Downtown Rezoning Not Clear Enough 10/23/17 Caucus & 10/25/17 Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY – There was a presentation at the 10/23/17 Caucus on Rezoning the Downtown Area. A Representative from the New York Architect Firm of Perkins Eastman, PARA Representative Annie Hindenlang, and a Planner Elizabeth McManus who took turns explaining about proposals for this area.

Hindenlang explained that they reached out to those businesses and residences in the rezoning area. “We are interested in preserving the character of those buildings in the affected areas.”

Eric Fang from the Perkins Eastman Group spoke about some of the proposals for the West Side of the Railroad Tracks which includes Oak Street.

Planner Elizabeth McManus then spoke, “We started looking at this back in June 2015. Many agencies were involved: The Planning Board, Council Members, Code Enforcement, the County, NJ Transit, the Public, and the Downtown Improvement District.”

Fang then started speaking again, “Your City has a lot of historic value. We are looking to encourage using the transit system and biking paths, and having a very compact development. This is a very walkable town. There are some buildings on Smith Street (near the train station) that can be developed into lofts which will be very attractive to retirees. Best Practices will be used for that area. Some of them will include natural processes using rain. The sea elevation is rising.

Elizabeth McManus then pointed to certain areas on a slide presentation highlighting areas C(Commercial)2 and areas R(Residential)60&25.

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez remarked, “I am somewhat confused because as the presentation was going on and they (Perkins Eastman Rep Fang and Planner McManus) were pointing to the diagrams

on the slideshow, there was no illustration as to what was new regarding the zoning. I need to know what changes are going to be made to this area. There should have been supporting documents with the ordinance.”

Gonzalez continued, “Some creative ideas are coming forth, but all are not completely clear. There are no markups of the area on the documents that we have.”

McManus said, “C1 and C1A are Commercial Areas.”

This prompted Council President Bill Petrick to ask, “Why label the areas from C1 to C1A Are there some new permitted uses?”

McManus answered, “Hotels both retail and commercial, residential, and multifamily. Proposals include architectural improvements both outside and inside of buildings. The C1 or C1A permits multi-families in other kinds of uses such as art studios.”

Petrick responded, “To provide for denser housing.”

McManus responded, “Yes, and family houses will be uninterrupted. The RP (Residential Parking) single family housing will remain.”

Petrick wanted to know, “How many stories are they looking to be built in the areas affected?”

McManus responded, “3 to 6.”

Petrick then wanted to know, “What’s the benefit to the community to add 3 more stories?”

Annie Hindenlang responded, “It will reduce the amount of flooding in the streets when people are able to add roof gardens. Businesses said there is no growth in the downtown area. We’re helping the business owners by bringing in more people.”

Councilman Fernando Gonzalez spoke up, “It will drain our resources such as the Police, (Fire Dept, Public Works) etc.”

Hindenlang continued, “There has been extensive community

outreach.”

Gonzalez responded, “I was on the Planning Board when there were discussions about the Master Plan.”

Hindenlang said, “We had the Planning Board, Zoning Board, City Council and the Department Heads on hand for suggestions. We are trying to address the growing community. We can have business owners come here to address the concerns they presented to us. 10 Story Buildings are already in the books.”

McManus then talked about some of the plans for Front and Water Streets, “The water views must be sustained.”

Bill Petrick then voiced his concerns about the parking with the increased density.

McManus explained, “We will be encouraging shared parking between the residential and office usage. An example would be when people leave to go to work, those parking spaces will be freed up for those coming into town.”

Hindenlang then added, “Summit and Morristown have shared parking. The Parking Authority has managed a lot of shared parking. King Plaza also has a lot of under utilized parking spaces (for instance, the parking deck connected to King Plaza Building).”

Council President Petrick responded, “People, especially women are wary of parking decks for safety reasons. People are more comfortable in an open space.”

Councilman Gonzalez then added, “King Plaza managed these parking lots because the City couldn’t.”

Hindenlang started speaking again, “A lot of the money for studies pertaining to the Masterplan came from grants. Single homes will be protected.”

Petrick then sounded confused, “There are two conflicting reports as to what is needed.”

Hindenlang answered, “More commercial companies will

come in as well as people interested in the arts.”

