Not in Agreement/ Not Representing PARA

9/11/17 Caucus & 9/13/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - At the Caucus Meeting. 9/11/17 Councilman Fernando Irizarry had a comment regarding R-364-9/17 – Requesting permission for the Dedication by Rider for the Bridge Perth Amboy I Urban Renewal Trust permitted under the Tax Exemption Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 20-1 et seq.

Irizarry said, "I am not in agreement with this resolution. It's too vague and ambiguous. Break it down to percentages and uses. It's not fiscally responsible. We should be paying down the debt and not using this for property tax relief for the homeowners. We will just have a temporary financial high."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez said, "I agree somewhat with Mr. Irizarry, but taxes went up by \$300. Our people can't afford to live here."

Irizarry countered, "This is only giving the taxpayers a band-aid. The City is paying interest on the debt they owe."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz added to the discussion, "It's the Council's decision on how the revenue obtained from Bridgeport is used. Our municipal taxes were 0%. The tax increase mentioned by Councilman Gonzalez was because of the School Board's Budget."

CFO Jill Goldy added, "The City doesn't have the ability to pay as you go."

Resolution R-364 was voided on the agenda for the regular 9/13/17 Council Meeting.

At the 9/11/17 Caucus, Business Administrator Adam Cruz reported that PARA has hired Joseph Maraziti LLP to contact Kushner Developers about the problems on Rector Street.

Council President Bill Petrick

spoke up and said, "The Council would like to have more say in this matter."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez said, "I am concerned because the developer has been doing some work that puts the City in danger."

Annie Hindenlang said, "Kushner Representatives had meetings with the Landings Residents stating they were representing PARA."

Law Director Peter King asked, "Has there been any written documents?"

Hindenlang responded, "We (PARA) will notify the Landings Residents that the Kushner Representatives that met with them did not represent PARA."

During the public portion, some of the Landings Condo owners came up to speak. One

SOUTH AMBOY - Councilman Thomas Reilly discussed the results (pros and cons) of the recent study that Rutgers did on the City of South Amboy. Reilly explained the last time South Amboy drew up a Master Plan was in 2004. "The Rutgers Study indicated that a walkway should be extended to the Waterfront. Parking problems still exist in the City. More signage is needed to highlight the historic sights and points of interest. The **Business Improvement District** and Historical Commission are positive aspects. The Arts Council continues to promote different programs, but more adult programs are needed. We used to have a men's basketball and softball league. Other items that can make South Amboy more attractive would be community gardens and possibly a farmer's market. The Façade Grant Program will continue to help businesses improve their exterior appearances and sidewalks. Code violations need to be addressed. Partnerships with grocery chains should be established. We should think about using local farmers with vendors on Main Street and Broadway. We

should reduce some of the reg-

ulatory value (restraints). We should improve on the Transit Village. These are just some of the items that Rutgers recommended."

He mentioned the upcoming business breakfasts.

Councilman Brian McLaughlin agreed with Reilly's comments. He congratulated the Fire Department coming in First Place at the Firemen's Convention in Wildwood. He also recognized the First Aid Squad who placed First Place in their category. "Both Departments still need more volunteers."

Councilwoman Zusette Dato congratulated the Arts Council for a job well done. "I went to the Duprees Concert that was held at the High School and it was wonderful. A lot of out-oftowners attended. On Saturday, October 28, 2017, there will be a Frankie Valli tribute concert."

Council President Mickey Gross congratulated the South Amboy Fire Department for their championship win in Wildwood. "They are always first in the town and in my heart. I also want to congratulate the ladies running the Arts Council. They will be having a

Handicapped Accessibility a Problem 9/13/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Resident Stephanie Márquez-Villafañe wanted to thank the Mayor and Council, "I talked to her in regards to making November Lung Cancer Awareness Month. Because of Mayor Diaz's efforts, a resolution was drawn up and passed by the Council to make this happen."

