Crime Statistics Questioned 10/11/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY – During the Public Portion of the 10/11/17 Council Meeting, Resident and Businessman David Caba referred to a report on the statistics of crime in Central Jersey that was published on the Internet, "According to this report, Perth Amboy has the 5th most violent crime in Central Jersey, which is according to the State Police and the FBI. You guys need to do your homework.

Can you imagine if myself, Ken Balut and Stanley Sierakowski didn't' come up here? I like this Council. I think you ran for office because you care. Councilman Joel Pabon - I don't always agree with you, but I like what you do. Councilman Fernando Irizarry - I don't always agree with you. Council President Bill Petrick - you, too. Councilman Fernando Gonzalez - what would we do without you? Councilman Helmin Caba, you're new here. You have to ask yourself why am I running (for office)? Here (the City) is the 5th most violent (in Central Jersey). I didn't agree with Greg Fehrenbach (former Business Administrator) all the time, but I would ask a question and he would give an answer. Mr. King (Law Director), you are a very responsible man. You

always ask a question."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry asked where David Caba got his information from (on the crime statistics).

Acting Police Chief Roman McKeon came up to speak to clarify the report on the Internet. "These statistics are a reflection of interstate uniform required codes. Some towns do not report their numbers. In Perth Amboy, we don't do that. Violent crime is categorized as: homicide, manslaughter, rape, and

McKeon proceeded to read a report on crime in Perth Amboy from 2016-2017, giving statistics on each category of violent crime. "For a city our size, crime

is not that extensive. We've had issues with people coming out of taverns (late at night) drunk. We've talked about this to tavern owners. Perth Amboy is one of the safest cities in the State of New Jersey. I put no credibility in that report (the one Caba referred to on the Internet). It's very safe to walk the streets in Perth Amboy. I'm very proud of the men and women who serve as Police Officers. We're proud of the City Administrators who back us up."

Resident Alan Silber came up next, "We have a Police Department to deal with problems - not to prevent them. If there were no crime, we wouldn't need police."

Updates on Activities & Improvements in the City 10/18/17 Council Meeting

SOUTH AMBOY – During the Second Readings of Ordinances: 13-2017 – An Ordinance to fix non-union minimum and maximum salaries, and Ordinance 14-2017 - An Ordinance to fix union minimum and maximum salaries, Councilman McLaughlin is the only one who voted, "No."

During Council and Administration Comments, Thomas Reilly spoke first: "I want to thank Business Administrator Stacey Kennedy and those City Employees involved in the Coop Program. (The Co-op Program involves students who shadow employees from different departments to gain work experience. These students help perform some of the duties in those departments.)" He also mentioned the upcoming fundraisers by the Friends of South Amboy (page 5). "The Texas Roadhouse Benefit is to help a young child with leukemia. Both parents are military veterans. The father has completed two tours of duty in the Middle East. Let's show our appreciation for them."

Reilly also asked for an update on the code violations on Broadway.

Kennedy responded, "I will ask Jay Elliott (Department of Code Enforcement) to provide a report."

Reilly then mentioned, "This may not be the proper venue to mention this, but my son and another resident of the City, Matt Reagan passed the bar exam."

Councilman McLaughlin asked, "When is lower Main Street work going to be put out for bid?"

City Engineer Mark Rasimowicz responded, "An RFQ was put out for an inspection and an engineer."

McLaughlin then said, "I'm happy to report that my wife is opening up a new photo business in town."

B.A. Stacey Kennedy spoke again, reminding the Council and all interested parties to, "Check out the new City Website. We're open for feedback." She also urged anyone to: "Please let us know about any information regarding upcoming community events or fundraisers so they can also be posted on the site."

Mark Rasimowicz also reported: "The Bordentown Avenue Project has begun."

