Commercial Development Company, Inc. Begins Final Demolition Stage at the Former ASARCO Site in Perth Amboy, NJ

Press Release 8/30/17 PERTH AMBOY - Commercial Development Company Inc. (CDC) announced today final plans for building demolition and environmental cleanup at the former ASAR-CO property in Perth Amboy, NJ. This milestone paves the way for an additional 1 million square feet of modern industrial buildings at "Bridgeport Logistic Center Phase 2".

Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda Diaz kicked off demolition of the largest building at 1160 State Street today, Wednesday, August 30th at 3:00 p.m. Additional City officials were also in attendance, including board members of Perth Amboy Redevelopment Authority (PARA).

"CDC is pleased to announce its final push to restore this historic site to productive reuse," said Stephen Collins, Executive Vice President at Commercial Development Company. "Since acquiring the site in 2009, CDC has relocated 22 tenants, demolished 13 buildings, and remediated 80 years environmental residue from ASARCO's metal smelting business."

Among the many daunting challenges was removing 14,000 shipping containers, rebuilding a cell tower, and raising the site to post-Sandy flood elevations.

ENRC will build a perimeter slurry wall this fall, with local business KT Marine serving as a subcontractor. Bridge Development will break ground in March 2018 on two indusbuildings totaling 1,073,000 square feet. This phase 2 project will complete a total of 2.4 million square feet at Bridgeport Logistics Center.

Bridge Development Partners, LLC has invested \$180 million for the construction of three warehousing and distribution facilities totaling 1,292,650 square feet where Target has established its first

"We are extremely excited to finally begin to move forward with the second phase of our Perth Amboy project. The Phase 1 buildings are nearing completion, are already over 55% leased and employing a large number of Perth Amboy residents. It is wonderful to see the transformation of once blighted properties into a new economic engine for the City of Perth Amboy," said Jeff Milanaik, Principal with Bridge Development Partners.

"The Perth Amboy's Redevelopment Agency (PARA) played a role in promoting and advancing this redevelopment, in addition to the City Council's support on the PILOT program. "Bridgeport Logistics Center" will transform a portion of Perth Amboy's historic shoreline from contaminated Brownfields into a state-of-the-art industrial complex providing great jobs and a sta-



ble tax base for the community," said Wilda Diaz, Mayor of Perth Amboy.

The Bridgeport Logistics Center (190 total acres) is located north of the 440 Outerbridge Crossing connecting Staten Island and the New Jersey Turnpike. It also borders the Arthur Kill, a major navigational channel for the Port of New York and Newark, NJ. Several waterfront tenants will remain at the site to serve marine uses.

For 80 years, this industrial site was a smelting and refining facility owned and operated by American Smelting and Refining Company (ASARCO). Since closing its doors in 1979, many tenants and environmental issues prevented redevelopment of the site. CDC acquired the site from ASARCO in 2009 and is pleased to help Perth Amboy redevelop its historic waterfront to provide 21st century jobs and services.



PERTH AMBOY - We hear a lot about 'ending homelessness'. It is a very reasonable question to ask- "Can homelessness end in our lifetime?" Robert F. Kennedy said, "There are those that look at things the way they are, and ask why? I dream of things that never were, and ask why not?"

Why not? Why not give it all we have and see what happens? Local Pastor Bernadette Falcon-Lopez and her "Army" (God's Army Ministries and other partners) stand ready, willing, and able to fight the war on homelessness. Understand however, this is not an army in the way most of us think of an army. This is a small army of five or six dedicated Volunteers who show up consistently to help. Moreover, hear this: most of the volunteers are folks who had been homeless and helped by Pastor Ber-

Despite the obstacles and the small numbers, in 2016, almost 2,000 meals were served to the homeless and poor. Nearly two hundred families and individuals were served through case management. Permanent housing was found for forty families and individuals and another one hundred and three were on the pending list. People were taken care of. They were not sent on their way with pat answers or a pat on the back. They were counseled, coached, and directed to services they needed. Each month, thousands of volunteer hours support the homeless to find food, shelter and services to help them succeed in their journeys of life and most importantly, to help them find a place to call home.

So, back to the question, can we end homelessness? The answer is a conditional No and Yes! No, without help this vision CANNOT see reality and, Yes, with your help, we CAN see an end to homelessness. Imagine what could happen if the Army could grow. Won't you 'enlist'?