Stephanie then spoke about the challenges she's having as handicapped individual. "Outsiders of the handicapped community can be ignorant. I am disappointed with Code Enforcement. King Plaza, which was built in 2008 does have adequate handicapped or van parking accommodations for their tenants. Barriers are not provided. I've met with Deputy Police Chief Cattano and other police representatives about this problem."

asked Stephanie, "Do you have written documentation pertaining to meetings you've had with different departments pertaining to this issue?"

Stephanie answered, "Yes. I also have maps showing where handicapped accessibility should be and hasn't been implemented, yet."

Petrick continued, "Different agreements are made and can we (the Council) get maps that state which are County streets and roads?"

Stephanie replied, "The City is not updated to ADA Laws when it comes to our streets and sidewalks."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz stated, "I met with Stephanie and her mother, and changes were made in the marina regarding handicapped accessibility. We looked at the

Council President Petrick library, too, but it's only been a month that we have started working with Stephanie and we will continue to do so. And yes, we have encountered problems with HUD Housing and County Roads when it comes to ADA compliance."

Resident Barbara Sottilaro came up to speak and mentioned that the library was supposed to be handicapped accessible 20 years "Renovations were made and the leaking stopped, but the site is still not ADA accessible. The City raises money for fireworks, but not to make the library ADA accessible. The people who sponsor the fireworks can give to the library."

Council President Bill Petrick mentioned, "The elevator (that was supposed to be built)

Celtic Fest coming up soon.

City Engineer Mark Rasimowicz gave an update on the improvements on lower Main Street. "RFQ's (Request for Quotation) were submitted for the reconstruction of Main Street. There must be an inspection, bids to be open, and plans designed. The County went out to bid for this work. Hopefully it will start sometime this year. With the Ferry, conceptional designs are being drawn up, especially for the bulkheads. The remediation is almost complete. Monitoring of the wells is being done. There's also going to be reconstruction on Bordentown Avenue from South Pine to Mason Street. A funding grant from the State for \$300,000 will be

used for this."

Mayor Henry then spoke about another grant for Pine Street, "Sidewalks and curbs will be part of the improvement. Our infrastructure is very important and we can't let it go. There are RFQ's out for the placement of the Ferry Terminal. It's a long ongoing process. In the long run, the Ferry will help the people here. I also want to congratulate the Arts Council for their concerts which bring people to town. Visitors can see what we offer such as dining and other attractions. The Fire Department always does South Amboy proud. The Department tells me they just try and I tell them you don't try – you just do it."

During the Public Portion, Church Street Resident Mark Messenger came up to speak. He congratulated the Council on some upcoming projects that look exciting. "... But back in March, I complained about a dilapidated property at 221 First Street. The condition of this building has not improved. The owner put it up for sale and just covered the roof with a tarp, which is falling down."

Council President Mickey Gross responded, "We'll inform Code Enforcement to look at this property."

Resident Barbara Pasternak came up next to speak and questioned, "How many units are being built for the Woodmont Property?"

Mayor Henry responded, "126 units consisting of one and two bedroom apartments with parking underneath the building."

Pasternak was concerned because she felt the buildings were too close together and presented a fire hazard. She then asked about the concrete structures across from those units.

City Engineer Mark Rasimowicz responded, "It's another

building. It's part of Woodmont. All of this went through the Planning Board."

Pasternak went on to mention, "With all these buildings, there will be a lot of traffic on these small streets."

Councilwoman Dato responded, "There were actually two ways to leave that area which involves John O'Leary Boulevard and Bordentown Avenue. All these structures must go through the Planning Board. All of the meetings are open to the public and publicized beforehand in the newspapers."

Mayor Henry added, "The Redevelopment Agency also made a presentation about the Woodmont Development."

Dato then mentioned how good of a neighbor Woodmont has been to the City of South Amboy, "The land that the YMCA was built on was donated by Woodmont."

Resident Ken Feeley came up to speak. He agreed with Councilman Reilly that a farmer's market will be good for the town. He then mentioned Deekers Farm. "We need another food chain market instead of all of these Krauzers."

Mayor Henry said, "The property (where the former Foodtown/Key Foods/C-Town was located) is an odd shaped lot."

Feeley then continued, "People are getting tired of all of these houses." He then turned around and addressed Mr. Messenger and said, "You need to speak directly to your Council who represents your ward regarding the house in ill shape. This Councilman will help you out."

