

A Lot on the Table 11/6/17 Caucus Meeting

PERTH AMBOY – There were 3 ordinances involving bonding that had to be carried to the 11/20/17 agenda. These included: 1. Capital Improvement; 2. & 3. Water/Wastewater Utility. The reason they had to be carried over to the 11/20/17 Meeting is because they required approval from the LFB (Local Finance Board) before they could be adopted.

Councilman Irizarry had a question about the Bond Ordinance No. 1. He said, "I thought at a previous Meeting the insertion of \$26,000 that was to be used for flag poles had to be deleted. I see that's still in the Ordinance."

Business Administrator Adam Cruz responded, "The \$26,000 will not be used for flag poles as per the request from the Council."

The next item in question dealt were the bids for the fire apparatus repair and maintenance contracts for 2018 -2020. Acting Fire Chief Mullen came up to explain, "There are 3 different vendors who will take care of their own apparatus. They pretty much have sole proprietary on their own equipment. We are trying to standardize the equipment. The aerial and pumps failed their tests, which we will have to fix. We get discounted rates with all of these vendors."

DPW Director Frank Hoffman came forward to respond to questions about resolutions R-418-11/17 – A contract with Pride Landscape Supply for calcium chloride ice melt.

Hoffman explained, "The Purchasing Department asked us to get a price for the pallets. "We're not getting the same amount of pallets for the same price."

On R-438 – Recognizing the excitement or transfer of the responsibility to comply with the terms and conditions of the financial agreement regarding the BRIDGE 1 Project & Approving the sale of the BRIDGE Project and approving the sale of the BRIDGE 1 Property to Duke Realty that ePort Urban Renewal LLC to continue the operation of the project and to allow the investment in the BRIDGE 2 Project to proceed." Robert Benecke - Bridge Consultant on PILOT Programs (Benecke Economics) came up to speak. "This transfer to Duke Realty will allow BRIDGE 2 to proceed. This is a \$125 million project. There is an investment of \$40 million going into this. I'm working for the City. The profit cannot exceed 12%."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez said, "This guarantee that BRIDGE 2 will be done. There should be a warranty that BRIDGE 2 will go through."

Benecke continued, "Leases have to be cemented on the first

building. The cost for square footage is \$9.92. per sqft. Duke Realty (a company from South Carolina) will have to put together a financing package. The agreement with the City still stands."

DPW Director Frank Hoffman came back to answer questions regarding Resolutions R-419 - R-421. "This will be for a custom built truck. The total price is a little over \$300,000."

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez asked, "Have there been repair problems with the present trucks?"

R-419 – 11/17 is contract for Cliffside Body Corp. for the purchase of a Monroe 10 ft. Plow & Hitch. R-420-11/17 - Authorizing a contract for the purchase of an Autocar ACX 42 Class 8 Engine, frame & cab through Hudson County Motors.

Hofffman explained, "The present trucks last 6 to 8 years. There's wear and tear on the parts. There is a safety factor cost because it will cut down on injuries and the amount of workers needed. There is going to be more pollution controls, which is mandated. The arm and body is the same on the new garbage truck as on the present garbage truck."

Hoffman also answered questions concerning R-423-11/17 – Approving a contract with Murray Paving and Concrete for reconstruction work of areas on the lower level of the Public Safety complex. "This work will include sheetrock and flooring installation. The cost went through co-op pricing. They do itemized listings of all types of services."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry then asked a question, "Did anyone go to a local contractor for a price?"

Law Director Peter King responded, "They have to qualify to the state, and the union would have to be involved."

Council President William Petrick asked, "Is the insurance going to cover most of the work?"

"Most of it.," Hoffman answered. "This company (Murray Contracting) has done work for us before, but I'm not sure they did this kind of work. I can have our Buildings and Grounds put together a package to present to bidders to see if local contractors will apply to do this sort of work."

Councilman Irizarry spoke up, "I know a local contractor who can do this."

Council President Petrick said, "We will pull R-423."

There was a question in regards to R-437 authorizing the City to enter into a 5 year lease purchase agreement with Fulton Bank in the amount of \$250,540.00 for body worn and vehicle mounted cameras." Po-

lice Chief Roman McKeon said, "Fulton Bank is just picking up the \$250,000.00 cost. The amount of money doesn't change – just who it's being sent to."

There was also a question on R-439 – Waving the residency requirement for Nichole Horvhth for the Department of Finance. CFO Jill Goldy came up. "The original applicant withdrew and none of the other applicants we received were City Residents."