Eric Fang then explained, “The Transit Lifestyle is becoming increasingly popular and you have businesses coming in with employment opportunities.”

Hindenlang then added, “We brought down the number of units permitted in certain areas.”

Petrick then cautioned, “We have to consider our Water System. The Masterplan of the 2000’s reflected the population projected during that time.”

Hindenlang answered, “That’s why we reduced the number of units in the redevelopment area because of the shortage of the water supply. Use the millions of dollars coming in to pay off the water debt.”

Councilman Irizarry then questioned, “How do we enforce all of this (Green roofs and certain architectural styles)?”

McManus explained, “Items can be reviewed by the Planning Board and the Zoning Board and other Departments can see if compliance is taking place. We can enforce architectural requirements, but for instance not the kind of bricks used.”

Councilman Fernando Irizarry was concerned, “We’ve had problems with workmanship in the past.”

Eric Fang responded, “We can only specify certain measurements be used.”

Councilman Joel Pabon commented, “We have people that should be living in full apartments. At the end of the day, it has to do with the enforcement of our laws.”

Councilman Helmin Caba commented, “We have a big parking issue that’s never addressed. We need to go back to the drawing board. The term shared parking is very vague.”

Hindenlang responded, “The City needs to do an extensive parking plan.”

McManus then commented,

“Usually there are 1.7 to 2.1 parking spaces per unit.”

Councilman Pabon then responded, “We allow people to sublet their apartments. It all boils down to Code Enforcement.”

Petrick said, “We need more residential parking permits.”

At the end of the presentation, Councilman Fernando Gonzalez suggested, “We should table this and have them (Representatives from Perkins Eastman) come back for further questioning. I need more clarification.”

At the 10/25/17 Council Meeting, Ordinance No. 6 First Reading - Amendments to the Focus 2000 Redevelopment Plan for Areas 1, 2 & 3 and Resolution R-416-10/17 referring to a proposed Amendment to the Focus 2000 Redevelopment Plan for Redevelopment Area 1, 2, & 3 to the Planning Board of the City of Perth Amboy for review were both pulled.

Remembering Another Important Part of Perth Amboy's History

William "Bill" Pavlovsky

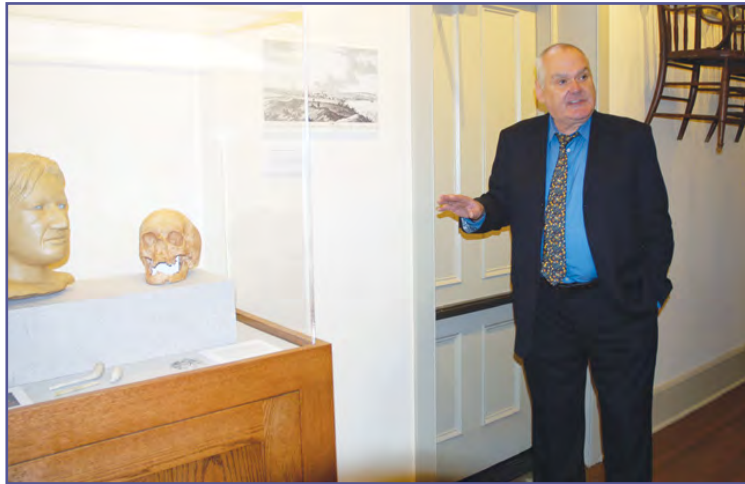
It is with sadness that we report the sudden passing of William Pavlovsky on Saturday, October 21, 2017. On the following day, there was a presentation by Dr. Richard Veit, at the historic Kearny Cottage on John Watson's Site. Dr. Veit is Professor of Anthropology and Chair of History and Anthropology at Monmouth University. Ironically Veit started his presentation by speaking about the Archaeological Dig that Bill Pavlovsky participated in 40 years ago.

Veit said he spoke to Pavlovsky 4 years ago about a dig that he did with Anton Massopust. Pavlovsky had participated in several digs on various historic properties located in Perth Amboy. These sites included properties owned by Benjamin Clarke and John Watson. The artifacts that were found on these digs showed a connection Perth Amboy had throughout the world which included the Latin America and European Countries. One of the most extraordinary finds by Pavlovsky was found in an oyster shell. It was what was left of a painting on a Flemish Canvas from the 1700's. Bill also found silver coins from Spain that were minted in Mexico.