Councilwoman Dato addressed Feeley in regards to pursuing having another supermarket in the City. "The three supermarkets that were here weren't financially successful. No one was supporting them."

Feeley responded, "It's a failure brought on by the owners of these stores."

Dato went on to explain, "The Mayor had reached out to chains and they always look at the demographics of an area."

Council President Mickey Gross remarked, "The supermarket chains said there's not enough traffic in the City to succeed."

Feeley reiterated, "Parking is still a problem. You can build and bring in businesses that bring in traffic. We have beat this subject to the ground."

Dato wanted to respond to a statement that Feeley made earlier. "It's unfair to take a swipe at a former Councilman who is not here to defend himself. That former Councilman has asked many questions while he was here."

Feeley responded, "You don't know what he's done to me. I will give you that. Maybe it was inappropriate to bring that up."

Council President Mickey Gross added his thoughts on the matter and stated, "That former Councilman busted his butt during Hurricane Sandy and I will stand up for him!"

Feeley responded, "I apologize for the remarks I made."

Council Vice President Christine Noble was not present at the Meeting. The next Business Meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 4, 2017 at 6 p.m.

Housing Authority Update: Best Practices

9/13/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - Douglas G. Dzema, PHM Executive Director of Housing Authority gave a brief overview what the Housing Authority achieved over the past year. "Right now, we have over 1000 units in Perth Amboy that are monitored by HUD. We are tested annually and are a high performer. The poverty level in the City is 20%. For those under the age of 18, it is 25%. 30% for those on social security. 17% over the age of 65. There are 500 people on the waiting list. We're looking to


increase the turnover rate. We have been promoting self-sufficiency through furthering the education and employment opportunities of our residents. We have a mortgage program that can get up to 15 years of assistance. Over 100 participants had completed the self-sufficiency program. We're only one of two HUD Certified Counseling Agencies. There are 365 Rental Housing Units under RAD (Rental Assistance Demonstration). We have awarded \$75,000 in scholarships since

Pulling Back the Curtain: Reflections on Ending Homelessness Event

There is a well-known movie that has been around for generations called: The Wizard of Oz. This movie based on a the first of series of books by Author L. Frank Baum. The main character, a young girl named Dorothy was caught in a tornado and knocked unconscious. When she woke up, she was in the Land of Oz. She went on a quest to meet the Wizard of Oz who appeared as an intimidating giant head in front of a closed curtain. Towards the end of the movie, the curtain was pulled back, revealing an ordinary man at a control board. The Wizard made this giant image appear with his machine.

When you pull back the curtain, it's not always what you think. This concept goes for the YMCA and also God's Army Ministry (Founded by Pastor Bernadette Falcon-Lopez (Pastor Berny)). When you pull back the curtain on these two organizations, you will see there are many more layers than what appears on the surface in front of the curtain.

On Thursday, September 21, 2017, we had the opportunity to go to a fundraiser held at Mi Tierra Restaurant, 315 State St., Perth Amboy. This fundraiser was to help God's Army Ministry help the homeless.

It's disheartening when some speakers at Council Meetings constantly berate and complain about the Perth Amboy YMCA. Please stop comparing it to the Community Center in Woodbridge and the South Amboy

YMCA. To make a comparison between the three is nonsense.

What even bothers me more, is when they talk about the YMCA CEO & President (Steve Jobin) salary which is in our humble opinion – not enough. First, that job is a not a 9 to 5'er and often he does a lot of work that he's not compensated for, and people don't know about it.

When it's mentioned about the money the Y owes the City, you should remember money taken in also pays for the salary of the employees. As previously mentioned, remember some Perth Amboy residents pay very little or no fee at all for memberships. 80% of YMCA employees are Perth Amboy Residents. What else struck us was the water safety classes for second graders. Isn't it worth it to teach your children how to swim instead of having to risk drowning.

There is a lot more to helping the homeless than giving them a meal. The public doesn't see the amount of work she does behind the scenes. She has often dipped into her own finances to help the homeless (both individuals and families).