There was a long discussion on R-442. Regarding a Change Order with Helios Construction increasing the contract for Waterfront Park Improvements in an amount not to exceed \$52,813.96. Business Administrator Adam Cruz explained, "This will enable us to proceed with work that was put on hold at the tennis courts."

Council President Bill Petrick explained his frustration about this resolution. "I can't in good conscience put my name to this resolution. This will enable a thirty-foot trailer that houses toilets to be placed across from the beautiful St. Demetrios Church located at our beautiful Waterfront."

Cruz interrupted Petrick and stated, "If we don't get the funding, we can't proceed with the work."

Petrick continued, "Can we get that company here (that will to supply the trailer)?"

Cruz then reminded the Council, "What was approved is what is being built and it met the specific requirements for the funding."

Petrick continued, stating, "I know some of the work will involve improving the tennis courts, but I can't approve of a 30 ft. trailer on that site. I understand a lot of hard work went into putting that proposal together."

At this point, Director of Recreation Kenny Ortiz came up to speak, "This project is over \$900,000. I was involved in this project in the beginning and the Council approved the bid. The contractor worked based on the specifications. The trailer is temporary and funds from the Economic Development and FEMA have to be used for the Waterfront. There were additional charges for changes. The whole unit (trailer) can be moved in 25 minutes. I wasn't involved in the design phase."

Petrick had further comments, "Nothing has been done, yet (sewer lines or electrical work) pertaining to the trailer. It can be moved to another location."

Law Director Peter King said, "I don't see a problem with that"

Petrick then continued, "St. Demetrios Church wants to

build housing and a community center. This trailer will obstruct the view."

Councilman Joel Pabon spoke up, "There used to be a structure that is now an empty field. To move is one thing and to build a structure is another thing."

Irizarry had several observations, "Wherever the trailer is placed will be a problem. This is tied to a \$975,000 project with other work that is being done. If this is stopped, those other projects will be stopped. If the trailer can be moved in 25 minutes, I'm okay."

Petrick then reminded the other Council Members, "We asked them to reduce the size of the trailer. It can be moved in an emergency."

Pabon then suggested, "We do need bathroom facilities in that area, but it needs to be a permanent, decent bathroom facilities."

Irizarry commented, "At this point, it's not possible to do that."

Petrick suggested, "Let's talk to these guys. We need a facility near the Waterfront."

Pabon cautioned, "The tennis court work needs to go on."

Ortiz then told the Council, "I can look to do a revised change order. I will ask the engineer and tell you more at the next meeting."

Petrick then concluded, "We will make a decision on R-442 after getting more information."

Oritz finished the discussion, by telling the Council, "My focus is getting the tennis courts done this year." During the Public Portion, Resident David Caba came up to speak about the July and August crime stats which came from the State Police and FBI. He said, "These stats came from the City. You could look them up yourselves. I'm going to call those two departments themselves to see where they got their crime stats. Call the person who wrote the article. People make smart comments, but not qualified answers."

Caba then quoted J.D. Watts, "Common sense and knowledge will get you further." Caba then suggested that the Council walk Smith Street at night from Convery Boulevard to the Waterfront. The article says we are the fifth most violent town in Middlesex County."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry responded, "Based on what I read, Perth Amboy is not number 5."

Caba countered, "This sheet I have is coming from Perth Amboy."

Irizarry then stated, "Some towns don't report their statistics."

Caba concluded, "I gave you the phone numbers for the FBI and State Police and I didn't see you (the Council write them down.) You have a lot more clout than I do."



What is the Mayor's Agenda for the Perth Amboy School Board?

Now that Mayor Wilda Diaz has managed to obtain the majority on the School Board, after trying for many years, the public would like to know what her agenda is.

This past Tuesday, November 7th, after arduous campaigning, a great deal of money spent, parades, and a tsunami of robocalls, the Mayor has managed to get two more candidates elected to the School Board -- Lisett Lebron, from the Housing Authority, and Jesus Martinez, giving her the majority on the School Board. Diaz's frontrunner, Irving Lozada, lost to

Milady Tejeda, presently the vice-president of the BOE. This gives the Mayor the majority of votes -- 5 of 9.

