"Today, we take one more step towards continuing to strengthen our public safety in the City of Perth Amboy. I am pleased to appoint Captain Roman McKeon as Acting Chief of Police, an officer who has served this community for nearly 30 years and is dedicated to improving quality of life and the safety for all residents."

Acting Chief Roman McKeon joined the Perth Amboy Police Department in 1988. Prior to joining the department McKeon served as an Auxiliary Police Officer in the Township of Edison from 1984-1985. McKeon graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice in 1985 from Glassboro College. He later graduated from the Middlesex County Police Academy in 1986 and served as a police officer for the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ).

As a career Patrol Officer, he served as the department's first certified field training officer for new recruits. McKeon was later promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 2003, Lieutenant in 2005 and to Captain in 2015 to serve in the patrol division after being assigned to the Support Service Division.

Acting Chief McKeon has attended numerous advanced training schools. Throughout his career he served as a firearms instructor, police baton (PR-24 – instructor), certified commander of the departmental SWAT team, as well as the range master for several years.

Apart from his 28 years of law enforcement experience he is also involved in the community and currently serves as

the Perth Amboy Police Chaplain Corps liaison. He also received the 200 Club Lifesaving Award for saving a suicidal jumper and has received several mayoral citations for outstanding service.

Acting Chief McKeon takes great pride in being a mentor to the officers in the department and in his ability to guide them through the challenges in 21st century policing.

Update on Redevelopment and City Resources

SOUTH AMBOY - 12/7/16 Business Meeting - An Easement Request was discussed for the Art's Center located at 141 North Broadway. Business Administrator Camille Tooker explained that many storefronts are not ADA Accessible and this Easement is needed to bring that location up to date.

Another Easement Request was for a location at 242-244 Bordentown Ave. This was to replace an existing porch which the owner has to pay for. City Attorney John Lanza said he would draw up a resolution to do so.

Under the Business Items a resolution for a Chapter 159. Tooker explained that the City received an unanticipated grant of \$7,000 from Homeland Security. OEM (Office of Emergency Management) Coordinators need to be certified and have more training. Monies from that grant can be used for that. Another Business Item E was Authorizing Budget Transfers. Tooker explained, "This is a good thing. You can transfer monies between budget lines where one department can move money that they do not need into another department." Resolution 165-SA Authorizing the Issuance of \$73,000 Special Emergency Notes for the Master Plan Re-examination in and by the City of South

Amboy. Tooker said, "For the new Master Plan, the DCA (Department of Community Affairs) allows the payment in 5 year increments."

Councilman Thomas Reilly moved that the Resolution be read by title and Dato seconded the motion. After the reading by City Clerk Laura Kemble-Kalantsis, Councilman Reilly moved to adopt the resolution. It was seconded by Dato.

During the public portion, Resident Pete Kenny asked about an ordinance that was passed earlier in the year regarding the purchase of computers and resurfacing of the tennis courts. He said, "These purchases and improvements must have at least a 5 year use-

Vitale Bill Adding Cyber-Harassment to Domestic Violence Law Signed by Governor

Press Release 12/5/16 TRENTON - Legislation sponsored by Senator Joseph F. Vitale that would add cyber-harassment to the list of offenses under current domestic violence statutes was signed into

sex). "I am pleased that our domestic violence laws now reflect this unfortunate reality and will better protect our residents against cyber-harassment."

The crime of cyber-harassment was enacted in 2013, and is defined as the act of making communication in an online capacity via any electronic device or through a social networking site with the purpose to harass another by: (1) threatening to inflict injury or physical harm to any person or the property of any person; (2) knowingly sending, posting, commenting, requesting, suggesting, or proposing any lewd, indecent, or obscene material to or about a person with the intent to emotionally harm someone or place them in fear of physical or emotional harm; or (3) threatening to commit any crime against a person or his or her property.

ment as a form of abuse will now allow victims to regain control over their own lives by enabling them to seek restraining orders to protect themselves," said Senator Vitale.