The program held at Mi Tierra Restaurant was paid for by M&T Bank. A tape of the event would be a helpful tool for everyone to see, especially critics of the Y and God's Army Ministry. It was very enlightening.

At many previous Perth Amboy City Council Meetings, the problem of homelessness has been discussed. Perth Amboy and New Brunswick are the

only two municipalities in Middlesex County that participate in the Code Blue Programs. Other municipalities refuse to take care of their homeless population and send them to Perth Amboy and New Brunswick. As of yet, other municipalities have been reluctant to participate in the Code Blue Programs.

The proof is in the pudding. The YMCA fostered a partnership with Pastor Berny when the facilities she was using were no longer available to her. Steve Jobin had heard a lot about Pastor Berny's efforts and decided to make a surprise visit to the facilities she was operating out of. Jobin was astonished at her volunteerism at how her team work together in serving those in need. They were committed to feeding the homeless in mind, body, and soul.

The one thing that both Pastor Berny and Steve Jobin emphasize is that they cannot do it alone. They recognize their team of volunteers and/or employees behind them.

They were grateful to those in attendance at Mi Tierra to make contributions in their campaign to help the homeless.

Mayor Wilda Diaz was the first to speak at the event, "Pastor Berny has been helping so many men and women. How many times out of her own pocket? They've gone to every corner of the earth to help the homeless. On the coldest, coldest days, she has gone to help them. Steve (Jobin). I can' thank you enough for partnering up. It's such an important effort. Starting in October, we don't have a men's shelter. The homeless men are counting on Pastor Berny and Steve Jobin. We're all in this together. It affects so many of us."

Diaz continued, "Pray for Puerto Rico (and for the victims

of the devastation caused by Hurricane Maria). So many of our families live in Puerto Rico. Pray for them."

Pastor Berny then came up to speak, "We partnered with many organizations and individuals. How many homeless are without food? I can' tell you how many families get permanent placement. Only God can do this - Only because of Him. We had no place to go. The YMCA then adopted us into their family. With the help of the Perth Amboy YMCA and Steve Jobin – he opened his heart. "How are you doing this?" he asked me. I answered, "By faith." The YMCA is a nonprofit organization. You have to pay out exactly what comes in. They did so much for us. It's about us as a community. We have to do more. Our winter is very scary, now. They all need help. It truly "takes a village." We've got a lot of homeless. We lost "Sammy" (a nickname of one of Perth Amboy's homeless who died in a fire) who was just trying to keep warm, and Chris Johnson, a Veteran who was murdered after he moved back in with his girlfriend who stabbed him to death in a domestic violence

There was a musical interlude performed by Marguette Feliciano and Pastor Berny's husband, Raul Lopez.

A video entitled, "Ending Homelessness" was shown. The video featured families who were helped out by Pastor Berny.

Gupreet Grewal came up to speak about her experience as a homeless person. "My husband and I were living in a car with our kids. We finally had to give the kids to family members to live with. We called social services. No one came to help us. We called the Salvation Army.

The woman on the phone gave me Pastor Berny's cell phone number. Pastor Berny put us up in a hotel. She got us vouchers and permanent placement. I can't thank them enough. I'm now one of her Church's volunteers." Tears of gratitude began to flow as she finished her presentation. She then hugged Pastor Berny

Steve Jobin spoke next. "Part of my job is fundraising. Our Y is a bunch of doers. People give to what they really care about. I'm was tired of walking by that guy by Dunkin Donuts and giving him a dollar. I said to myself, this time, I'm not going to give the guy a dollar. I'm going to ask the guy, "Can I help you?"

I asked myself."Why all this effort for Pastor Berny?" They trust her. It was the "aha" moment for me. The Board (of the YMCA) invested in a place on Smith Street for a Case Management Center. This is to make sure that these folks can get the help they need in a system that is too bureaucratic. Our goal is for November 15, 2017 to get our people warm this winter. Pastor Berny always says, "A cup of coffee means something." It's important to talk to them and get that "aha" moment. Generosity is from the heart, and it goes a long way. We need donations to make it happen."

