Hot Topics: Paving of Streets, Flooding of YMCA & Enforcing Codes

PERTH AMBOY - 11/21/16 Caucus - City Engineer, Jim Rauch was put in the hot seat to answer questions put forth by the City Council about the horrible conditions of many of Perth Amboy's streets.

Many of questions dealt with the utility companies making the roads worse after work was done. The Council Members questioned why the utility companies feet are not held to the fire to put the roads back in the same condition before they were dug up.

The following is a synopsis of what Engineer Rauch told the Council: "There will be repaying of some of these streets with restoration which will be done in the beginning of the spring.

When Councilman Fernando Gonzalez questioned Rauch about some of the Waterfront Streets that were being done half and half, Rauch responded, "That depends on what was done before on those particular streets."

Gonzalez continued with another question, "When streets are repaved, they are done with two different colors. If they can't match both sides after repaving, it should be paved with the same color."

Rauch responded, "The color is different because you have fresh, brand new asphalt with existing asphalt. You can open up the City to a lawsuit if you make the utility companies do more than what is required of them. Other towns have four feet wide trenches. It all depends how old the roads are (having the same color asphalt). Some exceptions are emergency repairs. We will be giving the Council more information on pavement restoration requirements and on other towns that have two colors on the roads."

Gonzalez responded, "I don't want us being treated differently than other towns. I also see a lot of patchwork being done on State Street."

Rauch responded, "There are different types of restoration of repaying. Some of them include infrared joints of seams."

Council President Lisa Nanton had a comment to make: "They (utility companies) should at least repave the whole street if they are going to dig up half of it and it should be repaved all the way to the intersection."

Rauch was also questioned about the gas meters that the Council Members had concerns about that were placed in front of buildings/houses. Rauch said, "I had a meeting with Elizabethtown Gas about the meters being installed very close to curb lines. I supplied them with a list of addresses. There are grey areas that we have no control over. I'll look at other municipalities ordinances to see how they deal with the placement of gas meters. Some things are out of my jurisdiction and should be handled by Code Enforcement."

Councilman Bill Petrick said, "Some of the meters are placed internally. How was this done before?"

Rauch responded, "With the existing buildings, the utility companies will decided where meters will be placed."

Council President Lisa Nanton spoke again, "On Water Street there were meters placed in front of people's homes. Our former Business Administrator Jillian Barrack and I met with representatives from Elizabethtown Gas. They said they would move those meters elsewhere. They did remove some of those meters, but didn't come back to move the rest."

Annie Hindenlang, who is now a PARA Consultant said, "The utility company changed the way they read meters now. They are not required to respond as they did in the past. They use (scanner) guns now to read the meters."

Nanton added the following

comments: "They (the gas company) are having the meters on the outside which makes it easier now to read, especially since Superstorm Sandy."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry had a concern, "We need to coordinate with Elizabethtown Gas about work that has to be done before streets are repaved."

Rauch responded, "Code Enforcement issues the permits and then it's handed to me until the work is completed."

Irizarry questioned, "Can we (the City) legally not have permits issued to a company who did not do their last work correctly?"

Rauch responded, "Some are County Streets and they are responsible for issuing permits."

Irizarry was concerned about how terrible Watson Avenue is

Rauch said, "That street is slated to be milled and repaved."

Irizarry asked, "With the (gas) meters that are being put in, will the utility companies be required to put in the concrete after replacing the meters?"

Rauch responded, "They will replace everything with concrete. I also met with Middlesex Water about the problem on Davison Street. We told Elizabethtown Gas that the work done has to be a full repavement restoration. We're looking to have a five year

Irizarry wondered if the City has a recourse if the utility company refuses to repave a street after the five years.

Rauch said, "We have not been rejected on our request."

Councilman Bill Petrick said, "I would rather have them do the work and fix it. I don't want the money that should be used for roadwork to go into the general fund."

Rauch remarked, "We should look at a performance bond instead of going into an escrow account."

Acting Law Director Luis Rainone suggested another option, "You should have the money available if they (utility company) doesn't do the required work, the money can be pulled."

