Pallone and Local Leaders to Show Solidarity Against Trump Executive Orders on Immigration

NEW BRUNSWICK/PERTH AMBOY – On Monday, January 30, in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06) and local leaders voiced their opposition to Trump's executive orders on immigration. Earlier this week, President Trump signed executive orders for construction of a Mexican border wall and targeting sanctuary cities by threatening to revoke federal funding.

President Trump has also threatened to revoke DACA (Deferring Action for Childhood Arrivals), a program implemented in 2012 by President Obama to allow certain undocumented immigrants to the United States who entered as minors to stay in the country. He is also said to be considering suspending visas from several Majority-Muslim nations. Congressman Pallone has called Trump's executive orders a "continuation of his impractical, dangerous and discriminatory beliefs." South Amboy Announces \$700,000 Budget Surplus

Ferry Terminal Project On Hold After Archeological Findings 2/1/17 Business Meeting

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - The South Amboy City Council covered a number of topics in what Council President Mickey Gross called a "very productive" business meeting.

Mayor Henry announced that the city had a \$700,000 surplus in the 2016 budget. He thanked the city council and Business Administrator Camille Tooker, and said it was time for everyone to take notice on how well the city has been doing.


"This is about four or five years in a row that we've done very well with that, and I think it's time for people to come in to look at what we have been doing and looking at our bond rating and making sure that it gets improved because what we have been doing the past few years has been incredible."

"I'd like to thank Camille for all the hard work she does, she does the day to day work here, her and [CFO] Angel Albanese put together great budgets... It's just good news that we have."

Business Administrator Camille Tooker gave an update on the ferry terminal project, which has been temporarily put on hold after construction works discovered historical ar-

"They think it is a railroad turntable where they used to turn the engines and also they found a row of not only sleeper stones but other stones that go under the sleeper stones," she said. "What they have to do is not only unearth the area where the turntable is but they also are charged with following that rail bed to see how far it goes."

"It may delay us a little, but we all have to remember it's all very important historically," she said. "Nobody thought we were going to find something like this."

"South Amboy has a rich history, especially with the railroading, and you never know what you going to find, even in South Amboy," Mayor Henry said. "Unfortunately it delayed things down there but it's not too long because the state has to come in, check out and categorize everything and we just move on from there." The city also discussed a resolution disapproving the Federal Highway Administration's request to remove the thin blue line down Broadway from Main Street to Bordentown Ave. in support of the city's police officers.

ministration released a directive that said that all towns participating needs to remove it because the blue paint used for the line is "confusing" because it's the same blue color as handicapped parking.

"We're doing this because there were over 100 police officers last year in the line of duty, it was open season on police, they've been through a lot, we want to show our support. This line does not affect any county road, state road, highway, or federal road."

The council unanimously agreed to pass the resolution so the city could send it back to the state in support of the blue line staying in place. Councilman Tom Reilly is in the process of trying to get a baseball field in the city dedicated to the late John Skarzynski. Skarzynski was a longtime official in South Amboy in multiple sports with at least 50 years of dedication to the city. Reilly asked that if anyone knows of any fields that are not dedicated to anyone or available to be dedicated to reach out. All council members were in attendance for the business meeting. The next city council meeting will be held on February 15th at 7:00 p.m.

"Looking back years ago when we first started this project, there was a memorandum of agreement between the city and State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)," Tooker said. "Under this agreement we have to have an archeological firm there constantly in case they find something. When they did find this of course SHPO was notified."




I simply will not allow that to happen – because it is my duty as Mayor to protect Perth Amboy.





SAVE LIFE Red Cross Critically Needs Donors After Winter Weather Adds to Severe Blood Shortage

Press Release 1/18/17 NEW JERSEY - Following several rounds of severe winter weather in many parts of the country, the American Red Cross urges eligible blood and platelet donors to help restock its shelves to overcome a shortage.

Since Dec. 1, about 300 blood drives across 27 states have been forced to cancel due to inclement winter weather, resulting in more than 10,500 blood and platelet donations going uncollected.

Blood donor Jim Taylor knows how it feels to have a loved one waiting for a transfusion. His son Aaron was born with a rare liver condition. In the short two months of his life, he received 115 blood products. Taylor said each transfusion gave his family more time with Aaron, so he encourages others to give.

"When the Red Cross says there is a shortage, they are not exaggerating," said Taylor. "I now know from experience that what they are saying is somewhere there is a father waiting on the donation that will save his son's life. When the Red Cross asks for help, what that means is a new dad is praying for a miracle." Cures Act Authorizes New Breed of Small Employer Health Reimbursement Arrangements (HRAs)

The 21st Century Cures Act, a new law signed late in 2016 that helps fund medical research, also provides a cure for the health insurance woes of small employers. Under this legislation, your small business may now offer standalone Health Reimbursement Arrangements (HRAs) for employees.