Cyber-harassment is a crime of the fourth degree, unless the person is 21 years of age or older at the time of the offense and impersonates a minor for the purpose of cyber-harassing a minor, in which case it is treated as a crime of the third degree. A crime of the fourth degree is generally punishable by a term of imprisonment of up to 18 months or a fine up to \$10,000, or both; a crime of the third degree, by a term of three to five years or a fine up to \$15,000, or both. The bill was approved by the Senate and the Assembly unanimously. The law takes effect immediately.

The existing "Prevention of Domestic Violence Act of 1991" provides a list of 18 predicate offenses that, if inflicted by an adult or an emancipated minor on a person protected under the act, constitute domestic violence. The law, S-1257, now adds cyber-harassment to the list and would therefore allow temporary or permanent restraining orders on those grounds.

"In today's digital world, domestic violence and harassment have taken on new form, with victims being targeted through the Internet and social media," said Senator Vitale (D-Middle-

some comments: "The new Waterfront development will be coming and may have about 10 kids coming into those units."

Tooker came back and explained, "We use Smart Growth for our PILOT Programs. Some PILOT Programs allow us to not have to give funds to schools."

Kenny also had questions about the South Amboy YMCA and whether or not it's under the PILOT Program.

Tooker responded, "The YMCA rents from the City."

Mayor Henry then answered Kenny who wanted to additional information about the Waterfront project. "The Sherman Group is looking for contractors and the Ferry is looking very positive."

Comments were made towards the end of the Meeting by Councilman Tom Reilly. He opened his comments acknowledging the passing of Ex-Fire Chief John Donnelly.

Tooker then spoke about tax rebates, "95% of the tax rebates are programed in the Gov. PILOT Program." Tooker then discussed the Shop South Amboy Program. "The City needed at least 15 merchants to participate. We have 18 to 19. We sent out letters to merchants and are ready to kickoff this program in the first quarter of 2017. "

Councilman Reilly then mentioned two upcoming fundraisers to benefit two South Amboy Residents: the December 17 Friends of South Amboy fundraiser (See Charity Basketball Tournament p. 12) and the December 20, 2016 Holiday Showcase Benefit Concert taking place at South Amboy High School (see p. 9). He also wanted a historic property on Main Street to be incorporated into the Master Plan.

B.A. Tooker was happy to

see 5 new applicants for the Fire Department and mentioned that many of them are working a second job.

City Attorney John Lanza said, "I'm sorry to hear about Donnelly's passing and I have represented the Donnelly family in hard times."


Council President Mickey Gross thanked the City Employees for all the work they've done throughout the year.

Pallone Sends Letter Requesting Hearing on JCP&L's Proposal to Increase Transmission Rates

Press Release 12/5/16 LONG BRANCH - Today, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) sent a letter to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission voicing his concerns over Jersey Central Power and Light's (JCP&L) proposal to increase electric transmission rates in 2017. Pallone requested a public hearing on the proposal which would increase rates by 150% and argues that "any increase of this magnitude should be carefully scrutinized."

Pallone has voiced concerns with other JCP&L proposals which could have negative impacts on New Jersey communities. In October, Pallone sent a letter to the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (BPU) voicing his concerns over Jersey Central Power and Light's (JCP&L) proposal for the Monmouth County Reliability Project (MCRP). The plan for JCP&L's new transmission line would impact Aberdeen, Hazlet and Middletown in Pallone's district and run along New Jersey Transit's North Jersey Coast line. Many residents have argued that the project is unnecessary and potentially harmful to the public health, environment, and economy of their communities. In August, he shared his concerns with BPU regarding JCP&L's proposal to transfer all of its transmission assets to Mid-Atlantic Interstate Transmission. JCP&L withdrew its transfer proposal in September, a week after Pallone's statement.

The text of the letter can be found below: December 5, 2016

Dear Chairman Bay:

I write regarding Jersey Central Power & Light's (JCP&L) proposal to increase electric transmission rates in 2017. I respectfully request that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) hold a hearing on this proposal to determine whether it is necessary, just and reasonable, particularly in regard to the impact the increase would have on ratepayers. The public should also be allowed an opportunity to comment on this proposal. As you know, FERC's approval is necessary for any rate increase by JCP&L to take effect. In making its decision, FERC should take into account concerns raised by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, the state Division of Rate Counsel, and other stakeholder groups. This rate increase could be a significant burden on ratepayers; accord-

ing to the Rate Counsel, JCP&L's proposal would increase rates by 150%. FERC should hold a hearing to investigate a rate increase of this magnitude.

