# Residents Advise Council on Stipulation for PILOT Projects

5/8/17 Caucus & 5/10/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Robert Benecke from Benecke Economics came before the Council to give a presentation on various types of PILOT (Payment in Lieu of Taxes) Programs. PILOT Presentations have been given before the Council at least three previous times.

Benecke explained, "There are three types of PILOT Programs:

- 1.) NJ Housing (Housing Authorities)
- 2.) Long Term Tax Exemption (Redevelopment and UEZ)
- 3.) Short Term Tax Abatements

Benecke explained, "In regards to the Bridge the \$2.2 million that the tenants pay would the City Coffers that could be used for the City infrastructure facilities."

Benecke continued, "With the (Bridgeport) Distribution Center, you have greater flexibility and it can offset the annual service charges. If the units are not occupied, then you don't receive the money. You receive more money with the PILOT Program than without."

Annie Hindenlang came forward to let the Council know how important PILOT Programs are. "400 people showed up for 50 Managerial positions at the recent Target Job Fair. Bridgeport has been a great partner and has brought a lot to the table. Financial agreements have not been finalized yet, so it can be adjusted."

Both Benecke and Hindenlang emphasized that money can be earmarked and it does not have to go into the general fund and there will be a \$193.00 savings for the tax-payers with this PILOT Program.

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez mentioned the surplus money that the City has had each year. "They still find a way to spend that money."

Councilman Fernando Irizar-

ry reminded the Council, "The \$5 million surplus money from last year - \$2 million came from grants."

Benecke complimented the City Council on how well the City's money is spent.

During the public portion, Resident Reinaldo Aviles said, "I'm not against PILOTs if we can get 1000 jobs out of it. If we can give away tax ratables, let's see what we can give residents. A lot of time, they (contractors/developers) say that they can go to other communities. We should not automatically say no to PILOT Programs."

Rector Street Resident Mark Achamizo made a suggestion pertaining to the PILOTs stating, "I recommend sustainable energy be built into the contracts. Maybe donations of solar panels. We need to work to be a self sustainable community."

During the Council Comments, Councilman Irizarry showed his frustration and asked,"When will the PILOT (for E-Port) be put on the agenda? We've had several presentations on this program."

Council President Bill Petrick responded, "We still have time and it can be discussed in closed session."

# South Amboy Adopts 2017 Budget

Business Administrator Camille Tooker Retires; Stacey Kennedy Named New B.A.

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - The city of South Amboy officially adopted the 2017 Budget at last Wednesday's city council meeting.

South Amboy's Chief Financial Officer Angel Albanese and City Auditor Gary Higgins were on hand to explain the results of this year's budget and answer any questions the council or residents of South Amboy may have had. Higgins discussed the highlights of the budget, including a healthy appropriation cap and tax levy cap.

"You're under two caps, an appropriation cap and a tax levy cap," Higgins explained. "You're \$1,013,000 under the appropriation cap, which is very substantial. The city is operating properly without the additional \$1 million in appro-

priations."

"On top of that you have a 2 percent tax levy cap and this budget is presented at approximately \$447,000 under the 2 percent tax levy cap," Higgins continued. "You're in full compliance with the appropriation cap and tax levy cap. The budget is in good shape and you can act and proceed to

adopt if you wish."

After a brief public portion of the hearing, the city unanimously approved to adopt the budget. Council President Mickey Gross and Mayor Fred Henry praised the hard work that the city's government put

"A lot of times in government we get criticized and the words sometimes used is 'rubberstamped'," Gross said. "It is not rubberstamped. I want to just personally thank everyone who participated in the process. We worked hard on it... certainly it's not a perfect budget but it's a budget I'm proud of."

"My administration continues to work hard for citizens of South Amboy," Mayor Henry said. "The council has reviewed it and questioned it and they commented on this year's budget and I want to thank them for their approval of this and the cooperation that we've had."

"This is a budget that I believe that the increase is one penny on the budget, which I believe comes out to about \$26 a year. I want thank especially Angel and Camille for her last budget."

Business Administrator Camille Tooker recently announced her retirement and attended her final meeting on Wednesday. The council and Mayor Henry praised Tooker's hard work and commitment to the city and wished her all the best in her retirement.

"I would like to thank Camille on behalf of South Amboy and definitely and mostly on behalf of myself," Councilwoman Christine Noble said.

## **South Amboy**

"You were a great help to me when I first came on, thank you very much, I'm going to miss you."

"You really don't know how hard that she works," City Attorney John Lanza said. "Even when she was very ill, she still continued to work on the behalf of the city and fulfill her responsibilities. It was my privilege to work with you all these years and I thank you."

