great special effects and action sequences, but they move so quickly that your eyes can barely follow it. That's is my only complaint about this film.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On August 1, 1941, Willys-Overland Motors of Toledo, Ohio, rolls the first production model of its MB four-wheeldrive utility vehicle — known as "the jeep" — off its assembly line for the U.S. Army. Some 640,000 of the vehicles follow, through 1945. In a decision aimed specifically at Japan, President Roosevelt forbids the export of oil and aviation fuel from the United States to anywhere except Great Britain, British Commonwealth countries and nations of the Western Hemisphere. Roosevelt's dictum expands on the freezing of Japanese assets in the U.S., (which occurred on July 26th). As a consequence of the American restrictions on petroleum exports, Japan is left with only limited stocks of oil for its extensive navy and for its domestic consumption. The predicament is such that the Japanese government must weigh either changing its foreign policy of expansion very radically or deciding to go to war and try to secure access to oil in the East Indies.

German forces in the north of Russia on August 2 begin to attack Staraya Russa, 62 miles south of Novgorod on their drive toward Leningrad. The United States begins sending Lend-Lease aid to the Soviet Union. Great Britain calls upon the governments of Iran and Afghanistan to expel all Germans immediately. In Occupied Norway, German occupation authorities confiscate all civilian radios.

Another German encircling movement closes on August 3 near Pervomaysk on the Bug River in southern Ukraine, trapping numerous units of the Red Army. In Münster, Germany, Catholic Bishop Clemens Graf von Galen gives a sermon making public and condemning the Nazi secret program of forcibly euthanizing institutionalized medical and psychiatric patients deemed "incurably sick."

On August 4 a small air raid by planes from the British carrier HMS Victorious is launched against German installations in Tromsø, in far northern Norway. Japan halts all commercial steamship traffic with the United States. Hitler meets with the top commanders of German troops in Russia: Field Marshal Fedor von Bock and Generals Heinz Guderian and Hermann Hoth. The three soldiers agree that a drive on Moscow should be the main priority, so as to get there before the harsh Russian winter sets in. Hitler, however, favors other goals, such as eliminating pockets of enemy resistance, and orders this be done first.

On the Eastern Front, the provisional Government of Lithuania is dissolved, on August 5. The fighting around Smolensk (220 miles west-southwest of Moscow) comes to an end: The Germans claim to have taken 310,000 prisoners and to have killed many of the 700,000-strong Soviet force; the Soviets admit to far lower losses. In Vichy France. Admiral François Darlan is placed in charge of government policy in North Africa, with Maxime Weygand, a World War I French Army staff officer, as his deputy.

In Tokyo on August 6 the Japanese government — headed by Prime Minister Prince Fumimaro Konoe — presents proposals to the U.S. involving some concessions in China and Indochina, asking in return for the end of the freeze on Japanese assets. The U.S. finds the proposals unacceptable because Japan will not back off its expansionist policies. When the rejection is made known to the Japanese, they propose that Konoe and Roosevelt meet to discuss the issues at stake. On the same day, both the U.S. and the U.K. warn Japan that any act threatening the independence and integrity of Thailand would be "a matter of concern."

On August 7, the British submarine *HMS Severn* sinks an Italian Marconi-class submarine off the northwest coast of Africa. A small force of Soviet bombers raids Berlin; the German capital is bombed on six more occasions by the Soviets this month. In Washington, the Senate, after considerable debate, passes an extension of the period of service for draftees from one year to thirty months (and a similar increase for service in the National Guard). President Roosevelt arrives in Placentia Bay, Newfoundland, Canada, aboard the heavy cruiser USS Augusta. Ostensibly on vacation, Roosevelt is there to meet with British prime minister Churchill. On the other side of the world, Australia's government states that it "will not stand by and watch" Japanese expansion in the Pacific.