Mayor Henry then reported, "There's a lot going on in South Amboy. The Friends of South Amboy have held many events, and so has the South Ambo y

Perth Amboy in Conjunction with the DEA is Taking Back Unwanted Prescription Drugs October 28 at the Perth Amboy Police Department

News Release

PERTH AMBOY - On Saturday, October 28, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Perth Amboy Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration will give the public its 14th opportunity in 7 years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your pills for disposal to the Perth Amboy Police Department located at 365 New Brunswick Avenue. (The DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, only pills or patches.) The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

Last April Americans turned in 450 tons (900,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at almost 5,500 sites operated by the DEA and more than 4,200 of its state and local law enforcement partners. Overall, in its 13 previous Take Back events, DEA and its partners have taken in over 8.1 million pounds—more than 4,050 tons—of pills.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and

overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.



You're Middle-Aged and Your Knee Hurts...

So, you're 51 years old, otherwise healthy, but your knee's not feeling right and it's hurting your golf game. Or, you're 63, a little over weight, and you'd like to "get back in shape," but your knee pain stops you from working out, even from going on neighborhood walks. Perhaps, you were "fine," until your 70-year-old knee "blew up" on you after an otherwise minor twist or fall...

The stories may differ, but the diagnosis is often the same: Your x-ray shows mild arthritis and your MRI shows a meniscus tear. You may ask, "How did I tear my meniscus, I didn't do anything?" or "It can't be the arthritis, my knee was fine two weeks ago!"... and now it's KILLING me!"

To review, osteoarthritis (the most common type of arthritis) is a degenerative condition, where the smooth cartilage inside a joint erodes, causing an irregular, rough surface. "Bone on bone" disease is the end result, often requiring knee replacement surgery. Until then, however, the joint may be stiff, swollen, painful, unstable, and unpredictable. It may feel fine at times, or can be quite painful, despite only "mild" arthritis.

The meniscus is the shock absorber in the knee joint, between the bones. Meniscus tears can occur in the young athletic population; for instance, an injury to a college lacrosse player. In these patients, surgery is required, typically to try to repair the tear. This is different than the middle-aged patient, where meniscus tears are usually degenerative in nature -- meaning it's part of the aging process. Many experts believe meniscus tears

simply to be part of the arthritis process.

So, back to your knee: Your knee is painful and might be swollen. It may hurt to squat or pivot. It's been bothering you for several weeks and won't seem to get better. Doc says you have arthritis. Many patients find it hard to believe arthritis can give them such pain---they think arthritis is just something you live with as you age, sort of like grandma's stiff back and hands. But it can be quite painful when it first acts up, especially in the middleaged patient, who is still working out, or working on their feet every day.....

The MRI shows a meniscus tear. So both patient and doctor may jump to the conclusion that the meniscus is the problem, and therefore surgery (a knee arthroscopy) is the solution..... However, one needs to know that degenerative meniscus tears are VERY COMMON, with greater than one-third of our population over age 50 having a meniscus tear. In patients with known knee arthritis, the rate is even higher: 75 percent of these patients have a meniscus tear. But, and this is VERY IMPORTANT: the majorty of patients do not have ANY symptoms! We know this from MRI research studies on patients who were symptom-free.

So, if the majority of patients with meniscus tears don't even know they have them, is it reasonable to say that meniscus tears don't need surgery when we first discover them? The simple answer is YES! People do NOT need to rush into surgery for a meniscus tear. In fact, often surgery can put off indefi-

Recent research studies have

shown that middle-aged patients with meniscus tears can be successfully treated without surgery. Similar to patients with arthritis, a combination of physical therapy, over-thecounter medications, injections and bracing can be a very effective treatment strategy for meniscus tears. The tears do not heal (and the arthritis doesn't go away), but the symptoms often do. In fact, these studies show that knee arthroscopy surgery (a "knee scope") should not be the first line of treatment for meniscus tears. Good research has changed how we as doctors approach meniscus tears. Knee arthroscopy can be effective for those patients who do not improve with non-operative measures, but it is no longer the first or only option.

Being middle-aged does not have to mean you're going downhill. Degenerative conditions do start to pop up, but they can be countered with the right exercise, diet and activity regimen. Talk to your orthopaedic surgeon to help get you back in the game, often without surgery!