This is not the only JCP&L proposal my constituents have concerns about. Over the past year, JCP&L, and its parent company FirstEnergy, attempted to transfer all of JCP&L's transmission assets to a separate company, Mid-Atlantic Interstate Transmission, and to build a new 10mile transmission line in my district, known as the Monmouth County Reliability Project. While the benefits of these proposals for ratepayers are dubious, JCP&L would certainly reap financial benefits if either of these proposals were approved.

That is why I am respectfully urging FERC to provide a serious and sincere opportunity for the public to comment on JCP&L's proposed rate increase. New Jersey ratepayers should not be subjected to onerous energy costs, and any increase of this magnitude should be carefully scrutinized. Thank you in advance for your most serious consideration of this request. Sincerely,

Guest Editorial: Oh, What a Time it Was!

"Black Friday" rush, etc. You may wonder if there was ever "Another Time"—Yes there was! "Oh what a time that was!"

The Ambler II is on the move again. In the last scene of Camelot, when King Arthur knew he was fighting his last battle, he told a Squire, "Run as fast as you can and tell all of England the glory that was once Camelot."

The Ambler is going to amble down Smith Street: from the train bridge to the Ferry Slip, and the years are from the mid 1940's to the late 50's. West of the train bridge was Robert Hall, where we bought our "good clothes" and the really only store up that way. As we amble east on the right side was Modern Boys where you could buy a scout uniform and again "good clothes." The men who ran the store we real gentlemen and treated all us kids like adults. Ahead was the "Hansen Bank," and everybody knew Mr. Hansen. Then came the Crystal Restaurant, and just down the street was the Coney Island. Both made hot dogs talked about today. Between them was the Rokey theater which brought much joy on dreary winter Saturday mornings (10 cartoons, a cowboy picture and a serial). Across the street was Leiber's Sporting Goods; Mr. Leiber was a very kind man who taught me much about hunting and fishing. Once when my cat escaped, someone painted her white with oil based paint. Mr. Leiber had hand clippers for \$12.00, but I had no money so I asked if I could pay him off in a few weeks so I could shave my cat. He just said, "Bring in the cat." and he shaved her for me. (I do not know what he did with the clippers). My cat wore a sweater for a month. Joe's Pet Sweet Shop with a soda foun-Shop was on both sides of the street since he burnt down and moved. Here you could buy fish, birds, hamsters and all the

Seeing the malls on the stuff to keep them. Across the street was Ace Drugs where you could buy all kinds of stuff like clocks, make-up (sort of like a CVS). Across the street on the corner of McClellan Street was Jack and Jill where all sorts of baby clothes were available. On this corner next to Leiber's was Fischer's Toy Store. We called it "The Junk Store," full of toy soldiers, dolls and all sorts of good stuff.

As we amble down further, we came to another theater the Crescent which became the Royal. Around the corner was the Majestic Theater where on Thursday afternoons you could see Vaudeville. The performers stayed across the street in the Palace Hotel. Down Madison Avenue was the Pink Elephant where Jon Bon Jovi started his career. Across the street was Fishkin Brothers, a store where there were trains, cameras, hobby stuff and hunting and fishing - Wow! What a store (It started out on Smith Street)! The Fishkin family were very nice and supported the City in many ways (Mr. Leiber worked there after his store burned down).

Going along, we come to Reynolds Department Store where you bought almost anything (My mother said during the Great Depression many people were paid in "Scrip" a sort of IOU). Reynolds was one of the few stores who honored them. All money was sent somewhere in tubes which zipped around the ceiling. Close by was Woolworths 5&10 where like in "Alice's Restaurant" you could get anything you want. Birds, fish clothes, jewelry and a lunch counter, I would always go there just to look - it was some place. There were two other 5&10 stores down the street.

Response to Mayor Diaz's 11/23/16 Letter

It was with amused interest that I read the letter from Wilda Diaz in your Nov. 23 edition.