In 2016, Diaz's School Board slate won under her banner, with candidate Randy Convery, BID Perth Amboy City employee, Junior Iglesia, 5 time runner for BOE. Tashi Vasquez, former employee of Jewish Renaissance, was hired soon after the election by Mayor Diaz, and given the title of Deputy Department Head in the Department of Human Services Housing Office. What other BOE candidates will be lured in by City Hall?

The Perth Amboy Board of Education's budget consists of \$330 million. What are we to expect from the new regime? Replacing the Superintendent Dr. David A. Roman, if he doesn't play along? There are also lucrative contracts, such as

the one currently held by the Machado Law Group -- will it soon be replaced and given to the Mayor's City attorneys, De-Cotiis, FitzPatrick, Cole & Giblin, LLP.? Will the non-union employees be losing their jobs and be replaced with those on Wilda's list? What will be built under the auspices of "doing it for the Children?" How will the coming redistribution of funds really benefit them?

I believe the Mayor's de facto control of the school budget is a major conflict of interest.

Although Mayor Diaz's 5-member majority is now controlling the School Board, there are a great many more people on the other side. We will remain vigilant as to what happens in the coming year.







Obituary: Charles W. Oliver July 9, 1926 – November 2, 2017

"Charlie", as he so humbly chose to be called, graduated at the top of his class at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point in 1949. Early on he served in the Korean War in Japan; as head of ROTC at U. Pennsylvania, as Chief of Staff for the Commander of USAF, Europe, and for many years as Deputy Director of the Dept. of Athletics at the US Air Force Academy, where he established the permanent US Olympic training site among his many enduring accomplishments. In addition to a B.S. in Engineering at West Point, he attended the prestigious Wharton School, and completed a Masters at Colombia University and Doctorate in Education at the University of Northern Colorado.

Amazingly, he was the number one tennis player in the U.S.A. from the time he was a freshman in high school under the early tutelage of tennis legend Don Budge, through his tenure at West Point, during which he beat three Wimbledon tennis champions. Later he played

an exhibition match in Denver with then world no. 1, Pancho Gonzales (ten years his junior), and almost beat him, losing in the third set, 15-13. Beyond lettering in multiple sports, his preternatural leadership called on for him to be the President of his high school class and the E1 Company Commander at West Point. After retiring from an illustrious 30 year service career with seven distinguished service decorations including the legion of merit and bronze star, he went on to serve for many years as a revered tennis professional at the Philadelphia Cricket Club where he also mentored tennis pros such as Lisa Raymond. He was a member of the U.S. Senior Davis Cup Team and was later inducted into multiple halls of fame, including at West Point and the USTA. In his later years, this gentle man was known for a warm sense of humor and an absolute adoration for his greatand grandchildren.

He was loved by all who were fortunate to know him,

including a proud mother and father, brother and sister, a beloved wife, five grateful children, 12 amazing grandchildren and seven greatgrandchildren, and so many more fellow veterans and friends.

His memory will surely live on in all of our hearts forever, as long as there is stardust. See you down range Dad – you finally won the biggest one of them all: game, set, match. To paraphrase a famous West Point motto, your life has been all about Duty, Honor, Country, and so much enduring love.

Assumption Catholic School Students Help Warm Hearts in Ukraine **Photo Submitted

PERTH AMBOY - Students from Assumption Catholic School (ACS) in Perth Amboy, New Jersey give back and have impacted the lives of children in Ukraine. For the second year in a row, the 8th grade class, in cooperation with the Carteret Youth Chapter of the Ukrainian Youth Association (CYM), have collected items of warm clothing, school supplies, sweets and toys packaged in backpacks to be distributed to children of parents who are currently engaged in military action or have given their lives in Eastern Ukraine or who have been displaced from their homes as a result of the fighting. with a query from Ms. Anna Lawrence, the music teacher at ACS, to a CYM social media campaign of this initiative. After initial inquiries, ASC students and staff members became interested in contributing to this campaign. "It would have never occurred to me that we'd ask a grade school to be involved with such a campaign. But when members of ACS learned about what we were doing and inquired about how it could help, it revealed itself as being a perfect fit. We are very fortunate to include these amazing students in these actions." recounted Roman Wernyj, Youth Program Director of Carteret CYM. This year, the 8th grade class, under the direction of their teacher Mrs.

