Councilman Reilly Looks to Help South Amboy Youth Succeed

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - Councilman Tom Reilly discussed ways to get South Amboy's youth involved in the city's day-to-day operations at last Wednesday's city business meeting.

On August 15th Reilly, along with Mayor Fred Henry and Business Administrator Stacey Kennedy, will meet with South Amboy's Board of Education to put the final touches on the city's new co-op program. The co-op will give high school students the opportunity to work at city hall and gain valuable experience in the work place.

"We're ironing out the details of how many students were going to incorporate into city hall," Reilly said. "Joanne Katko in the Tax Office asked me about the program and she would really like to have someone in there with her as part of the co-op program. That's actually a good thing that we have somebody stepping up and showing an interest in bringing a student in here and teaching them."

"Hopefully we can iron out the details and get ourselves up and running for September," he added.

Reilly also spoke about the

city's fourth and fifth grade government club and pitched the idea of bringing them to city hall to shadow the city's council for a day.

"We would have kids from that government club come over and spend a day in city hall, acting in compacity of the Business Administrator, the Mayor, the council, then have them come to the council meeting that night," Reilly said. "Maybe we can have them draw up a piece of legislation, something silly, and let them do it."

"I think it would be a further gesture that we're showing in-



FY18 Budget Increases are 'A Major Win' For NJ Catholic Schools

While the unfortunate delay in passing the FY18 state budget certainly held our collective attention for several days this summer and caused concern for many, the final budget approved and signed by Governor Christie on July 4 was well worth the wait for Catholic schools, here in the Diocese of Metuchen and throughout New Jersey.

After months of letter writing, emailing, calling and meeting in person with our elected officials, the approved budget includes a much needed and long anticipated increase in funding for non-public schools in the areas of transportation, security, nursing and technology. By working together and advocating for the good of all Catholic school communities, we have earned a major win.

In the area of transportation, we are very optimistic that the long-overdue increase from \$884 to \$1000 per student allowance will improve access to bus transportation this academic year and in the future. Restored and increased funds

for nursing services will enable our schools to better afford nursing staff. With money allotted for technology and security, our schools will be in a better position to consistently update technology in our schools and add or maintain safety features to help keep students harm free.

On behalf of Bishop James F. Checchio and the diocesan Office of Schools, I would like publically to extend our sincerest thanks to all pastors and principals, who oversee our 23 elementary and four Catholic high schools, for their tireless efforts to coordinate and mobilize a grassroots effort in their respective school communities. I also extend heartfelt gratitude to all of our Catholic school students, their families and other supporters for doing their part to ensure that our voices were heard and positive change was enacted that will benefit thousands of nonpublic school students across the state. Our appreciation further extends to New Jersey Catholic Conference, who advocates on our behalf in legislative matters, as well as the many legislators who listened to our serious concerns and, ultimately, whose bi-partisan efforts yielded a fair and just outcome for nonpublic students and their families.

As we enjoy this moment of victory, we also remain keenly aware of the need to continue in our ongoing education, advocacy and outreach efforts, so that our state lawmakers and fellow resident taxpayers know that families who choose to send their child or children to a nonpublic school save the State of New Jersey over \$1.8 billion annually. These families pay federal, state and local taxes which support their local education system. Most rely on the same essential non-academic services provided by their state, county and resident school districts that are afforded to their public school counterparts.

Today, we are busy gearing up for back-to-school activities and this is great news for those families who have chosen or are considering a Catholic school education for their children.

In the days ahead, we are committed to engaging in a continued partnership with the various public school districts in Middlesex, Somerset, Hunterdon and Warren counties, which serve the many public and nonpublic school students of the Diocese of Metuchen. Together, we will work to ensure the provision of student transportation for our Catholic school students remains in place during the upcoming academic year and in years to come.



Perth Amboy Fire Department Remembers Firefighter Richard W. Leonard







Is Your HSA a Retirement Tool? The Good, The Bad, & The Ugly

Health Savings Accounts (HSAs) are a great way to pay for medical expenses, and since unused funds roll over from year to year, the account can also provide a source of retirement funds in addition to other plans like 401(k)s or IRAs. But be aware that HSAs have significant disadvantages when compared to other retirement investment tools.

The Good

- HSAs work best when they are used to pay for qualified medical expenses. Neither your original contributions to an HSA nor your investment earnings are taxed when used this way.
- There is no required distribution after you reach age 70½, like there is with 401(k)s and IRAs.

The Bad

- You can only contribute to an HSA if you have a high deductible health insurance plan. This means you will pay more out of pocket each year when you need to use health services.
- Annual contributions to HSAs are limited to \$3,400 a year for individuals and

\$6,750 a year for families (add \$1,000 for people aged 55 or older).