Veit mentioned that Bill attended William and Mary College, where one of his Professors, Norman Barkin further peaked Bill's interest in excavations. Upon leaving College, he had all the knowledge he needed and had an real eye for archaeological sites.

I personally remember meeting Bill for the first time when I was appointed to the Perth Amboy Historic Preservation Commission when it was resurrected in 2009.

We spoke to Russell O'Reilly who was a very close friend of Pavlovsky. O'Reilly mentioned when the two of them were on the Zoning Board, Mayor Wil-da Diaz had approached them about starting up the Historic

Preservation Commission again. They were very interested in doing so.

Pavlovsky and O'Reilly both had a vast knowledge of the history of Perth Amboy so it was a shoe-in that Bill was unanimously voted as Chair and O'Reilly as Vice Chair of the PAHPC.

During their tenure on the PAHPC, they both orchestrated the signage program which identified historic homes in Perth Amboy.

Pavlovsky had to eventually resign from the PAHPC when his company was awarded the contract to restore the Surveyor General's Office into a museum.

Pictured above was the grand opening of the Surveyor General's Office in May 2017. One of the displays is the recasting of an indentured servant whose bones along with other indentured servants were found in mass grave at St. Peter's Episcopal Church. This was all made possible due to the efforts of Pavlovsky and O'Reilly.

Pavlovsky was born and raised in Perth Amboy. He later lived in Cambridge, Massachusetts, but his connection to Perth Amboy was never severed. It is only fitting that he has come home to Perth Amboy to be interred at St. Peter's historic church cemetery. Remember, it is in that cemetery that many notable Perth Am-

boy Citizens are interred. I think it's very fitting.

I remember when I happened to see Bill and his sister, Mary Ellen a couple of days after Superstorm Sandy hit. They took me to their family house on Water Street so I could see the view of the devastation from their back porch that looked over Raritan Bay. They were both very gracious.

My memory of Bill is being very tall, soft spoken, but with a commanding demeanor. He was very intelligent and went into great detail when he spoke about projects both past, present and upcoming.

One thing I forgot to mention is that during Professor Veit's presentation, he noted that he and Bill were talking about collaborating on a book. This project included all the artifacts that Pavlovsky had found on his digs. Many of these items are on display at Monmouth University.

Perth Amboy City Historian Anton J. Massopust added the following: "Bill Pavlovsky's greatest contribution to the City of Perth Amboy was the guiding of the restoration of the Proprietary House. It would not be where it is today without Pavlovsky's accomplishments."

There is an extensive history on Bill Pavlovsky submitted by his sister, Mary Ellen on page 8 of this paper. There is so much more to Bill than I ever knew. It was my pleasure to know such a fine gentleman who appreciated and acknowledged what everyone should know. Perth Amboy is one of the ten most historic cities in the United States. *C.M.*

PERTH AMBOY POLICE DEPARTMENT HALLOWEEN CURFEW INFORMATION:

For your continued safety, effective Monday, October 30th and Tuesday, October 31, 2017, all children under 17 years of age (unless accompanied by a parent/guardian) MUST be off the streets by 6:00 PM.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS:

- A responsible adult should always accompany children ages 12 and under when trick-or-treating
- Adults and children should wear reflective clothing and/or carry a light or glow stick
- Children over the age of 12 going out without adults should stay in groups, follow a pre-planned route, and watch for cars
- Teach children to never enter any home without you or your permission

- Teach children to tell a trusted adult if they see anything unusual

Obituary: William Stephen Pavlovsky Jr.

Age: 63 Cambridge, Massachusetts and Perth Amboy

 CAMBRIDGE/PERTH AMBOY - William Stephen Pavlovsky Jr. ("Bill") 63, architect and historian, of Perth Amboy, NJ and Cambridge, MA, passed away suddenly on Saturday, October 21, 2017 at his home in Cambridge.

