



Activities From Ages 2 to 92

Fortunately, Perth Amboy has a ton of activities for ages 2 to 92. As a matter of fact, if I had a child, I would probably be exhausted taking them to all the activities that the City offers, many of whom are free for a nominal fee.

Some people and some Council Members have complained about the maintenance cost associated with the YMCA.

According to YMCA CEO and President Steve Jobin, the Y provides free memberships for 7th Graders, free swimming lessons for 2nd Graders, discounted memberships for all Perth Amboy Residents. Free Teen night for high school students. This is in conjunction with the Office of Recreation and is open to any high school student in the City public or private. For Seniors, there is Silver Sneakers Program which is an insurance based health and wellness program. There are also programs for people that have physical disabilities or limitations. This year there will be \$75,000 worth of scholarships for people who can't afford memberships and go through the Y-Cares Program. All city employees have a significantly reduced Y membership and a free membership for police.

There are a ton of other programs associated with the Y and we suggest you go to their website or drop by to see which ones are of interest to you or your family.

The Department of Recreation under the guidance of Ken Ortiz not only does a wonderful job keeping our youth occupied with various activities, but they also run various trips in the summertime which is open to all age groups. We particularly looking forward their trips to the Bronx Zoo

They are too numerous to list here and we suggest you contact them in person. The Senior Services start at the age of 60+. Why they call it Senior Services is beyond me because some of those activities that those Seniors do could exhaust some people of younger age.

Last year at a Council Meeting, Dianne Roman of the same department was there along with a representative from the Bergen PAC (Performing Arts Center) who was there to talk about free tickets for performances for the Perth Amboy Seniors. There are so many organizations intertwined that provide services for all age groups and a lot of these agencies work together.

We suggest you also contact the JRF and PRAHD for services for all ages and income brackets.

The Gallery on the corner of Reade and Fayette Streets is an outlet for artists to exhibit their works plus classes are offered for the public.

RBMC offers many health and wellness programs either free or at a minimal fee.

There are organizations hold heath fairs throughout the year with local businesses participating.

Everyone looks forward to Family Day, car shows and the many festivals held throughout the City.

There are a ton of musical performances at the Waterfront through various organizations in the late spring to early fall. The City prints a 4 page newsletter periodically to showcase seasonal events throughout the City. Besides being printed in our publication, the newsletter is available on the City Website, posted throughout the City on bulletin boards, in City Hall and sometimes on business windows and billboards.

Consolidation can only work if one city has an excess capacity of some

quality and the other city is lacking in this quality. Or there must be a downsizing to reduce costs, and this can be done without consolidation.

The 565 municipalities for 21 counties and 8 million people was not a problem with the 1844 state constitution. The high property taxes in NJ are the result of two facts: the high population density, and, the lack of democracy. In other places the bigger the city the higher its property taxes. In 1968 the state of New York raised its sales tax from 4% to 6% but split it equally between the state and each county. Why can't NJ allow each municipality to get the first 1% of the

sales tax and the first 1% of the income tax?

One person's vote in a city of 30,000 has more effect that a vote in a city of 300,000. The working definition of democracy is "local control". The reason a township could split into multiple municipalities is to allow each city to set its own priorities.

Has anyone calculated the advantages of consolidation with Pennsylvania to eliminate the high costs of NJ state government? Would that result in "lower property taxes and improved services"?

our Waterfront and businesses destroyed or damaged."

Corodemus then explained how Mayor Diaz saw that the Waterfront was rebuilt.

Corodemus cited Diaz's honors and distinctions including being elected to the Perth Amboy Hall of Fame, the Latina Service Award and being featured as: "The Accidental Politician."

"I understand what it is to be a woman in public service. We know famous and infamous male mayors. Diaz is the first woman mayor of Perth Amboy. She is the first woman elected Chair of the Urban Mayor Association. "

Corodemus ended her introduction with a quote from Pericles. "What you leave behind is not what is engraved in stone monuments, but what is woven into the lives of others."

With that, Mayor Wilda Diaz came up to the podium, "It's good solid change and I'm happy to see it through. We are stronger, have quality of life, investors and progressing and going to get better. The Strategic Task Force – many of our ideas were brought to the table. They assisted in formulating a 4 year guide for the City's future. Their work is a blueprint for success."