Mary Beth Pickering and new principal Mrs. Lissette Shumny, brought in various items to snuggly fills 16 backpacks, which accounts for over 60% of the materials collected by Carteret CYM. Fr. Ivan Turyk, the pastor of Assumption Catholic church, who supervises the activities at ACS, noted, "This is a group of caring young men and women who don't only study but also practice their faith. They and the entire ACS are always eager to reach out and help the less fortunate either here in this country or overseas." Overall, over 200 lbs. of material was shipped to Ukraine on October 31, 2017 to children in the area of Kalush in the Ivano-Frankivsk oblast in Ukraine.



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

The Naval Battle of Ironbottom Sound off Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands, takes place on November 13, 1942. Seven Japanese destroyers are sunk, as well as the battleship *Hiei*. The Japanese sink three American destroyers and two American cruisers, but fail to land reinforcements on Guadalcanal (the goal of the Japanese sortie). One of the American cruisers lost is *USS Juneau* — all but 10 of her crew of 673 officers and men die, including the five Sullivan brothers who were serving aboard. In Europe, another German attempt to take Stalingrad ends in failure. The Germans manage to make a foothold on the River Volga, but the Soviets mount a stiff resistance.

The Naval Battle of Guadalcanal continues on November 14. Despite U.S. losses, control of the seas around Guadalcanal is passing to the Americans, with supply problems mounting for the Japanese. Already many Japanese soldiers on the island are sick and hungry. Elsewhere in the Solomons, the Japanese occupy New Georgia. In the Mediterranean, the British submarine HMS Sahib sinks the Italian cargo ship SS Scillin. Around 800 Allied prisoners of war being transported by the ship from North Africa to Italy die, along with 79 Italian crewmen.

The battleship *USS Washington* on November 15 sinks the Japanese battleship *Kirishima* off Lunga Point, Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands, beating off a Japanese resupply convoy heading towards the island. In North Africa, a German buildup is taking place in Tunisia, with 10,000 troops and over 100 combat airplanes getting into position. Church bells are rung throughout England to celebrate the Allied victory at El Alamein. It is the first time they are sounded since they were ordered silenced in 1940. In the U.S., the first issue of the comic book "Archie" hits the newsstands.

In Papua-New Guinea, U.S. and Australian troops link up on November 16 for an assault on the last Japanese stronghold in northern Papua, the Buna-Gona bridgehead. In the U.S., Brig. Gen. Leslie Groves and physicist J. Robert Oppenheimer select a remote boys' school in Los Alamos, New Mexico, as the site for "the Project." Oppenheimer then begins traveling the U.S., recruiting top scientists and persuading them to move to New Mexico. Hungarian-American nuclear physicist Edward Teller is the first of the 100 or so scientists to join the Manhattan Project. Allied forces advance into Tunisia against determined German resistance.

The British Eighth Army occupies Derna, Libya, on November 17. In Tunisia, British paratroopers engage German troops, while the first clashes occur between the newly landed U.S. troops and Axis forces. Any remaining Vichy resistance to the Anglo-American "Operation Torch" landings in North and West Africa collapses as Vichy Adm. Jean Darlan and Gen. Alphonse Juin, commander of French troops in Morocco, reiterate their cease-fire order to all French troops in Africa. Germany begins to extend its occupation of Vichy-controlled France.

In an attempt to counter Adm. Darlan's control of Vichy forces in Africa, the Vichy government in France on November 18 gives Vice-Premier and Prime Minister Pierre Laval absolute authority to rule by decree in Africa. The British Eighth Army reaches Cyrene, Libya. President Roosevelt orders all males who have turned 18 since July 1, 1942, to register for the Selective Service draft. This makes almost 500,000 additional men immediately eligible for military service.

On November 19, British troops engage a German tank column only 30 miles from Tunis, in Tunisia. The Red Army opens a winter offensive with a pincer movement around Stalingrad with the aim of encircling and destroying the German forces fighting in the city. The initial attacks by the Soviet 5th Tank Army, from the north, and the 51st Army, from the south, are directed against the exposed rear flanks of the German Sixth Army and 4th Panzer Army. The German flanks are held by the Romanian 3rd and 4th Armies, which are overrun and scattered, losing 65,000 prisoners in 24 hours. Two RAF Horsa gliders carrying 34 British Royal Engineer commandos crash in Norway en route to their mission of destroying a German "heavy water" plant at Telemark, important to Germany's nuclear-weapons development program. The survivors are captured by the Germans, interrogated, tortured and killed, even though they are all in uniform. The executions are carried out per Adolf Hitler's "Commando Order" of October 18, 1942, which mandated that captured Allied commandos — even if in uniform and having surrendered — be executed without trial.