Councilman Bill Petrick remembered, "Even back in the 1970's, money was being diverted to projects that they were not intended for."

Hindenlang came up to speak and said, "Two streets (Riverview Drive & Herbert Street) will be replaced with the new development project coming up."

Rauch told the Council that the County DPW has two programs for repaving or milling County roads. "With this program, the County will be responsible for the curbs, too. The County DPW will be working on the Market Street Roads which will include the curbs and the sidewalks."

Carmine Muccio, Facility Manager of the YMCA came forward to answer questions about the flooding that occurred in the YMCA a few months ago. "When they were filling the second pool, water got into the elevator pits and set off alarms. There are checks in place on the sewer pipes, but there are no water alarms on the higher floors. The sewer and injection pipes failed. Paper towels jammed them up."

Acting City Law Director Luis Rainone said, "The YMCA and the City insurance company submitted claims. The City's insurance company covered our cost completely and so did the Y's."

Muccio said, "Sheetrock was replaced and so was the tile at the Y that was damaged."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry was concerned and said, "I don't want any work done on the cheap. All damaged furniture was replaced, but I don't want to see the City's insurance money to pay for the Y's damage."

Councilman Bill Petrick asked, "Did the insurance company give the Council the total amount of cost for the damage done?"

Muccio also added, "Three elevators were involved."

Irizarry also questioned, "Will the insurance pay for the







"During the Mayoral Debate that was held a Temple Beth Mordecai, I was astounded when Mayor Diaz took credit for the restoration of the historic Perth Amboy Ferry Slip at the foot of Smith Street.

In 1977 the Waterfront Association to Effect Restoration (W.A.T.E.R.) was formed for the express of saving the dilapidated ferry slip from being razed. We were successful in our efforts, and the ferry slip was placed on the State and National Register of Historic Places.

Our members worked tirelessly to stabilize the structure, and we received an annual Community Development Block Grant from the City as well as construction assistance from the U.S. Navy Seabees who trained at the adjacent Ar-

Mayor Joseph Vas secured a Federal Transportation Grant through the late Senator Frank Lautenberg, and the slip was completely restored and dedicated in 1998.

Mayor Diaz had not even entered politics at the time and

was not involved in this 20year project. I understand that Mayor Diaz is desirous of establishing a museum in the ferry slip. It is an ideal location for a maritime museum, and a Tourism office, however, it is never open on a regular basis, and it appears to be defunct. I would like to hear the Mayor's vision for this wonderful building in the future."

Stem Grant Received for Preschoolers at **South Amboy YMCA**

Press Release 11/23/16 METUCHEN/EDISON/ WOODBRIDGE/SOUTH AMBOY - The YMCA of Metuchen, Edison, Woodbridge & South Amboy (MEWSA) has received notification of a grant award in the amount of \$7,500 from the PNC Foundation to implement a Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Program at the Ready...Set... Learn Early Education Center at the South Amboy YMCA. This grant is unique in that the curriculum will focus on teaching and learning activities through a STEM lens for 2-4 year olds. The PNC Foundation is a long-time supporter of non-profit organizations and an advocate for educational programs geared towards children and youth, especially for pre-school children ages 2-4,

with a focus on a STEM course of study.

The funding will go towards the purchase of iSmartStart Tablets and the creation of an individualized, observationbased assessment system to document development and learning across key milestones, based on The Creative Curriculum® and GOLD® teaching strategies. STEMrelated experiments and activities will be incorporated to provide well-rounded, hands-on approach to learning, forming a solid foundation for understanding key concepts later on. "We are firm believers that it is never too early to introduce STEM concepts into our early education programs", said Rose Cushing, CEO & President of the YMCA of MEWSA. "It will prepare the children for

success in college, career and life". The program is scheduled to begin in January 2017 with the goal of implementing a full-day program by September 2017.

The YMCA has previously received a grant from the PNC Foundation for a summer extended learning program at Harborview Early Learning Center in Woodbridge which served to limit the amount of summer learning loss experienced by students that were entering Kindergarten.