• HSAs typically have fewer investment options compared with other investment tools including 401(k)s and IRAs. They also often have high management and administrative fees.

The Ugly

- Before you reach age 65, non-medical withdrawals from HSAs come with a whopping 20 percent penalty, plus they are taxed as income.
- Even after age 65, both contributions and earnings are taxed when they are withdrawn for non-medical expenses. In this way, HSAs compare unfavorably with 401(k)s and IRAs, which end their early withdrawal period earlier, at age 59½. They also have lower early withdrawal penalties of just 10 percent.

HSAs are a powerful tool to help manage the ever-rising costs of health care. Knowing the rules and the costs associated with them can help you position an HSA with your other retirement options.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On August 7, 1942, the Guadalcanal Campaign begins in the Pacific: 19,000 U.S. Marines make amphibious landings on the islands of Guadalcanal, Gavutu, Florida, Tanambogo and Tulagi in the Solomons. In Europe, members of the Dutch Resistance bomb a railway line outside of Rotterdam. The formation of a Palestine Regiment within the British Army is announced. Separate Arab and Jewish battalions will be created within the regiment. U.S. Marines capture the still-under-construction Japanese airfield at Lunga Point, Guadalcanal, on August 8. They rename it Henderson Field in honor of Maj. Lofton Henderson, USMC, the first Marine Corps aviator killed during the Battle of Midway in June 1942. On New Guinea, the Japanese attempt to capture Port Moresby, but are repulsed by Australian troops. In Switzerland, Gerhart Riegner, Geneva representative of the World Jewish Congress, sends a telegram to the U.S. vice-consul there, informing the Allies for the first time of the Nazis' plan for a "Final Solution:" the systematic extermination of all Jews in Germanoccupied territory. The "Riegner Telegram," as it comes to be called, is received mostly with disbelief by the Allies. In Bombay, Mohandas Gandhi delivers his "Quit India" speech, urging followers to engage in civil disobedience to force the British out of India. Gandhi and most of the other leaders of the All-India Congress Committee are jailed by the British the next day.

The overnight Naval Battle of Savo Island, Solomon Islands, ends on August 9 in a Japanese victory. The Americans lose three cruisers and the Australians, one, all sunk, with the Japanese suffering only light damage to three cruisers. In the Atlantic, Convoy SC-94, which has already lost one vessel, loses seven more British, U.S. and Dutch ships, torpedoed by German U-boats. In India, the incarceration by the British of Mohandas Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru and other activists for Indian independence, causes widespread rioting — despite Gandhi's personal and public commitment to, and calls for, nonviolence. In Russia, the German 1st Panzer Army captures the Maykop oilfields. However, these have been left burning furiously by the Red Army, leaving little refined fuel to be found there. Krasnodar and Yeysk, a port on the Sea of Azov, are captured by the Germans.

The British convoy "Pedestal" (14 merchant vessels, two battleships, three aircraft-carriers, 14 destroyers and three anti-aircraft cruisers), which left Britain on August 2 en route to Malta, reaches the Straits of Gibraltar on August 10, where it is reinforced with three heavy cruisers and 11 more destroyers. For a time, the aircraft-carrier *HMS Furious* joins the convoy with a complement of 38 Supermarine Spitfires that are to be flown off towards the embattled island. In the Pacific, the submarine USS *S-44* sinks the Japanese heavy cruiser *Kako* off Kavieng, New Ireland.


On August 11, the "Pedestal" convoy is spotted by a German U-boat. Over the coming days, 21 German and Italian submarines, nearly 800 aircraft, 23 torpedo boats, and units of the Italian fleet move in to intercept the Malta-bound convoy. In Vichy France, Prime Minister Pierre Laval announces: "The hour of liberation for France is the hour of Germany's victory in the war." Laval also reveals that 150,000 French workers will be sent to Germany in exchange for the return of 50,000 French prisoners of war. Mobs continue to riot in many Indian cities. British troops are called out to try to maintain order. Many injuries and some deaths are reported.

U.S. forces begin expanding bases in the New Hebrides Islands on August 12. Especially important is the port of Espiritu Santo, which has an airfield. In Europe, the German Army approaches Stalingrad. Churchill arrives in Moscow for talks with Stalin; Averell Harriman represents the U.S. during the conference. During four days of often-acrimonious discussions, Stalin is eventually forced to accept the reality that there will be no "Second Front" during 1942. SS *Reichsführer* Heinrich Himmler is made responsible for maintaining order in Occupied Norway and Denmark. In Los Angeles, movie star Clark Gable, aged 41, enlists in the U.S. Army Air Forces as a private, expressing his wish to become a tail gunner on a bomber.

On August 13, Lt. Gen. Bernard Montgomery replaces Gen. Neil Ritchie as commander of the British Eighth Army.