Diaz continued, "When I first came into office, the City unemployment rate was 16%; now it is cut in half. As we continue redevelopment, I believe it (unemployment rate) is coming down - not promises - not dreams - but tangible results. The new owners of Ameristeel, North Wide Capital Partnership will remediate 92 acres of land. The company plans to restore two historic structures in a \$125 million Development. We are in Phase 1 of the E-Port Building on lower State Street. The work of Code Enforcement with Developers helped to benefit the community. The general public has an opportunity to work

We're planning additional projects at 500 High Street.

"We took a devastated Waterfront with \$10 million in damage and renovated it with the capability to resist another superstorm." "We're planning to open up our beaches and our goal is to make them swimmable. Middlesex County will make the first county park in Perth Amboy. We plan to expand Rudyk Park for festivals."

and PRAHD - to improve health. In 2016, the schools gave over 60,000 lunches to kids every summer. The DPW was awarded for the education of their youth. They have an APP to aid in recycling. The emphasis on children of our City has been the central theme of my administration. I would like thank each Board of Education Member for putting the children first with the beginnings of building a new high school. The AUL Charter School is opening its doors to 7th and 8th Graders soon."

what he said about helping the low income. He wants to eliminate the CDBG funds, not just reduce them. It's an insult on our communities and we are not going to stand for it. Local programs are needed to spur the economy and it's important for our infrastructure. For every dollar of CDBG funds, it brings in \$4.00 of private funding. Communities in the State will be going from \$81.3 million in funds to zero. Job training, helping juvenile defendants, health care programs, infrastructure, rehabilitating dilapidated homes and Meals on Wheels which helps to keep people independent all rely on part of CDBG funds. We are all here collectively for the collective values of all of America. That's what the national budget should be. We are here in Perth Amboy to dramatize how these cuts will affect all communities who depend on CDBG funds. I'm on the Senate Finance Budget Committee. Trump's budget proposal of a \$54 billion increase in defense spending is not needed. We spend more on defense than the 7 biggest other countries combined: (China, Saudi Arabia, Russia, United Kingdom, India, France & Japan) with a budget of \$596 billion."

The audience members then asked a few questions. Mayor Diaz responded to one of them. "The City received \$610,000 in CDBG funds and in 2014 the City was recognized (by funds. "It provides services for youth employment which trains them for needed skills and job readiness. Many older adults are taking jobs usually held by our youth. The funds have provided youth programs for over 20,000. First time home buyers are provided with money through CDBG funds along with rehab programs that provide safe housing. Other programs which have been partially funded include Concerts by the Bay, Senior services and some programs provided by PRAHD. Funding was used for tenant based home assistant programs. The Jewish Renaissance uses some of the CDBG funds to assist in providing low rental units. \$450,000 of CDBG funds was used in improving our Tennis Courts, building a community garden and on this building. We are a City that has a lot of young families with many children. Because of this, recreation and after school programs are very important. A lot of these young families don't have the extra income for this. When you work one-onone with our youth, you know how much you are impacting them. If the CDBG funds are eliminated over 150 youth will be eliminated from the after school programs at the YMCA (according to YMCA President and CEO Steve Jobin). We are organizing with the US Conference of Mayors. I think the President would be more open after the defeat of the

Diaz continued, "Perth Amboy was named one of the youngest cities in New Jersey. (age of average citizen is under 25) Jobs with a good living wage is the bedrock of our City. The workforce develops key upcoming employment opportunities. A multi-agency partnership of half million dollars in grant funds will provide 300 hours of education at no charge to the City."

"Through the diligence of the City, we will be able to make a positive outcome. This upcoming May, there will be an expungment program. I believe everyone deserves a second chance. We're beautifying vacant areas and refining a strategic economy. It's the third year

After Diaz spoke, Senator Menendez spoke again and said that many cities are facing the same problems (as Perth Amboy). "Cutting services will have an economic effect. Ratables will go down. Private sectors need to raise their voices to say that budget cuts don't make sense. It will hurt small businesses who need the funding and capital provided by these CDBG funds."



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

The Japanese begin an all-out assault on American and Filipino forces on Bataan on April 3, 1942. In Burma, the Japanese conduct sustained aerial attacks with incendiary bombs on Burma's capital, Mandalay; the resulting firestorm kills over 2,000 civilians. As part of "Operation C," a Japanese fleet accompanying five aircraft carriers heads for the island of Ceylon off the southeast coast of India.