First, I would like to wish Perth Amboy a Happy Hanukkah, Blessed Kwanzaa and a Merry Christmas. As I leave political office, which I have chosen to do, I would like the city to know that in all my years here, I was happy to serve in various areas. Over 20 years I was re-elected to District Democratic committeewoman and worked tirelessly to elect candidates who I believed would serve the city well. For over 20 years I physically labored every Saturday morning with the Royal Garden Club to beautify our city as well as serving as President twice, establishing a Garden Contest for private gardens and Beautification Awards for businesses and organizations who endeavored to improve the appearance of our beloved historic city. In 2012, after submitting a narrative of a walk through our public gardens, the city won the Great Public Spaces award from the American Planning Association. I have served on the Zoning Board – the front line for property owners who need protection from thoughtless imposition from neighbors. I served on the Board of Education while my children attended public school here. I am presently President of the Proprietary House Association and alternate member of the New Jersey Historical Commission. I worked on the Creative Placemaking Plan, which won an award in 2015 for Best Municipal Plan. As a member of the Art Council, which was an outgrowth of that endeavor, we sponsored the successful Waterfront Arts Festival. My term on the City Council was a tumultuous one but, thanks to all my years as a music teacher and Choral Director and Masters Degree in counseling, my experience dealing with young temperamental divas came in handy. I have chosen to leave the Council because it absorbed much more time than I anticipated. It is not a part time job. It is a 24/7 job. The Councils' mission is to provide checks and balances in city government. When I witnessed the unraveling of the Diaz administration, the pressure and bullying imposed by the mayor on the council to accept under qualified directors, the revolving door of Business Administrators, Law Directors, Public Works Directors and various other departments; the attempt to give away valuable city property just to expedite contracts, it became apparent to the council that our city was being jeopardized solely to satisfy the mayor's hidden and prejudicial agenda and to secure her re-election, with no regard for our taxpayers. All one has to do is look at the voting record of the Council to realize that we were never in lock-step with each other, but each vote was independently realized. So if the council came together to support new leadership, it was not I who drove the council to that decision, it was the mayor herself.

If I had a political agenda, why would I choose to leave? What I do have is a vision and a dream for the city that my maternal and paternal grandparents, my parents, my husband's family, and all my aunts and uncles called home. That is where I have focused my energy, as my record demonstrates.

Perth Amboy is historically prestigious, and geographically gifted. Outsiders realize this and are eager to take advantage. We mustn't' allow ourselves to be sold down the river for someone's greed and/or self interest. We need knowledgeable and ethical leaders who understand our value to protect us from those entities that look to capitalize on our resources, while property owners are left to foot the bill.

The mayor likes to speak of progress, yet this has shown to be a rather ambiguous statement. Have no doubt that the city is suffering. Almost half of Perth Amboy's registered voters didn't bother to turn out in this last election-and almost 60% of them wanted her gone. According to recent census figures, household median income in Perth Amboy is down 16%, compared to 5% for the rest of the state. Home values in Perth Amboy are down 30% compared to 19.5% for the rest of the state. People in Perth Amboy have lost an average of about \$100,000 in home value during the last few years.


Poverty rate in Perth Amboy is up 5% compared to 2% for the rest of the state. Twentythree percent of Perth Amboy residents live in poverty compared to 11% for the rest of the state, and the percentage of people in poverty has risen since the Mayor took office. Yet the Mayor had no problem signing contracts to give your tax dollars to several directors before the election, over \$100,000 in RAISES. They had no problem supporting her. Ironically, one of them moved out of Perth Amboy.

Now city employees are questioned as to their loyalty to her. Character assassinations are prevalent. I have been screamed at, cursed at, and called names by the mayor on many occasions-both publicly and privately. I have never responded in kind. She has threatened other council members if they did not go along with her. This is not characteristic of a person's strength - this is characteristic of a person who is fearful. The fact that she kept the last agenda hidden from the public begs the question – what has she promised her supporters that she's afraid she can't deliver? When she ran against the incumbent mayor in 2008, the very oppressor she detested, she has now become.