A Representative from the Fire Department stated, "The elevator shaft pumps were working."

Muccio said, "There was flooding ranging from 6 inches to 2 feet."

This prompted Councilman Bill Petrick to say, "Perhaps this needs to be added to the budget."

Lance Nelson from Code Enforcement came up next to answer questions from the Council. First he gave a brief synopsis to the Council as to how Code Enforcement is handling people who have been violating some of the ordinances.

"Several summons have been issued to residents on Water Street about placements of their garbage cans. They have a limited amount of space where they can place their

Council President Lisa Nanton disagreed and said, "They all have garages and places on the sides of their properties where they can place their cans."

Nanton also wanted to know if there is a current list of abandoned properties.

Nelson responded, "I gave you a list. Can you give me more clarity? I can give you a list of those properties that were issued notices and summons. Some of these properties have been placed back into the system and are now ratables."

Annie Hindenlang came up

to speak, "There is a difference between abandoned and vacant properties. The criteria is different."

Nelson continued and related what steps are taken by Code Enforcement when dealing with abandoned properties. "First we have to identify who owns the property including any lien holders. They all have to be contacted first. Then they all must respond within a certain time frame. If they fail to do so, then the properties are registered to the City. Everything is documented. We also have been getting checks every day where property owners have been paying up."

Councilman Joel Pabon was concerned about a lot of garages in the City that are filled with vehicles.

Nelson responded, "A lot of these service stations are subletting their property and don't realize they must be registered with the State. There was a garage on Amboy Avenue that had two partners that subleted part of their property. One of the partners left and he was the partner listed as the owner."

Pabon questioned Nelson about one particular service station on the corner of Maple and Fayette Streets, "They are loaded with vehicles and look like dumps."

Nelson responded, "I know which one your talking about AAMCO - and they just got out of court (for violations)."

Nelson also talked about a business (Carvel) located on New Brunswick Avenue that was mistakenly listed as being in the residential zone. "We are looking to add it back in as commercial."

Perth Amboy Mayor and President of NJUMA Wilda Diaz Holds Press Conference on Undocumented Immigrants

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - On Tuesday, 11/22/16 Mayor Wilda Diaz, President of the New Jersey Urban Mayor's Association held a press conference in City Hall Circle in front of the Liberty Bell.

On the cold, windy day, Mayor Diaz spoke about the protection of Undocumented Residents in the City of Perth Amboy.

Diaz assured the residents that the names for Municipal ID's are kept confidential and encouraged anyone that is an Undocumented Resident age 14 and older who does not have an ID to get one. "We do not make copies of the ID," Diaz reassured everyone. "It's disturbing to have hate crimes. We will continue to protect everyone. We are making progress with the Police Chaplain Corps and Auxiliaries. Our Officers are here to help. I'm here as Mayor of Perth Amboy and President of the New Jersey Urban Mayor's Association. Here (in Perth Amboy) we honor all walks of life. It's about everybody who lives in Perth Amboy. In my opinion, there's no higher office to serve Perth Amboy directly. As Mayors we are here to protect our Cities."

Diaz then stated that anyone who is found guilty of committing crimes will be treated accordingly - documented or undocumented.

Sgt. Richard Zaleski spoke next. "We practice Community Policing and Philosophy. We are stressing to the residents that we serve everyone. We formed partnerships that bridge the gap between communities. I hope this eases any tension or anxiety that our residents may be having (due to the results of the presidential election). We wish to empow-

er our residents. We are only as effective as our community. If you see something, say something. It works."

Mayor Diaz then fielded some questions from the press. Q: How many Undocumented Residents live in Perth Am-

Diaz: We are here to assure the community. People come to this country to make a better life for themselves. We welcome it. We estimate several thousand (undocumented immigrants). We want the residents of our community only to be welcoming.

O: Will you protect Undocumented Immigrants and risk losing federal aid?