"Camille is more than just a Business Administrator...she has been a friend," Mayor Henry said. "She has given her soul to the city of South Amboy and I can't imagine anyone giving more than Camille has done over the years."

Tooker thanked Mayor Henry and the council and reflected on her time in South Ambov.

"I appreciate the opportunity to come and work for the citizens," Tooker said. "The best thing I loved about my job is I met so many wonderful people, both my co-workers and residents. You wouldn't believe how many people have called me. That touches me because when you make a difference to a person that's what really matters."

Amidst the budget being approved and Tooker's last meeting, the council also unanimously voted to appoint Stacey Kennedy South Amboy's Business Administrator. Kennedy has served as the Secretary to the Mayor and Business Administrator since

2014.

"This position is of the utmost importance and must go to someone in whom I have complete confidence," Mayor Henry said. "I have worked with Ms. Kennedy these past few years, I have witnessed her professionalism and confidence she has within herself. She has proven herself over and over again how capable she is to successfully occupy the office as our Business Administrator."

"There are big shoes to fill, Camille has done a great job over the years," he continued. "Stacey has worked not as a secretary but almost as an equal down in the office. She knows the ins and outs of everything going on and I know she will approach this in a very professional manner. I wish her well."

"I have the utmost confidence in Stacey having worked with her for over three years," Tooker said. "I've seen her abilities, I've seen how she handles herself, I've seen the knowledge that she's garnered through redevelopment and planning board, and most importantly I've seen her put all that knowledge into action."

Councilwoman Zusette Dato was unable to attend the meeting in person, but voted on the budget and appointment of Business Administrator Kennedy via phone conference. The next city council meeting will be held on June 21st at 7:00 p.m.

# Residents' Pleas 5/10/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - During the Public Comments, Resident Jeremy Baratta questioned the absence of Code Enforcement Personnel stating, "I thought you (the Council) requested at Monday's Caucus Meeting (5/8/17) that Code Enforcement be here (tonight)."

Business Administrator was illegal hadam Cruz told Baratta, "We said they will be here at the next Caucus Meeting." was illegal had nell Street."

Resident Volume to spea

Resident Ken Balut talked about Resolution R-194-5/17 - awarding a contract to Water Loss Systems, Inc. for a leak detection survey.

The amount of the contract was a total of \$18,525

Balut wanted to thank the Council for putting a bid out. He also had a question about Communication No. 3 where Council President Petrick asked the Business Administrator to provide the Council with a report of a fire at 524 Cornell Street. "Were any summons issued? Code Enforcement is not doing an investigation. You see graffiti and no

one gets a summons. Code Enforcement puts on blinders. Someone's going to die and it's going to be your fault. Code Enforcement loses files on C/O's (Certificate of Occupancy)."

B.A. Cruz answered one of Balut's concerns, "Yes, there was illegal housing at 524 Cornell Street."

Resident Vince Mackiel came up to speak in reference to Communications No. 7 & No. 8 pertaining to Buckeye and also Langan Engineering and Environmental Services. He wanted to know, "What are the site improvements (Flood Hazard Area). There are booms (temporary floating barriers used to contain an oil spill; they are used to reduce the possibility of polluting shorelines and other resources, and to help make recovery easier) down there which indicate a spill. The Mayor and others are looking at other sources of renewable energy. We need jobs, but we need to make sure we have a cleanup of the area."

At this time, Deputy Police Chief Larry Cattano said, "Booms are in the area in case of spills or leaks. There has not been anything ongoing that hs been reported."

When it came to the last Public Portion, Jeremy Baratta was visibly upset about the elevators and fire alarms that were still not working at 675 New Brunswick Avenue. "This is an ongoing problem. I thought we had standards when it comes to these issues. The Police are always coming here to the Meetings. Next to the Fire Department, the Code Enforcement Department is very important."

B.A. Cruz addressed Baratta's concerns, "The circuit board on the elevator went down. It's on order. It will take about 5 days to get it. (At the time of the 5/10/17 Council Meeting). We go with a third party for elevator inspections because of the amount of elevators we have in the City."

# Three Presentations at the 5/3/17 BOE Meeting

Board commenced business at
5:30 p.m. and immediately
went into closed session to begin the open meeting at 7:48

There were 3 presentations at the Meeting.

The first presentation was by Student Brandon Cisneros. Cisneros gave a presentation on the scholarship tool and finder APP SCHOLLY. This APP helps students find a scholarship based on their profile and matches it to find scholarships that they may be eligible for. It was first introduced on Shark Tank by creator Christopher Gray. Gray won \$1.3 million in scholarships through a painstaking process. He wanted to make it easier to find scholarships so he created the APP SCHOLLY.