Jobin spoke about the rickety old van that Pastor Berny used to help the homeless. "This van was bad news. That was the day someone walked into the Y and said they needed the Board of Social Services. He was told Pastor Berny could help him.

Jobin said he asked Adele from A.T. Towing if he could fix Pastor Berny's van. In order to



do the proper repairs to the van, Adele put in \$1500 worth of parts (which he paid for himself) and did the work for free. The Men's Guild gave the other \$1000 for parts. That's a total of around \$2500 to fix the van. "That's what makes our city so special. You are a part of the solution."

Jobin later told the Guardian that Auto Dealer John Lohman had a fundraiser on Saturday, Sept. 9, 2017. For every car sold on that Saturday, he donated \$100 to God's Army Ministry."

Jobin concluded, "The Y offers a lot more than just a gym and swim. We offer childcare and aftercare. We offer classes to educate 2nd Graders in water safety. Our summer camp is such a great experience for the kids."

YMCA Board Member Dot Daniel came up to speak, "Steve is a blessing. Everyday our Y is open. We are blessed to see people who work for us." Jobin concluded, "Thank you to all of our partners and for your donations."

The Amboy Guardian took some time and asked Pastor Berny a few questions:

AG: What made you decide to help the homeless?

PB: I used to feed the homeless once a week at a building on New Brunswick Ave. (on the 2nd Floor). I sat down and ate with the homeless and asked them how they felt. They answered, "It's not that we're homeless – it's how people ignore us."

But the problem does exist. I said to my husband, "We have to do something for them."

AG: What services do you offer?

PB: Food, housing, case management, placement from the county, getting them shelter, vouchers, benefits and getting the right medical needs. It's so much more than people think. It's a case by case effort. Some of the homeless suffer from mental illness and need medical assistance. We work towards

getting them self sufficiency.

AG: What are the reasons that people become homeless?

PB: For statistics on the homeless go to: https://monarchhousing.org/endinghomelessness/njcounts/

AG: Are there more men or women that are homeless?

PB: A few years ago it was almost all men, but now more and more women and their families are homeless. They are sleeping in cars. We placed a family of 9 just a few months ago.

AG: How many of the homeless that you help are from Perth Amboy?

PB: Many of the homeless are from Perth Amboy. You just don't notice them. There are other people that come from out of town.

AG: How have you managed to do this financially?

PB: By the Grace of God.

AG: What support do you have from Middlesex County?

PB: We brought up these issues at the Freeholders Meeting in November 2016. They agree

that Perth Amboy and New Brunswick take the brunt of the homeless. Many other municipalities in Middlesex County refuse to accept they have homeless. We work with the County to house folks. We're all a part of a coalition. Senator Joe Vitale is a big supporter. Assemblyman Craig Coughlin sees there's a need. I'm afraid how the hurricanes in Florida, Texas,

and Puerto Rico are going to affect us all. We're going to get people from all over. What's going to happen to them?

of the Landings owners said, "We're making progress with the Kushner vendors who are putting the units back in the condition that we were promised. There is nothing in writing, yet. The community room and gym are being transitioned back to the Condo Association once improvements are made. Only the Admiral units have not received their settlement money."

Daniel Santo Pietro, who owns a unit in the Admiral Building came up to speak next, "We (the Landings Owners) are going in the right direction without any help from the Council. We want to see Perth Amboy thrive. There's very little from City intervention. I'm going to talk to all the residents. It's been a lot of blood, sweat, and tears from our side."

The secretary from the Bayview Board said, "We received all our settlements from Kushner."

Mayor Diaz came up to speak, "I want to thank the Landings Homeowners Association who worked to move the Kushner Project forward. There have been many mixeduse projects that came through the Zoning Board, yet you (the Council) have not asked them to come to the meetings. They (The Zoning Board) have approved large projects that have no parking with them. The Redevelopment Agency has always come before you."

At the September 13, 2017 Regular Council Meeting, Resident and Business Owner David Caba came up to speak. He stated, "I'm happy because Rector Street (by the Portion of the Landings Property) is finally going to be repaired after 10 years, but only when Kushner's new project is approved. It's not moving the City forward when you build 600 rental units. It took 7 meetings to get things done. I hope I don't have to come up here 7 times and talk about the same subject to get things done."