Born and raised in Perth Amboy, Bill was a graduate of Perth Amboy High School. He held a B.A. with Honors from the College of William & Mary, where he concentrated in Architectural History and his studies included special courses at Colonial Williamsburg. Bill also held a Master of Architecture degree from Harvard University's Graduate School of Design, where his coursework included advanced studies in historic preservation and restoration. He was a long-time member of the Harvard Faculty Club in Cambridge and as well as a member of the Redwood Library and Athenaeum in Newport, RI.

Bill began his professional career with the renowned Cambridge-based firm, Benjamin Thompson and Associates. He later started his own Cambridge-based firm, William S. Pavlovsky, Architecture & Historic Preservation. For a time, Bill also served as a lecturer in Architectural History at the New England School of Art and Design, and was a Design Studio Critic at the Boston Architectural Center. Additionally, he collaborated on foreign embassy, bank and other prestigious projects with a number of other architects in the Boston area, including the Beacon Hill-based firm, James McNeely Architects.

In 1988-89, Bill researched and developed the conjectural drawings that were the basis for constructing a miniature replica model of the original design of the College of William and

Mary's Wren Building, the oldest still-existing college building in America. Bill worked on this project in consultation with renowned architectural historians, James D. Kornwulf and John F. Millar, and architect Nicholas A. Pappas. The model was first shown at William and Mary's Muscarelle Museum, in Williamsburg, VA, as part of the exhibition, "So Good a Design." Afterward, the model was placed on display at the Wren Building, where it continues to be on public view today. Over the years, Bill also was a contributing writer and editor for a number of publications on colonial American architecture.

Perth Amboy history was the great passion of Bill's life and, since his youth, he made countless contributions to the research, preservation and promotion of Perth Amboy's history, with the vast majority of time he so devoted having been volunteered. He was a long-time member and trustee of, as well as preservation consultant for both the Proprietary House Association and the Kearny Cottage Historical Association. The popular "Old Perth Amboy Walking Guide," now in its seventh edition, was authored and designed by Bill. During the 1970s, he conducted a number of archaeological digs of important historic sites in Perth Amboy, including that of the residence and gallery of early colonial artist, John Watson. A wide array of artifacts unearthed in those excavations continue to be exhibited to the public today, in addition to being the subject of historians' research, lectures and documentaries.

Since the 1960s, Bill devoted inestimable time and effort to researching, preserving and restoring Perth Amboy's Proprietary House, colonial New Jersey's royal governor's mansion.

During the 1980s and 1990s, he headed The Restoration Partnership, which restored and rehabilitated Proprietary House, which is the only original, official colonial royal governor's mansion still standing in America. Bill also designed and advised on the construction of the Bill of Rights Arch, erected in Perth Amboy's City Hall Circle to commemorate the bicentennial of the Bill of Rights, first ratified in 1787 by the State of New Jersey in Perth Amboy, which then was the state's capital. Since 1990, Bill served in various positions with the City of Perth Amboy, including City Historian, Chairman of the Perth Amboy Historic Preservation Commission and Chairman of the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

Most recently, Bill led the restoration and conversion to use as the city's history museum of the Surveyor General's Office in Perth Amboy. He also served as curator of the SGO museum, which first opened in May 2017. Many of the 18th century artifacts discovered during Bill's archaeological digs of the 1970s are now on exhibit at the museum. During his William and Mary days, Bill's rare passion for the past had been nurtured by the famed historical archae-

ologist of Colonial Williamsburg, Ivor Noel Hume, who became a mentor. Bill hoped that the exhibits and displays he organized for the new SGO museum would similarly inspire others. He often said, "If I can influence even one young person to love and appreciate history as much as I do, my efforts will not have been wasted."

Bill led numerous other historic site restoration and other projects in Massachusetts, Ohio and New Jersey. His Massachusetts projects included several historic residences in the Boston suburbs of Arlington and Lexington. In Ohio, he designed new, high-end, Georgian-style residences for a number of prestigious clients, including the prominent Bolton family. Some of Bill's New Jersey projects included Perth Amboy's Kearny Cottage, Metuchen's Old Franklin School and Old Bridge's Thomas Warne Historical Museum.