Cisneros stated, "It took me two weeks on Google and I still didn't find what I needed. Within 5 minutes after filling out a profile on SCHOLLY, I was able to find scholarships. Many people don't have internet access. There is the Give

SCHOLLY Program where sponsors can pay for the SCHOLLY Membership."

The second presentation was on the on the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Program and given by Dr. Ashanti Holley. "The 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Program is the beacon of change, support and success."

The presentation included a short promotional video featuring students and teachers in the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Program. The students and teachers in the film emphasized the closeness of the relationship between teachers and students and the support the students receive from teachers. It also featured success stories from both the teachers and students. It emphasized the level of rigor in the program and what was expected out of the students. Students stated in the video that there "...were a lot of trips to colleges and that you need a chance to be what you want to be."

Dr. Holley was assisted by Student Delilah Morales who stated, "Kindness of teachers helped me come out of my shell. I was able to go to St. Peter's University with the debate team and received the Best Delegate Award. "We work hard to combat stereotyping."

Board Secretary Derek Jess and Supervisor Dr. David Roman gave the last presentation which was on the Board of Education 2017-2018 Budget.

The total budget for 2017-2018 school year is \$315,648,042 with \$27,713,696 or 8.4% coming from taxes. State Aid is \$186,647,166 or 59.13%.

Dr. Roman stated that each student costs 26.5 cents a day or \$8.00 a month and gave the financial position of the Board, "Over the next 3 years, all of our debt *(regarding previous bonds)* will be paid."

"The Dual Language Program will be increased to the 5th Grade." Roman also stated, "We're meeting biweekly with the SDA (School Development Authority) to bring a robust program to the new High School. The plan is for the new high school to open in 2021 at no cost to the Perth Amboy Taxpayers."

Caba continued, "Poor people get fined when they have violations on their property, but not Kushner and his dump. Kushner promised all of these amenities. They (the people (contractors/developers) will get a PILOT because of a weak administration. It's your (the Council) job to look out for the residents, and not the developers."

Resident Ken Balut came up to speak, He was concerned about the many houses that are being put up in small plots of land. "They want to put houses between two houses on my block. (Bruck Avenue). Kushner gave a \$100,000 to a PAC in Jersey City. Who is negotiating PARA contracts? Now we're having a contractor on PARA. It was easier to find money (given to the former Mayor). People who pay money to your campaign (some of the Council Members) took a cut of 15%. Many contractors who make campaign contributions get City contracts. We send out bids on items that have a low cost, but not on million dollar contracts."

# Council Comments 5/10/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Councilman Fernando Gonzalez was pleased to report that the last BID Meeting he attended they talked about extensive programs. "I think they are moving in the right direction. But they should look at increased lighting (in the downtown area). They should also improve their dialogue with PSEG because the citizens and merchants would appreciate it."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry said, "I want to know what work is being done on State Street."

B.A. Cruz answered, "Elizabeth Town Gas is still replacing gas mains."

Irizarry wondered, "Will the road (State Street) be put back the way it was before the work started?"

Cruz responded, "We will do our due diligence to make sure that the roads will be put back as close as possible before digging began."

Irizarry went on to mention Amboy Avenue, "That road is okay, but nothing has been done yet with New Brunswick Avenue."

Councilman Joel Pabon was concerned about the Youth Complex Field (by Willow Pond) and Rudyk Park. "They're lagging behind in maintenance."

Cruz responded, "We are resurfacing and DPW are redirecting funds for this."

Cruz also made additional comments on the roads that have been dug up. He reminded the Council that it takes about 90 days for the material to settle.





## Movie Review: Alien Covenant

"You're right, we shouldn't have come. We don't belong here."

The Alien saga continues in "Alien: Covenant." Starship Covenant is carrying a group of colonists to a distant planet with the hopes of starting a new life. While everyone is in hyper-sleep for the long journey (except android Walter (Michael Fassbender), the captain and some colonists are accidentally killed while in cryosleep due to a fire in the cryo-sleep chambers. The remaining crew realize that they have to repair their ship to continue their journey. After they repair the ship, the colonists decide stop in nearby planet which has a breathable atmosphere and everything that they could use. However, the climate seems strange. There's plenty of plant life, but no animals - not even any insects. The new Captain doesn't think that the crew has faith in him and he's unsure of himself as well. The crew find a hostile group of hybrid Aliens (similar to the



ones we know). They discover that someone is doing experiments on these Aliens. These Aliens are extremely hostile to humans. Daniels (Katherine Waterston), the deceased Captain's wife must deal with her own personal issues, who to trust as well as the Aliens.