Resident Alan Silber said, "The Landings Residents didn't get that road cleaned up. David Caba and Irizarry did. Look at the road (Fayette Street) leading to Crow's Nest. It's horrible."

Resident Ken Balut asked, "How much will the Bridge PILOT cause the School System and the City to lose? Our taxes went up on the school side because of the PILOT. Why is Arlene Quinones-Perez negotiating in regards to the Landings? Did the Landings people who spoke here tonight and said they approve of the new Landings project get more money in their settlement?"

Council President Bill Petrick said, "The Council has no information about Quinones' meeting with the Landings residents."



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On September 25, 1942, four Royal Air Force de Havilland Mosquito bombers make a low-level attack on Gestapo headquarters in Oslo, Norway. Unfortunately, 80 civilians are killed, one bomber is lost and the Gestapo facility survives the attack. In Washington, D.C., the Maritime Trade Commission announces that 488 cargo ships have been built in the U.S. in the last year.

The "final" German offensive begins at Stalingrad on September 26. In Germany, August Frank, deputy chief of the SS Main Economic Administration Office, issues a memorandum containing detailed instructions on how the confiscation and dispersal of the personal property of "evacuated" Jews is to be performed. The U.S. War Production Board grants the Manhattan Project the highest level of emergency procurement priority.

In Stalingrad, the German Sixth Army succeeds in capturing most of the strategic hill known as Mamayev Kurgan and penetrates the heavily defended Red October and Barricades housing estates on September 27. A swastika flag is raised over Communist Party headquarters in Stalingrad. In New Guinea, the Australians begin pushing the Japanese back. The Second Battle of the Matanikau River on Guadalcanal ends in a Japanese victory.

Soviet forces on September 28 cross the Volga River near Rzhev, Russia, in an offensive against German Army Group Center. Rzhev sits astride the highway and railway connecting Moscow and Riga, Latvia. The U.S. Navy claims that 42 Japanese planes have been shot down in the Solomon Islands within the last three days, with no U.S. losses. In Moscow, Joseph Stalin orders the resumption of the Soviet nuclear research program that had been dormant for over a year.

British troops occupy Tananarive, the capital of Madagascar, on September 29. In the United Kingdom, American pilots who have been flying with the British Royal Air Force since the beginning of the war — including some who fought in the airborne Battle of Britain — are transferred to U.S. Army Air Force commands. In Czechoslovakia, 255 Czechs are sentenced to death for supporting, sheltering or refusing to condemn the killers of Reinhard Heydrich, who died on June 4, 1942, from wounds suffered in an assassination attempt in Prague on May 27, 1942. Heydrich is considered the prime architect of the Nazis' Jewish genocide program.

On September 30, elements of the Red Army cross the Volga River northwest of Moscow and recapture 25 villages. Top Luftwaffe ace Hans-Joachim Marseille (158 British aircraft shot down) is killed in a non-combat flying accident. Turkey and Germany complete a trade agreement: Germany will get Turkish chrome, Turkey will get German weapons. The first British military-liaison team arrives in Axis-occupied Greece. In Berlin, Adolf Hitler gives a speech, telling his audience, ". . . it will not be the Aryan peoples, but rather Jewry, that will be exterminated."

On October 1, the first U.S. jet fighter — the experimental Bell XP-59 — takes to the skies over the Mojave Desert in California. Despite the breakthrough, no U.S. jet fighter will see action before the end of the war. Off the coast of eastern China, the American submarine *USS Grouper* torpedoes and sinks the Japanese transport ship *Lisbon Maru*. Only later is it learned that the vessel was carrying 1,800 British prisoners of war from Hong Kong, 800 of whom die in the sinking. On the home front, publishers Simon & Schuster of New York and Western Publishing of Racine, Wisconsin, begin jointly publishing "Little Golden Books" for children. The books sell for 25 cents each. Fuel oil is now being rationed in 17 eastern states of the U.S., and a nationwide speed limit of 35 miles per hour is established for civilian vehicles.