It is in all our best interests to wish Mayor Diaz well in her third term. I still want Perth Amboy to succeed and it doesn't matter who gets it done, just as long as it does. The Mayor has assembled teams to take on the challenge, and I pray for their success as well. For those of you who have any affection for this city, get involved. Volunteer. Attend public meetings and pay attention to what goes on in YOUR city. There's much to be done. It's time for me to get back to my bucket list. I wish all of Perth Amboy health, happiness and prosperity in the New Year and for the Mayors term. May God Bless Perth Amboy



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On December 12, 1941, Adolf Hitler holds a meeting with leaders of the Nazi party at the Reich Chancellery in Berlin. Attendee Joseph Goebbels notes in his diary: "With respect of the Jewish Question, the Führer has decided to make a clean sweep. . . the annihilation of the Jews must be the necessary consequence." Hungary and Romania declare war on the U.S.; the U.S. reciprocates. British India declares war on Japan. The Japanese occupy Legazpi, the capital of Albay Province, on Luzon, the Philippines. In Malaya, the Japanese push Indian troops out of Jitra; Japanese planes bomb Penang, killing 600. In New York City, the U.S. seizes the docked French ocean liner *SS Normandie*. In Germany, Jews are forbidden to use public telephones.

In Hong Kong (a British Crown Colony leased from China), British and Canadian forces, pressured by attacking Japanese, on December 13 withdraw from the mainland portion of the territory to Hong Kong Island. Elsewhere, the Japanese continue their advance through Malaya and strengthen their positions in the northern Philippines. In the Mediterranean, British and Dutch warships attack an Italian flotilla off Cape Bon, Tunisia. Two Italian cruisers are sunk, with the loss of 900 crewmen.

The British light cruiser *HMS Galatea* is sunk on December 14 by German sub U-557 in the Mediterranean off Alexandria, Egypt. The Japanese continue their advance through Malaya.

December 15 sees action in the North African desert. In a clash at Gazala, Libya, Rommel's *Panzergruppe Afrika* is pushed back from its defensive line by British, Indian, New Zealand and Polish forces of the British Eighth Army. On the Eastern Front, Soviet troops retake Klin, 53 miles northwest of Moscow. From today through December 27, Nazi SS *Einsatzgruppen* (task forces) and Latvian auxiliary police and militia will massacre 2,731 Jews and 23 communists outside of Liepāja, Latvia.

On December 16, Rommel orders his forces to withdraw all the way back to El Agheila, in far western Cyrenaica, Libya, which is from where his offensive started in March. He will wait there for more men and tanks. In southeast Asia, the Japanese invade British-controlled northern Borneo (the Dutch control the southern portion of the island). Small British and Dutch military units there set fire to oil-processing and storage facilities as they withdraw. In Malaya, a second wave of Japanese invasions occurs, forcing the British garrison at Penang, on the northwest coast, to withdraw and move southward toward Singapore. In Russia, with the German attack on Moscow halted in its tracks, Field Marshal Fedor von Bock is relieved as commander of German Army Group Center because of "health problems." Hitler orders German troops on the Eastern Front to mount "fanatical resistance," and he forbids any retreats from around Moscow.

Field Marshal Günther von Kluge takes command of Army Group Center on December 17, replacing von Bock. On Ukraine's Crimean Peninsula, the Battle of Sevastopol begins. In Washington, Rear Admiral Chester Nimitz is named Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, replacing Adm. Husband Kimmel, who was removed from command in the wake of the Pearl Harbor attack. In the central Atlantic, the British light cruiser HMS Dunedin is torpedoed and sunk by German sub U-124. Off the coast of Libya, an Italian flotilla exchanges fire with British warships in the Gulf of Sidra, southeast of Malta. Neither side suffers more than minimal damage. Australian and Dutch troops occupy Portuguese Timor in the East Indies. Dutch planes sink the Japanese destroyer Shinonome off Sarawak, Borneo. Japanese troops on December 18 land on Hong Kong Island, defended by the significantly outnumbered British and Canadian garrison. In the U.S., Congress passes the War Powers Act, which authorizes the president, among other things, to censor international mail, cable, radio and other means of communication. In the U.K., Parliament passes the National Service Act, which makes every male under 50 and every adult, unmarried woman under 30 liable for national service of some sort.