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

In North Africa, British Gen. Bernard Montgomery launches the Second Battle of El Alamein on October 23, 1942, with a 1,000-gun bombardment against German forces around the city. The British Eighth Army gains ground on a six-mile front and repulses Axis counterattacks. On Guadalcanal, Japanese infantry and armor cross the Matanikau River, triggering the Battle for Henderson Field. The defenders repulse the attack soundly, killing over 600 Japanese.

Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, the wife of the U.S. president, arrives in London on October 24 for a three-week visit as a guest of King George VI. At Stalingrad, activities of the German Sixth Army slow due to exhaustion and the onset of cold weather. In North Africa, Gen. Wilhelm Ritter von Thoma takes command of the Afrika Korps after its commander, Gen. Georg Stumme is killed during an advanced reconnaissance patrol.

Japanese naval vessels bombard U.S. positions and shipping off Lunga Point, Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands, on October 25. Another Japanese offensive is launched against Henderson Field and is repulsed by the Marine defenders. The attack is renewed later that evening and is once again turned back. At El Alamein, Egypt, four Allied brigades begin to penetrate German lines, but take very high losses. Field Marshal Erwin Rommel breaks off his sick leave in Germany and hurriedly returns to North Africa to take charge of the critical situation in which the Axis forces now find themselves. In eastern Europe, the Germans launch a fresh offensive in the Caucasus.

On October 26, U.S. naval forces attack a large Japanese supporting fleet off Guadalcanal in what is known as the Battle of Santa Cruz. The Americans shoot down 100 Japanese aircraft and damage two aircraft carriers, one battleship and three cruisers. On land, the Battle for Henderson Field ends in an American victory, with the Japanese losing over 3,000 killed.

A German submarine wolfpack designated "Battleaxe" on October 27 attacks Convoy SL-125 (37 ships), which is sailing from Sierra Leone to the United Kingdom. The attack begins off the northwest coast of Africa, not far from Gibraltar, and continues until 31 October 1942. During this time 12 merchant vessels (a total of 80,005 gross tons) are sunk and seven are damaged. For the duration of the submarine attacks, the Allies re-route all convoys associated with the "Operation Torch" landings in North Africa. German and Italian armored units attempt an attack near El Alamein, Egypt. In Europe, the Soviet 37th Army is defeated in the Caucasus. Off New Guinea, the Battle of Goodenough Island ends in an Australian victory. The island is turned into a staging, supply and medical base by the Allies for future operations in the area. At Stalingrad, the Germans make headway between the Barricades housing development and the Red October metals factory. In Berlin, 17-yearold Helmuth Hübener, of Hamburg, is executed by guillotine for high treason. His crime: listening to foreign radio transmissions (the BBC) and distributing pamphlets containing news and information gathered from the broadcasts.

The 1,700-mile Alaska Highway is completed on October 28. It connects the contiguous U.S. with Alaska via Canada. The highway starts in Dawson Creek, British Columbia, Canada, passes through Whitehorse, Yukon Territory, and ends at Delta Junction, Alaska, about 160 miles southeast of Fairbanks. It will be used primarily to transport war materiel. In North Africa, an Australian night attack near El Alamein gains some ground. In New York, the U.S. government orders the seizure of two entities operated by the previously seized Union Banking Corporation. The government declares that the Holland-American Trading Corporation and the Seamless Steel Equipment Corporation are Nazi front organizations. Actor Clark Gable graduates from Officer Candidate School and is commissioned a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army Air Forces. This allows him to re-grow his trademark mustache that he had to shave off when he enlisted as a private in August.

The Germans on October 29 capture Nalchik, in the Caucasus, only 50 miles from the Grozny oil fields. In London, leading British clergymen and politicians — including British Prime Minister Winston Churchill — hold a public rally to denounce the Nazis' persecution of Jews. Some 590 miles north of the Azores, the British vessel *M/V Abosso* — carrying 149 military and 61 civilian passengers, 20 Royal Navy gunners, 163 crew, 400 bags of mail and 3,000 tons of wool — sailing alone and unescorted from Cape Town, South Africa, to Liverpool, England, is torpedoed and sunk by German sub *U-575*. The 31 survivors of the 393 souls aboard Abosso are rescued by a passing Allied convoy two days later.