Bill was a very talented artist and was particularly accomplished in pen-and-ink drawing and engraving. With history as a passion, he also was an avid collector of antiques, about which he attained an expert level of knowledge. Bill's other favorite pastimes included visiting museums and art galleries,

as well as frequent travel to Newport, RI, Marblehead, MA and other historic locations. He also loved his time travelling in Italy and France.

Bill is preceded in death by his beloved parents William S. Sr. and Helen A. (nee Andrako) Pavlovsky. Bill is survived by his wife of 28 years, Monika Z. Pauli. Bill also is survived by his sisters, Mary Ellen Pavlovsky and Andrea Gillhuley, and her husband Peter; his brother, Jon C. Pavlovsky; his uncle, Dr. John Andrako; his cherished niece, Catie Gillhuley; and numerous cousins and dear friends.

A Funeral Mass will be held on Monday, November 6, 2017 at 10 a.m. at the Most Holy Name of Jesus Parish at Holy Trinity Church, 315 Lawrie St., Perth Amboy. Interment will follow at St. Peter's Episcopal Church Cemetery, 188 Rector St. Visiting is on Sunday, November 5, 2017 from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. at Gustav J. This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

British naval forces near Port Said, Egypt, on October 30, 1942, track, attack and force German sub U-559 to surface. The German crew abandons the sinking vessel, but one officer and two sailors (one a civilian crewman of the Naval Canteen Service) from the destroyer HMS Petard board the sub and enter it. They retrieve secret documents that will allow British cipher experts to crack the German signals system. The officer and one of the sailors drown when the sub suddenly goes down; the civilian sailor narrowly escapes. Shortly thereafter, the survivor, Thomas Brown, is found to have lied about his age (15) when he enlisted in 1941, and he is sent home, being too young to serve. (Brown joins the Royal Navy when he comes of age and serves aboard the light cruiser *HMS Belfast* until his death [in a fire at his home] in 1945.)

On October 31, *Luftwaffe* bombers hit Canterbury, England. In North Africa, fierce fighting continues between Australian and German forces near Tell el Eisa, Egypt. Confident that Stalingrad would soon fall, Adolf Hitler moves his eastern military headquarters from *Werwolf* ("Werewolf"), north of Vinnytsia, Ukraine, 596 miles northwestward to *Wolfsschanze* ("Wolf's Lair") near Rastenburg, East Prussia. ("Wolf" was Hitler's self-styled nickname, which he began using in the 1930s. "Wolf" is an old German form of the name Adolf.) Wearing sweater number 15, 21-year-old Maurice "Rocket" Richard makes his National Hockey League debut with the Montreal Canadiens, playing against the Boston Bruins at the Montreal Forum. The Habs won, 3-2. In the U.S., Bing Crosby's recording of "White Christmas" hits Number One on *Billboard* magazine's singles charts.

On November 1, U.S. Marines begin a new series of attacks along the Poha River on Guadalcanal. In the Battle of El Alamein, both sides suffer damage. The British can stand the losses; the Axis cannot. Rommel sends word to Berlin that a British breakthrough is inevitable, and withdrawal is necessary. In Europe, the Germans capture Alagir, in the Caucasus. Strikes break out in southeastern Vichy France in protest of the government's plan to force French laborers to work in Germany.

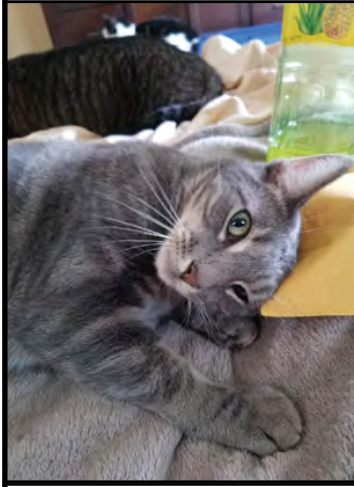
Australian troops retake Kokoda, Papua-New Guinea, from the Japanese on October 2. In Egypt, British and New Zealand forces break through the Axis defenses at El Alamein. In Russia, bitter street fighting continues in Stalingrad, with neither side making much progress. Due to increasing supply problems and the onset of winter, German Army Group A's advance into the Caucasus comes to a halt. The American military newspaper Stars and Stripes becomes a daily publication; it had previously been a weekly.