Diaz: There's a lot of discussion going on. There are things one says while campaigning and other things while governing. There's a lot to be done when we work together. We are here to work for the people. I am going to vigilant to see what comes. Federal funding is essential to every community. Undocumented Immigrants are in every community. We need to see what happens. Q: Does protecting your Undocumented Immigrants may oppose federal policy?

Diaz: The Police are here to protect the citizens. They are not INS Officers. They will not go house to house looking for Undocumented Immigrants. It's very shameful. People come here with a dream. When they come here they want to be a part of the Greatest of Our Nations. My job is to protect and serve the families of Perth Amboy.

Perth Amboy Paid Out \$150,000 to Settle Sexual Harassment **Complaint Filed Against Former Police Chief**

Courtesy of John Paff 11/23/16 PERTH AMBOY/NEW BRUSNWICK - In September 2016, the City of Perth Amboy (Middlesex County) agreed to pay \$150,000 to a female secretary who said that the City's former police chief would incessantly "stare at her breasts and feet" which made the woman "feel disgusting and repulsed."

In her lawsuit, Nalda Capo said that former police chief Benjamin Ruiz stared at her and harassed her from 2007 until 2014. According to the complaint, Ruiz told Capo to "start dressing up and get your nails and hair done." She claimed that he would come to her office uninvited and "rub her neck and shoulders," would introduce her to citizens as his wife and stand in front of her desk and "stare at her breasts for long periods of time." She said that she "lived in fear every time the door opened to her office" and that she "would jump out of her chair in fear that Defendant Ruiz would try to touch her again."

Capo said that she reported Ruiz's behavior to her union president Ruth Vega but that Vega "violated her rights" by reporting to Ruiz Capo's intention of filing a sexual harassment charge against him.

Capo also said that Ruiz gave her unfairly poor performance reviews and that she was passed over for a Detective Bureau secretary position in favor of someone who was less qualified and had less seniority. She said that at a grievance hearing, her union representative, Debra Parks, told her that Ruiz "put [Capo]

down like a piece of garbage."

Ruiz no longer works for the City. According to news reports, he was suspended without pay in December 2014 and was later terminated after having been indicted on official misconduct and other charges. In September 2016, Ruiz was acquitted by a jury on all charges.

The case is captioned Capo v. City of Perth Amboy, et al, Docket No. MID-L-7267-15 and Capo's attorney was Stephen E. Klausner of Manville. Case documents are on-line

The settlement agreement specifically reserves for Capo the right to pursue three orthopedic Workers Compensation claims against the City while calling for "a claim for psychiatric or psychological injury" to be dismissed.

None of lawsuit's allegations have been proven or disproven in court. Settlement agreements typically state that payment does not constitute an admission of wrongdoing by any of the defendants. All that is known for sure is that Perth Amboy or its insurer, for whatever reason, decided that it would rather pay Capo \$150,000 than take the matter to trial. Perhaps the defendants' decision was done to save further legal expense and the costs of trying what were in fact exaggerated or meritless claims. Or, perhaps the claims were true and the defendants wanted to avoid being embarrassed at trial. This is the problem when cases resolve before trial--it is impossible to know the truth of what really happened.

After Goldy spoke, Business Administrator Adam Cruz said, "Any contract over a certain amount has to be bid out. There are exceptions for bidding. Some examples are Priority or State Contracts."


a.m., will be leading the audience in holiday songs during the wait for Santa.






"There are days that define your life. Like the day they arrived." - Louise Banks.

The Arrival is a hard sci-fi film about a college linguistics professor and translator (Amy Adams) who is called upon by the military to decipher an alien language when 12 alien space ships descend to Earth. The military wants to know why they're here and what their intentions are. Along with Ian Donnelly (Jeremy Renner), Dr. Banks has to figure out those answers before those who are afraid of the aliens begin what could become a global war. I really can't say more about the plot without spoiling it, but this movie is not about what you think it is about.

The cast is fantastic, led by Renner and Adams, both Academy Award nominees and it also features Forest Whitaker, an Academy Award winner. They lend a human element to a movie that is both slow and serious.