On April 4, ships from the British naval force protecting the Indian Ocean — five battleships and three aircraft carriers sail from Ceylon to intercept the Japanese "Operation C" force heading their way. The fleets never find each other. The Luftwaffe launches a strong raid against Kronstadt Harbor in Russia, 19 miles west of Leningrad, with the objective of destroying the Soviet fleet there. Seventy German bombers, along with 62 Stuka dive-bombers and 50 Messerschmitt Bf-109 fighters attack and damage 13 Soviet warships. However, the facility is fiercely defended by anti-aircraft guns and none of the Soviet vessels are sunk. The British cargo ship *Empire Arnold*, part of a convoy sailing from New York to Alexandria, Egypt, via Cape Town and the Suez Canal, is sunk off French Guiana by German sub U-155. Among her 10,000 tons of cargo are airplanes and tanks for the British Eighth Army in North Africa.

On Bataan, in the Philippines, the Japanese capture Mt. Samat, a key point in the Allied defense line, on April 5. Carrierlaunched airplanes of the Imperial Japanese Navy attack Colombo, Ceylon, sinking the British Royal Navy cruisers *HMS Cornwall* and *HMS Dorsetshire* southwest of the island. The destroyer *HMS Tenedos* is also sunk. In Germany, Hitler issues "Führer Directive 41," which outlines his plans for a summer offensive in Russia, code-named "Case Blue." The primary goal is to capture the oil fields in the Caucasus; the secondary goal is to capture Stalingrad. In the Pacific, the Japanese complete their invasion of Buka and Bougainville islands.

On April 6, Japanese naval vessels put several hundred troops of the 8th Special Base Force ashore at Manus Island in the Bismarck Archipelago. The Australian defenders withdraw into the jungle. The Indian naval sloop *HMIS Indus* is bombed by Japanese Mitsubishi G3M bombers off Akyab, Burma. The vessel suffers three direct hits and sinks in 35 minutes. Ten sailors are injured, but no lives are lost.

In Bombay, the Indian National Congress's Working Committee on April 7 rejects British government envoy Stafford Cripps's proposal for post-war independence for India in return for loyalty during the war. Instead, the Committee's leadership demands immediate self-government in return for continued war support. Mohandas Gandhi says that Cripps's proposal of Dominion status after the war is a "post-dated checque drawn on a crashing bank." The Luftwaffe bombs the Maltese capital of Valletta, causing much damage. The city's architecturally renowned opera house takes a direct hit and is reduced to rubble. In Lübeck, Germany, Lutheran pastor Karl Friedrich Stellbrink is arrested for criticizing Nazi rule. Within two and a half months, three Catholic priests - Johannes Prassek, Eduard Müller and Hermann Lange - are also rounded up on the same charges. Tried in June 1943, the "Lübeck Martyrs," as the four come to be known, are executed by beheading in November 1943.

Hamburg, Germany, on April 8 is bombed heavily by the RAF. The U.S. Navy's floating drydock, USS Dewey, at Mariveles, on the Bataan Peninsula in the Philippines, is scuttled to prevent its capture and use by the Japanese. In Canada, the government creates the Park Steamship Co. to build Canadianflagged, steam-powered merchant vessels that are the equivalent of American Liberty ships. In the U.S., the War Production Board bans all non-essential construction to conserve building materials. It also restricts the use of wool, rayon, cotton, and other materials in garments, and publishes maximum allowable lengths for jackets, coats, and skirts. The Imperial Japanese Navy launches an air raid on Trincomalee, Ceylon, on April 9. The Allies lose three ships off the east coast of the island in the attack: the British aircraft carrier HMS Hermes, the British corvette HMS Hollyhock, and the Australian destroyer HMAS Vampire. In the Philippines, Bataan falls to the Japanese. The "Bataan Death March" begins as between 60,000 and 80,000 captive Filipino and American POWs in weakened physical condition are forced to march 97 miles north to Camp O'Donnell, a detention center that had been a Philippines Army post. As many as 650 Americans and between 5,000 and 18,000 Filipinos die before reaching their destination. With Bataan conquered, the final point of Allied resistance on Luzon becomes the island of Corregidor, in the middle of Manila Bay.