The Second Battle of El Alamein concludes on November 3. Rejecting out of hand Field Marshal Rommel's proposal to withdraw the Afrika Korps, now down to about 40 tanks, Hitler orders Rommel to "stand and die." In Moscow, in an interview with American journalists, Stalin describes U.S. military aid as "of little effect." In the U.S., Republican candidates gain considerable ground in Congressional and gubernatorial elections, indicating potential difficulties in domestic politics and dissatisfaction with the Democrats (President Roosevelt's party). The Democrats, however, retain control of both chambers of Congress.

In North Africa, the Italian 20th Motorized Corps is destroyed on November 4. Rommel, with only 12 tanks left, disobeys *der Führer* and re-issues his orders for a retreat. The British take 10,724 Axis prisoners, including nine generals.

On November 5, the British attack Rommel's rearguard, which is now almost 100 miles west of El Alamein. On Madagascar, the British sign a treaty of peace with the Vichy French government on the island. Fighting in and around Stalingrad forces the city's power plant to shut down. Entertainer and songwriter ("Over There," "You're a Grand Old Flag," "Give My Regards to Broadway") George M. Cohan dies of cancer in New York City at the age of 64.

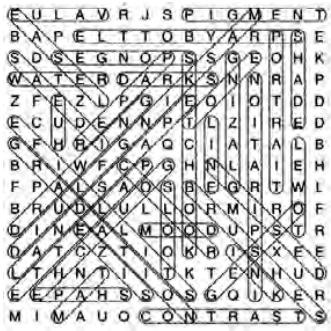

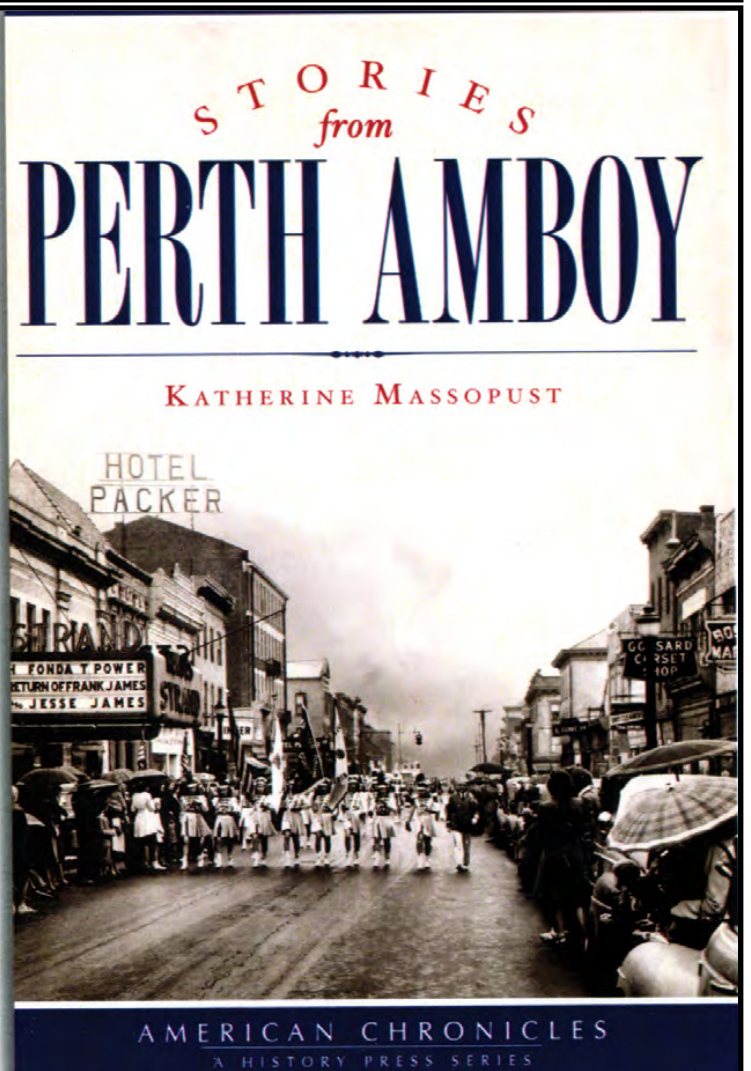