Director Ridley Scott of the original Alien films returns to the franchise with this new movie. The film has all the gritty style that the original film had. The spaceships are kind of dirty along with the equipment that looks like it's been used to give a realistic feel.

The group of actors who are in the Starship's crew have an interesting chemistry. The alien creatures look completely different than in previous Alien films including Prometheus.

My problems with "Alien: Covenant" is the lack of original characters. You don't feel scared for the colonists and there is a lot of predictability. The exterior shots that of the planet are quite a sight to behold and the special effects are great. There's a lot of blood and guts, but you'd expect that in an Alien movie. • More than \$3 billion for healthcare infrastructure, to re vive the successful Hill-Burton hospital infrastructure program, fund medical facility infrastructure in Indian Country, support state labs fighting Zika and other infectious diseases, and support community based health care infrastructure; and

•\$40 billion for the deployment of secure and resilient broadband, to expand access for communities nationwide while protecting privacy and promoting security by design;

"Investing in our nation's infrastructure makes sense for everyone. It will provide good jobs for the skilled men and women of the unions I am proud to represent. It will improve our local economies, and keep our nation competitive in an ever globalizing economy," said President Bill Mullen of the NJ Building & Construction Trades Council. 



# This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

Spurred by the torpedoing of two of its ships by German Uboats — one off Florida and the other in the Gulf of Mexico — Mexico declares war on Germany, Italy and Japan on May 22, 1942. Near Townsville, Queensland, in northeastern Australia, around 600 African-American members of the 96th Battalion, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, riot in their camp. Fed up with continual racial abuse from some of their white officers, the soldiers mutiny, machine-gunning the officers' tents. Australian troops are called out to keep the rioters contained within the camp. In the resulting eight-hour rampage, one person is killed and dozens are severely injured. In the U.S., the War Production Board announces that new tires and safety razors will not be available to the average citizen for at least two years. In Boston, Red Sox star outfielder Ted Williams enlists in the U.S. Navy's aviation program.

On May 23, tanks of Gen. Ewald von Kleist and Gen. Friedrich von Paulus meet up at Balakleya, southeast of Kharkiv, Ukraine. They have encircled most of the Soviet 6th and 57th Armies and have caused over 200,000 casualties.

U.S. Army Gen. Joseph "Vinegar Joe" Stilwell and his party arrive in New Delhi, India, from Manipur on May 24, after their long retreat from Burma. In London, two gatherings — one organized by the Communist Party, the other by the Daily Express newspaper — adopt resolutions calling for a second front to be opened in Europe. In Russia, the Germans begin a six-day sweep along the Bryansk-Vyazma railway line southwest of Moscow. Thousands of anti-Nazi partisans will be captured and killed.

The Japanese submarine tender Asahi is torpedoed and sunk in the South China Sea on May 25 by the submarine USS Salmon.

In Libya, Lt. Gen. Erwin Rommel on May 26 launches a major combined German-Italian offensive to take the Allies' Gazala Line, which runs from Gazala, near the coast, some 50 miles south to Bir Hakeim. Rommel's goal is to move around the line, then head north and capture Tobruk. In London, the foreign secretaries of the Soviet Union and the United Kingdom conclude a treaty whereby each party agrees that no peace will be arranged with the Axis unless approved by the other.

Rommel's troops on May 27 have reached to just south of Bir Hakeim and are poised to turn north. They are held up, however, by a vicious defense by the 1st Free French Brigade. In Prague, Czechoslovakia, Reinhard Heydrich, Reich Protector of Bohemia and Moravia and one of the main architects of the "Final Solution to the Jewish Question," is ambushed and severely wounded in a hand-grenade attack by two Czech Army sergeants. The two attackers escape, although one subsequently kills himself rather than be captured; the other is killed in a gun battle with troops hunting for him. The aircraft carrier USS Yorktown, damaged in the Battle of the Coral Sea, limps into Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, for hurried repairs. In Tokyo, Prime Minister Hideki Tojo, addressing the Japanese Diet, reviews the status of the war and encourages India to strive for independence by rising against the British.

On May 28 in New York, Italian opera singer Ezio Pinza is released from confinement at Ellis Island. He had been detained there for three months after being arrested on suspicion of being an enemy alien and supporting the Axis. In Occupied Belgium, the wearing of a yellow badge becomes compulsory for Jews.