This is a thinking man's movie. It tries to make language translation exciting in the way that The Firm tried to make photocopying exciting. Unfortunately, it proved a bit too slow for my taste. The reveal at the end didn't resonate with me. I didn't hate it but it just didn't work for me that well. I do want to add that the sound and sound editing are fantastic and really enhance the drama and the action.

It's certainly a different spin on science fiction and I'm sure the academy will love this film and will want to see more sci-fi films like this. That isn't necessarily a bad thing. It was interesting but if you don't like a slow paced movie, then perhaps you should wait for DVD or Netflix before giving it a try.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

In East Africa, terms are negotiated and accepted on November 28, 1941, for the surrender of 22,000 Italian troops in Ethiopia. In North Africa, there is renewed fighting around Sidi Rezegh, Libya. Northwest of Ed Duda, Libya, New Zealand troops make contact with soldiers from the Tobruk garrison, breaking the siege. In Berlin, Mohammed Amin al-Husseini, the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, meets with Hitler, the both pledging mutual support.

Panzer forces commanded by Gen. Georg-Hans Reinhardt reach the Moscow-Volga Canal on November 29 and cross it. Red Army resistance, however, is fierce. At Taganrog, on the Sea of Azov, the Germans are forced to withdraw in the face of stiff Soviet defense.

On November 30, a British Whitney bomber sinks the German submarine *U-206* in France's Bay of Biscay with the assistance of air-to-surface-vessel radar. It is the first successful use of the equipment. In Borneo, British sources report Japanese naval movements; the assumption is that the vessels are headed for Malaya or the East Indies. In North Africa, Axis forces attack New Zealand troops at Sidi Rezegh, Libya, in a renewed attack on Tobruk.

On December 1, the Germans continue their attack on Tobruk; New Zealanders facing them are forced to retreat. The Axis troops, however, are becoming exhausted, and many officers have been killed or wounded. The British Eighth Army, though battered, is still receiving supplies and replacement tanks. In Japan, the government of Hideki Tojo decides that the terms of the "Hull Note" are an unacceptable ultimatum; Emperor Hirohito approves attacks against the United States, Great Britain and the Netherlands. A state of emergency is declared in British Malaya. In the U.S., Fiorello LaGuardia, mayor of New York City and Director, U.S. Office of Civilian Defense, signs Administrative Order Number 9 creating the Civil Air Patrol, which will operate under the authority of the U.S. Army Air Forces. On the Eastern Front, SS Col. Karl Jäger reports to Berlin that Lithuania is "clean of Jews." Farther south, Field Marshal Gerd von Rundstedt resigns following the German retreat that he ordered from Rostov-on-Don (on November 24th against Hitler's direct command), the first significant German withdrawal of the war. Subsequent commanders later affirm that Rundstedt had made the correct decision.

From Tokyo on December 2 the code message "Climb Mount Niitaka" is sent to the Japanese task force en route to Hawaii, indicating that negotiations have broken down and the attack is to be carried out as planned. In the Soviet Union, small German scout units reach the outskirts of Moscow as the weather turns colder with heavy snow falling in blizzard conditions. U.S. cryptologists intercept Japanese orders to destroy codes at the embassy in Washington.

In North Africa, Lt. Gen. Erwin Rommel orders attacks against the garrisons of Bardia, Libya, and Sollum and the Halfaya Pass, in Egypt, but all are repulsed. In the United Kingdom, conscription is expanded on December 3 to include all males between the ages of 18 and 50. Women are encouraged to join auxiliary groups and to serve on fire brigades. In Finland, the Soviets evacuate the naval base at Hanko, 80 miles west of Helsinki, besieged since June 29.

On December 4, the temperature on the Moscow front falls to -34°F. In the U.S., the *Chicago Tribune* and the *Washing*ton Times-Herald publish an article revealing leaked details of the top-secret war plan put together by the Secretary of War and the Secretary of the Navy, including the statement that the U.S. would not be able to field forces in strength until mid-1943. The German chargé d'affaires in Washington radios a report on the article to Berlin.