An HRA is a special account used to pay health care expenses, similar to the way some employers use Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs). Unlike FSAs, however, HRAs may pay for insurance costs including deductibles, co-insurance and co-payments – in addition to other qualified expenses. In this newly defined, small employer HRA, contributions are provided by the

employer as opposed to pay withdrawals determined by the employee.

HRAs are often paired with high-deductible health insurance plans. Distributions and reimbursements from HRAs used to pay for qualified expenses are completely tax-free to employees.

Previously, the Affordable Care Act (ACA), which includes an insurance mandate for employers with 50 or more full-time (or full-time equivalent) employees, effectively barred stand-alone HRAs for small employers. But now the Cures Act permits stand-alone HRAs if the following conditions are met:

• The employer has fewer than 50 employees and doesn't offer any other group health plan to employees.

• The plan is funded solely by

employer contributions.

• Typically, HRAs must offer the same basic terms for all eligible employees.

• The maximum annual employer contribution is \$4,950 per year for an HRA covering just the employee and \$10,000 that also covers family members.

• The plan must provide payment or reimbursement for qualified expenses. Documentation by employees is required.

Although the future of the Affordable Care Act is uncertain, it is expected that standalone HRAs for small employers will remain a viable option in the years to come. If interested, these new smaller employee HRAs may be offered beginning in 2017.

He is accompanied by Rashid Ali al-Gaylani, the former Iraqi leader who had tried to oust the British in 1941.

In North Africa, Rommel halts his offensive near Gazala, Libya, on February 7. In two weeks, he has regained most of the territory taken by the British Eighth Army in the latter part of 1941. Vidkun Quisling suspends Norway's constitution and establishes a dictatorship. In Washington, the government establishes the War Shipping Administration (WSA) to administer the purchasing and operation of civilian shipping tonnage needed by the U.S. to conduct the war. The agency will operate under the supervision of Vice Admiral Emory Land, head of the U.S. Maritime Commission. In the Philippines, American and Filipino troops continue their defense of the Bataan Peninsula against Japanese forces under Lt. Gen. Masaharu Homma.

On February 8, the Battle of Singapore — "The Gibraltar of the East" — begins. Approximately 36,000 troops of the Japanese 25th Army, along with elements of the Imperial Japanese Navy, begin attacking around 85,000 densely packed British, Australian, New Zealand, Indian and Malayan defenders. On the Eastern Front, the city of Kursk, Russia — captured by the Germans in November 1941 — is re-taken by the Red Army. German engineer Fritz Todt, Reich Minister for Armaments and Ammunition and a favorite of Hitler, dies in a plane crash shortly after leaving "Wolf's Lair," *Der Führer's* Eastern Front headquarters near Rastenburg, East Prussia.

Japanese forces begin crossing the Straits of Johor to invade Singapore on February 9. President Roosevelt institutes year-round Daylight Savings Time — called "War Time" throughout the U.S. It will remain in effect until Sunday, September 30, 1945. Nationalist Chinese leader Chiang Kai-shek and his wife arrive in India for a two-week visit. The seized French cruise ship, SS Normandie, docked in New York City and being converted into a U.S. troopship, catches fire and capsizes at her berth. Although probably caused by a workman doing welding, the fire is the subject of many conspiracy theories. The capsized vessel is seen — and is part of the plot — in the April 1942 Alfred Hitchcock film "Saboteur," starring Robert Cummings and Priscilla Lane.

On February 10, Adolf Hitler begins a two-day meeting with Romanian leader Ion Antonescu at the "Wolf's Lair," in East Prussia. Antonescu promises to provide large numbers of Romanian troops for the coming offensive on the Eastern Front, but asks for modern equipment as a condition for the assistance. In Burma, Japanese troops begin moving across the River Salween near Martaban. In the United Kingdom, the government begins rationing soap. The last civilian automobile moves off the assembly line of the Ford Motor Co.'s River Rouge Plant in Michigan, as the company switches to making only military vehicles.

The German battleships Scharnhorst and Gneisenau, along with the heavy cruiser Prinz Eugen, depart from Brest, France, on February 11 and dash northward through the English Channel to German ports, successfully running a British naval blockade. In the Pacific, the submarine USS Shark is sunk by the Japanese destroyer Yamakaze. It is the first American sub to be lost to anti-submarine operations in the war. On February 12, German Army Groups in the Soviet Union are renamed: Manstein's Army Group Don becomes Army Group South and Kluge's Army Group B becomes Army Group Center. In Berlin, a state funeral is held for Fritz Todt. killed in an airplane crash on February 8. Hitler attends and speaks at the services, and posthumously makes Todt the first recipient of a new decoration of honor: The German Order, the most important award the Nazi Party could bestow on an individual. At Valletta, Malta, the British destroyer HMS Maori is bombed and sunk by the Luftwaffe while moored in the Grand Harbour.