Tom's Tax Tips

Say Goodbye to the **College Tuition Deduction**

It's hard enough to watch your child leave for college. Now you also have to saygoodbye to the tuition and fees tax deduction. Congress decided not to extend this \$4,000 deduction for 2017, leaving many parents worried that college will now be more expensive.

But it isn't as bad as it sounds. That's because Congress left in place two popular education credits that may offer a more valuable tax break:

- The AOTC. The American Opportunity Tax Credit (AOTC) is a credit of up to \$2,500 per student per year for qualified undergraduate tuition, fees, and course material. The deduction phases out at higher income levels, and is eliminated altogether for married couples with a modified adjusted gross income of \$180,000 (\$90,000 for singles.)
- Lifetime Learning Credit. The Lifetime Learning Credit provides an annual credit of 20 percent on the first \$10,000 of tuition and fees,

for either undergraduate or graduate level classes. There is no lifetime limit on the credit, but only couples making less than \$130,000 per year (or singles making \$65,000) qualify. Unlike the AOTC, this deduction is per tax return, not per student. So who is affected by the loss of the tuition and fees deduction? If you are paying for your student's graduatelevel courses and are making too much to qualify for the Lifetime Learning Credit, the tuition and fees deduction is generally the only means you have to reduce your tax bill.

But there's still hope! In addition to the two alternative education credits, there are many other tax benefits that help reduce the cost of education. There are breaks for employer-provided tuition assistance, deductions for student loan interest, taxbeneficial college savings options, and many other taxplanning alternatives. This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

In the U.S. on September 4, 1942, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers creates the Manhattan Engineering District, marking the beginning of a full-scale effort by the U.S. to produce a nuclear weapon. In the Soviet Union, the Luftwaffe mounts a raid on the city of Stalingrad, utilizing over 1,000 aircraft. To the south of the city, German forces reach the Volga River. In Hungary, Soviet planes bomb Budapest for the first time.

Australian and U.S. forces defeat the Japanese at Milne Bay, Papua-New Guinea, on September 5. It is the first outright defeat of Japanese land forces in the Pacific War. The resulting Japanese evacuation and failure to establish an airbase there, eases the threat to Australia of a Japanese invasion.

In North Africa, Rommel's forces on September 6 are back to the positions they held on August 31, having lost 51 tanks (out of 515), 70 guns, 400 trucks and 2,865 men. British Eighth Army's losses are 1,640 men and 68 tanks. The 4th Gebirgsjäger Division of the German 17th Army captures the Black Sea naval base of Novorossiysk, in the Caucasus, while just to the north, six Axis divisions cross the Straits of Kerch from the Crimea to Taman. In the center of Stalingrad, heavy house-to-house fighting continues.

In Canada, on September 7, German sub U-517 attacks the convoy QS-33 in the mouth of the St. Lawrence River, sinking two Greek cargo ships and a Canadian collier. Seven sailors die and 78 are rescued, but lost are 16 tanks destined for Great Britain and almost 12,000 tons of general cargo. In the Solomon Islands, 600 U.S. Marine Corps Raiders attack the Japanese base at Taivu, damaging the facility and disrupting preparations for an attack on the main U.S. positions on Guadalcanal.

On September 8, 249 RAF bombers embark on a night raid targeting Frankfurt, Germany. Most of their bombs fall in the countryside about 15 miles southwest of the city. The British lose two of their aircraft. In Vichy France, Gen. Pierre Robert de Saint-Vincent, the military governor of Lyon, is removed from office for refusing to aid in the arrest of Jewish citizens in the area. In the U.S., the cartoon characters Pogo the 'Possum and Albert the Alligator, drawn by Walt Kelly, make their first appearance in Animal Comics, Issue #1.

A Japanese floatplane launched from an offshore submarine drops incendiary bombs over Oregon forests for a second time, on September 9. Again, little damage is caused. In Europe, Hitler sacks Field Marshal Wilhelm List and takes personal command of Army Group A, which — having been foiled by the Red Army in the western Caucasus — is meeting increased resistance in its drive towards Astrakhan and Baku. The British, fighting Vichy French forces in Madagascar, take control of the Mozambique Channel that separates the island from the African mainland. On Guadalcanal, Japanese troops land at Tassafaronga.

In the north of Russia, Red Army units attacking from besieged Leningrad on September 10 fail to break the lines of German Army Group North. (The city has been under siege since September 8, 1941.) In the U.S., German submarine U-69 lays 12 mines in Chesapeake Bay. In the Aleutian Islands, U.S. planes bomb Japanese troops on Kiska Island, Alaska.




